Introduction

This review explored the Council's readiness to deliver segregated cycle lanes in some areas. This is within its stated aim of improving cycling conditions on main roads.

The Commission looked at the circumstances in which the Council would consider this type of intervention, and how it would work to overcome the challenges to delivering effective schemes.

Members spoke to some of those with experience of delivering segregated cycling provision, and to cyclist groups and representatives of other vulnerable road users. They heard the the cases for and against segregated lanes, and views towards the principles which any schemes should follow.

The Commission also visited Waltham Forest to examine segregated cycle lane schemes delivered within its Mini Holland programme.

The report made 5 recommendations.
