6	Application for a Premises Licence - The Dialogue, 130 Upper Clapton Road, Hackney E5 9JY	<p><u>The decision</u></p> <p>The Sub-Committee in considering this decision from the information presented to it within the report and at the hearing today has determined that, having regard to the promotion of all the licensing objectives, namely:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• The prevention of crime and disorder;• Public safety;• Prevention of public nuisance; and• The protection of children from harm, <p>the application has been approved in accordance with the Council's licensing statement and the conditions set out in paragraph 8.1, subject to the following additional condition:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• There shall be a maximum of five patrons smoking outside of the premises at any one time. Those patrons shall smoke outside of the front of the premises. <p>And the following amendment to condition 16:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• The last sentence of condition 16 shall be replaced with the following <p>“Alcohol shall not be sold, supplied or consumed otherwise than to persons who are seated at a table and taking a substantial meal from the menu and that the consumption of alcohol by such persons is ancillary to taking such meals. 		<p><u>Reasons for the decision</u> The Licensing Sub-committee considered carefully the representations made by other persons regarding the impact the proposed operation would have on existing disorder and noise problems within the area of the premises due to the high concentration of licensed premises.</p> <p>The Sub-committee noted that the Police had withdrawn its representation and the applicant's responses regarding the proposed operation's impact on existing disorder and crime in the area.</p> <p>The Licensing Sub-committee believed that the premises' small capacity, the licence conditions preventing "vertical drinking", the absence of a licence for regulated entertainment after 23:00, and conditions proposed by the Police (and accepted by the applicant) to ensure that the premises would not add to the existing disorder and noise within the area constituted exceptional circumstances within the meaning of LP13 of the Council's licensing policy.</p> <p>On balance, the Licensing Sub-committee was satisfied that granting the premises licence subject to conditions and the above amendments would not undermine the licensing objectives.</p> <p><u>Public informative</u></p> <p>The applicant is reminded of the need to operate the premises according to any current planning permission relating to its user class, conditions and hours.</p>

		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The prevention of crime and disorder; • Public safety; • Prevention of public nuisance; and • The protection of children from harm, <p>the application has been approved in accordance with the Council’s licensing statement and the conditions set out in paragraph 8.1, subject to the following additional conditions:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The basement area at the premises shall not be used for licensable activities. • The ground floor at the premises shall have a maximum capacity of 35 persons. • There shall be no sale of alcohol unless the alcohol is mixed with coffee or is a sale of a coffee liqueur. <p><u>Reasons for the decision</u></p> <p>The application has been approved, with the above amendments, as the Licensing Sub-Committee was, on balance, satisfied that the licensing objectives would not be undermined.</p> <p>The Licensing Sub-committee considered carefully the representations made by other persons regarding the impact the proposed operation would have on existing disorder and noise problems within the area of the premises due to the high concentration of licensed premises.</p> <p>The Sub-committee noted that the Police had withdrawn its representation and the applicant’s responses regarding the proposed operation’s impact on existing disorder and crime in the area.</p> <p>The Licensing Sub-committee believed that the premises’ small capacity, alcohol only being sold if mixed with coffee or as coffee liqueur and early terminal hour of the premises meant that granting a licence would not add to existing disorder and noise within the area.</p>
