6. GUIDANCE CONSIDERATIONS

6.1 The Licensing Authority is required to have regard to any guidance issued by the Secretary of State under the Licensing Act 2003.

7. POLICY CONSIDERATIONS

- 7.1 Licensing Sub-Committee is required to have regard to the London Borough of Hackney's Statement of Licensing Policy ("the Policy") adopted by the Licensing Authority.
- 7.2 The Policy applies to applications where relevant representations have been made. With regard to this application, policies, LP3 (Operating Schedule), LP4 (Crime and Disorder), LP5 (Public Nuisance), LP6 (Protection of Children from Harm), LP8 (Public Safety) and LP14 (Special Policy Area Dalston) are relevant.

8. OFFICER OBSERVATIONS

8.1 If the Sub-Committee is minded to approve the application, the following conditions should be applied the licence:

Supply of Alcohol (On/Both)

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:
- (a) At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence.
- (b)At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 3. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
- (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises -
- (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;
- (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit(other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
- (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);

- (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
- (e)dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- 4. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 5.5.1. The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sales or supply of alcohol.
- 5.2 The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licences must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
- 5.3. The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either:-
- (a) a holographic mark or
- (b) an ultraviolet feature
- 6. The responsible person must ensure that:
- a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures:
- beer or cider:1/2 pint;
- gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25ml or 35ml; and
- still wine in a glass: 125ml; and
- b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
- c)where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customers is made aware that these measures are available.

Minimum Drinks Pricing

- 7. 7.1 A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 7.2 For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 7.1 above (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;

- (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula P = D+(DxV) Where -
- (i)P is the permitted price,
- (ii)D is the rate of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii)V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol:
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -
- (i) the holder of the premises licence,
- (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence:
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 7.3 Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 7.2(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 7.4 (1) Sub-paragraph 7.4(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 7.2(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Conditions derived from operating schedule

- 8. A Challenge 25 proof of age scheme shall be operated at the premises where the only acceptable forms of identification are recognised photographic identification cards, such as driving licence or passport.
- 9. The licence holder shall maintain a dedicated telephone number of the Designated Premises Supervisor for use by any Responsible Authority or any person who may wish to make a complaint. This contact number shall be provided to licensing authority, police and to any local residents upon request.

Conditions derived from Responsible Authority representations

10. The premises shall maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of a Metropolitan Police Crime Prevention Officer. All public areas, entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer.

- 11. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises are open to the public. This staff member shall be able to show Police or an authorised officer of Hackney Borough Council recent data or footage with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.
- 12. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available immediately to an authorised officer of the Hackney Borough Council or the Police, which will record the following:
- a. all crimes reported to the venue
- b. any complaints received
- c. any incidents of disorder
- d. any faults in the CCTV system
- e. any refusal of the sale of alcohol
- f. any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.
- 13. All instances of crime or disorder to be reported by the designated premises supervisor or responsible member of staff to an agreed police contact point, as agreed with the Police.
- 14. Where the sale or supply of alcohol is taking place employees of the premises must request sight of evidence of the age of any person appearing to be under 25 years of age (Challenge 25). Such evidence may include a driving licence or passport.
- 15. There shall be prominent signage requesting customers to leave the premises quietly and respect local residents.
- 16. All staff will be given refresher training every twelve months on the legislation relating to the sales of alcohol to underage persons and drunken persons. Written records of this training shall be kept on the premises and produced to police or other authorised officer upon request.
- 17. The license holder shall maintain a dedicated telephone number of the DPS for use by any responsible authority or any person who may wish to make a complaint. This contact umber shall be provided to the licensing authority, police and to any local residents upon request.
- 18. The premises shall adhere to Hackney Police Weapons and Drugs Policies and any updates thereof.
- 19. There shall be no glass, drinks or open containers taken outside of the premises at any time.
- 20. After 10pm there shall be no more than ** tbc ** smokers outside the venue.
- 21. The capacity of the premises will be ** tbc ** excluding staff.
- 22. The front of the premises shall be kept clean and swept at the close of business each day.

- 23. Reasonable steps shall be taken to ensure that an authorised person is a member of the local pubwatch.
- 24. The Licensee shall ensure that all staff are fully trained and made aware of the legal requirement of business to comply with their duty of care as regards the disposal of waste produced from the business premises. The procedure for handling and preparing for disposal of the waste shall be in writing and displayed in a prominent place where it can be referred to at all times by staff.
- 25. The Licensee shall ensure that any contract for general and recyclable waste disposal shall be appropriate in size to the amount of waste produced by the business. The Licensee shall maintain an adequate supply of waste receptacles provided by its registered waste carrier (refuse sacks or commercial waste bins) in order to ensure all refuse emanating from the business is always presented for collection by his waste carrier and shall not use any plain black or unidentifiable refuse sacks or any other unidentifiable or unmarked waste receptacles.
- 26. The Licensee shall provide a safe receptacle for cigarette ends to be placed outside for the use of customers, such receptacles being carefully placed so as not to cause an obstruction or trip hazard.
- 27. The primary use of these premises shall be as a gallery, displaying and selling artwork. Any other activity shall be ancillary to the premises use as a gallery.

9. REASONS FOR OFFICER OBSERVATIONS

9.1 Conditions 8 to 9 above are derived from the applicant's operating schedule. Conditions 10 to 27 have been proposed by the Police.

10. LEGAL COMMENTS

- 10.1 The Council has a duty as a Licensing Authority under the Licensing Act 2003 to carry out its functions with a view to promoting the following 4 licensing objectives:
 - The Prevention of Crime and Disorder
 - Public Safety
 - Prevention of Public Nuisance
 - The Protection of Children from Harm
- 10.2 It should be noted that each of the licensing objectives have equal importance and are the only grounds upon which a relevant representation can be made and for which an application can be refused or terms and conditions attached to a licence.

11. HUMAN RIGHTS ACT 1998 IMPLICATIONS

- 11.1 There are implications to:
 - **Article 6** Right to a fair hearing
 - **Article 14** Not to discriminate

Balancing: Article 1- Peaceful enjoyment of their possession (i.e. a licence is defined as being a possession) with Article 8 – Right of Privacy (i.e. respect private & family life) to achieve a proportionate decision having regard to the protection of an individuals rights against the interests of the community at large.

Thank you for taking the time to list your concerns in respect of our application for a new Premises Licence at the above address.

As you will know, we have been based here for over 2 years and, like you, we are part of the local community. Our current operation, we believe, helps maintain the positive and diverse profile of the area, allows us to offer employment and provide an art space for the community.

Can we please ask you to bear in mind that we intend to continue to operate as a gallery but with the addition of being able to provide a small amount of alcohol to support our business. As you may well be aware the nature of businesses in Dalston over recent years has changed significantly and we are looking to keep our business as it is, a gallery and art space.

We do not intend to be a drinking establishment and have agreed with the responsible authorities that any alcohol served will be alongside when we are operating as a gallery or when similar un-licensed activities are taking place. Generally this is once/twice a month for opening nights. This together with the small capacity of 60 persons will ensure that the premises can comply with local governance.

There are a range of controls in respect of licensed premises and so various agencies / council departments are given the opportunity to comment on applications. In the case of our application we have received representations which we have taken on board and, of course, we have received your representations.

We certainly do not want to be at odds with our neighbours, and wish to work with everyone to ensure that our operation does not impact on you. We have noted your concerns and would like to take this opportunity to respond, setting out the measures we propose.

Concern:

Being able to open 12 hours a day, seven days a week. Number of licensed premises and noise from people making their way home. An increase in general crime and nuisance.

Response:

We understand your concerns regarding the number of licensed premises with the Dalston SPA, however the nature of our business is not alcohol led and we will continue to be a Gallery and Art Space. We do not intend to sell alcohol 12 hours a day, seven days of the week. This application will allow for alcohol to be sold as an ancillary activity to support our current operation. We have agreed conditions to prevent this premises from operating as a bar / club and of course request that our customers leave the area quietly.

We reiterate we do wish to co-exist happily with our neighbours, to benefit us all. Although we are seeking to add the sale of alcohol to our business, we do not propose to lower our working standards and will maintain strict adherence with the conditions applied to any new licence.

We would like to invite you to visit us at our gallery on Monday 22nd January 2018 between 6 p.m. and 8 p.m. We feel being able to meet in person prior to any council hearing will be beneficial to all persons involved and we value the opportunity to show you what we are about.



This premises is situated within the Dalston Special Policy Area. The SPA was initially proposed due to the area becoming saturated with licensed premises and was 'directed at the concentration of persons in the area.'

Police would like further information as follows:

- What is the capacity of the premises?
- Will there be a member of staff on duty that has a personal licence?
- Will the whole of the basement be licensed?
- Will the premises be open to the public everyday?
- Will alcohol be available everyday?
- What sort of events will be held at the venue?
- Will events be pre-booked?

The application form or attachment does not mention the use of CCTV. Police believe the addition of CCTV to be an important tool, not only for the safety of the applicant's venue, but also for the staff and customers alike. - 1. The premises shall maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of a Metropolitan Police Crime Prevention Officer. All public areas, entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer.
- 2. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises are open to the public. This staff member shall be able to show Police or an authorised officer of Hackney Borough Council recent data or footage with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.
- 3. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available immediately to an authorised officer of the Hackney Borough Council or the Police, which will record the following:
 - a. all crimes reported to the venue
 - b. any complaints received
 - c. any incidents of disorder
 - d. any faults in the CCTV system
 - e. any refusal of the sale of alcohol
 - f. any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.
- 4. All instances of crime or disorder to be reported by the designated premises supervisor or responsible member of staff to an agreed police contact point, as agreed with the Police.
- 5. Where the sale or supply of alcohol is taking place employees of the premises must request sight of evidence of the age of any person appearing to be under 25 years of age (Challenge 25). Such evidence may include a driving licence or passport.
- 6. There shall be prominent signage requesting customers to leave the premises quietly and respect local residents.
- 7. All staff will be given refresher training every twelve months on the legislation relating to the sales of alcohol to underage persons and drunken persons. Written records of this training shall be kept on the premises and produced to police or other authorised officer upon request.
- 8. The license holder shall maintain a dedicated telephone number of the DPS for use by any responsible authority or any person who may wish to make a complaint. This contact umber shall be provided to the licensing authority, police and to any local residents upon request.

- 9. The premises shall adhere to Hackney Police Weapons and Drugs Policies and any updates thereof.
- 10. There shall be no glass, drinks or open containers taken outside of the premises at any time.
- 11. After 10pm there shall be no more than ** tbc ** smokers outside the venue.
- 12. The capacity of the premises will be ** tbc ** excluding staff.
- 13. The front of the premises shall be kept clean and swept at the close of business each day.

After considering this application the Licensing Authority submit the following representation.

The premises is located in the Dalston Special Policy Area and the Licensing Authority are concerned that further 'wet sales' in this area may undermine the licensing objectives. The 'Prevention of Public Nuisance' objective may particularly be at risk of being undermined as the premises is located in close proximity to local residents with flats above, neighbouring and opposite along the commercial parade where it is located.

Additionally the proposed activity of 'On sales' for a 12 hour period on each day means that the premises could act as Bar, Pub, Club style premises if it so wished. This could potentially lead to further drinking establishment in the Dalston Special Policy Area. The Dalston Special Policy makes reference to the concentration of persons in the area who have been drinking late at night, the application has not demonstrated how it will not add to the cumulative impact issues experienced in the Dalston area.

The plans for the premises have not indicated where the licensable activity will be taking place or where the counter/bar the alcohol sales will take place from is located. The locations of smoke alarms, fire extinguishers, seating or any of the fixed fittings on the premises have also been omitted.

Some excerpts from the current licensing policy have been included below.

LP14 Special Policy Area – Dalston

All **new or variation** applications within the Dalston SPA will have to show:

- High standards of management, (an example would include a Management Strategy see paragraph 33.8)
- The quality and track record of the management
- The good character of the applicant

Notwithstanding the above, where a relevant representation is made the policy will be to refuse any new or variation application which seeks to:

- Increase the capacity of an existing premises,
- Extend the hours of operation of an existing premises, or
- Permit any activity/use not identified or allowed for in the table below or,
- Permit any activity/use where there is a genuine concern that the proposal will have a negative impact in the area. For example this may include premises that have a large capacity or are mainly outdoors.

The policy is directed at the concentration of persons in the area and particularly those who have been drinking late at night. Therefore any application will need to demonstrate that it does not add to the issues of cumulative impact in the Dalston area.

Quite simply this is an application for a supposed art gallery to sell alcohol for 12 hours a day seven days a week, effectively allowing it to operate as a bar similar to all the various 'sport clubs' and 'social clubs' along the same road. This application is just a backhanded way of converting the 'art gallery' into a bar and must be rejected.

What makes this application even worse than most I have seen is that there is no hiding behind the provision of food, it is just the pure sale of alcohol late into the night. This will breach the local structure plan which is supposed to stop the expansion of such premises as they are such a detriment to the local residents.

The property is right near the corner of Crossway and there is very limited outside space - so that people who would be drinking in such a venue who want to smoke will cause more congestion, noise and antisocial behaviour on an already crowded intersection.

I am writing on behalf of the Rio Cross Residents Association to OBJECT to two applications for licenses (in one case a bar license and in the other case a bar and club license) for the basements at numbers 5D and 8 Stoke Newington Road.

The first The first, at number 5D requests an 'Application for a premises licence to authorise supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises from 12:00 to 00:00 Mon to Sun.'

The second, across the road at number 8, is an 'Application for a premises licence for films, indoor sporting events, live music, recorded music, performance of dance,

anything of similar description and to authorise supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises from 12:00 to 23:00 Sun to Thurs and from 12:00 to 00:00 Fri and Sat and late night refreshment from 23:00 to 00:00 Sun to Thurs and from 23:00 to 01:00am Fri and Sat.'

the application 'for a premises licence for late night refreshment from 23:00 to 00:00 Sun to Thurs and from 23:00 to 02:00am Fri and Sat and to authorise supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises from 11:00 to 23:30 Sun to Thurs and from 11:00 to 01:30am Fri and Sat.' at 7 Stoke Newington Road. Please consider this as an objection to BOTH applications.

These addresses are already surrounded by other premises with alcohol licenses, several of which have a history of causing nuisance to local residents (as well as offences relating to failing to prevent the supply of drugs and alcohol to minors). The rather narrow pavement outside is already so thronged with people in the evenings that pedestrians are often pushed out into the road into the path of traffic. There is also considerable noise nuisance. Considerable disturance is already experienced by local residents ans we are frequently woken then by the sounds of fighting, shouting, drunken singing, breaking bottles, revving vehicles and other noise nuisance. The morning after, we emerge to the overpowering stench of urine on our doorsteps and are sometimes faced with other human deposits.

Local residents believe that granting these licenses will add to the cumulative impact of alcohol-related antisocial behaviour in the area and will be detrimental to all four of the Council's licensing policy objectives.

- The area is already a crime hotspot. adding to the congestion on the pavement will encourage further crime (such as pickpocketing) and disorder.
- It will exacerbate risks to public safety (in particular jostling of vulnerable local residents, including the elderly and disabled, and pushing them into the path of traffic near to a busy intersection)
- It will add to public nuisance including noise, public displays of drunkenness and violence, public urination and vomiting, graffitti and littering
- It will add to risks to minors (e.g. from sexual harrassment and drug dealing)

Stoke Newington Road is a TfL Red Route and "A" board signs are strictly forbidden on the footway of the road [it is an offence under the Highways Act 1980, section 137 (1) to wilfully obstruct a highway].

Despite having received warnings from TfL that they should remove their "A" board sign, the management have continued to place their sign on the footway.

The "A" board sign's location, both on the footway and so close to the nearby pedestrian crossing means this obstruction is highly hazardous to blind and visually impaired pedestrians.

The management's refusal to consider the safety and well-being of passing pedestrians makes me doubt the competency of the management of the Basement Bar, 5 Stoke Newington Road and I object on grounds of public safety.

If a license is granted, I hope the Committee will take into consideration the needs of passing pedestrians - to be able to walk past the venue unimpeded by "A" board signs, customers standing around smoking and other potential obstructions pertaining to the venue.
