## Licensing Sub-Committee Hearings

This guide details the procedure for Licensing Sub-Committee hearings under the Licensing Act 2003. Whilst this will be used in most cases, the procedure will be altered in exceptional circumstances and when for example Personal Licences, Temporary Event Notices and Reviews are considered.

## A Licensing Sub-Committee will be held if:

- The applicant has applied for a Premises Licence, Provisional Statement, Club Premises Certificate or expressed their intention to vary their existing licence/certificate and has advertised this in a local newspaper and displayed a distinctive blue notice at the premises, following which representations have been made by a Responsible Authority or Other Person/s.
- A Review has been requested by a Responsible Authority or Other Person/s and the Review has been advertised by displaying a distinctive blue notice at the premises and also at the Council's office and website.
- An application is made to transfer a Premises Licence or for interim authority and the Police have issued an objection
- The applicant has made a Personal Licence application and the Police have objected to the Licence being granted.
- A Temporary Event Notice has been given and the Police and/or those in the Council that exercise environmental health functions have issued an objection.


## Prior to your item being heard:

- The Licensing team upon receiving representations will form a view as to whether the representations are irrelevant, frivolous, vexatious or for review applications; repetitious.
- The Licensing team would have provided written notice to all parties in advance of the hearing and would have responded to any request relating to personal details being removed from the agenda.

If you do not believe this to have happened, please contact the Licensing Service on 0208356 4970 or email licensing@hackney.gov.uk as soon as possible. For further information on the application process, please see the guidance notes at www.hackney.gov.uk/licensing.

## Making decisions on the items being heard:

Hearings will normally be held in public unless the Sub-Committee believe it not to be in the public interest to do so. Although the Chair will try to make the proceedings as informal as possible, these hearings are of a quasi-judicial nature, and the rules of natural justice shall apply.

Only those Responsible Authorities and Other Persons who have made a relevant representation in writing at the consultation stage can register to speak at a subsequent hearing. Applicants, Other Persons and Responsible Authorities will all be given a fair opportunity to put their case and the Sub-Committee will take these representations into account when making their decision. The Sub-Committee may still make a decision on any matter even if any party fails to attend the hearing. However, in these circumstances, it will only be that party's written representation that may be taken into account.

For new applications relating to Premises Licences and Club Premises Certificates, Members can grant with additional conditions attached to the licence, exclude any licensable activities, refuse a Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) if appropriate or reject the application.

Members when making decisions on variation applications regarding a Premises Licence or Club Premises Certificate, can modify (add, delete or amend) conditions on the licence or reject the application in whole or part. Members will be considering the request for a variation and the impact that this may have. Therefore, representations should be focused on the impact of the variation, although concerns relating to the existing terms of the licence may be relevant in considering the track record of the applicant. However, Members may consider other issues which relate to the promotion of the licensing objectives, although only if it is reasonable and proportionate to do so.

For Provisional Statements, Members can consider any steps that are necessary having regard to the representations made in order to ensure the licensing objectives are not undermined.

Members when deciding a Review application can modify (add, delete or amend) the conditions of the licence, exclude any licensable activities, remove a DPS if appropriate, suspend the licence/certificate for up to 3 months or revoke the licence/certificate completely.

For transfer of Premises Licences, interim authority requests and Personal Licence applications Members can only refuse or grant the application.

Members when deciding on an objection made against a Temporary Event Notice (TEN) will determine whether or not to issue a Counter Notice, which if issued will prevent the proposed event from proceeding. If a TEN has been given for a premises that already has a licence/certificate, Members may impose any of those conditions from the existing licence/certificate to the TEN.

## Before the meeting starts:

The Sub-Committee Members are requested to report for business no more than half an hour before the meeting starts to deal with any administrative/procedural issues. This will allow Members to consider;

- the appointment for any substitutes if required
- the appointment of the chair
- any procedural issues
- obtain the list of attendees
- late documents delivered prior to the meeting and to ensure all the paperwork is in order

The Sub-Committee will not be considering any of the actual points raised within the Report itself and no Responsible Authority or Other Person/s shall be present when the SubCommittee deal with the above issues.

## Attending the hearing that concerns you:

All Applicants, Other Persons and Responsible Authorities involved will be informed in writing of the date and time that their application will be considered by the Licensing Sub-Committee. Please contact the Licensing Service on 02083564970 or email licensing@hackney.gov.uk to confirm whether you wish to attend and/or register to speak at the Sub-Committee hearing or if you wish for someone else to speak on your behalf. If you are unable to attend, the application may be heard in your absence.

All parties should arrive promptly at the outset of the scheduled meeting regardless of when the item is listed to be heard on the agenda.

Please contact the Licensing Service for advice within 4 working days from the date on the notice letter if any of the following apply;

- you have special requirements to help make your representation, because of a disability or you need a translator for example
- you wish to supply additional [documentary] information such as photographs and videos/DVDs

Please note that if you wish to provide additional relevant information, this should be given at least 5 working days before the hearing. Any additional information provided once the hearing has started will only be accepted if all parties agree. Please note that the use of videos/DVDs is at the Sub-Committee's discretion - requests to show these should be made in advance to the Committee Officer.

## Timings

In most cases the application will last no longer than 1 hour, and the times to be allocated to each section are shown on the relevant hearing procedure. If you think that your evidence is likely to exceed this time period, please let the Licensing Service know within 4 working days of the date on the notice letter and the Sub-Committee will be advised. If your request is agreed, all parties will also be granted the same extension of time.

## Rights of Press and Public to Report on Meetings

Where a meeting of the Council and its committees are open to the public, the press and public are welcome to report on meetings of the Council and its committees, through any audio, visual or written methods and may use digital and social media providing they do not disturb the conduct of the meeting and providing that the person reporting or providing the commentary is present at the meeting.

Those wishing to film, photograph or audio record a meeting are asked to notify the Council's Monitoring Officer by noon on the day of the meeting, if possible, or any time prior to the start of the meeting or notify the Chair at the start of the meeting.

The Monitoring Officer, or the Chair of the meeting, may designate a set area from which all recording must take place at a meeting.

The Council will endeavour to provide reasonable space and seating to view, hear and record the meeting. If those intending to record a meeting require any other reasonable facilities, notice should be given to the Monitoring Officer in advance of the meeting and will only be provided if practicable to do so.

The Chair shall have discretion to regulate the behaviour of all those present recording a meeting in the interests of the efficient conduct of the meeting. Anyone acting in a disruptive manner may be required by the Chair to cease recording or may be excluded from the meeting. Disruptive behaviour may include: moving from any designated recording area; causing excessive noise; intrusive lighting; interrupting the meeting; or filming members of the public who have asked not to be filmed.

All those visually recording a meeting are requested to only focus on recording councillors, officers and the public who are directly involved in the conduct of the meeting. The Chair of the meeting will ask any members of the public present if they have objections to being visually recorded. Those visually recording a meeting are asked to respect the wishes of those who do not wish to be filmed or photographed. Failure by someone recording a meeting to respect the
wishes of those who do not wish to be filmed and photographed may result in the Chair instructing them to cease recording or in their exclusion from the meeting.

If a meeting passes a motion to exclude the press and public then in order to consider confidential or exempt information, all recording must cease and all recording equipment must be removed from the meeting room. The press and public are not permitted to use any means which might enable them to see or hear the proceedings whilst they are excluded from a meeting and confidential or exempt information is under consideration.

Providing oral commentary during a meeting is not permitted.

## Lobbying of Councillors

If a person or an organisation wants to make a representation to the Licensing Sub-Committee, they must NOT contact Sub-Committee Members directly. Licensing Sub-Committee Members have to retain an open mind on any application and determine it on its merits. Members can not be in anyway biased towards a party. Therefore, if a Member of the Sub-Committee has had any prior involvement they must ensure that they come to the hearing with an open mind.

Local ward councillors may be able to speak on behalf of objectors if requested to do so, provided that if they have a disclosable pecuniary interest they leave the meeting room when the application is being considered unless they have been granted dispensation.

## Reports

Agendas and Reports for Licensing Sub-Committees are published on the Council's website (www.hackney.gov.uk) 5 working days before the hearing takes place. Copies are also available by contacting Governance Services on 02083563578 or email governance@hackney.gov.uk. Copies of applications together with the detail of any objections will be included in the report.

## Appeals

Applicants or any party to the hearing can appeal against the decision made by the SubCommittee. The appeal to the Thames Magistrates Court must be made within 21 days of the decision being sent formally in writing. However, TEN's have the added restriction that no appeals can be made later than 5 working days before the event is scheduled to take place.

## Withdrawal of an Item or Cancellation of a Hearing

An item may be withdrawn from the agenda of a Licensing Sub-Committee meeting at short notice due to the withdrawal or resolution of the representations or objections to an application or notice. A hearing by the Licensing Sub-Committee may therefore be cancelled at short notice if there are no substantive items remaining on the agenda.

As much advance notice as is practicable of the withdrawal of an item on the agenda or cancellation of a meeting of the Licensing Sub-Committee will be provided on the Council's website but please note that this might be as little as a few hours before the hearing if the applicant chooses to leave it that late to satisfactorily address any representation or objection giving rise to the need for a hearing.

## Facilities

There are public toilets available, with wheelchair access, on the ground floor of the Town Hall. Induction loop facilities are available in the Assembly Halls, rooms 101, 102 \& 103 and the Council Chamber. Access for people with mobility difficulties can be obtained through the ramp on the side to the main Town Hall entrance.

## ADVICE TO MEMBERS ON DECLARING INTERESTS

Hackney Council's Code of Conduct applies to all Members of the Council, the Mayor and co-opted Members.

This note is intended to provide general guidance for Members on declaring interests. However, you may need to obtain specific advice on whether you have an interest in a particular matter. If you need advice, you can contact:

- The Corporate Director of Legal, HR and Regulatory Services;
- The Legal Adviser to the committee; or
- Governance Services.

If at all possible, you should try to identify any potential interest you may have before the meeting so that you and the person you ask for advice can fully consider all the circumstances before reaching a conclusion on what action you should take.

1. Do you have a disclosable pecuniary interest in any matter on the agenda or which is being considered at the meeting?

You will have a disclosable pecuniary interest in a matter if it:
i. relates to an interest that you have already registered in Parts A and C of the Register of Pecuniary Interests of you or your spouse/civil partner, or anyone living with you as if they were your spouse/civil partner;
ii. relates to an interest that should be registered in Parts $A$ and $C$ of the Register of Pecuniary Interests of your spouse/civil partner, or anyone living with you as if they were your spouse/civil partner, but you have not yet done so; or
iii. affects your well-being or financial position or that of your spouse/civil partner, or anyone living with you as if they were your spouse/civil partner.

## 2. If you have a disclosable pecuniary interest in an item on the

 agenda you must:i. Declare the existence and nature of the interest (in relation to the relevant agenda item) as soon as it becomes apparent to you (subject to the rules regarding sensitive interests).
ii. You must leave the room when the item in which you have an interest is being discussed. You cannot stay in the meeting room or public gallery whilst discussion of the item takes place and you cannot vote on the matter. In addition, you must not seek to improperly influence the decision.
iii. If you have, however, obtained dispensation from the Monitoring Officer or Standards Committee you may remain in the room and participate in the meeting. If dispensation has been granted it will stipulate the extent of your involvement, such as whether you can only be present to make representations, provide evidence or whether you are able to fully participate and vote on the matter in which you have a pecuniary interest.
3. Do you have any other non-pecuniary interest on any matter on the agenda which is being considered at the meeting?

You will have 'other non-pecuniary interest' in a matter if:
i. It relates to an external body that you have been appointed to as a Member or in another capacity; or
ii. It relates to an organisation or individual which you have actively engaged in supporting.

## 4. If you have other non-pecuniary interest in an item on the agenda you must:

i. Declare the existence and nature of the interest (in relation to the relevant agenda item) as soon as it becomes apparent to you.
ii. You may remain in the room, participate in any discussion or vote provided that contractual, financial, consent, permission or licence matters are not under consideration relating to the item in which you have an interest.
iii. If you have an interest in a contractual, financial, consent, permission or licence matter under consideration, you must leave the room unless you have obtained a dispensation from the Monitoring Officer or Standards Committee. You cannot stay in the room or public gallery whilst discussion of the item takes place and you cannot vote on the matter. In addition, you must not seek to improperly influence the decision. Where members of the public are allowed to make representations, or to give evidence or answer questions about the matter you may, with the permission of the meeting, speak on a matter then leave the room. Once you have finished making your representation, you must leave the room whilst the matter is being discussed.
iv. If you have been granted dispensation, in accordance with the Council's dispensation procedure you may remain in the room. If dispensation has been granted it will stipulate the extent of your involvement, such as whether you can only be present to make representations, provide evidence or whether you are able to fully participate and vote on the matter in which you have a non pecuniary interest.

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## Relevant Extracts from Hackney's Statement of Licensing Policy

Please find below relevant extracts from the Statement of Licensing Policy 2018.

## LP1 General Principles

The Council expects applicants to demonstrate:
(a) That they have an understanding of the nature of the locality in which the premises are located and that this is has been taken into consideration whilst preparing the operating schedule.
(b) Where the application is for evening and night-time activity, that the proposal reflects the Council's aspiration to diversify the offer, whilst at the same time promoting the licensing objectives.

## LP2 Licensing Objectives

## Prevention of Crime and Disorder

Whether the proposal includes satisfactory measures to mitigate any risk of the proposed operation making an unacceptable contribution to levels of crime and disorder in the locality.

## Public Safety

Whether the necessary and satisfactory risk assessments have been undertaken, the management procedures put in place and the relevant certification produced to demonstrate that the public will be kept safe both within and in close proximity to the premises.

## Prevention of Public Nuisance

Whether the applicant has addressed the potential for nuisance arising from the characteristics and style of the proposed activity and identified the appropriate steps to reduce the risk of public nuisance occurring.

## Protection of Children from Harm

Whether the applicant has identified and addressed any risks with the aim of protecting children from harm when on the premises or in close proximity to the premises.

Hours for licensable activity will generally be authorised, subject to demonstrating LP 1 and LP2, as follows:

- Monday to Thursday 08:00 to 23:00
- Friday and Saturday 08:00 to 00:00
- Sunday 10:00 to 22:30

Hours may be more restrictive dependent on the character of the area and if the individual circumstances require it.

Later hours may be considered where the applicant has identified any risk that may undermine the promotion of the licensing objectives and has put in place robust measures to mitigate those risks.
It should be noted that this policy does not apply to those who are making an application within a special policy area (see section 3) unless they have been able to demonstrate that the proposed activity or operation of the premises will not add to the cumulative impact that is already being experienced.

## LP4 Off' Sales of Alcohol

Hours for the supply of alcohol will generally be restricted to between 08:00 and 23:00.

## LP5 Planning Status

Licence applications should normally be from premises where:
(a) The activity to be authorised by the licence is a lawful planning use or is a deemed permitted development pursuant to the General Permitted Development Order (1995) as amended.
(b) The hours sought do not exceed those authorised by any planning permission.

The Licensing Authority may take into account the lack of planning permission or an established lawful use in deciding whether there is likely to be any harm to the licensing objectives.

## LP6 External Areas and Outdoor Events

The Licensing Authority will normally restrict external areas and outdoor activity to between 08:00 and 22:00 unless the applicant can demonstrate that comprehensive control measures have been implemented that ensure the promotion of the licensing objectives, in particular the public nuisance objective. Notwithstanding any proposed control measures, the Licensing Authority may restrict the hours and/or activity even further

## LP7 Minor Variations

The Council expects applications to be made in the following circumstances only:

- Small changes in the layout/structure of the premises
- The addition of voluntary/agreed conditions
- Removal of conditions that are dated and have no impact on the operation of the premises
- Reduction of hours for any licensable activity


## LP8 Temporary Event Notices

When considering an objection to a TEN the Council will:

- Expect that any existing conditions will be maintained (where relevant) in circumstances where an event is to take place at a premises that has an existing authorisation.
- Assess any history of complaints as a result of licensable activity that may or may not have been authorised by a TEN.
- Consider the track record of the premises user
- Consider any other control measures proposed to mitigate the objection


## LP9 Personal Licences

(a) The Council will consider whether a refusal of the licence is appropriate for the promotion of the crime prevention objective and will consider the:
(i) Seriousness and relevance of any conviction(s)
(ii) The period that has elapsed since committing the offence(s)
(iii) Any mitigating circumstances that assist in demonstrating that the crime prevention objective will not be undermined.

## LP10 Special Policy Areas - Dalston and Shoreditch

It is the Council's policy that where a relevant representation is made to any
application within the area of the Dalston SPA or Shoreditch SPA, the applicant will need to demonstrate that the proposed activity and the operation of the premises will not add to the cumulative impact that is currently being experienced in these areas. This policy is to be strictly applied.

It should also be noted that the;

- quality and track record of the management;
- good character of the applicant; and
- extent of any variation sought

May not be in itself sufficient. It should be noted that if an applicant can demonstrate that they will not add to the cumulative impact in their operating schedule and at any hearing, then the Core Hours Policy within LP3 will apply.

LP11 Cumulative Impact - General
The Council will give due regard to any relevant representations received where concerns are raised and supported around the negative cumulative impact the proposed application has on one or more of the licensing objectives.

| Step 7 Closing remarks | The Chair will ask Responsible Authorities, Other Persons, Applicants and the Licensing Officer if they have any final comments to make. | Step 8 - Final clarification | Licensing Sub-Committee Members will have a final opportunity to seek clarification on any points raised, following which the Chair will conclude the discussion. | 5 minutes |

| Step 10 Chair announces the decision | The Sub-Committee will return and the Chair will announce the decision. ## 2. APPLICATION

2.1 Blondies Brewery Ltd has made an application for a premises licence under the Licensing Act 2003 to authorise:

- The supply alcohol for consumption on and off the premises
- Regulated entertainment
- Late night refreshment
2.2 The application is attached as Appendix A. The proposed hours and activities have subsequently been amended to those described in para. 1 above. The applicant has proposed measures that could be converted to conditions (see paragraph 8.1 below).


## 3. CURRENT STATUS / HISTORY

3.1 The premises are not currently licensed for any activity.
3.2 No Temporary Event Notices have been given for the premises over the past 12 months.

## 6. GUIDANCE CONSIDERATIONS

6.1 The Licensing Authority is required to have regard to any guidance issued by the Secretary of State under the Licensing Act 2003.

## 7. POLICY CONSIDERATIONS

7.1 Licensing Sub-Committee is required to have regard to the London Borough of Hackney's Statement of Licensing Policy ("the Policy") adopted by the Licensing Authority.
7.2 The Policy applies to applications where relevant representations have been made. With regard to this application, policies, LP1 (General Principles), LP2 (Licensing Objectives), LP3 (Core Hours) are relevant

## 8. OFFICER OBSERVATIONS

8.1 If the Sub-Committee is minded to approve the application, the following conditions should be applied the licence:

## Supply of Alcohol (On/Both)

1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:
(a) At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence.
(b)At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
3. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
(2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises -
(a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;
(i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit(other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
(ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
(b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
(c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
(d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
(e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
4. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
5.5.1. The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sales or supply of alcohol.
5.2 The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licences must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
5.3. The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either:-
(a) a holographic mark or
(b) an ultraviolet feature
5. The responsible person must ensure that:
a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures:

- beer or cider:1/2 pint;
- gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml ; and
- still wine in a glass: 125ml; and
b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customers is made aware that these measures are available.

Minimum Drinks Pricing
7. 7.1 A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
7.2 For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 7.1 above -
(a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
(b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula $-\mathrm{P}=\mathrm{D}+(\mathrm{DxV})$ Where -
(i) P is the permitted price,
(ii) D is the rate of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
(iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
(c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -
(i) the holder of the premises licence,
(ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
(iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
(d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
(e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
7.3 Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 7.2(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that subparagraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
7.4 (1) Sub-paragraph 7.4(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 7.2(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

## Door Supervision

8. Each individual who is to carry out a security activity at the premises must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

## Conditions derived from operating schedule

9. All instances of crime and disorder shall be reported to the police. An incident book shall be used to record all instances of public disorder and incidents at the premises.
10. On Thursday, Friday and Saturday nights, and whenever the premises supervisor deems necessary, an SIA registered door supervisor will be employed from 9pm until 30 past closing time to assist with dispersal.
11. CCTV shall be installed, operated and maintained in agreement with the Police. The CCTV system shall incorporate a recording facility and any recordings shall be retained and stored in a suitable and secure manner for a minimum of 31 days. A system shall be in place to maintain the quality of the recorded image and a complete audit trail maintained. The system will comply with other essential legislation, and all signs as required will be clearly displayed. The system will be maintained and fully operational throughout the hours that the premises are open for any licensable activity. There must also be someone on the premises, who can download the images and present them on request by a police officer or other responsible authority. One camera shall be placed outside the entrance and on entry.
12. All exit routes shall be kept unobstructed, with non-slippery and even surfaces, free of trip hazards and clearly identified. All exits doors shall be maintained easily operable without the use of a key, card, code or similar means.
13. Exit doors shall be regularly checked to ensure that they function satisfactorily and a record of the check shall be kept.
14. Adequate and appropriate supply of first aid equipment and materials must be available on the premises at all times.
15. A limiter will be put on the sound system to maintain control of volume.
16. Doors and windows to the premises will be kept closed, so far as practicable, at all times when noise generating regulated entertainment is taking place.
17. Loudspeakers shall not be located outside the premise building.
18. Front smoking area will close at 10pm and customers will be advised to smoke in the external smoking area from that time.
19. Drinking up time will be announced 30 minutes prior to close of business, allowing another 10 minutes for last drink orders.
20. Refuse such as bottles must be placed into receptacles outside the premises at times that will minimise the disturbance to nearby properties. No glass bottle bins will be emptied after 10pm.
21. The licensee shall devise a dispersal plan for evening events to be made available on request to reasonable authorities.
22. The licensee shall ensure that all staff, including Door Supervisors if required, shall be trained to carry out these tasks and to facilitate effective crowd dispersal at the end of any given evening, and ensure that they have signed a staff record form to verify that they have been trained in these processes.
23. The premises will operate a Challenge 25 Policy, with clear signage stating the policy is in place, all persons who appear under the age of 25 will be age checked, only official documents with a photograph and date of birth or verified pass card are to be accepted.
24.Advertisement and implementation of "Zero Tolerance" policy in respect of drugs.
24. Refuse entry to any known or suspected drug dealers.
25. The contact telephone number for the premises duty manager shall be displayed inside the premises or immediately outside the premises such that it is clearly visible from outside without the need to enter the premises.
26. Regularly carry out toilet checks and maintain a record of such checks or employ a toilet attendant or supervisor.
27. All staff are to be trained on a regular basis, training must be recorded this and a formal training document must be available for inspection by authorised officers or police, which verifies the subject areas and training provided.
28. The Licensee shall ensure that all staff are fully trained and made aware of the legal requirement of businesses to comply with their responsibility as regards the disposal of waste produced from the business premises. The procedure for handling and preparing for disposal of the waste shall be in writing and displayed in a prominent place where it can be referred to at all times by staff.
29. The Licensee shall ensure that any contract for general and recyclable waste disposal shall be appropriate in size to the amount of waste produced by the business. The Licensee shall maintain an adequate supply of waste receptacles provided by his registered waste carrier (refuse sacks or commercial waste bins) in order to ensure all refuse emanating from the business is always presented for collection by his waste carrier and shall not use any plain black or unidentifiable refuse sacks or any other unidentifiable or unmarked waste receptacles.
30. In order to minimise the amount of time any waste remains on the public highway in readiness for collection, the Licensee will ensure the timeframe within which it may expect its waste carrier to collect is adhered to.
31. In streets or areas where the London Borough of Hackney imposes a requirement that refuse may only be left on the public highway at certain times the Licensee must ensure she complies with any orders or notices served by the Council AND if the Licensee's waste carrier cannot or does not comply by collecting the refuse within an hour after the close of any time band imposed by such order or notice, the Licensee must remove the refuse from the public highway and/or keep it within the premises until such time as his/her waste carrier arrives to collect the refuse).
32. The Licensee shall instruct members of staff to make regular checks of the area immediately outside the premises and remove any litter, bottles and glasses emanating from the premises. A final check should be made at close of business.
33. The Licensee shall provide a safe receptacle for cigarette ends to be placed outside for the use of customers, such receptacle being carefully placed so as not to cause an obstruction or trip.
34. The current trade waste agreement/duty of care waste transfer document shall be conspicuously displayed and maintained in the window of the premises where it can be conveniently seen and read by persons standing in Blondies Brewery Ltd. This should remain unobstructed at all times and should clearly identify:-

- the name of the registered waste carrier
- the date of commencement of trade waste contract the date of expiry of trade waste contract
- the days and times of collection
- the type of waste including the European Waste Code


## 9. REASONS FOR OFFICER OBSERVATIONS

9.1 Conditions 9 to 35 above are derived from the applicant's operating schedule and incorporate conditions proposed by Trading Standards and Environmental Enforcement.
10. LEGAL COMMENTS
10.1 The Council has a duty as a Licensing Authority under the Licensing Act 2003 to carry out its functions with a view to promoting the following 4 licensing objectives;

- The Prevention of Crime and Disorder
- Public Safety
- Prevention of Public Nuisance
- The Protection of Children from Harm
10.2 It should be noted that each of the licensing objectives have equal importance and are the only grounds upon which a relevant representation can be made and for which an application can be refused or terms and conditions attached to a licence.

11. HUMAN RIGHTS ACT 1998 IMPLICATIONS
11.1 There are implications to;

- Article 6 - Right to a fair hearing
- Article 14 - Not to discriminate
- Balancing: Article 1- Peaceful enjoyment of their possession (i.e. a licence is defined as being a possession) with Article 8 - Right of Privacy (i.e. respect private \& family life) to achieve a proportionate decision having regard to the protection of an individual's rights against the interests of the community at large.

A clear and legible notice outside the premises indicating the normal hours under the terms of the premises licence during which licensable activities are permitted.
Clear and conspicuous notices warning of potential criminal activity, such as theft, that may target customers will be displayed.
As a late night refreshment premises, custom will not be sought by means of personal solicitation outside or in the vicinity of the premises.

## c) Public safety

A $\log$ book or recording system shall be kept upon the premises in which shall be entered particulars of inspections made; those required to be made by statute, and information compiled to comply with any public safety condition attached to the premises licence that requires the recording of such information. The log book shall be kept available for inspection when required by persons authorised by the Licensing Act 2003 or associated legislation.
Adequate access is provided for emergency vehicles.
All parts of the premises and all fittings and apparatus therein, door fastenings and notices
and the seating, lighting, heating, electrical, ventilation, sanitary accommodation, washing facilities and other installations, will be maintained at all times n good order and in a safe condition.

## d) The prevention of public nuisance

Prominent, clear and legible notices will be displayed at all exits requesting the public to respect the needs of nearby residents and to leave the premises and the area quietly.
Deliveries of materials necessary for the operation of the business will be carried out at such a time or in such a manner as to prevent nuisance and disturbance to nearby residents. The Licensee will ensure that staff who arrive early morning or depart late at night when the business has ceased trading conduct themselves in such a manner to avoid causing disturbance to nearby residents.
Customers will be asked not to stand around talking in the street outside the premises; and asked to leave the vicinity quickly and quietly.
A specific taxi operator has been nominated for staff and customers use. The company's telephone number is advertised to customers. The operator, and all drivers, are aware that they should arrive and depart as quietly as possible, should not sound vehicle horns as a signal of their arrival or leave engines running unnecessarily.
The movement of bins and rubbish outside the premises will be kept to a minimum after 11.00 pm . This will help to reduce the levels of noise produced by the premises.

Bright lights on or outside the premises will be positioned and screened in such a way so as to not cause a disturbance to nearby residents.
Adequate waste receptacles for use by customers will be provided in the local vicinity.

## e) The protection of children from harm

Ensure no children are allowed in after a certain time, or no unaccompanied children after a certain time.

Notes for Guidance

## Blondies Brewery - Licensing Conditions

1. All instances of crime and disorder shall be reported to the police. An incident book shall be used to record all instances of public disorder and incidents at the premises.
2. On Thursday, Friday and Saturday nights, and whenever the premises supervisor sees necessary, an SIA registered door supervisor will be employed from 9pm until 30 past closing time to assist with dispersal.
3. CCTV shall be installed, operated and maintained in agreement with the Police. The CCTV system shall incorporate a recording facility and any recordings shall be retained and stored in a suitable and secure manner for a minimum of 31 days. A system shall be in place to maintain the quality of the recorded image and a complete audit trail maintained. The system will comply with other essential legislation, and all signs as required will be clearly displayed. The system will be maintained and fully operational throughout the hours that the premises are open for any licensable activity. There must also be someone on the premises, who can download the images and present them on request by a police officer or other responsible authority. One camera shall be placed outside the entrance and on entry.
4. All exit routes shall be kept unobstructed, with non-slippery and even surfaces, free of trip hazards and clearly identified. All exits doors shall be maintained easily operable without the use of a key, card, code or similar means.
5. Exit doors shall be regularly checked to ensure that they function satisfactorily and a record of the check shall be kept.
6. Adequate and appropriate supply of first aid equipment and materials must be available on the premises at all times.
7. A limiter will be put on the sound system to maintain control of volume.
8. Doors and windows to the premises will be kept closed, so far as practicable, at all times when noise generating regulated entertainment is taking place.
9. Loudspeakers shall not be located outside the premise building.
10. Front smoking area will close at 10 pm and customers will be advised to smoke in the external smoking area from that time.
11. Drinking up time will be announced 30 minutes prior to close of business, allowing another 10 minutes for last drink orders.
12. Refuse such as bottles must be placed into receptacles outside the premises at times that will minimise the disturbance to nearby properties. No glass bottle bins will be emptied after 10pm.
13. The licensee shall devise a dispersal plan for evening events to be made available on request to reasonable authorities.
14. The licensee shall ensure that all staff, including Door Supervisors if required, shall be trained to carry out these tasks and to facilitate effective crowd dispersal at the end of any given evening, and ensure that they have signed a staff record form to verify that they have been trained in these processes.
15. The premises will operate a Challenge 25 Policy, with clear signage stating the policy is in place, all persons who appear under the age of 25 will be age checked, only official documents with a photograph and date of birth or verified pass card are to be accepted.
16. Advertisement and implementation of "Zero Tolerance" policy in respect of drugs.
17.Refuse entry to any known or suspected drug dealers.
17. The contact telephone number for the premises duty manager shall be displayed inside the premises or immediately outside the premises such that it is clearly visible from outside without the need to enter the premises.
18. Regularly carry out toilet checks and maintain a record of such checks or employ a toilet attendant or supervisor.
19. All staff are to be trained on a regular basis, training must be recorded this and a formal training document must be available for inspection by authorised officers or police, which verifies the subject areas and training provided.
20. The Licensee shall ensure that all staff are fully trained and made aware of the legal requirement of businesses to comply with their responsibility as regards the disposal of waste produced from the business premises. The procedure for handling and preparing for disposal of the waste shall be in writing and displayed in a prominent place where it can be referred to at all times by staff.
21. The Licensee shall ensure that any contract for general and recyclable waste disposal shall be appropriate in size to the amount of waste produced by the business. The Licensee shall maintain an adequate supply of waste receptacles provided by his registered waste carrier (refuse sacks or commercial waste bins) in order to ensure all refuse emanating from the business is always presented for collection by his waste carrier and shall not use any plain black or unidentifiable refuse sacks or any other unidentifiable or unmarked waste receptacles.
22. In order to minimise the amount of time any waste remains on the public highway in readiness for collection, the Licensee will ensure the timeframe within which it may expect its waste carrier to collect is adhered to.
23. In streets or areas where the London Borough of Hackney imposes a requirement that refuse may only be left on the public highway at certain times the Licensee must ensure she complies with any orders or notices served by the Council AND if the Licensee's waste carrier cannot or does not comply by collecting the refuse within an hour after the close of any time band imposed by such order or notice, the Licensee must remove the refuse from the public highway and/or keep it within the premises until such time as his/her waste carrier arrives to collect the refuse).
24. The Licensee shall instruct members of staff to make regular checks of the area immediately outside the premises and remove any litter, bottles and glasses emanating from the premises. A final check should be made at close of business.
25. The Licensee shall provide a safe receptacle for cigarette ends to be placed outside for the use of customers, such receptacle being carefully placed so as not to cause an obstruction or trip.
26. The current trade waste agreement/duty of care waste transfer document shall be conspicuously displayed and maintained in the window of the premises where it can be conveniently seen and read by persons standing in Blondies Brewery LTD
This should remain unobstructed at all times and should clearly identify:-

- the name of the registered waste carrier
- the date of commencement of trade waste contract the date of expiry of trade waste contract
- the days and times of collection
- the type of waste including the European Waste Code


## BLONDIES BREWERY - DISPERSAL POLICY

## 1. PURPOSE

This policy is designed to provide guidance for the management and employees and set out the terms for the dispersal of customers from the premises.

The purpose of this policy is to set out the reasonable steps the premises will undertake to prevent unnecessary avoidable disturbance to residents, services and other businesses operating in the vicinity of the premises.

It is the stated intention of the premises to operate in a manner which causes the minimum impact from noise nuisance and anti-social behaviour from our customers to neighbours and other members of the public.

To this end all relevant staff will be trained in this policy and other appropriate skills to achieve an orderly and safe dispersal from the premises.

All staff are compelled by their contract of employment to comply with and actively implement this dispersal policy; where their job role includes these responsibilities.

It is the responsibility of the Designated Premises Supervisor to ensure that this policy is enforced at the premises and to regularly update the policy to meet the requirements of the business.

## 2. LOCAL CO-OPERATION

The premises will work in cooperation, where appropriate, with other premises in the area The premises will, where practicable, work in partnership with Responsible Authorities through Pubwatch or similar partnership group to share information and best practice.

The premise will have open communication with local residents to ensure that community concerns are addressed appropriately.

## 3. DISPERSAL

After 10pm, dispersal will be through the exit at 449 Lower Clapton Road. As there are two exit and entry points, the larger entrance at 449 a , will be closed at 10 pm so minimise the impact on the surrounding residents.

This entrance will remain closed for the rest of the evening. The exit at the other side of the venue will act as a tunnel to minimise sound as no speakers will be positioned at that end of the venue.

All conditions relating to dispersal included in the Premises licence will be enforced and relevant staff will be trained in these conditions, as well as the operating hours outlined on the premises licence.

Allocation of staff in the last 30 minutes prior to closing will be reviewed, to ensure that the collecting of glasses and the clearing of other waste is prioritised; this provides a message to customers that the premises is in the process of closing and encourages them to finish their drinks and prepare for departure.

A suitable member of staff or a Door Supervisor will be visible at exit point to control the dispersal, to remind people to leave quietly and to prevent patrons from re-entering the premises.

## Action Points:

## Front of building at 10pm:

Make an announcement at 9:30 that the tables will be taken inside and front entance of venue will close in half an hour.

A reminder that area will be closing at 10 so have 15 minuets to make there way back inside.
At 10pm, customers will be politely asked to move inside and tables to be taken in and door closed for the night, remaining an emergency exit only.

## Close of business:

Make an announcement at the end of the evening to encourage patrons to disperse gradually and to leave the area quietly.

Ensure adequate signage is available at each exit asking people to leave quietly and not to congregate outside or in the local area; direct patrons attention to these signs as they leave.

Remove drinks and glass vessels from patrons as they leave to ensure no glass leaves the premises.

Door Supervisors Licensed by the Security Industry Authority will be employed by the premises based upon the risk assessment carried out in relation to the following factors:

Size of the venue<br>Expected attendance<br>Type of event taking place<br>Location of the premises<br>Time of year<br>Special occasion (New Year, Halloween, Local Festivals etc.)<br>Premises Licence Conditions

## Door Supervisors will be tasked with:

## Management of the Queue to Enter the Premises.

Where a queue forms they will monitor to ensure the behaviour of those queuing is conducive with the entry policy. Any person who appears to be drunk or intoxicated will, where possible, be removed from the queue prior to them reaching the front.

While monitoring the queue the Door Supervisor should remove alcohol from anyone consuming alcohol while queuing or if they are unwilling to give up their alcohol remove them from the queue and advise them they will be refused entry as a result.

An appropriate member of staff should also ask people to have their ID ready to show at the door.

Door Supervisors must seek to control the noise from any person queuing outside the premises in order to reduce the potential for noise to disturb people living and working in the local community. This is achieved by politely reminding customers that anyone not complying with the request will be refused entry to the premises.

## Dispersal from the Premises.

The door supervisor will help to usher customers inside when closing the front area of the venue.

During the 'soft closure' period and once the premises is closed, the Door Supervisors shall assist with the dispersal of customers from the area. The purpose of an effective dispersal is to ensure that patrons leave the area quickly, quietly and in an orderly manner.

The most effective approach to dispersal is to be friendly and helpful, understanding that one of the effects of alcohol is to inhibit the effective decision-making ability. What may seem obvious and logical to a sober person, may seem confusing and complicated to a person who has consumed alcohol.

People loitering may be doing so because they are unable to make a decision or easily access the information they require; often they will disperse when they are given this information. Many patrons will move on if they can be helped to achieve one of the following outcomes:

How to get home?
Where can they go next?
Where can they get some food?

By providing this information it can encourage them to leave the immediate area more quickly.

## Door Supervisors will be easily identifiable.

The law requires Door Supervisors to display their SIA Licence.

## Action Points:

Door Supervisors can expedite the dispersal of patrons with their actions both at closing time and throughout the night by:

Controlling the level of intoxication of patrons throughout the night and acting appropriately when people become intoxicated. Anyone who becomes too intoxicated to be served at the bar, shall be removed from the premises.

Encourage patrons to leave gradually via the appropriate exits at the end of the night; try and avoid large numbers of patrons all leaving at the same time.

Provide information about the transport options from the premises.
Remove drinks and glasses and bottles from those leaving the premises.
Remind people who are leaving to do so quietly and direct their attention to the signs displayed

Ask patrons not to assemble or loiter outside the premises once they have left; politely reminding people who do not comply that they may be refused entrance in the future if they fail to disperse.

## 4. TRANSPORT

SIA and staff will be trained to know and assist customers with their transport home by:
Assisting in organising a ride-hailing vehicle through mobile app ie Uber, Via Van or Bolt
Pointing out the local taxi officers which are located on Dalston Lane
Overground - Liverpool Street to Enfield Town, Cheshunt and Chingford Route Northbound -
Trains operate every 15 minutes until
Monday - Sunday 01:10
Southbound to Liverpool Street-
Trains operate every 15 minutes until
Monday - Saturday 00:15
Sunday 23:59
Night busses run throughout the evening from Dalston Lane -
N38 - Victoria Station to Lea Bridge Roundabout - Every 20-30 mins throughout the evening
N277 - Islington to Crossharbour - Every 20-30 mins throughout the evening
N242 - Homerton Hospital - Aldgate Station - Every 30 mins throughout the evening

## 5. SIGNAGE \& LIGHTING

The following signs will be displayed at the premises:
Sings highlighting the Entry Requirement of the Premises
Signs requesting patrons to Leave Quietly and Respect the Neighbours
Signs regarding the 'Challenge 25' Policy
Signs regarding the 'Zero Tolerance' Drug Policy
These signs are to be displayed prominently at every public entrance and exit from the premises.

Lighting (Internal) - The premises will turn on the House Lights 15 minutes prior to closing time; the time by which every patron must have left the premises; this coincides with the closing time of the bar. This is a follow on from last orders being called 30 minutes prior to closing time.

Turning the house lights on is a clear indication to patrons that the premises is in the process of closing and generally encourages patrons to leave gradually over the following 30 minutes (often referred to as a 'drinking up time'). There is a distinct advantage to patrons leaving of their own free will as they are much more likely to leave and disperse, then if they are asked to do so.

Lighting (External) - External lighting should be sufficient for patrons to leave the premises safely. Providing sufficient lighting in the external areas of the premises will encourage patrons to leave; patrons may be slower to leave if it is brighter inside than outside.

External lighting will be regularly reviewed to ensure it is not a cause of nuisance to neighbours.

Both internal and external lighting will be regularly reviewed to ensure it does not impede the effectiveness of CCTV.

## 6. SMOKING AREAS

The Premises operates a designated smoking area at the front of archway 449a throughout the day where there will be tables and a designated seating area. This area will be closed at 10 pm and customers will be advised that they can smoke in the other designated smoking area.

There will be a secondary smoking area at the other entrance point to the venue, 449 , which will become the designated smoking area and the point of entry and exit after 10pm.

## 7. BOTTLES, GLASSES \& LITTER

The premises will maintain the area at the front and rear of the premises. Members of staff will regularly clear bottles, glasses, litter and sweeping cigarette butts.

No glasses, bottles or other drinks are permitted to leave the premises and it is the responsibility of the Door Supervisor to ensure this rule is enforced.

It may be the case that glass bottles and glasses are brought to the area from other premises and left in the vicinity or at the front of the premises. It is the responsibility of the Door Supervisor to ensure none of these items enter the premises.

Despite these items not originating from the premises, it is the responsibility of staff to clear them on a regular basis throughout a session and to check at the end of the night that no such items remain to the front of the premises.

Effective house-keeping of this nature reduces the chances of glasses and bottles breaking or causing potential accidents. Consideration should also be given that such litter causes a nuisance to neighbours and while much of this may not originate from the premises an effort should be made to clear such litter as is reasonable by way of being a good neighbour.

## Action Points:

Prior to closing the premises check that all litter to the front of the premises has been cleared.
Sweeping outside the premises at the end of the session not only clears smaller rubbish, but may assist in getting patrons to move away from the premises.

## 8. LOST PROPERTY

Any possessions that are found left behind at the end of an event will be held for a period of three months unless claimed by their owner. At this time they will be donated to local charities and no claim can be made against the company. Notices to this effect will be displayed at the premises.

## 9. ‘SOFT CLOSURE’ - MUSIC \& ENTERTAINMENT

A 'soft closure' is in place at the premises, this is designed to close the premises more slowly and thus to encourage a more even dispersal rather than everyone being asked to leave at the same time. This in turn seeks to minimise the potential for noise and anti-social behaviour which can occur when larger numbers of people leave a venue at the same time.

## Action Points

Patrons will be notified by announcement of 'Last Orders' giving the 10 minutes to purchase a last drink if they wish to do so.
'Bar Closed' will then be announced when the bar closes.
Minutes after 'time' has been called, staff cleaning and collecting glasses will start politely asking people to finish their drinks. Doing this is a polite individual manner, rather than shouting at the whole bar, is likely to have a more positive effect.

20 Minutes after 'Time' has been called people should be asked to leave in the same manner as that indicated above.

30 Minutes after 'Time' has been called, everyone should have left and dispersal as described earlier in this policy should be underway.

## 10. CONTROLLING CUSTOMERS \& PREVENTING LOITERING

There are a number of solutions already described earlier in the policy on strategies which will help move people away from the premises and disperse them. However addition consideration can be given to the following:

- Making announcements
- Lighting
- Notices and signage
- Staff allocation
- Thanking patrons on the way out; this also encourages them to return by ensuring their final interaction with staff is positive.
- Staff should be aware when leaving after their shift, where background noise may no longer drown them out, staff can be a source of nuisance themselves.
- Consideration should be given to additional training for key staff. Intoxicated customers may react more positively to messages from staff other than Door Supervisors. People who are intoxicated are instinctively adverse to authority figures, such as the police or door supervisors. While the Police and Door Supervisors are trained to handle conflict, the vast majority of patrons are not involved in conflict and for them a more positive outcome may be achieved by other staff providing them with the messages and information they require.

## Blondies Brewery Ltd;

Verity \& Sharmaine Cox are Directors of Blondies Brewery Ltd.
They currently have a bar (Blondies Bar) on Lower Clapton Road.

- It is close to the busy intersection of the A107 \& A104
- It is adjacent to Hackney Downs Station
- There is a walkthrough from Hackney Downs Station to Amhurst Road


It is noted that there is Five Points Brewing Company nearby and this serves the Penbury Tavern but this Brewery is large scale commercial and there is enough passing trade noted to serve both.

Please note there is an existing planning application being processed for the existing Blondies Bar Reference: 2019/1319

## General Specifics of the Business;

- The Brewery will be run by a qualified commercial brewer, Charlotte Freeston
- The Facility Manager \& Liscensee will be Verity Cox
- Verity will employ a qualified Bar Manager
- The Footfall is expected to be no more than 200
- Their will be live events at the venue but the Main Roller Door will be closed
- There will be seating both inside and out but generally, the Front Roller Door will be shut
- The Brewery itself will be fenced off from the public with the exception of the Fire Exit which will be a swing gate with signage
- The Archway was previosly a Craft Juice Drinks Company and the Archway aready has the services for the Brewery including drainage
- There is suitable lighting
- There is Emergency Exit Lighting
- The rear yard will act as keg storage, staff toilet (existing) chiller location, goods inwards and Fire Exit
- Blondies has already made acquaintance with their potential neighbours, in particular the MOT Station next door and they are fully aware of our plans and in fact, quite supportive!


## Project Parameters;

1. The 'Blondies Project' will be split into two Phases; The Brewery installation and commissioning first to produce revenue for the business and then the Bar with public access
2. The original Blondies Bar will continue to operate after the Archway is open.
3. It is the intention to attract passing foot traffic from both the station and road so intend to have footfall from both entrances to the yard late into the evening (subject to local licensing laws of course)
4. It is intended to have a Billboard Sign on both entrances to the yard on the Public Footpath
5. There will be no public access to Archway from the rear entrance which will be designated for deliveries \& Emergency Access/Egress only
6. Please note on the drawing 1907001-BB04-D that we are putting freestanding secondary walls up so to not affix/anchor onto any existing structures and to stop the public accessing building services
7. All our brewery equipment and amenities (including the bar) will be free standing and not anchored to the floor, it is not required (no moving parts)
8. We will be installing a removable ramp in the Fermenting Area to replace the unsafe steps currently existing
9. All services will be run either on the false walls or on service support posts
10. Due to public footfall, two toilet blocks are required, and we will build this as per the drawing 1907001-BB04-D attached which replicates the unit next door
11. The Brewery area will be public access by invitation only and supervised to reduce the Health \& Safety implications to the public
12. It is our intention, with the theme of the venue in mind to paint the ceiling arch in the bar area
13. In the long term, we intend to enhance the lighting in the bar area, in with the theme of the bar
14. The equipment in the rear yard does not create noise nuisance
15. The Brewery itself draws electrical power which the existing incoming supplies provides enough Kw for so no gas will be required for a steam boiler
16. The only exhaust for the Brewery is steam which is condensed so there will be no emissions from the unit
17. The natural temperature of the archway (and from previous experience) reduces any odour coming from our process
18. All by products from our process will be recycled weekly
19. It is intended to site a temporary cold store outside in the Car Parking Area for storing finished product;

- The Unit will be constructed from Quadcore Panels of dimensions 4 m Long $\times 2.5 \mathrm{~m}$ Wide x 2.3 m High.
- There will be no windows and one sliding door at the front.

Dear local resident,

We are writing to introduce ourselves. My sister and I have run Blondies, a small bar in Clapton for over 4 and a half years. We have become a welcome addition to Lower Clapton Road and the residents who live there.

We are currently trying to open a new business in one of the archways at 449 Amhurst Road, E8 2AJ, as I'm sure you are aware. We are writing to connect with you all and hope to alleviate some of the stresses that you have mentioned in your emails regarding the recent licensing application. As young hackney residents ourselves, our ultimate goal is to make sure this project has a positive impact on residents and the community as a whole. We are aware and understand the concerns that local residents are having in regards to noise pollution and public nuisance. We can assure you we are and will be taking all possible steps to prevent this from happening. We won't take your concerns lightly.

We wanted to assure you that our intention for the new business is not to be a loud music venue, but to be a brewery with a tap room, designed specifically for beer tasting and showcasing our beer that will be made on site. For that reason, we have decided to remove the live music element of the application. Opening a brewery has been something we have dreamed about for over 10 years and we are really excited that this is a possibility in our borough that we love so much. We hope to bring many jobs to the area and be a positive impact. Our focus is to become a community based space and somewhere that the local community would be included. We are excited and confident that we will be able to offer a valuable cultural addition to the local area, accessible to a diverse audience.

One of the other main concerns have been the issue of the late night hours. We have applied for a later licence in the evening as we wanted to give ourselves flexibility in our new business. With the high looming risk due to rent prices ect, we want to make sure we can make the most of hours where we might have custom in the tap room. Our intent is not for this to cause nuisance to the surrounding neighbours. I would be happy to reduce the hours requested to: Sunday to Wednesday 10:00 to 00:00, Thursday to Saturday 10:00 to 02:00. We have a great track record with the police after having run a license premises in Clapton for over 4 and a half years. After putting all our resources into this project, we are just wanting to give our business the best chance of survival.

We are offering up a set of robust operating plans and procedures as part of the application, to enable us to run a successful business and not impact the amenity of local residents.
There will be CCTV cameras set up in and around the premises so that we are able to monitor behaviour and we will work closely with the police and local authorities to identify and prosecute trouble makers.

A dispersal plan will be in place to ensure responsible behaviour when leaving the venue. Our experienced security team will be instructed to monitor the local streets and alleyways, to make sure patrons arrive and leave in an orderly fashion. We adopt a zero tolerance policy to all anti-social behaviour, and when necessary we will refuse entry, issue lifetime bans or notify the police. We will be employing security ThursdaySaturday each week to make sure crowds are being correctly monitored and disperse in an orderly fashion. Upon leaving the venue at the end of the evening, patrons will be ushered away from the immediate vicinity by our experienced security team and will insist that our patron's behaviour in a respectful manner. With the brewery located inside the building, there will be lots of expensive and valuable equipment, so the security of the building and the surrounding areas is of great importance and something that we will take into great consideration.

In addition to implementing an effective security plan, we will take further steps to make sure we don't cause any disturbance to local residents by sound proofing the venue. We will have a limiter on the sound system so we can maintain control over the music levels and there will be clearly marked signs at the entry and exit points to ensure patrons entering and exiting the premises are keeping their noise to a minimum.

We also wanted to address the issue of our social media campaign and what, in retrospect, can understandably be seen as an under-handed way to solicit support in an unethical manner. We sincerely apologies for the way that it came across and was definitely not the message we were trying to translate. We also just wanted to say that not a single drink was ever actually given by ourselves or any of the staff to anyone who wrote in. The submissions that were sent in to support the application were from general patrons of our venue and people who have had positive experiences becoming apart of our community.

We would like to invite you to Blondies on Lower Clapton road and we can meet in person to chat over any concerns you might have. We'll be hosting an open evening from 6-8pm on Monday the 27 th of January if you would like to come down and speak in person. If you can't make it on the 27th January, or would be happier to meet closer to
your properties so we can better understand the concerns, please email Verity at hello@blondiesbar.co.uk.

We have copied the legally enforceable licence conditions which have been offered as part of the application.

1. All instances of crime and disorder shall be reported to the police. An incident book shall be used to record all instances of public disorder and incidents at the premises.
2. On Friday and Saturday nights, and whenever the premises supervisor sees necessary, a SIA registered door supervisors will be employed from 9pm until 30 past closing time to assist with monitor dispersal.
3. CCTV shall be installed, operated and maintained in agreement with the Police. The CCTV system shall incorporate a recording facility and any recordings shall be retained and stored in a suitable and secure manner for a minimum of 31 days. A system shall be in place to maintain the quality of the recorded image and a complete audit trail maintained. The system will comply with other essential legislation, and all signs as required will be clearly displayed. The system will be maintained and fully operational throughout the hours that the premises are open for any licensable activity. There must also be someone on the premises, who can download the images and present them on request by a police officer or other responsible authority. One camera shall be placed outside the entrance and on entry.
4. All exit routes shall be kept unobstructed, with non-slippery and even surfaces, free of trip hazards and clearly identified. All exits doors shall be maintained easily operable without the use of a key, card, code or similar means.
5. Exit doors shall be regularly checked to ensure that they function satisfactorily and a record of the check shall be kept.
6. Adequate and appropriate supply of first aid equipment and materials must be available on the premises at all times.
7. A limiter will be put on the sound system to maintain control of volume.
8. Doors and windows to the premises will be kept closed, so far as practicable, at all times when noise generating regulated entertainment is taking place.
9. Loudspeakers shall not be located outside the premise building.
10. All windows and external doors shall be kept closed after 22:00 hours, or at any time when regulated entertainment takes place, except for the immediate access \& egress of persons.
11. Refuse such as bottles must be placed into receptacles outside the premises at times that will minimise the disturbance to nearby properties. No glass bottle bins will be emptied after 10pm.
12. The contact telephone number for the premises duty manager shall be displayed inside the premises or immediately outside the premises such that it is clearly visible from outside without the need to enter the premises.
13. The licensee shall devise a dispersal plan for evening events to be made available on request to reasonable authorities.
14. The licensee shall ensure that all staff, including Door Supervisors if required, shall be trained to carry out these tasks and to facilitate effective crowd dispersal at the end of any given evening, and ensure that they have signed a staff record form to verify that they have been trained in these processes.
15. The premises will operate a Challenge 25 Policy, with clear signage stating the policy is in place, all persons who appear under the age of 25 will be age checked, only official documents with a photograph and date of birth or verified pass card are to be accepted.
16. Advertisement and implementation of "Zero Tolerance" policy in respect of drugs.
17.Refuse entry to any known or suspected drug dealers.
17. Regularly carry out toilet checks and maintain a record of such checks or employ a toilet attendant or supervisor.
18. All staff are to be trained on a regular basis, training must be recorded this and a formal training document must be available for inspection by authorised officers or police, which verifies the subject areas and training provided.
19. The Licensee shall ensure that all staff are fully trained and made aware of the legal requirement of businesses to comply with their responsibility as regards the disposal of waste produced from the business premises. The procedure for handling and preparing for disposal of the waste shall be in writing and displayed in a prominent place where it can be referred to at all times by staff.
20. The Licensee shall ensure that any contract for general and recyclable waste disposal shall be appropriate in size to the amount of waste produced by the business. The Licensee shall maintain an adequate supply of waste receptacles provided by his registered waste carrier (refuse sacks or commercial waste bins) in order to ensure all refuse emanating from the business is always presented for collection by his waste carrier and shall not use any plain black or unidentifiable refuse sacks or any other unidentifiable or unmarked waste receptacles.
21. In order to minimise the amount of time any waste remains on the public highway in readiness for collection, the Licensee will ensure the timeframe within which it may expect its waste carrier to collect is adhered to.
22. In streets or areas where the London Borough of Hackney imposes a requirement that refuse may only be left on the public highway at certain times the Licensee must ensure she complies with any orders or notices served by the Council AND if the Licensee's waste carrier cannot or does not comply by collecting the refuse within an hour after the close of any time band imposed by such order or notice, the Licensee must remove the refuse from the public highway and/or keep it within the premises until such time as his/her waste carrier arrives to collect the refuse).
23. The Licensee shall instruct members of staff to make regular checks of the area immediately outside the premises and remove any litter, bottles and glasses emanating from the premises. A final check should be made at close of business.
24. The Licensee shall provide a safe receptacle for cigarette ends to be placed outside for the use of customers, such receptacle being carefully placed so as not to cause an obstruction or trip.
25. The current trade waste agreement/duty of care waste transfer document shall be conspicuously displayed and maintained in the window of the premises where it can be conveniently seen and read by persons standing in Blondies Brewery LTD
This should remain unobstructed at all times and should clearly identify:-

- the name of the registered waste carrier
- the date of commencement of trade waste contract the date of expiry of trade waste contract
- the days and times of collection
- the type of waste including the European Waste Code

## In More Detail:

1. The potential public nuisance that may ensue should this ficense be granted.

As a resident of flat $\square$ Albion Works Studios, I live within close proximity of the applicant property and in this regard I am an 'interested party' to this application.

The reason for my representation opposing the granting of the license is that I consider there to be a high risk of public nuisance through the very likely potential for late night noise pollution emitted from the applicant premises.

It is important to recognise that the residential blocks adjacent to the applicant site (of which Albion Works Studios is one) have tall brick walls, as does the railway arches themselves. This configuration of built elements has the effect of encouraging sound to bounce off the hard masonry surfaces and further exacerbates the risk of sound poliution to the 21 flats of Albion Works Studios and the adjacent houses and housing blocks on Dalston Lane and Sigdon Road.

Furthermore, the school building on the corner of Sigdon Road and Dalston Lane acts as a sound wall and rebounds all noise from the vicinity of the applicants premises back towards the West side of Albion Works.
An acoustic nightmare.
As residents who live adjacent to a train line we are not unused to noise of a sort and are very-familiar with how sound behaves in this particular confinedenvironment. Noise from astrainsline is something that we know and understand and is part of our lives - noise from a new night-time live and recorded music venue is not.

From the point of issuing a license, the license will have full effect for an 'indefinite time'. In this regard, this application has the potential to cause disruption to sleep and ongoing distress to my neighbours and I for a very long period of time. This license application, if granted, will have a seriously adverse impact on the on the wellbeing and ability for the inhabitants of this residential area to enjoy their homes and neighbourhood. We are lucky that Albion Works Studios attracts everybody from single occupants, young families and octogenarians - I cannot see how this healthy mix can be sustained if is to be inundated on a nightly basis by live and recorded music.

Please also consider that Albion Works Studios is accessed by a wide ramp down from Sigdon Road. This ramped area is a semi-concealed space close to the main thoroughfare of Dalston Lane and to this regard it has a tendency to attract anti-social behaviour (urination, defecation and littering). I would anticipate that this space, being quite so close to a new late-night, night-time establishment such as that proposed by the applicant, would see an increase in instances of anti-social behaviour and public nuisance. Similarly, the narrow path called Sigdon Passage (which links Amhurst Road to Sigdon Road and passes along the outside of Albion Works Studios), along with the car parking area accessed off the passage to the rear of Derby Lodge (53-57 Sigdon Road) already have their fair share of anti-social behaviour in the form of occasional gatherings of youths on bicycles and casual drug-dealing. The introduction of a late-night establishment will only exacerbate instances of anti-social behaviour in the vicinity of these residential properties.

Please consider that this is a residential area and the Hackney Central Area Action Plan (AAP) does not identify these railway arches as a location for the managed expansion of night-time economy uses. The railway arches between Amhurst Road and Dalston Lane (where the applicant premises are located) are in a residential context which is very different to the railway arches located on Bohemia Place (which are identified in the AAP) and front onto a bus garage. The precedent and success of Bohemia Place must not be considered pertinent to this applicant's proposed premises.
The Hackney Development Management Local Plan makes reference to the Core Strategy and identifies that night-time activities, if not well managed, can lead to problems such as noise and disturbance, anti-social behaviour, fear of crime and environmental degradation. With particular reference to the risk of noise and disturbance to the residents of Albion Works Studios and the surrounding properties, I ask that Hackney Council please consider whether there is a realistic prospect that the adverse effects of this establishment can truly be effectively managed within this residential context. I have unfortunately come to the conclusion that it cannot.

At a conservative estimate, there are over 500 dwellings within a 100 m radius of 449 Amhurst Road.
At a very conservative estimate there are at least 1,000 residents whom may be affected in the manner outlined above.

So lt would be upsetting for there to be added disturbance after midnight, particularly for our elderly neighbours such as Janet who's window faces the back alley arches where 449 Amhurst backs on to.

Il would be great to have some more information, as I've said I don't want to oppose something without knowing whether it will actually be a problem. If there's a dialogue between us and the appllcant then perinaps it might all work out well for both sides.

I wish to make a representation strongly opposing the application by Blondies Brewery Ltd for a music and late refreshment license at the Railway Arch at 449 Amhurst Road London E8 2AJ.

Ilive at Albion Works Studios, a stone's throw away from the Railway Arch in question, and am very surprised that we were not consulted by the council regarding this application.

Having learned of this application by chance, I wish to oppose the granting of the license on the grounds of the prevention of public nuisance, in particular the potential of noise pollution late at night.

This is very much a residential area - the building in front of the railway arches in Sigdon Passage, our building (21 flats at Albion Works Studios), the houses in Amhurst Road and the houses in Dalston Lane are all very close to the premises and will be directly affected by the noise produced by live and recorded music - the latter till 2.00am. I don't know if any of Hackney Council Noise team officers have been here when there has been a party in one of the houses on Amhurst or Sigdon Road whose gardens back on to each other. This is thankfully not a frequent occurrence but is a disturbance - and sometimes the parties go all night. The sound rises and echoes round and even with the windows closed and ear plugs in, it is difficult to shut out the noise. In fact even a conversation from people loitering in Sigdon Passage late at night can be a disturbance and make it difficult to get to sleep. We do not want more noise and a drinking venue with music so near to us will only mean more movement of people around this area, where even late night conversations are a disturbance.

I very much want to stress how easily noise travels, how the buildings seem to amplify the sound and how this is a residential area. I have lived in this building for 30 years and in that time have seen the density of population around Dalston Lane, Amhurst Road massively increase, making it even more of a residential area. Within approximately 200 metres of our building, a petrol station, a Benefits Office, 2 unused buildings, and 2 plots of land have all been converted into residential properties in the time I have lived here. In view of this , Ithink Hackney has a duty to protect the interests and rights to peaceful enjoyment of their homes of its residents and Council Tax payers.

A second concern I would like to present is that of anti-social behaviour.
I fear that being so close to the proposed new late-night, nighttime venue, we would see an increase in instances of anti-social behaviour and public nuisance - possibly at the entrance to our property -(the drive going down off Sigdon Road, which I presume you are familiar with). We already have to put up with urination in our drive and occasional defecation there during the night and certainly do not want any more. In addition, Sigdon Passage (which links Anhurst Road to Sigdon Road and passes along the outside of Albion Works Studios), and the car parking area accessed off Sigdon Passage to the rear of Derby Lodge (53-57 Sigdon Road) already have some anti-social behaviour, in the form of occasional gatherings of young people, and casual drug-dealing. The introduction of a late- night establishment will only exacerbate instances of anti-social behaviour in the vicinity of these residential properties.

I understand that the Hackney Central Area Action Plan (AAP) does not identify these railway arches as a location for the managed expansion of nighttime economy uses. I am writing to make a representation against the application by Blondies Brewery Ltd for a premises licence at Railway Arch 449a Amhurst Road London E8 2AJ for:

As the owner of Albion Works Studios, 63 Sigdon Road, E8 1AW my flat is extremely close to the applicant property and to this regard I am an 'interested party' to this application.

The reason for my representation opposing the granting of the license is that I consider there to be a high risk of public nuisance through the very likely potential for late night noise pollution emitted from the applicant premises. It is important to recognise that the residential blocks adjacent to the applicant site (of which Albion Works Studios is one) have tall brick walls, as does the railway arches themselves. This configuration of built elements has the effect of encouraging sound to bounce off the hard masonry surfaces and further exacerbates the risk of sound pollution to the 21 no. flats of Albion Works Studios and the adjacent houses and housing blocks on Dalston Lane and Sigdon Road. As residents who live adjacent to a train line we are not unused to noise of a sort and are very familiar with how sound behaves in this particular confined environment. Noise from a train line is something that we know and understand and is part of our lives - noise from a new night-time live and recorded music venue is not.

From the point of issuing a license, the license will have full effect for an 'indefinite time'. To this regard, this application has the potential to cause disruption to sleep and ongoing distress to my neighbours and I for a very long period of time. This license application, if granted, will have a seriously adverse impact on the wellbeing and ability for the inhabitants of this residential area to enjoy their homes and neighbourhood. We are lucky that Albion Works Studios attracts everybody from single occupants, young families and octogenarians - I cannot see how this healthy mix can be sustained if is to be inundated on a nightly basis by live and recorded music.

Please also consider that Albion Works Studios is accessed by a wide ramp down from Sigdon Road. This ramped area is a semi-concealed space close to the main thoroughfare of Dalston Lane and to this regard it has a tendency to attract anti-social behaviour (urination, defecation and littering). I would anticipate that this space, being so close to a new late-night establishment such as that proposed by the applicant, would see an increase in instances of antisocial behaviour and public nuisance. Similarly, the narrow path called Sigdon Passage (which links Amhurst Road to Sigdon Road and passes along the outside of Albion Works Studios), along with the car parking area accessed off the passage to the rear of Derby Lodge (53-57 Sigdon Road) already have their fair share of anti-social behaviour.
