

	A. Adequacy of no entry signage on west entrance onto Windus Road. Residents reported common issue of drivers entering Windus Road from Stamford Hill, which has caused accidents and close shaves.	
	B. The section of Cazenove Road between Stamford Hill and Simon Marks School. Despite this area having bus stops, local shops and being a throughway for the school and the train station, residents are concerned that there are no or few dropped kerbs, and no zebra crossings.	



5.	Elaine to keep Ward Forum informed of any testing of current traffic calming measures in the Ward.	Elaine – ongoing through Tom.		
6.	Elaine is meeting Sgt Gordon, Hackney Safer Transport Police on 3rd July. As part of meeting Elaine to raise residents concerns around horn usage by cars by minibuses in the Cazenove Ward. To report residents view that enforcement activity previously carried out against horn usage was successful, albeit in the short term. Elaine to ask Sgt Gordon around the viability of more enforcement action, and to get advice on how residents can report this.	Elaine to feedback to Ward Forum on 8 October.

9.	Nursery School Provision. A resident was encountering problems in securing whole day nursery places as opposed to multiple half days at the Fernbank Children's Centre. Other residents said that Children Centres in Hackney were not always as user friendly as other boroughs (Camden) in offering full days care within the Nursery Education Funding scheme.	Cllr Akhoon to raise with Fernbank and to feedback directly to resident or in Ward Forum of 8 October.		
10	Trees			
	A. A tree on the corner of Oldhill Street and Clapton Common was reported as causing a hazard.	No further action now required. Rupert Bentley Walls has confirmed that the tree is TFL owned, and that it is to be felled on 15 July 2013.		
	B. A resident enquired about any further planting or renewal programmes on trees on Alkham Road.	I have been advised that there are no plans at this point for		

further planting, or renewals further to some treatments carried out earlier this year. Rupert Bentley Walls has made himself available to talk to resident directly or to Cllr Jacobson – Rupert's number is 020 8356 8437 and his email Rupert.Bentleywalls@hackney. gov.uk C. Another resident reported a leaning tree outside 33 Cllr Jacobson to feedback to Filey Avenue. Cllr Jacobson attended the site resident. immediately after the Ward Forum and has now raised the issue with the Council.
