6. GUIDANCE CONSIDERATIONS

6.1 The Licensing Authority is required to have regard to any guidance issued by the Secretary of State under the Licensing Act 2003.

7. POLICY CONSIDERATIONS

- 7.1 Licensing Sub-Committee is required to have regard to the London Borough of Hackney's Statement of Licensing Policy ("the Policy") adopted by the Licensing Authority.
- 7.2 The Policy applies to applications where relevant representations have been made. With regard to this application, policies, LP1 (General Principles), LP2 (Licensing Objectives), LP10 (Special Policy Areas Dalston and Shoreditch), and LP11 (Cumulative Impact General).

8. OFFICER OBSERVATIONS

8.1 If the Sub-Committee is minded to approve the application, the following conditions should be applied the licence:

Supply of Alcohol (On/Both)

1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:

(a) At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence.

(b)At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

3. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

(2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises -

(a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;

(i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit(other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or

(ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within

a time limit or otherwise);

(b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

(c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

(d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise

anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.

(e)dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).

4. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

5.5.1. The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sales or supply of alcohol.

5.2 The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licences must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

5.3. The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either:-

(a) a holographic mark or

(b) an ultraviolet feature

6. The responsible person must ensure that:

a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures:

• beer or cider:1/2 pint;

• gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25ml or 35ml; and

• still wine in a glass: 125ml; and

b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and

c)where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customers is made aware that these measures are available.

Minimum Drinks Pricing

7. 7.1 A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

7.2 For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 7.1 above -(a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;

(b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula -

P = D + (DxV)

Where -

(i)P is the permitted price,

(ii)D is the rate of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and (iii)V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;

(c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -

(i) the holder of the premises licence,

(ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;

(d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and

(e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

7.3 Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 7.2(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

7.4 (1) Sub-paragraph 7.4(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 7.2(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Conditions derived from operating schedule

8. Deliveries of goods necessary for the operation of the business shall be carried out at such a time or in such a manner as to prevent nuisance and disturbance to nearby residents.

9. The movement of bins and rubbish outside the premises shall be kept to a minimum after 11.00pm.

10. Any lighting on or outside the premises shall be positioned and screened in such a way so as to not cause a disturbance to nearby residents.

Conditions derived from Responsible Authority representations

11. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of a Metropolitan Police Crime Prevention Officer. All public areas and each entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer. 12. There shall be a staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system on the premises at all times when the premises are open to the public. This staff member must be able to show a Police or authorised council officer recent data or footage when requested.

13. Signs will be prominently displayed at all entrance and exit points reminding customers to leave quietly and respect local residents.

14. A Challenge 25 proof of age scheme shall be operated at the premises where the only acceptable forms of identification are recognised photographic identification cards, such as driving licence or passport.

15. During the hours of operation of the premises, the licence holder shall ensure sufficient measures are in place to remove and prevent litter or waste arising or accumulating from customers in the area immediately outside the premises, and that this area shall be swept and or washed, and litter and sweepings collected and stored in accordance with the approved refuse storage arrangements by close of business.

16. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to an authorised officer of the council or the police, which will record the following.

- a) All crimes reported:
- b) All ejections of patrons
- c) Any complaints received.
- d) Any incidents of disorder.
- e) Seizure of drugs or offensive weapons.
- f) Any faults in the CCTV system.
- g) Any refusal of the sale of alcohol.
- h) Any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.

17. Premises to operate zero tolerance policy to drugs and comply with Hackney Police Drugs and Weapons policy where appropriate.

18. All instances of crime and disorder witnessed or brought to the attention of staff is to be reported by the Designated Premises Supervisor or responsible member of staff to Police

19. All staff shall receive training on the legislation relating to the sales of alcohol to underage persons and drunken persons and shall have refresher training every 12 months. There shall be written records of such training which will be kept on the premises and produced to a police officer or other authorised officer upon request.

20. There shall be no glass, or open containers taken outside of the premises at any time.

21. Substantial food and substantial beverages other than intoxicating liquor (including drinking water) shall be available during the whole of the permitted hours in all parts of the premises where intoxicating liquor is sold or supplied.

22. All alcohol served shall be to seated customers only and ancillary to a substantial table meal.

23. Checks shall be undertaken prior to opening to ensure that all public areas are kept clear and fire exits unlocked and capable of use in an emergency.

24. The Licensee shall provide a safe receptacle for cigarette ends to be placed outside for the use of customers, such receptacle being carefully placed so as not to cause an obstruction or trip.

25. Music at the venue shall be played at background level. The licensee is to submit a noise impact report to Environmental Protection team if amplified music is to be played at the premises.

26. Patrons or customers of Oliveira Organic Vegetarian Kitchen shall not use the front of the premises as a designated smoking area at any time.

9. REASONS FOR OFFICER OBSERVATIONS

9.1 Conditions 8 to 10 above are derived from the applicant's operating schedule. Conditions 11 to 24 have been proposed by the police and 25 to 26 by environmental protection. The proposed conditions have been accepted by the applicant.

10. LEGAL COMMENTS

- 10.1 The Council has a duty as a Licensing Authority under the Licensing Act 2003 to carry out its functions with a view to promoting the following 4 licensing objectives;
 - The Prevention of Crime and Disorder
 - Public Safety
 - Prevention of Public Nuisance
 - The Protection of Children from Harm
- 10.2 It should be noted that each of the licensing objectives have equal importance and are the only grounds upon which a relevant representation can be made and for which an application can be refused or terms and conditions attached to a licence.

11. HUMAN RIGHTS ACT 1998 IMPLICATIONS

- 11.1 There are implications to;
 - Article 6 Right to a fair hearing
 - Article 14 Not to discriminate
 - Balancing: Article 1- Peaceful enjoyment of their possession (i.e. a licence is defined as being a possession) with Article 8 – Right of Privacy (i.e. respect private & family life) to achieve a proportionate decision having regard to the protection of an individuals rights against the interests of the community at large.

TO PROMOTE ALL FOUR LICENSING OBJECTIVES, WE WILL KEEP: Strong management controls and effective training of all staff so that they are aware of the premises licence and the requirements to meet the four licensing objectives with particular attention to:

- No selling of alcohol to underage people
- No drunk and disorderly behaviour on the premises area
- Vigilance in preventing the use and sale of illegal drugs at the retail area
- No violent and anti-social behaviour

- No any harm to children - Operating Schedule providing the hours of operation and licensable activities during those hours.

- Designated premises supervisor confirmed it is obligated to be in day-to-day control of the premises, to provide good training for staff on the Licensing Act (Training Record), to make or authorize each sale

- Clear "Challenge 25" information to prevent the supply of alcohol to under-age drinkers.

- CCTV system installed with recording option available

- As a licensed premise we know that it is necessary to carry out our functions or operate their businesses with a purpose of promoting these objectives. We promise to support these objectives through their operating schedules and other measures (including staff training and qualifications, policies, and strategic partnerships with other agencies).

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

The prevention of crime and disorder CCTV System installed to monitor entrances, exits, and other parts of the premises in order to address the prevention of crime objective.

- A clear and legible notice outside the premises indicating the normal hours under the terms of the premises licence during which licensable activities are permitted.

- Clear and conspicuous notices warning of potential criminal activity, such as theft, that may target customers will be displayed.

- Not selling of alcohol to drunk or intoxicated customers.

- Custom will not be sought by means of personal solicitation outside or in the vicinity of the premises.

- Prevention and vigilance in illegal drug use at the retail unit area.

- Staff will be well trained in asking customers to use premises in an orderly and respectful manner and prevent drinking alcohol from other retail unit (ex. canned or bottled beer) outside our premises.

c) Public safety

Public safety Internal and external lighting fixed to promote the public safety objective.

- Well trained staff adherence to environmental health requirements.

- Training and implementation of underage ID checks.

- A log book or recording system shall be kept upon the premises in which shall be entered particulars of inspections made; those required to be made by statute, and information compiled to comply with any public safety condition attached to the premises licence that requires the recording of such information. The log book shall be kept available for inspection when required by persons authorised by the Licensing Act 2003 or associated legislation.





Representation in relation to:

I make this representation as the premises is located within the Shoreditch Special Policy Area (SPA).

The high concentration of licensed premises in the area have been identified as having a negative impact on the promotion of the licensing objectives and as such having an adverse impact on local residents and local amenity.

The Licensing Authority are concerned that the proposed activity may further increase the cumulative impact of licensed premises in the area and undermine the promotion of the licensing objectives.

"LP10 Special Policy Areas – Dalston and Shoreditch

It is the Council's policy that where a relevant representation is made to any application within the area of the Dalston SPA or Shoreditch SPA, the applicant will need to demonstrate that the proposed activity and the operation of the premises will not add to the cumulative impact that is currently being experienced in these areas. This policy is to be strictly applied.

It should also be noted that the;

- quality and track record of the management;
- good character of the applicant; and
- extent of any variation sought

May not be in itself sufficient.

It should be noted that if an applicant can demonstrate that they will not add to the cumulative impact in their operating schedule and at any hearing, then the Core Hours Policy within LP3 will apply."

Evidential research used to inform the Policy made a number of notable findings, including:

- Most crimes (87%) in the Hoxton East and Shoreditch Ward associated with licensed premises occurred between 2000 and 0359 hours; peak hours of 2300 to 0159 (53%). Friday's to Sunday's experienced more crime than other days, specifically Friday PM to Saturday AM, and Saturday PM to Sunday AM (between 2100 and 0359 hours); 61% of ward total.
- In recent years, Thursday's have also begun to feature. However, peak crime hours on a Thursday were more limited between 2300 hours on a Thursday and 0159 hours on the Friday morning suggesting that Thursday nights are not yet quite as prevalent as Friday and Saturday nights.
- Overall most of the crime in this ward was theft (87%), and then violence (9%). Whilst there was a 60% reduction in theft offences, violent crime increased by 68%, particularly serious wounding (up 350% or 39 more crimes so % increase brought about by low numbers), common assault and harassment.

The above representations are supported by the following evidence and information.

Statement of Licensing Policy 2018 - 2023, Licensing Act 2003, Section 182 Guidance issued by the Home Office.

Are there any actions or measures that could be taken to allay concerns or objections? If so, please explain.
