The Skills Economy and Growth Scrutiny Commission is hosting a discussion to talk about the future of the Borough's night time economy. This will be a space for residents, businesses and those that manage the night time economy to come together and talk about what action needs to be taken to implement the Council's vision. We will be joined by the Cabinet Member with lead responsibility for the night time economy Cllr Caroline Selman, Cabinet Member for Community Safety, Policy and the Voluntary Sector.

- Creating a Sustainable Night Time Economy
- Jobs in the Night Time Economy.

The Council has been working on its vision for the night time economy. In addition to this there has been a number of changes such as a review of their licensing policy, introduction of the late night levy and development of the new Local Plan (LP33 key strategic planning document used to direct and guide development in the borough up to 2033). All these changes have contributed to the council's work in developing its vision for Hackney's evening and night time leisure economy.
