The supply of alcohol shall be by waiter or waitress service only."

and replace with

"The supply of alcohol shall be by waiter or waitress service only. There shall be no dancing area for dancing in the premises.

There shall be no disc jockeys on the premises.

There shall be no standing at the bar."

- 3.1 The current premises licence was granted in 2013 and transferred to the current licensee in April 2017.

- 10.2 It should be noted that each of the licensing objectives have equal importance and are the only grounds upon which a relevant representation can be made and for which an application can be refused or terms and conditions attached to a licence.

Notes for Guidance

This application cannot be used to vary the licence so as to extend the period for which the licence has effect or to vary substantially the premises to which it relates. Background Information, to accompany premises licence variation application .

23rd December 2019

- 1. This document is an outline of the proposal for the variation of the licensed premises at L'Atelier at 31 Stoke Newington Road, Hackney, N16 8BJ, and with relevant background information to support the application.
- The premises is on the main Stoke Newington Road in Dalston, and was originally granted a premises licence in 2013, as a small café bar with food available and with standard café and restaurant opening hours. The bar would like to operate as a specialist high end cocktail bar, specialising in cocktails, for discerning customers. There will be luxury leather seating for around 30 people only; there is no standing bar area, no dance floor, no djs and no dancing. The bar operates a table waiting service only, and has a simple kitchen with food available throughout the opening hours.
- 3 Mr Erdal has much experience of running late night bars in the West End, and decided on a complete refit and refurbishment and to concentrate on high end cocktails, and with no djs, no live music, no dance floor and no dancing. He intends to install luxury seating, and décor, and operate with experienced trained cocktail bartenders, and with table service only. The cocktails are to be priced accordingly, and the bar to be well managed and run as a premises to attract a much better class of clientele.
- This variation application seeks to vary Condition 14 so that there is an ability to serve alcohol without the necessity of customers taking a full meal at this particular premises. This will enable customers who do not want to sit and eat a full meal to still be able to have food if they desire, but also to just have cocktails and sit comfortably with waiter service, if they do not want a full meal. There will still be food available throughout the operating hours, as the kitchen will remail open. This is only a small café bar, and is located in a very busy and popular area, with many local restaurants already catering for more substantial meals. Customers often prefer to take a cocktail first and then eat at a more traditional restaurant, and then maybe finish off the evening with just a drink at a cocktail bar. This variation would allow this to happen at this premises in a safe and controlled way.
- There is no intention for later hours or increased capacity. This is only a small café bar of some 30 capacity, which makes it an ideal premises to operates as a small, well controlled, and safely run cocktail bar.
- A responsible attitude has been taken by the new owner to all necessary regulations and assessments. All fire risk assessments and gas safety checks are up to date. Bar managers attend the local Pub Watch scheme to keep up to date with local policing and licensing issues in the Dalston area. This new policy has proved to be very successful; the new owner has managed the bar effectively and has a strict entry policy, and with seated table service, and there is no shouting or unruly behaviour tolerated. There is only background music, with a very small sound system and no djs.

- Since Mr Erdal has opened the bar, and with his effective operating policy and refurbishment, there have been no complaints from any of the residents, no complaints or issues with the Police or Licensing Authority, and no complaints made to the noise team. The café bar has been effectively and responsibly managed with a strict new policy and has been safely operating as cocktail bar in the heart of Dalston's restaurant area.
- The L'Atelier café bar is located in the Dalston Special Policy Area, and the owner is aware of this, and he is also well aware of his responsibilities and duties as a licencee. He is also aware of all the historic reasons why the special policy was set up, to prevent further noise and disturbance to local residents, and to prevent further demands on the Local Authority and Police, from unruly behaviour late at night. The area is very commercial with many other late night bars, and many traditional restaurants nearby.
- The new owner has effectively shown, and successfully confirmed, that over a long period of almost four years with no complaints or issues, that he is a responsible operator, and can effectively, and safely, manage this bar. This has been shown by the complete absence of any complaints or any issue from any of the authorities that have an active interest in the premises. This application is only to simply amend one condition, which will allow food to still be available, but to enjoy a specialist cocktail, waiter served, but without the necessitiy to eat a full meal in this particular premises.
- The capacity of only 30 seated well behaved people at maximum is considered to have no significant additional impact on the surrounding residential area. There is a mini cab office nearby and arrangements have been running successfully since the new owner took over the bar with the minicab firm so that customers do not even leave the premises until a cab is ready to escort them home. There are many late night bus stops directly outside the premises which will also take customers away with the minimum of disturbance. It is considered that this simple variation will make no significant impact on the local area, and still be within the objectives of the special policy area, and it would now be appropriate to grant the variation.

Supply of Alcohol

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:
 - (a) At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence.
 - (b) At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 3. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises -
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
 - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).

- 4. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 5. 5.1. The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sales or supply of alcohol.
 - 5.2 The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licences must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
 - 5.3. The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years if age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either:-
 - A. a holographic mark or
 - B. an ultraviolet feature.
- 6. The responsible person shall ensure that:
 - a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures:
 - beer or cider: 1/2 pint;
 - gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25ml or 35ml; and
 - still wine in a glass: 125ml; and
 - a. these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
 - b. where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

Minimum Drinks Pricing

- 7. 7.1 A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
 - 7.2 For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 7.1 above -
 - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979:
 - (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula P = D+(DxV) Where -
 - (i)P is the permitted price,
 - (ii)D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
 - (iii)V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;

- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -
- (i) the holder of the premises licence,
- (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 7.3 Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8.2(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 7.4 (1) Sub-paragraph 7.4(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 7.2(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

- 8. The premises shall maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of a Metropolitan Police Crime Prevention Officer. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer.
- 9. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises are open to the public. This staff member shall be able to show Police or an authorised officer of Hackney Borough Council recent data or footage with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.
- 10. An incident lo g shall be kept at the premises, and made available immediately to an authorised officer of the Hackney Borough Council or

the Police, which will record the following:

- (a) all crimes reported to the venue
- (b) any complaints received
- (c) any incidents of disorder
- (d) any faults in the CCTV system or searching equipment or scanning equipment
- (e) any refusal of the sale of alcohol
- (f) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.
- 11. There shall be "CCTV in Operation" signs prominently displayed.
- 12. All instances of crime or disorder to be reported by the designated premises supervisor or responsible member of staff to an agreed police contact point, as agreed with the Police.
- 13. Suitable beverages, other than intoxicating liquor, including drinking water, shall be available at the premises.
- 14. Intoxicating liquor shall not be sold, supplied, or consumed on the premises otherwise than to persons who are taking a substantial table meal from the menu and that the consumption of intoxicating liquor by such persons is ancillary to taking such meals. The supply of alcohol shall be by waiter or waitress service only
- 15. The premises licence holder shall comply with a dispersal Policy, a copy of which will be made available to the police or authorised officer upon request.
- 16. Where the sale or supply of alcohol is taking place employees of the premises must request sight of evidence of the age of any person appearing to be under 25 years of age (Challenge 25). Such evidence may include a driving licence or passport.
- 17. Premises to operate a zero tolerance policy to drugs and comply with Weapons Policy where appropriate Hackney Police
 Theft Reduction Policy 2011
 Or any subsequent reviews of these policies.
- 18. The premises will display prominent signage by every entrance and exit requesting customers to leave the premises quietly and respect local residents.
- 19. Patrons permitted to temporarily leave and re-enter (e.g. to smoke) shall not be permitted to take drinks or glass containers with them. The area outside the premises will be monitored.
- 20. Refuse, including bottles, shall not be taken and placed in receptacles outside the premises between the hours of 2000 and 0800.
- 21. There shall be no deliveries to the premises between the hours of 22.00 to 08.00.

- 22. All staff should receive training and have an awareness of the four licensing objectives.
- 23. The Licensee shall ensure that all staff are fully trained and made aware of the legal requirement of businesses to comply with their responsibility as regards the disposal of waste produced from the business premises. The procedure for handling and preparing for disposal of the waste shall be in writing and displayed in a prominent place where is can be referred to at all times by staff.
- 24. The Licensee shall maintain an adequate supply of receptacles (this includes refuse sacks) in order to ensure his waste is always presented for collection in receptacles provided by his registered waste carrier and shall not use any plain black or unidentifiable refuse sacks or any other unidentifiable or unmarked waste receptacles.
- 25. The Licensee shall provide a safe receptacle for cigarette ends to be placed outside for the use of customers, such receptacle being carefully placed so as not to cause an obstruction or trip.
- 26. The Licensee shall instruct members of staff to make regular checks of the area immediately outside and within 10 metres either side of the premises, removing any litter, glasses and bottles.
- 27. No more than 5 patrons to be permitted to smoke outside the premises at any one time
- 28. Background music to be only played at a level that permits face to face conversation at normal speech level


