### 2. APPLICATION

- 2.1 Essence Cuisine UK Limited has made an application vary their premises licence under the Licensing Act 2003:
  - To add off-sales of alcohol to current licence
- 2.2 The application is attached as Appendix A. The applicant has accepted additional measures to address the licensing objectives.

### 3. CURRENT STATUS / HISTORY

3.1 The current premises licence was granted by Licensing Sub-Committee in June 2016. The licence was transferred to the current applicant in April 2017 and a minor variation application to extend opening hours from 8.00am to 7.00am was approved in August 2017.

3.2 The current licence permits on sales of alcohol with the hours described in para. 1 above and is subject to the following conditions:

### **Annex 1 - Mandatory Conditions**

### Supply of Alcohol

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:
  - (a) At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence.
  - (b) At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 3. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
  - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises -
  - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;
  - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit(other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
  - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
  - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
  - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
  - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
  - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- 4. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

- 5. 5.1. The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sales or supply of alcohol.
  - 5.2. The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licences must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
  - 5.3. The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either:-
  - (a) a holographic mark or
  - (b) an ultraviolet feature
- 6. The responsible person must ensure that:
  - a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures:
  - beer or cider:1/2 pint;
  - gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25ml or 35ml; and
  - still wine in a glass: 125ml; and
  - b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
  - c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customers is made aware that these measures are available.

### **Minimum Drinks Pricing**

- 7. 7.1 A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
  - 7.2 For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 7.1 above -
  - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979:
  - (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula P = D + (DxV) Where -
  - (i)P is the permitted price,
  - (ii)D is the rate of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
  - (iii)V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
  - (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -
  - (i) the holder of the premises licence,
  - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or

- (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 7.3 Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 7.2(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 7.4 (1) Sub-paragraph 7.4(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 7.2(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

### **Door Supervision**

8. Each individual who is to carry out a security activity at the premises must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

### **Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule**

- 9. Music will be kept to background noise levels at all times.
- The premises will display prominent signage by every entrance and exit requesting customers to leave the premises quietly and respect local residents
- 11. The premises shall maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of a Metropolitan Police Crime Prevention Officer. All public areas, entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer.
- 12. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises are open to the public. This staff member shall be able to show Police or an authorised officer of Hackney Borough Council recent data or footage with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.

- 13. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available immediately to an authorised officer of the Hackney Borough Council or the Police, which will record the following:
  - a. all crimes reported to the venue
  - b. any complaints received
  - c. any incidents of disorder
  - d. any faults in the CCTV system
  - e. any refusal of the sale of alcohol
  - f. any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.
- 14. There shall be "CCTV in Operation" signs prominently displayed.
- 15. All instances of crime or disorder to be reported by the designated premises supervisor or responsible member of staff to an agreed police contact point, as agreed with the Police.
- 16. Where the sale or supply of alcohol is taking place employees of the premises must request sight of evidence of the age of any person appearing to be under 25 years of age (Challenge 25). Such evidence may include a driving licence or passport.
- 17. There shall be no glass, drinks or open containers taken outside of the premises except for a maximum of four customers using the designated seating area.
- 18. The premises will display and maintain appropriate signage advising customers of the contact details of the Designated Premises Supervisor.
- 19. All staff will be given refresher training every twelve months on the legislation relating to the sales of alcohol to underage persons and drunken persons. Written records of this training shall be kept on the premises and produced to police or other authorised officer upon request.
- 20. SIA registered door supervisors shall be employed at the venue on an operational risk assessment basis. All security staff shall be clearly identifiable at all times. All door supervisors shall enter their full details in the premises daily register at the commencement of their work. They shall record their full name, home address and contact telephone number, their SIA registration number, and the time they commence and conclude working. If the door supervisor was provided by an agency the name, registered business address and contact telephone number will also be provided. This register will be made available to police or authorised officer immediately upon request.
- 21. There shall be a written dispersal policy, which has been approved by police, at the premises. This policy will be kept on the premises and be made available to a police officer or other authorised officer upon request.
- 22. Any sales of alcohol shall be charged at no less than 50p per unit of alcohol. The licence holder will prepare a price list calculating the units for each available product, which shall be made available to the Police or Licensing Enforcement on request.

23. Notices advertising that the premises operates a 'Challenge 25' scheme will be displayed prominently at the premises entrance(s) and inside the premises.

### Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority

- 24. The outside area will not be used after 21:00hrs except for smokers.
- 25. The licence holder shall ensure that food is available at all times.
- 26. The installation of sound limiting devices (device type to be approved by the Pollution Team) to all music players. The limiting devices should be set to ensure that all music is played at background levels only and a certificate of compliance should be submitted to the Pollution Team. The device should be controlled by the Licensee and kept in a locked, tamper-proof box.
- 27. The noise limiter must be recalibrated annually to ensure that the music volume does not exceed the level at which a face to face conversation can be had in the premises and the methodology and copy of the calibration certificate must be submitted to the Pollution Team annually.

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### 6. GUIDANCE CONSIDERATIONS

6.1 The Licensing Authority is required to have regard to any guidance issued by the Secretary of State under the Licensing Act 2003.

### 7. POLICY CONSIDERATIONS

- 7.1 Licensing Sub-Committee is required to have regard to the London Borough of Hackney's Statement of Licensing Policy ("the Policy") adopted by the Licensing Authority.
- 7.2 The Policy applies to applications where relevant representations have been made. With regard to this application, policies LP1 Planning, LP3 (Operating Schedule), LP4 (Crime and Disorder), LP5 (Public Nuisance), LP6 (Protection of Children from Harm), LP8 (Public Safety) and LP12 (Licensing Hours) are relevant.

### 8. OFFICER OBSERVATIONS

8.1 If the Sub-Committee is minded to approve the application, the following additional conditions should be applied the licence:

### Conditions derived from Responsible Authority representations

- 1. All off sales of alcohol shall be sold in sealed containers to be consumed away from the premises
- 2. Customers to be reminded it is a criminal offence for a person under 18 years to purchase or attempt to purchase alcohol and that it is also an offence to purchase alcohol on behalf of a person aged under 18 years
- 3. Staff making the deliveries which include alcohol must be at least 18 years old
- 4. Alcohol can only be delivered to a residential or business address and not to a public place, and delivery staff will not deliver to any person anywhere other than at the residential or business address given when the order was placed
- 5. ID verification will be made when orders containing alcohol are delivered (no ID no delivery) acceptable proof of age shall include identification bearing the customer's photograph, date of birth and integral holographic mark or security measure

- 6. Any sales of alcohol shall be charged at no less than 50p per unit of alcohol. The licence holder will prepare a price list calculating the units for each available product, which shall be made available to the Police or Licensing Enforcement on request.
- (A unit of alcohol is 10ml of ethanol. The number of units is calculated by multiplying the % Alcohol By Volume x Volume in centilitres. Thus a half-litre of beer at 5% ABV contains 2.5 units:  $(5/100 \text{ ABV}) \times 50\text{cl}$  and would be price at a minimum of £1.25)
- 7. The Licensee shall ensure that all staff are fully trained and made aware of the legal requirement of businesses to comply with their duty of care as regards the disposal of waste produced from the business premises. The procedure for handling and preparing for disposal of the waste shall be in writing and displayed in a prominent place where is can be referred to at all times by staff.
- 8. The Licensee shall ensure that any contract for general and recyclable waste disposal shall be appropriate in size to the amount of waste produced by the business. The Licensee shall maintain an adequate supply of waste receptacles provided by his registered waste carrier (refuse sacks or commercial waste bins) in order to ensure all refuse emanating from the business is always presented for collection by his waste carrier and shall not use any plain black or unidentifiable refuse sacks or any other unidentifiable or unmarked waste receptacles.
- 9. The Licensee's premises are situated in an area within which refuse may only be left on the public highway during certain time bands. If the Licensee's waste carrier cannot or does not comply by collecting the refuse during the present or any future time bands imposed by the waste authority, the Licensee must remove the refuse from the public highway and/or keep it within the premises until such time as its waste carrier arrives to collect the refuse.
- 10. The Licensee shall erect a sign asking customers to refrain from littering the public highway outside the premises if deemed necessary, and will also instruct member of staff to make regular checks of the area immediately outside and within 10 metres either side of the premises and remove any litter, bottles and glasses emanating from the premises. The collection and removal of litter should include satisfactory disposal of spilled food and similar materials so as to leave the footway in a clean, safe and wholesome condition.
- 11. The Licensee shall provide a safe receptacle for cigarette ends to be placed outside, either on the wall or close to the wall of the building so as not to cause an obstruction or trip, for the use of customers if deemed necessary.
- 8.2 In order to allay their concerns, the Licensing Authority would be seeking the following amendments to the application;
  - All 'Off Sales' will be made from sealed containers and not for consumption within the immediate Vicinity/external area of the premises.

- Condition '17'. There shall be no glass, drinks or open containers taken outside of the premises except for a maximum of four customers using the designated seating area. Should be removed from the current Premises Licence or amended to omit any glass and/or open containers in the external seating area.
- Condition '24'. The outside area will not be used after 21:00hrs except for smokers. Should be removed from the Licence.

### 9. REASONS FOR OFFICER OBSERVATIONS

9.1 Additional condition 1 has bee been proposed by the police, 2 to 6 by Public Health and 7 to 11 by Environmental Enforcement. All have been accepted by the applicant. The Licensing Authority have proposed amendments described in para 8.2.

### 10. LEGAL COMMENTS

- 10.1 The Council has a duty as a Licensing Authority under the Licensing Act 2003 to carry out its functions with a view to promoting the following 4 licensing objectives;
  - The Prevention of Crime and Disorder
  - Public Safety
  - Prevention of Public Nuisance
  - The Protection of Children from Harm
- 10.2 It should be noted that each of the licensing objectives have equal importance and are the only grounds upon which a relevant representation can be made and for which an application can be refused or terms and conditions attached to a licence.

### 11. HUMAN RIGHTS ACT 1998 IMPLICATIONS

- 11.1 There are implications to;
  - Article 6 Right to a fair hearing
  - Article 14 Not to discriminate
  - Balancing: *Article 1* Peaceful enjoyment of their possession (i.e. a licence is defined as being a possession) with *Article 8* Right of Privacy (i.e. respect private & family life) to achieve a proportionate decision having regard to the protection of an individuals rights against the interests of the community at large.

### 12. MEMBERS DECISION MAKING

### a) General – all four licensing objectives (b, c, d and e) (please read guidance note 11)

We are not going to be open as late as the license allows- we will be closing at 7pm so we don't anticipate there being a huge amount of alcohol being sold. However, we do wish to be able to let customers buy a bottle of beer or wine to take with them should they choose to do so.

### b) The prevention of crime and disorder

All staff will be trained on how to deal with customers should they get rowdy or aggressive. We will not tolerate any criminal activity inside or around our restaurant and will be swiftly contacting the police should there ever be such an incident. Our premises will be fitted with CCTV and a state of the art alarm system.

### c) Public safety

We will have a number of trained first aiders on site, as well as a full first aid kit. Our staff will be well trained on health and safety, as well as food safety measures to make sure that we are not doing anything that could jeapordise public safety in any way.

### d) The prevention of public nuisance

Staff will be fully trained on how to deal with customers who are overly inebriated. We will under no circumstances serve alcohol to anyone who appears to be drunk. Planning Ref. South/724/00 for the change of use of basement and ground floor from B1 (office) to A1 (retail) was approved.

Planning ref. 2012/2174 for the change of use of basement and ground floor from B1 (office) to A1 (shop) was refused by Council on 28 September 2012.

Planning ref. 2012/3072 for the change of use of basement and ground floor from B1 (office) to A1 (shop) was withdrawn by the applicant on 4 December 2012

In July 2015, a licensing application was lodged for usage of the premises as a café. A planning objection was raised against the application as the premises did not have planning permission for the use of the premises as a café.

A licensing application was made in August 2015 for usage of the premises as a cafe to which the planning department raised no objection.

Having considered the application, the Licensing Authority object to the grant of this Premises Licence Variation for the following reasons.

### LP5 Public Nuisance & LP15 Cumulative Impact – General

The premises is located very close to the Shoreditch Special Policy Area and any additional 'Off Sales' may increase the probability of Public Nuisance occurring which, in turn would undermine the Licensing Objective 'Prevention of Public Nuisance'.

The location of the premises is very close to the Shoreditch Special Policy Area which has already been Identified as suffering from the negative effects of having so many licensed premises in close proximity. The Licensing Authority are concerned that further the alcohol off sales in this area may undermine the licensing objectives due to the **Cumulative Impact** of so many licensed premises.

The premises has an external seated area mentioned specifically on the current conditions.

On the current Premises Licence, Condition 17 states;

17. There shall be no glass, drinks or open containers taken outside of the premises except for a maximum of four customers using the designated seating area.

The addition of 'Off Sales' would make this condition unenforceable, but the applicant has not requested its removal.

Further to the comments above, 'Off Sales' were removed from the application when the Licence was determined by the Licensing Sub-Committee on 9<sup>th</sup> June 2016, I have attached a copy of the decision for your convenience.

In part 'M' of the application, the applicant states 'We are not going to be open as late as the license allows- we will be closing at 7pm' Yet no reduction in hours have been offered on the application.

The above representations are supported by the following evidence and information.

The Licensing Act 2003, Statement of Licensing Policy 2016 and Guidance issued by the Home Office.

Are there any actions or measures that could be taken to allay concerns or objections? If so, please explain.

In order to allay the concerns of the Licensing Authority, the Licensing Authority would be seeking the following amendments to the application;

- A significant reduction in the hours for Licensable activity to reflect the new operation taking place (As suggested by the applicant in section 'M' (a) and again in section 'M' (d) of the application). The supply of Alcohol to cease at 18:30hrs and the closing time of the premises to be reduced to 19:00hrs.
- All 'Off Sales' will be made from sealed containers and not for consumption within the immediate Vicinity/external area of the premises.

In conjunction with reduced hours, the following conditions should be amended/removed.



### Re; Licence application 94 Leonard Street, London, EC2A 4RH

I wish to strongly object to the application for a premises licence to allow 'off sale of alcohol'.

My understanding is this is wanted purely to allow the premises to sell alcohol which the premises patrons can then open and drink outside the premises, creating a further outside drinking location!

We have long ago reached a tipping point within the Leonard street area, where the number of licensed premises and revellers these attract to the area seriously disturb our residential amenities and those of the numerous residential properties in Leonard Street.

My husband has shared numerous photo's with Hackney Council licensing in recent weeks of the disturbance that already and regularly exists within the area.

Residents already find it difficult to achieve reasonable peace, quiet and the undisturbed sleep required to live a normal, functioning life.

Noise and nuisance is created by customers simply leaving any premises, slamming car doors or conversing into the early hours of every morning.

We regularly have to deal with broken glass on our door step, people urinating feet from our front door, piles of sick on the pavement close to our home and abuse being shouted as us as we leave or return to our flat in the evening.

Any further noise, disturbance or increase in the number of people being brought into the area will create a living environment untenable for the numerous residents on Leonard Street.

Increased presents of inebriated individuals will also significantly increase the likelihood of petty crime – vandalism (such as was recently experienced with our own car), theft etc....It will also significantly increase the likelihood of more serious crime – narcotics, assault etc... Both common occurrences induced by late night drinking.
