6. GUIDANCE CONSIDERATIONS

6.1 The Licensing Authority is required to have regard to any guidance issued by the Secretary of State under the Licensing Act 2003.

7. POLICY CONSIDERATIONS

- 7.1 Licensing Sub-Committee is required to have regard to the London Borough of Hackney's Statement of Licensing Policy ("the Policy") adopted by the Licensing Authority.
- 7.2 The Policy applies to applications where relevant representations have been made. With regard to this application, policies, LP1 (General Principles), LP2 (Licensing Objectives), LP3 (Core Hours), LP4 ('Off' Sales of Alcohol) and LP10 (Special Policy Areas Dalston and Shoreditch) are relevant.

8. OFFICER OBSERVATIONS

- 8.1 If the Sub-Committee is minded to approve the application, the following conditions should be applied the licence:
 - 1. There shall be CCTV cameras recording 24/7 within and outside the premises and allow Police to access CCTV footage.
 - 2. Proof of age ID verification shall be operated at the premises.
 - 3. Noise of vibration generated on the premises will be maintained at a level not disruptive of neighbours.
 - 4. Ventilation and extract systems are designed and maintained so as to prevent noxious smells causing a nuisance to nearby properties.

9. REASONS FOR OFFICER OBSERVATIONS

9.1 Conditions 1 to 4 above are derived from the applicant's operating schedule.

9. LEGAL COMMENTS

- 9.1 The Council has a duty as a Licensing Authority under the Licensing Act 2003 to carry out its functions with a view to promoting the following 4 licensing objectives;
 - The Prevention of Crime and Disorder
 - Public Safety
 - Prevention of Public Nuisance
 - The Protection of Children from Harm
- 9.2 It should be noted that each of the licensing objectives have equal importance and are the only grounds upon which a relevant representation can be made and for which an application can be refused or terms and conditions attached to a licence.

10. HUMAN RIGHTS ACT 1998 IMPLICATIONS

- 10.1 There are implications to:
 - *Article 6* Right to a fair hearing
 - *Article 14* Not to discriminate
 - Balancing: **Article 1-** Peaceful enjoyment of their possession (i.e. a licence is defined as being a possession) with **Article 8** Right of Privacy (i.e. respect private & family life) to achieve a proportionate decision having regard to the protection of an individuals rights against the interests of the community at large.





Representations (which include comments and/or objections) in relation to:

Police make the following representations for the premises licence application at The Donor Store 468 Kingsland Road.

The applicant is seeking a premises licence for late night refreshment Sunday to Thursday 2300-0200hours and Fridays and Saturdays 2300-0400hours. They are also seeking a licence for the supply of alcohol both on and off sales Sunday – Thursday 1100-0200hours and Friday and Saturday 1100-0400hours.

This premises is located within the boundaries of the Dalston Special Policy area (SPA) the SPA has been recognised as an area where there is a high density of licensed premises. The applicant has sought on sales as part of their application yet the plan submitted by the applicant shows no clear definition of the licensable area.

It should also be noted that the hours sought by the applicant far exceed those laid out in the London Borough Hackney Statement of licensing Policy which states in LP3 as Monday to Thursday 08:00 to 23:00, Friday and Saturday 08:00 to 00:00, and Sunday 10:00 to 22:30. In addition to this LP4 also states In relation to off sales that Hours for the supply of alcohol will generally be restricted to between 08:00 and 23:00.

In addition to the above the venue is located below residential premises and as such police are concerned that the granting of a licence to such a late hours will have an impact on the quality of life for local resident as avenue opening to such a late hour offering food and alcohol is likely to attract those leaving nearby bars.

Police would ask the following of the applicant:

- -Are the proposed saes of alcohol to be ancillary to the sales of food?
- -What steps does the applicant intend to take in order to minimise any disruption to local residents?
- -The applicant is seeking on sales of alcohol. What capacity of customers is the applicant seeking in relation to this?
- -Will the applicant be doing a delivery? If so how will they manage the disruption that the delivery vehicles may cause?

Police are concerned that the granting of the licence particularly to the hours applied for will undermine the Licensing objectives, namely crime and disorder and public nuisance

The applicant is seeking a premises licence for late night refreshment and the supply of alcohol for on and off sales between the following hours;

Sunday to Thursday 11:00 to 02:00 Friday and Saturday 11:00 to 04:00

The premises are located in the Dalston special policy area and the hours sought are in excess of the Core Hours Policy set out within LP3 of the council's licensing policy.

The Licensing Authority is concerned that the grant of this premises licence may lead to the Prevention of Public Nuisance licensing objective being undermined given the locality, hours and activities sought.

The applicant has not demonstrated in the application how they would not add to the cumulative impact of licensed premises already experienced in the area. The supply of alcohol on and off sales for the hours sought may also be particularly problematic, the applicant has offered no conditions in relation to the supply of alcohol and could effectively operate as a bar at the discretion of the operator(s).

With the premises being located within the Dalston special policy area, removing alcohol sales entirely from the application should also be considered.

The Licensing Authority feels that the applicant has not demonstrated an understanding of the locality and licensing policy as set out in the Revised Guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 (April 2018), chapters 8.41, 8.42 and 8.43.

The Licensing Authority feels the following suggested amendments may be more suitable for this premises licence application.

An amendment to the hours for licensable activity and opening to match the core hours set out in LP3 of the council's licensing policy.

The following conditions;

"Alcohol shall not be sold, supplied, or consumed on the premises otherwise than to persons who are taking substantial table meals and/or takeaway/delivery meals and that the consumption of alcohol by such persons is ancillary to taking such meals."

"Any alcohol sold or supplied [for consumption off the premises] must be in a sealed container."

LP10 Special Policy Areas - Dalston and Shoreditch

It is the Council's policy that where a relevant representation is made to any application within the area of the Dalston SPA or Shoreditch SPA, the applicant will need to demonstrate that the

proposed activity and the operation of the premises will not add to the cumulative impact that is currently being experienced in these areas. This policy is to be strictly applied. It should also be noted that the;

- quality and track record of the management;
- good character of the applicant; and
- extent of any variation sought

May not be in itself sufficient. It should be noted that if an applicant can demonstrate that they will not add to the cumulative impact in their operating schedule and at any hearing, then the Core Hours Policy within LP3 will apply

LP3 Core Hours

Hours for licensable activity will generally be authorised, subject to demonstrating LP 1 and LP2, as follows:

- Monday to Thursday 08:00 to 23:00
- Friday and Saturday 08:00 to 00:00
- Sunday 10:00 to 22:30

Hours may be more restrictive dependent on the character of the area and if the individual circumstances require it.

Later hours may be considered where the applicant has identified any risk that may undermine the promotion of the licensing objectives and has put in place robust measures to mitigate those risks.

Whilst living in a vibrant part of Dalston, I accept a certain amount of noise and atmosphere comes as part of the package, however, I would ask that you consider taking into account a reasonable closing time.


Therefore, the hours requested above by The Doner Store would be very much outside the status quo that exists currently, and it is for that reason I object to their application for late-night refreshment.

I am writing to comment on the proposition for the following from 468 Kingsland Road, E8 4AE:

Supply of alcohol consumption on and off the premises:
Sunday to Thursday from 11:00 am to 02:00 am
and Friday & Saturday from 11:00 am to 04:00 am

Late Night Refreshment:
Sunday to Thursday from 11:00 pm to 02:00 am
and Friday & Saturday from 11:00 pm to 04:00 am.

I object to the late-night refreshment application on the grounds that this is beyond the opening hours for similar local providers (local restaurants and bars) and there is no requirement for such service in the community for opening hours beyond midnight. Additionally, there is no seating area within the premises and The Doner store has established a seating area on the pavement. Therefore, a late licence would not be contained within the premises and would result in a congregation of people on the street. I believe that opening hours beyond this time pose a significant risk of antisocial behaviour and noise disturbance which would be of detriment to nearby residents and community.

Regarding the request for supply of alcohol consumption, currently, The Doner Store does not accommodate consumption of food/drink within its building and only facilitates 'on-site' dining in the additional seating area located on the pavement. I therefore suggest that without appropriate facilities, it would be inadvisable to grant permission for the supply of alcohol which would be consumed on the pavement, adding to the risk of antisocial behaviour and noise disturbance. Furthermore, there are several nearby establishments supplying alcohol in the vicinity and therefore I feel there is no need for this additional service in the community. For these reasons, I object the application for supply of alcohol on and off the premises.
