# a) General – all four licensing objectives (b, c, d and e) (please read guidance note 11)

An Incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to an authroised officer of Hackney Borough Council and the Metropolitan Police, which will record the following:

- a) All crimes reported in the venue
- b) All ejections of patrons
- c) any complaints received concerning crime and disorder
- e) Any incidents of disorder
- f) any faults in the CCTV system or searching equipment or scanning equipment
- g) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service

The premises licence holder or nominated representative shall keep and maintain all right to work documents for all staff members. Right to work documents shall be kept at the premises or accessible digitally and produced to authorised officers of Hackney Borough Council and the Metropolitan Police upon request. Right to work documents must be retained at the premises accessible digitally for a minimum of 12 months after employment has ceased.

During licensable hours there will always be a minimum of two members of staff present insdie the premises.

## b) The prevention of crime and disorder

CCTV shall be installed, operated and maintained at all times that the premises is open for licensable activities, so as to comply with the following criteria:

- a) The licensee will ensure that the system is checked every two weeks to ensure that the system is working properly and that the date and time are correct. A record of these checks, showing the date and time of the person checking, shall be kept and made available to police or authorised council officers on request.
- b) The police must be informed if the system will not be operating for longer than one day of business for any reason.
- c) Cameras will show a close any person entering and leaving the premises clearly.
- d) The system shall record in real time and recordings will be date and time stamped.
- e) Recordings will be kept for a minimum of 31 days and downloaded footage will be provided free of charge to police or authorised council officers on request within 24 hours of any request.
- f) at all times the premises are open for licensable activity, there will be a person on the premises who can operate the system sufficiently to allow ploice or authorised council officers to view footage on request.

A sign will be placed clearly in the premises which will state that CCTV is in operation at the premises. The use of CCTV will also be registered with the Information Commisioner Office.

## c) Public safety

Staff will attend to any spillage within the venue as soon as possible to minimise the risk of injury to customers.

A fire saftey risk assessment will be carried out annually as per the government guidelines and a copy of this assessment can be produced to an authorised officer of Hackney Borough Council, the Metropolitan Police or the London Fire service upon request.

First aid equipment and materials will be available on the premises at all times.

## d) The prevention of public nuisance

Clear notices will be displayed in the premises requesting customers to leave the premises in an orderly manner and not to disturb the residents around the area.

No person carrying an open bottle of alcholic beverage would be permitted any time to come inside the premises and would be asked to leave.

Display signs will be placed inside the premises encouring customers and other relevant stakeholders not o loiter outside and to place their rubbish inside the bins.

Staff will be trained on how to deal with intoxicated and aggressive behaviour of customers so to reduce the risk of causing any injury to any parties involved.

The premises will have bins for use by the customer to dispose off their rubbish. The removal of rubbish will only take place from 19:00 to 21:00 outside of the premises as per the timing of rubbish collection company.



    contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman wrestling, or freestyle
    wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the
    audience does not exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports defined
    as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling
    with one or more martial arts are licensable as a boxing or wrestling
    entertainment rather than an indoor sporting event.

Police make the following representations in relation to the application to vary the Premises Licence at CHICKEN COTTAGE, 125 CITY ROAD, LONDON, EC1V 1JB for the following reason(s);

This premises is situated on the outskirts of the Shoreditch Special Policy Area, which has an incredibly high footfall during the evenings and early hours of the morning on most days, but especially on Thursdays to Saturdays.

An application has been received by police to vary the premises licence at this venue and proposes to extend the timings for the sale of late night refreshment until 0100hrs on Sunday to Wednesday and until 0500hrs on Thursday – Saturday.

This application has been received due to interaction between police and the applicant. During the early hours of Sunday 18th April 2021, at approximately 0230hrs, police were called to the location after a fight and assault, involving staff, had taken place inside the venue. It transpired that the premises should actually have closed at midnight and were trading way outside of the hours authorised by the current premises licence. The premises were sent a warning letter on 28th April 2021 by police, hence this application being submitted.

The hours proposed in this licence are extremely late and effectively allow the premises to trade for 24 hours from the opening of the premises on Thursday until the close of the premises on Sunday morning which encourages those people who have consumed large amounts of alcohol in Shoreditch to loiter in the street. The behaviour of people who have consumed various amounts of alcohol changes and they very often become more aggressive, confrontational and incidents of violence and disorder occur.

Police are not yet satisfied that the applicant is a responsible operator. They have been seen to be operating outside of their authorised hours with a violent incident taking place, which police believe is not a single occurrence.

Police would like to see the dispersal policy that is required in condition 5 of the current premises licence.

Currently, police still have concerns around the undermining of the licensing objectives, in particular, the **prevention** of crime and disorder in the area surrounding Shoreditch and the Special Policy Area.

Police look forward to hearing from the applicant to discuss a way forward for this application soon.

I write in relation to the application submitted for a new premises licence. The proposed extension of hours would have a negative impact on the promotion of the licensing objectives, in particular, the prevention of crime and disorder and the prevention of public nuisance given the character of the surrounding area.

The premises is located within the Shoreditch SPA which is an area highlighted as suffering from the cumulative impact caused by the concentration of licensed premises in the area. The applicant does not appear to have included any information in order to rebut the Special Policy at LP10 of the Council Licensing Statement which states:

## **LP10 Special Policy Areas – Dalston and Shoreditch**

It is the Council's policy that where a relevant representation is made to any application within the area of the Dalston SPA or Shoreditch SPA, the applicant will need to demonstrate that the proposed activity and the operation of the premises will not add to the cumulative impact that is currently being experienced in these areas. This policy is to be strictly applied. It should also be noted that the:

- quality and track record of the management;
- good character of the applicant; and
- extent of any variation sought

May not be in itself sufficient.

It should be noted that if an applicant can demonstrate that they will not add to the cumulative impact in their operating schedule and at any hearing, then the Core Hours Policy within LP3 will apply.

The applicant may therefore wish to make further submissions in relation to the above matters.

## **Conditions derived from the Operating Schedule**

1. A comprehensive CCTV system that ensures all areas of the licensed premises are monitored, including all entry points, and which enables frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. All cameras shall continually record whilst the premises are in operation and the recording shall be kept available for a minimum of 31 days with time and date stamping. Recording shall be made available to a duly authorised Hackney Council officer or a police officer together with facilities for viewing. The recordings for the preceding 31 days shall be made available immediately onrequest. The CCTV system shall be operated in accordance with the DataProtection Act 1998 and any other relevant legislation.

- 2. Adequate/improved security lighting outside the premises with consideration being given to light pollution of neighbouring properties. All entrances to the venue to be lit and painted white to enable better quality of CCTV images for identification purposes.
- 3. Premises to operate a zero tolerance policy to drugs and comply with the Hackney Police/Council Community Safety Unit Drugs and Weapons Policy.
- 4. Toilets to be checked by staff randomly and at least once per hour after 2000 and an entry made in a register and made immediately available to police at a reasonable request.
- 5. Premises will provide the police with a dispersal policy and comply with its contents to ensure that all patrons leave the venue and the vicinity quickly and quietly. Notices to be displayed at exit requesting that patrons respect the needs of local residents and leave the premises and the area quietly.
- 6. All instances of crime or disorder to be reported by the designated premises supervisor or responsible member of staff to an agreed police contact point.
- 7. The Licence Holder shall provide and maintain a dedicated telephone number of the Designated Premises Supervisor for use by anyResponsible Authority or any person who may wish to make a complaint during the operation of the licence. This shall be provided to the Licensing Authority, Police and local Residents Associations. The Licence Holder shall ensure that any changes to these details are sent to these parties within seven days.
- 8. The Licence Holder shall ensure that the details of all complaints are recorded in an occurrence book.
