Licensing Sub-Committee Hearings

This guide details the procedure for Licensing Sub-Committee hearings under the Licensing Act 2003. Whilst this will be used in most cases, the procedure will be altered in exceptional circumstances and when for example Personal Licences, Temporary Event Notices and Reviews are considered.

Until further notice, all Licensing Sub-Committee Hearings will be held remotely using the Google Meets platform. Licensing Sub-Committee Hearings are public meetings that are live-streamed. Hearings are available to be viewed by the public online.

A Licensing Sub-Committee will be held if:

- The applicant has applied for a Premises Licence, Provisional Statement, Club Premises Certificate or expressed their intention to vary their existing licence/certificate and has advertised this in a local newspaper and displayed a distinctive blue notice at the premises, following which representations have been made by a Responsible Authority or Other Person/s.
- A Review has been requested by a Responsible Authority or Other Person/s and the Review has been advertised by displaying a distinctive blue notice at the premises and also at the Council's office and website.
- An application is made to transfer a Premises Licence or for interim authority and the Police have issued an objection
- The applicant has made a Personal Licence application and the Police have objected to the Licence being granted.
- A Temporary Event Notice has been given and the Police and/or those in the Council that exercise environmental health functions have issued an objection.

Prior to your item being heard:

- The Licensing team upon receiving representations will form a view as to whether the representations are irrelevant, frivolous, vexatious or for review applications; repetitious.
- The Licensing team would have provided written notice to all parties in advance of the hearing and would have responded to any request relating to personal details being removed from the agenda.

Making decisions on the items being heard:

Hearings will normally be held in public unless the Sub-Committee believe it not to be in the public interest to do so. Although the Chair will try to make the proceedings as informal as possible, these hearings are of a quasi-judicial nature, and the rules of natural justice shall apply.

Only those Responsible Authorities and Other Persons who have made a relevant representation in writing at the consultation stage **can register to speak at a subsequent hearing**. Applicants, Other Persons and Responsible Authorities will all be given a fair opportunity to put their case and the Sub-Committee will take these representations into account when making their decision. The Sub-Committee may still make a decision on any matter even if any party fails to attend the hearing. However, in these circumstances, it will only be that party's written representation that may be taken into account.

For new applications relating to Premises Licences and Club Premises Certificates, Members can grant with additional conditions attached to the licence, exclude any licensable activities, refuse a Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) if appropriate or reject the application.

Members when making decisions on variation applications regarding a Premises Licence or Club Premises Certificate, can modify (add, delete or amend) conditions on the licence or reject the application in whole or part. Members will be considering the request for a variation and the impact that this may have. Therefore, representations should be focused on the impact of the variation, although concerns relating to the existing terms of the licence may be relevant in considering the track record of the applicant. However, Members may consider other issues which relate to the promotion of the licensing objectives, although only if it is reasonable and proportionate to do so.

For Provisional Statements, Members can consider any steps that are necessary having regard to the representations made in order to ensure the licensing objectives are not undermined.

Members when deciding a Review application can modify (add, delete or amend) the conditions of the licence, exclude any licensable activities, remove a DPS if appropriate, suspend the licence/certificate for up to 3 months or revoke the licence/certificate completely.

For transfer of Premises Licences, interim authority requests and Personal Licence applications Members can only refuse or grant the application.

Members when deciding on an objection made against a Temporary Event Notice (TEN) will determine whether or not to issue a Counter Notice, which if issued will prevent the proposed event from proceeding. If a TEN has been given for a



premises that already has a licence/certificate, Members may impose any of those conditions from the existing licence/certificate to the TEN.

Before the meeting starts:

The Sub-Committee Members are requested to report for business no more than half an hour before the meeting starts to deal with any administrative/procedural issues. This will allow Members to consider;

- the appointment for any substitutes if required
- the appointment of the chair
- any procedural issues
- obtain the list of attendees
- late documents delivered prior to the meeting and to ensure all the paperwork is in order

The Sub-Committee will not be considering any of the actual points raised within the Report itself and no Responsible Authority or Other Person/s shall be present when the Sub-Committee deal with the above issues.

Attending the hearing that concerns you:

All Applicants, Other Persons and Responsible Authorities involved will be informed in writing of the date and time that their application will be considered by the Licensing Sub-Committee. Please contact the Licensing Service on 020 8356 4970 or email licensing@hackney.gov.uk to confirm whether you wish to attend and/or register to speak at the Sub-Committee hearing or if you wish for someone else to speak on your behalf. If you are unable to attend, the application may be heard in your absence.

All parties should arrive promptly at the outset of the scheduled meeting regardless of when the item is listed to be heard on the agenda.

Please contact the Licensing Service for advice within 4 working days from the date on the notice letter if any of the following apply;

- you have special requirements to help make your representation, because of a disability or you need a translator for example
- you wish to supply additional [documentary] information such as photographs and videos/DVDs

Please note that if you wish to provide additional relevant information, this should be given at least **5 working days** before the hearing. Any additional information provided once the hearing has started will only be accepted if all parties agree. Please note that the use of videos/DVDs is at the Sub-Committee's discretion – requests to show these should be made in advance to the Committee Officer.

Timings



In most cases the application will last no longer than 1 hour, and the times to be allocated to each section are shown on the relevant hearing procedure. If you think that your evidence is likely to exceed this time period, please let the Licensing Service know within 4 working days of the date on the notice letter and the Sub-Committee will be advised. If your request is agreed, all parties will also be granted the same extension of time.

Rights of Press and Public to Report on Meetings

Where a meeting of the Council and its committees are open to the public, the press and public are welcome to report on meetings of the Council and its committees, through any audio, visual or written methods and may use digital and social media providing they do not disturb the conduct of the meeting and providing that the person reporting or providing the commentary is present at the meeting.

Those wishing to film, photograph or audio record a meeting are asked to notify the Council's Monitoring Officer by noon on the day of the meeting, if possible, or any time prior to the start of the meeting or notify the Chair at the start of the meeting.

The Monitoring Officer, or the Chair of the meeting, may designate a set area from which all recording must take place at a meeting.

The Council will endeavour to provide reasonable space and seating to view, hear and record the meeting. If those intending to record a meeting require any other reasonable facilities, notice should be given to the Monitoring Officer in advance of the meeting and will only be provided if practicable to do so.

The Chair shall have discretion to regulate the behaviour of all those present recording a meeting in the interests of the efficient conduct of the meeting. Anyone acting in a disruptive manner may be required by the Chair to cease recording or may be excluded from the meeting. Disruptive behaviour may include: moving from any designated recording area; causing excessive noise; intrusive lighting; interrupting the meeting; or filming members of the public who have asked not to be filmed.

All those visually recording a meeting are requested to only focus on recording councillors, officers and the public who are directly involved in the conduct of the meeting. The Chair of the meeting will ask any members of the public present if they have objections to being visually recorded. Those visually recording a meeting are asked to respect the wishes of those who do not wish to be filmed or photographed. Failure by someone recording a meeting to respect the wishes of those who do not wish to be filmed and photographed may result in the Chair instructing them to cease recording or in their exclusion from the meeting.

If a meeting passes a motion to exclude the press and public then in order to consider confidential or exempt information, all recording must cease and all recording equipment must be removed from the meeting room. The press and public are not permitted to use any means which might enable them to see or hear the proceedings whilst they are excluded from a meeting and confidential or exempt information is under consideration.

Providing oral commentary during a meeting is not permitted.

Lobbying of Councillors

If a person or an organisation wants to make a representation to the Licensing Sub-Committee, they must **NOT** contact Sub-Committee Members directly. Licensing



Sub-Committee Members have to retain an open mind on any application and determine it on its merits. Members cannot be in anyway biased towards a party. Therefore, if a Member of the Sub-Committee has had any prior involvement they must ensure that they come to the hearing with an open mind.

Local ward councillors may be able to speak on behalf of objectors if requested to do so, provided that if they have a disclosable pecuniary interest (further information provided below) they leave the meeting room when the application is being considered unless they have been granted dispensation.

Reports

Agendas and Reports for Licensing Sub-Committees are published on the Council's website (www.hackney.gov.uk) 5 working days before the hearing takes place. Copies are also available by contacting Governance Services on 0208 356 3578 or email governance@hackney.gov.uk. Copies of applications together with the detail of any objections will be included in the report.

Appeals

Applicants or any party to the hearing can appeal against the decision made by the Sub-Committee. The appeal to the Thames Magistrates Court must be made within 21 days of the decision being sent formally in writing. However, TEN's have the added restriction that no appeals can be made later than 5 working days before the event is scheduled to take place.

Withdrawal of an Item or Cancellation of a Hearing

An item may be withdrawn from the agenda of a Licensing Sub-Committee meeting at short notice due to the withdrawal or resolution of the representations or objections to an application or notice. A hearing by the Licensing Sub-Committee may therefore be cancelled at short notice if there are no substantive items remaining on the agenda.

As much advance notice as is practicable of the withdrawal of an item on the agenda or cancellation of a meeting of the Licensing Sub-Committee will be provided on the Council's website but please note that this might be as little as a few hours before the hearing if the applicant chooses to leave it that late to satisfactorily address any representation or objection giving rise to the need for a hearing.

Advice to Members on Declaring Interests

If you require advice on declarations of interests, this can be obtained from:

- The Monitoring Officer;
- The Deputy Monitoring Officer; or
- The legal adviser to the meeting.

It is recommended that any advice be sought in advance of, rather than at, the meeting.

Disclosable Pecuniary Interests (DPIs)

You will have a Disclosable Pecuniary Interest (*DPI) if it:

- Relates to your employment, sponsorship, contracts as well as wider financial interests and assets including land, property, licenses and corporate tenancies.
- Relates to an interest which you have registered in that part of the Register of Interests form relating to DPIs as being an interest of you, your spouse or civil partner, or anyone living with you as if they were your spouse or civil partner.
- Relates to an interest which should be registered in that part of the Register of Interests form relating to DPIs, but you have not yet done so.

If you are present at <u>any</u> meeting of the Council and you have a DPI relating to any business that will be considered at the meeting, you **must**:

- Not seek to improperly influence decision-making on that matter;
- Make a verbal declaration of the existence and nature of the DPI at or before the consideration of the item of business or as soon as the interest becomes apparent; and
- Leave the room whilst the matter is under consideration

You **must not:**

- Participate in any discussion of the business at the meeting, or if you become aware of your Disclosable Pecuniary Interest during the meeting, participate further in any discussion of the business; or
- Participate in any vote or further vote taken on the matter at the meeting.

If you have obtained a dispensation from the Monitoring Officer or Standards Committee prior to the matter being considered, then you should make a verbal declaration of the existence and nature of the DPI and that you have obtained a dispensation. The dispensation granted will explain the extent to which you are able to participate.



Other Registrable Interests

You will have an 'Other Registrable Interest' (ORI) in a matter if it

- Relates to appointments made by the authority to any outside bodies, membership of: charities, trade unions,, lobbying or campaign groups, voluntary organisations in the borough or governorships at any educational institution within the borough.
- Relates to an interest which you have registered in that part of the Register of Interests form relating to ORIs as being an interest of you, your spouse or civil partner, or anyone living with you as if they were your spouse or civil partner; or
- Relates to an interest which should be registered in that part of the Register of Interests form relating to ORIs, but you have not yet done so.

Where a matter arises at <u>any</u> meeting of the Council which affects a body or organisation you have named in that part of the Register of Interests Form relating to ORIs, **you must** make a verbal declaration of the existence and nature of the DPI at or before the consideration of the item of business or as soon as the interest becomes apparent. **You may** speak on the matter only if members of the public are also allowed to speak at the meeting but otherwise must not take part in any discussion or vote on the matter and must not remain in the room unless you have been granted a dispensation.

Disclosure of Other Interests

Where a matter arises at any meeting of the Council which **directly relates** to your financial interest or well-being or a financial interest or well-being of a relative or close associate, you **must** disclose the interest. **You may** speak on the matter only if members of the public are also allowed to speak at the meeting. Otherwise you must not take part in any discussion or vote on the matter and must not remain in the room unless you have been granted a dispensation.

Where a matter arises at <u>any</u> meeting of the Council which **affects** your financial interest or well-being, or a financial interest of well-being of a relative or close associate to a greater extent than it affects the financial interest or wellbeing of the majority of inhabitants of the ward affected by the decision <u>and</u> a reasonable member of the public knowing all the facts would believe that it would affect your view of the wider public interest, you **must** declare the interest. You **may** only speak on the matter if members of the public are able to speak. Otherwise you must not take part in any discussion or voting on the matter and must not remain in the room unless you have been granted a dispensation.

In all cases, where the Monitoring Officer has agreed that the interest in question is a **sensitive interest**, you do not have to disclose the nature of the interest itself.

The Licensee shall ensure that all staff will undertake training in their responsibilities in relation to the sale of alcohol, particularly with regard to drunkenness and underage persons. Records will be kept of training and refresher training.

Be capable of visually confirming the nature of the crime committed. 6. Provide a linked record of the date, time and place of any image. 7. Provide good quality images -colour during opening times. 8. Operate under existing light levels within and outside the premises. 9. Have the recording device located in a secure area or locked cabinet. 10. Have a monitor to review images and recorded picture quality. 11. Be regularly maintained to ensure continuous quality of image capture retention. 12. Have signage displayed in the customer area to advise that CCTV is in operation. 13. Digital images must be kept for 31 days. 14. Police will have access to images at any reasonable time. 15. The equipment must have a suitable export method, e.g. CD/DVD writer so that the police can make an evidential copy of the data they require. This data should be in the native file format, to ensure that no image quality is lost when making the copy, if this format is non-standard (i.e. manufacturer proprietary) then the manufacturer should supply the replay software to ensure that the video on the CD can be replayed by the police on a standard computer. Copies must be made available to Police on request.

c) Public safety

Appropriate fire safety procedures are in place including fire extinguishers, internally illuminated fire exit signs, numerous smoke detectors and emergency lighting (see enclosed plan for details of locations). All appliances are inspected annually. All emergency exits shall be kept free from obstruction at all times.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

All customers will be asked to leave quietly. Clear and legible notices will be prominently displayed to remind customers to leave quietly and have regard to our neighbours.

e) The protection of children from harm

The licensee and staff will ask persons who appear to be under the age of 25 for photographic ID such as proof of age cards, the Connexions Card and Citizen Card, photographic driving licence or passport, an official identity card issued by HM Forces or by an EU country, bearing the photograph and date of birth of bearer. All staff will be trained for UNDERAGE SALES PREVENTION regularly. A register of refused sales shall be kept and maintained on the premises.



- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 3. 3.1.The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sales or supply of alcohol. 3.2 The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licences must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy. 3.3.The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either:-
 - (a) a holographic mark or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.

Minimum Drinks Pricing

- 4. 4.1 A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
 - 4.2 For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 4.1 above
 - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
 - (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula P = D+(DxV)

Where -

- (i)P is the permitted price,
- (ii)D is the rate of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii)V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;

- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -
- (i) the holder of the premises licence,
- (ii)the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
- (iii)the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence:
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 4.3 Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 4.2(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 4.4 (1) Sub-paragraph 4.4(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 4.2(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

- 5. No deliveries will be received or rubbish removed from the premises between 22.00 and 07.00.
- 6. The premises shall maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of a Metropolitan Police Crime Prevention Officer. All public areas, entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer.
- 7. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises are open to the public. This staff member shall be able to show Police or an

- authorised officer of Hackney Borough Council recent data or footage with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.
- 8. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available immediately to an authorised officer of the Hackney Borough Council or the Police, which will record the following:
 - a. all alcohol related crimes reported to the premises
 - b. any complaints received
 - c. any incidents of disorder
 - d. any faults in the CCTV system
 - e. any refusal of the sale of alcohol
 - f. any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.
- 9. All instances of crime or disorder to be reported by the designated premises supervisor or responsible member of staff to an agreed police contact point, as agreed with the Police.
- 10. Where the sale or supply of alcohol is taking place employees of the premises must request sight of evidence of the age of any person appearing to be under 25 years of age (Challenge 25). Such evidence may include a driving licence or passport.
- 11. The license holder shall maintain a dedicated telephone number of the DPS for use by any responsible authority or any person who may wish to make a complaint. This contact umber shall be provided to the licensing authority, police and to any local residents upon request.
- 12. The premises shall adhere to Hackney Police Weapons and Drugs Policies and any updates thereof.
- 13. The front of the premises shall be kept clean and swept at the close of business each day.



- 14. There be one personal licence holder on the premises at all times when licensable activities are being carried out.
- 15. No beers, ciders or lagers over six per cent Alcohol By Volume (ABV) shall be sold or supplied at the premises.

 - a. That Closed Circuit Television (CCTV) and challenge 25 are in operation
 - b. Advising customers of the provisions of the licensing act regarding underage and proxy sales
 - c. Of the permitted hours of licensable activities and the opening times of the premises
 - d. Not to drink in the street
 - e. To respect residents, leave quietly, not to loiter outside the premises or in the vicinity and to dispose of litter legally.

- 17. All staff who work front of house will be trained for their role on induction and be given refresher training every six months. Written training records will be kept for each staff member and be produced to police and authorised council officers on request. Training will include identifying persons under 25, making a challenge, acceptable proof of age and checking it, making and recording a refusal, avoiding conflict and responsible alcohol retailing.
- 18. The premises licence holder to employ an external agency to conduct training for all new staff and refresher training annually with training records to be retained by the premises licence holder on the premises and produced to the Police or other authorised officer upon request.

I have liaised with my client following receipt of the objections to his premises licence variation application.
In addition to those conditions already on his premises licence, we would like to propose the following additional conditions to allay any concerns that Responsible Authorities have in relation to a) the prevention of crime and disorder, and b) the prevention of public nuisance.
The additional conditions proposed are:
A2. No single cans or bottles of beer, lager or cider shall be sold or supplied at the premises after midnight.
A3. No miniature bottles of sprits of 50ml or less shall be sold or supplied at the premises after midnight.
A7. Any alcohol sold or supplied (for consumption off the premises) must be in a sealed container.
G2. The licensee shall display the telephone number/email address of the Designated premises Supervisor for use by any Responsible Authority or any person who may wish to make a complaint during the operation of the licence in a prominent external location at the premises that is easily accessible to the public.

6.1. The Licensing Authority is required to have regard to any guidance issued by the Secretary of State under the Licensing Act 2003.

7. Policy Considerations

- 7.1. Licensing Sub-Committee is required to have regard to the London Borough of Hackney's Statement of Licensing Policy ("the Policy) adopted by the Licensing Authority.
- 7.2. The Policy applies to applications where relevant representations have been made. With regard to this application, policies, LP1 (General Principles), LP2 (Licensing Objectives), LP3 (Core Hours) and LP10 (Special Policy Areas-Dalston and Shoreditch) are relevant.

8. Officer Observations

- 8.1. If the Sub-Committee is minded to approve the application, the following conditions should be applied the licence:
 - 1. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of a Metropolitan Police Crime Prevention Officer. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the preceding 31-day period.
 - 2. There shall be a staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system on the premises at all times when the premises are open to the public. This staff member must be able to show Police or authorised council officer recent data or footage when requested.
 - 3. An incident log shall be kept at the premises and made available on request to an authorised officer of the council or the police, which will record the following.
 - a. All crimes reported
 - b. All ejections of patrons
 - c. Any complaints received
 - d. Any incidents of disorder

- e. Seizure of drugs or offensive weapons
- f. Any faults in the CCTV system or searching equipment or scanning equipment
- g. Any refusal of the sale of alcohol
- h. Any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service
- 4. All doors and windows shall remained closed save for access and egress after 21.00.
- 5. Clear and prominent notices shall be displayed and maintained at all exits in a place where they can be seen and easily read by customers requiring customers to leave the premises and the area quietly.
- 6. No fumes, steam or odours shall be emitted from the licensed premises so as to cause a nuisance to any persons living or carrying on business in the area where the premises are situated.
- 7. There shall be no idling of vehicles, being delivery vehicles outside the premises whilst the premises is in operation.
- 8. Waste collections shall be restricted to timings to be determined by the local authority.
- 9. The Licensee shall ensure that all relevant staff are fully trained and made aware of the legal requirement of businesses to comply with their responsibility as regards the disposal of waste produced from the business premises. The procedure for handling and preparing for disposal of the waste shall be in writing and displayed in a prominent place where it can be referred to at all times by staff.
- 10. The Licensee shall ensure that any contract for general and recyclable waste disposal shall be appropriate in size to the amount of waste produced by the business. The Licensee shall maintain an adequate supply of waste receptacles provided by his registered waste carrier (refuse sacks or commercial waste bins) in order to ensure all refuse emanating from the business is always presented for collection by his waste carrier and shall not use any plain black or unidentifiable refuse sacks or any other unidentifiable or unmarked waste receptacles.
- 11. The Licensee's premises are situated in an area within which refuse may only be left on the public highway at certain times (time bands). If the Licensee's waste carrier cannot or does not comply by collecting the refuse within an hour after the close of any time band imposed by the waste authority, the Licensee must remove the refuse from the public highway and/or keep it within the premises until such time as his/her waste carrier arrives to collect the refuse.
- 12. The Licensee shall instruct members of staff to make regular checks of the area immediately outside the premises and remove any litter, bottles and glasses emanating from the premises. A final check should be made at close

of business.

- 13. The Licensee shall provide a safe receptacle for cigarette ends to be placed outside for the use of customers, such receptacle being carefully placed so as not to cause an obstruction or trip.
- 14. The current trade waste agreement/duty of care waste transfer document shall be conspicuously displayed and maintained in the window of the premises where it can be conveniently seen and read by persons standing in Rack & Bite. This should remain unobstructed at all times and should clearly identify:-
 - the name of the registered waste carrier
 - the date of commencement of trade waste contract
 - the date of expiry of trade waste contract
 - the days and times of collection
 - the type of waste including the European Waste Code

9. Reasons for Officer Observations

9.1. Conditions 1 to 8 are derived from the applicant's operating schedule and conditions 9 to 14 have been agreed with Environmental Enforcement.

10. **Legal Comments**

- 10.1. The Council has a duty as a Licensing Authority under the Licensing Act 2003 to carry out its functions with a view to promoting the following 4 licensing objectives;
 - The Prevention of Crime and Disorder
 - Public Safety
 - Prevention of Public Nuisance
 - The Protection of Children from Harm
- 10.2. It should be noted that each of the licensing objectives have equal importance and are the only grounds upon which a relevant representation can be made and for which an application can be refused or terms and conditions attached to a licence.



Police have seen a vast increase in serious violence and disorder in Shoreditch over the past several months – year, as the footfall has increased to unprecedented levels since the easing of Coronavirus Restrictions. Behaviours and attitudes to drinking seem to have changed and we have seen a big increase in levels of extreme drunkenness and illness due to intoxication on the streets of Shoreditch. There are crowds of people on the streets after midnight in Shoreditch and police regularly receive complaints from residents in relation to ASB, violence, litter and noise. 

To Whom it may concern,

We are writing to oppose the application by Rack and Bite, 36 Great Eastern Street, London EC2A 3EH for permission to sell late night refreshments. This application seeks to extend the time for late night refreshment from 23:00 to 02:00am Mon and Tue, 23:00 to 04:00am Wed to Sat and from 23:00 to 00:00 Sun.

This extension would lead to further overcrowding of the Shoreditch area late at night, when noise pollution, anti-social behaviour, drinking in the streets, nitrous oxide consumption, and other behaviours (including criminal offences such as assaults and sexual offences) are already disrupting residents' ability to sleep and creating a threatening atmosphere. Allowing any additional sales will only add to these issues, which are currently slipping out of control again, after a few months of improvement between late 2021 and June 2022. In particular sales for consumption off-premises directly encourage groups to congregate and loiter in residential streets drinking through the night. We are objecting to all aspects of this proposal, however, it ought to be especially obvious that allowing sales until 02.00am on quite week nights and 04.00am four nights a week is particularly unreasonable and, in our opinion, impossible to justify for any venue.

We oppose the application on the following specific grounds:

The premises are located in the Shoreditch Special Policy Area. We are not aware of any information provided by the applicant as to how this application avoids any negative impact on this area. We understand that it is the applicant's responsibility to demonstrate why the license should be granted. Arguments based on concerns about recent increases in prices, pressures on customers due to inflation, etc. apply to all hospitality business of this kind and do not therefore constitute an acceptable reason to extend any individual licence.

The prevention of crime, disorder, anti-social behaviour and noise pollution ought to be the top priority in Shoreditch, which is heavily residential and where a proper balance needs to be struck between the Council's duty to its residents and the wishes of late night economy venues. Additional late night hours will by definition contribute to the cumulative impact on crime, disorder, anti-social behaviour and noise pollution, and risks undermining the SPA/saturation zones in the area. Longer sales hours will deepen the problems already being experienced.

Public safety is also at risk with this new application. The neighbourhood already has significant issues with violence, vomiting, urination, defecation and drug use late into the night, presenting real safety, security and nuisance issues. This is not limited to the immediate vicinity of any venue, but spreads to the streets such as ours where groups gather throughout the night.

This extension of hours will only add to the crowding issue. Consumption of refreshments will create significant noise from the venue, the noise created by groups coming and going, and drunk and disorderly crowds gathering underneath bedroom windows.

The protection of residents, including children, from harm is an important consideration. Residents cannot be expected to put up with the disruption caused by extended hours, as the existing amount of venues, alcohol and refreshments consumed are already stretching the resources of the police and Hackney enforcement to manage and control the late night economy to breaking point. We have just submitted a report to the police about the situation over the last two weekends in our street, which reflects the deterioration already occurring this summer (CAD reference and difficult situation worse.

I write to oppose the application by Rack and Bite, 36 Great Eastern Street, London EC2A 3EHfor late night refreshment. This application will see people lingering over greasy takeout after spilling out of the neighbouring venues, until 4:00 on many nights. It is completely inappropriate.

I oppose the application on the following specific grounds:

- The premises is located in the Shoreditch Special Policy Area, and should be rejected. No evidence has been submitted with the application indicating exceptional circumstances. It is the applicant's responsibility to demonstrate why the license should be granted, and they have not done so.
- The prevention of crime and disorder is paramount in Shoreditch, which has amongst the highest crime rates in London, heavily related to the late-night economy. Additional late night venues, particular on this corner, will by definition contribute to the cumulative impact on crime, and risks undermining the SPA/saturation zones in the area.
- Public safety is at risk with this new application. The neighbourhood already has significant issues with violence, vomiting, urination, defecation and drug use late into the night, presenting real safety, security and nuisance issues.
- This additional late night license contributes to the public nuisance via overwhelming crowdsA late night licence will enable significant noise from the venue, and the nuisance of people coming and going, with drunk and disorderly crowds gathering underneath bedroom windows.
- The protection of children from harm is vital. Evenings regularly attract violent people, illicit acts and vile behaviour, as confirmed by the police. The addition of another late-night establishment will contribute to the impact on the numerous children in the neighbourhood.

We live just behind Great Eastern Street, at the corner of Charlotte Road and Rivington Street, the path used by night revellers on their way to Hoxton Square and other late night venues in Shoreditch.

Our nights regularly involve noisy brawls, fights, people urinating and vomiting on our doorstep, or using our porch as a dustbin for their greasy take-away leftovers ...

The latest incident being a fight, half an hour ago just under our bedroom window.. waking us up in the middle of the night.

We understand that the night economy brings business, which on paper is a good thing (jobs, tax receipts, activity) but it should not be at the detriment of residents who also have jobs, contribute to the local economy, its community, and have a right to a decent quality of life. This situation is very upsetting indeed.

We experience first-hand the direct impact of late opening of bars, fast food restaurants, delis, etc in the area. These attract AND keep people out on the streets until the early hours of the morning on a quasi-daily-basis, causing severe nuisances and countless degradations.

With the above in mind, we vigorously object to the application by *Rack and Bite*, 36 Great Eastern Street, London EC2A 3EH for late night refreshments licence. Should this licence be granted, in our view, it would contribute to the cumulative impact of late night anti-social activity in our area, which has been a source of tremendous stress to us (residents) for many years and is pushing the fantastic local police team close to break point.

We strongly oppose the application for the following reasons:

- Rack & Bite is located in the Shoreditch Special Policy Area.
- The cumulative impact on anti-social behaviour (SPA/saturation zone) in the area.
- Late night bar activity has a direct impact on Hackney residents safety (crime, thefts, fights, break-ins, drunkenness, vomiting, fouling and drug use).
- Public safety.
