	The Mayor introduced the report.
	The Mayor informed the Cabinet that he had been elected as the Chair of the Transport and Environment Committee at London Councils, this was highlighted as the Capital Update Report referred to walking and cycling sustainable transport schemes.
	RESOLVED
	That the schemes for Childrens, Adults and Community Health as set out in section 9.2 be approved as follows: Woodberry Down Children's Centre: Resource and spend approval of £1,819k (£707k in 2021/22 and £1,112k in 2022/23) is requested to continue the redevelopment to bring two centres together under one roof.
	REASONS FOR DECISION
	The decisions required are necessary in order that the schemes within the Council's approved Capital programme can be delivered as set out in this report.
	In most cases, resources have already been allocated to the schemes as part of the budget setting exercise but spending approval is required in order for the scheme to proceed. Where however resources have not previously been allocated, resource approval is requested in this report.

7. CHILD-FRIENDLY PLACES SUPPLEMENTARY PLANNING DOCUMENT KEY DECISION NO - NH Q55

Councillor Nicolson and Councillor Woodley introduced the report.

Deputy Mayor Bramble explained that the child friendly places were not just for newly built areas but also for existing properties and neighbourhoods within Hackney.

Councillor Woodley thanked the officers involved for their input and recommended the report to Cabinet for approval.

Councillor Burke also welcomed this piece of work and commended the speed at which the work had been developed, and how the work had influenced policy making elsewhere.

REASONS FOR DECISION

Continuous consultation and engagement with stakeholders and the public is integral to producing local plan documents. Consultation on the draft SPD is required in accordance with Regulation 12 of the Town and Country Planning (Local Planning) (England) Regulations 2012 and will help inform and influence the final version of the SPD.

8. CITY AND HACKNEY SAFEGUARDING ADULTS BOARD ANNUAL REPORT 2021/20 AND STRATEGY 2020/25 -NON KEY DECISION

Councilor Kennedy invited Dr Adi Cooper to introduce the report.

Dr Adi Cooper highlighted a number of reviews within the report and how there had been significant learning and impact around understanding safeguarding issues for homeless people. Dr Cooper highlighted the joint working of the board with other partnerships such as Community Safet Partnership and the Childrens Partnership on modern day slavery. Cabinet Members were informed that the board had been meeting more frequently to seek assurance that their partners had been meeting their targets and ensuring that safeguarding issues were raised and addressed throughout the current Covid-19 challenge.
