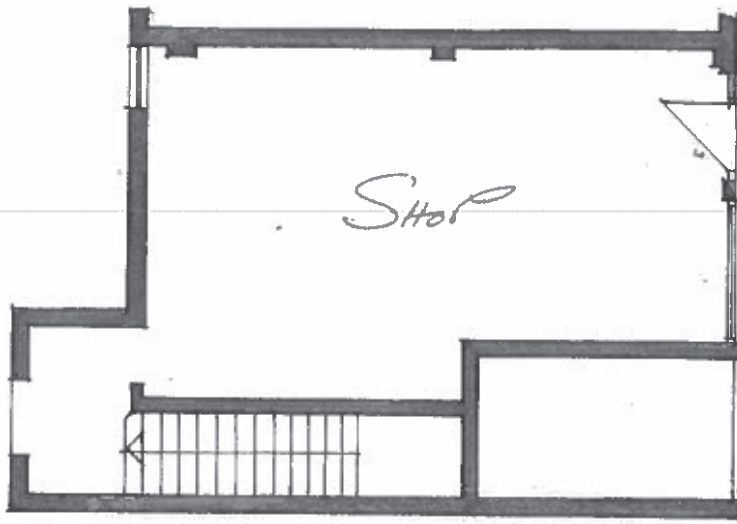

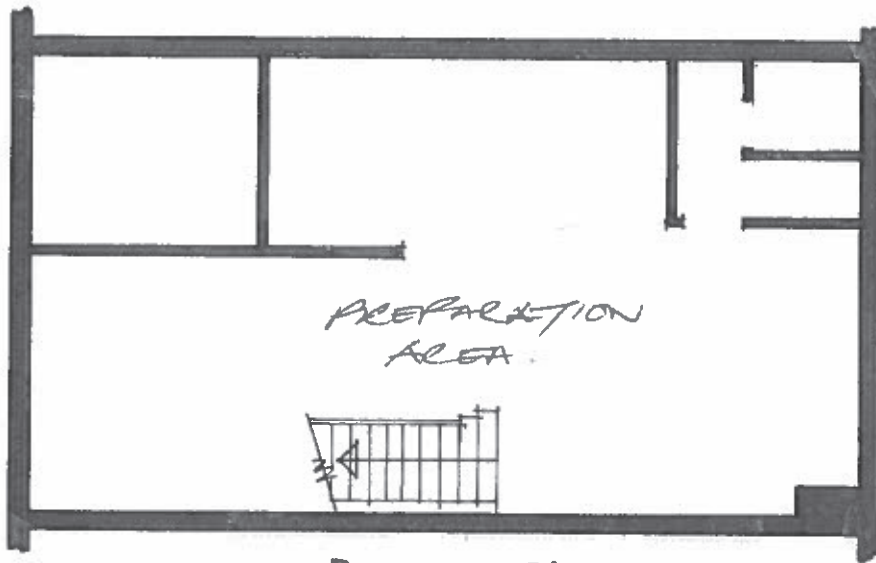

ENVIRONMENTAL LICENCE CONDITIONS IN RESPECT OF

Red Planet Pizza, 26 Kingsland Road, E2 8DA

The business is located in Kingsland Road which is an area where waste is not allowed to be stored on the public highway for any length of time. Businesses have a legal requirement to ensure that they have adequate arrangements in place for the storage and disposal of waste generated by the business. Also there should be measures put in place to prevent littering to the detriment of the area.

The above representations are supported by the following evidence and information.

Information and Evidence – we have received complaints in the past regarding littering and build-up of waste in the area, There is a pending prosecution against the previous owners of this business for the illegal deposit of waste on the public highway, and we do not believe that the current waste contract in place for the business is sufficient for the amount of waste they are producing. There have been instances in the past where Enforcement Officers have found evidence of the illegal disposal of waste from this business.

Experience has also shown that there is the probability that there will be cigarette litter outside these premises due to the smoking ban.

Police make the following representations in relation to the application to for a new Premises Licence at RED PLANET PIZZA, 26 KINGSLAND ROAD, LONDON, E2 for the following reason(s):

Red Planet Pizza is located within the Shoreditch Special Policy Area. This area is already saturated with licensed premises. LBH's Statement of licensing policy states that 'where a relevant representation is made to any application within the area of Shoreditch SPA, the application will be refused unless there are exceptional circumstances. This policy is to be strictly applied. Police would like to ask the applicant what the 'exceptional circumstances' are in this case?

Shoreditch has an extremely high footfall, especially at weekend, where tens of thousands of people come to eat and drink. Police deal with countless incidents of drunkenness, ASB (urination, vomiting, fighting), crime and disorder every night and another venue on this incredibly busy street will undoubtedly add to this.

Police are familiar with this particular venue as police reviewed the licence when the licence holders consistently breached their conditions, were the subject of various visits from Immigration Officers and stayed open beyond their specified opening hours. This process resulted in the premises licence being revoked.

This premises is located in one of the busiest spots in Shoreditch as there is a long bank of licensed bars surrounding it. During the early hours of the morning I have observed on numerous occasions as members of the public have had to step into the road to pass the crowds loitering on the pavements. There is a very busy bus lane directly outside, which has seen many near misses. People naturally loiter outside and around a hot food establishment during the early hours of the morning waiting for friends or deciding what to do/go instead of moving on and finding transport home or another destination.

Is the applicant aware that their premises is within a Special Policy Area? This application seeks a licence to be open very late. Police cannot support this application.

Representations (which include comments and/or objections) in relation to:

The premises is located in the Shoreditch Special Policy Area (SPA) therefore Policy LP13 applies. This area has been identified as suffering from negative cumulative impact as a result of the high concentration of licensed premises in the area. And as part of a review of the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy a study was carried out by the Council's Corporate Policy Team to look at the impact of the night time economy in the locality. This study was used to formulate the report which was presented to the Licensing Committee on 25th March 2015. The study made a number of findings, however the following are particularly notable:

- 342 premises were granted across Hackney between 1st January 2011 and 31st December 2014.
- 33% of all current licences granted between 1st January 2011 and 31st December 2014 were in the Special Policy Area and the wider Shoreditch area.
- Shoreditch contained 28% of the alcohol licences in Hackney.
- Where areas containing the top 50% of crimes [robbery, violence and thefts] have been singled out, the pattern of crime also appears to follow the trajectory of commercial premises locations.
- Figures from the London Ambulance Service show that between 2011 and 2014, 15% of alcohol related ambulance call outs were in the Hoxton East and Shoreditch ward, a trend which is increasing.

LP13 of the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy states the following:

LP13 Special Policy Area – Shoreditch

It is the Council's policy that where a relevant representation is made to any application within the area of the Shoreditch SPA, the application will be refused unless there are exceptional circumstances. This policy is to be strictly applied. The Council expects that any exceptional circumstances offered by the applicant should be genuinely exceptional and so would not

include reference to:

- **The quality and track record of the management**
- **The good character of the applicant**
- **The extent of any variation sought.**

It is noted that the proposed hours are well in excess of the hours authorised by a premises licence that was revoked by the Licensing Sub-Committee on 7 July 2016 following a review application by the Police. See:

Dear Licensing Service:

I reside ██████████ Kingsland Road, London E2 ██████████.

As such I am an interested party in relation to the above late license application.

I strongly object to the license application made by Sonia Alam in relation to these premises.

I object on the following grounds:

1. Prevention of Crime and Disorder; and/or

The premises is already open from 11am until 12am (midnight) every day of the week. There is a bus stop directly outside the premises where people already congregate in large groups. Several attempts have been made to break into my property. The outer window glass of the front door has been smashed and the camera door bell damaged beyond repair. Fortunately a metal shield behind the front door prevented the perpetrators gaining access. The extension of hours requested will exacerbate this existing problem and further create a magnet for people leaving late night drinking establishments who are often intoxicated. If the application is granted we respectfully submit that this will only increase the chances of criminal damage to my property and greater disorder outside the property. I therefore respectfully ask that this licensing application for a late license be denied.

2. Public Safety; and/or

The premises is already open from 11am until 12am (midnight) every day of the week. Fights frequently occur outside already and the Police have had to be called to intervene on several occasions when I have asked the parties involved to be respectful of noise levels. The extension of hours requested will only exacerbate this existing problem and will create a magnet for persons leaving late night drinking establishments who are often intoxicated. I believe this makes breaches of public safety more likely to occur as intoxicated clients are more likely to be involved in altercations with the general public or each other. I would respectfully ask that this licensing application for a late license be denied.

I believe the premises are sublet as a franchise and the workers operating the premises change frequently. The record will show that armed S019 Police have raided Red Planet in the past in relation to the operation of the premises. I would respectfully submit given this history this is also concerning from a Public safety standpoint and an additional reason to refuse this application.

3. Prevention of Public Nuisance

- (a) The premises is already open from 11am until 12am (midnight) every day of the week. The extension of hours requested will create a magnet for persons leaving late night drinking establishments who are often intoxicated. I believe it will be impossible for the applicant to ensure peace and quiet for residents of the building and neighbouring buildings. By its very nature the operations of the business will create a noise nuisance late at night which far outweighs any service to the public offered by an extended license. As stated above, the clients of this business during the late licensing hours requested will more likely than not be intoxicated. This I believe also makes it more likely that they will cause excess noise, litter, confrontation, altercations and other nuisance which will adversely affect the residents of the building and its neighbours.
- (b) The applicant has recently changed the nature of the business from a Pizza parlor to a purveyor of all types of deep fried and fried foods. This has already resulted in nuisance to the building through the installation of an addition to the extraction venting which was carried out with no notice to the other tenants of the building. Presently, it is almost impossible to sleep until the venting system is shut down at midnight. An extension of hours would make this problem intolerable. In summer opening the front windows is out of the question due to noise from the applicant's clientele loitering outside. Opening the rear windows is similarly a problem due to noise and vibration from the applicant's venting system.
- (c) I would respectfully ask that this licensing application for a late license be denied.

For all of the reasons stated above I would respectfully ask that this licensing application for a late license be denied.

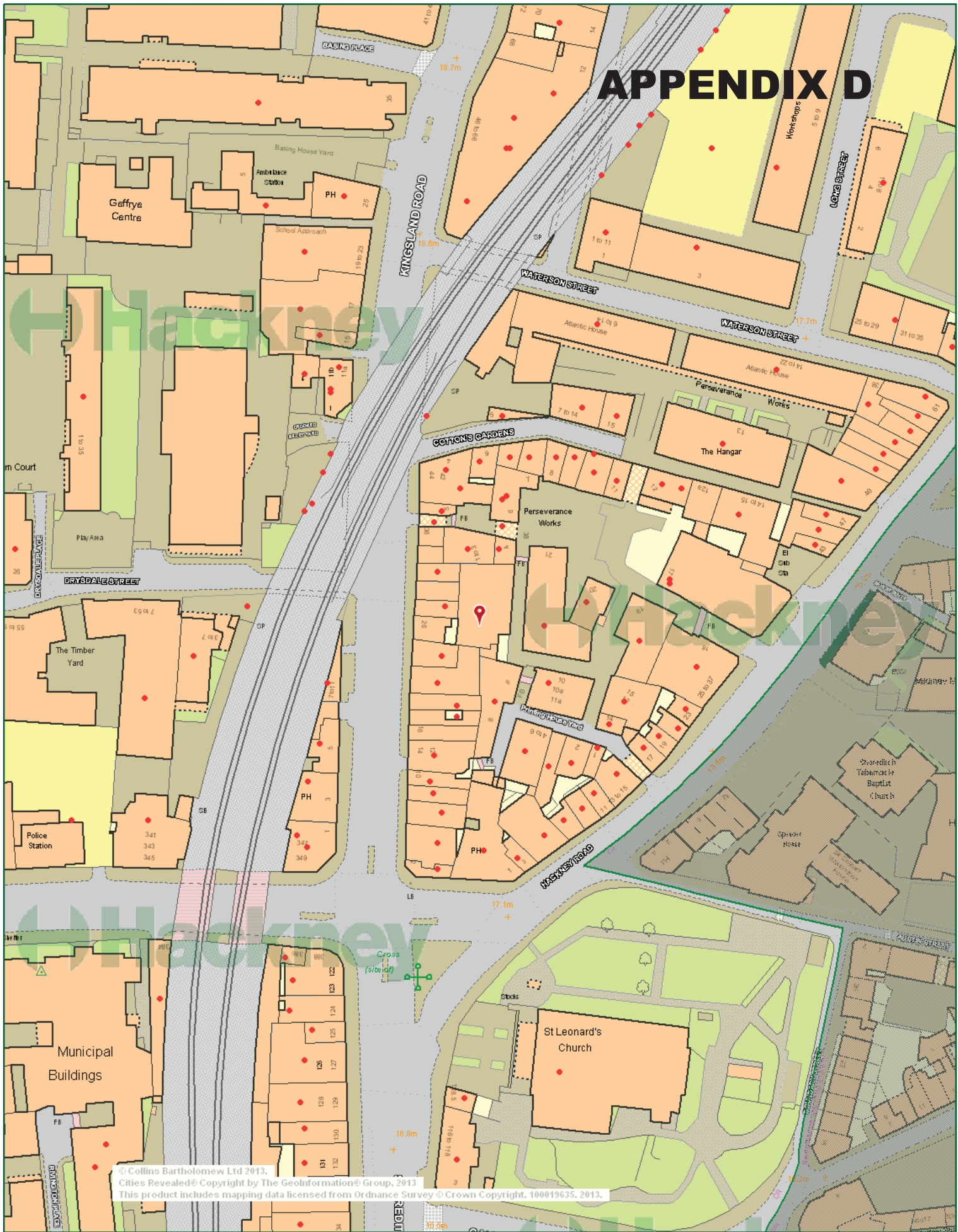
I would be more than happy to discuss these issues in person with the Licensing Service and again respectfully request that this late license application be rejected.
