## 6. GUIDANCE CONSIDERATIONS

6.1 The Licensing Authority is required to have regard to any guidance issued by the Secretary of State under the Licensing Act 2003.

## 7. POLICY CONSIDERATIONS

- 7.1 Licensing Sub-Committee is required to have regard to the London Borough of Hackney's Statement of Licensing Policy ("the Policy") adopted by the Licensing Authority.
- 7.2 The Policy applies to applications where relevant representations have been made. With regard to this application, policies, LP1 (General Principles), LP2 (Licensing Objectives) and LP11 (Cumulative Impact-General) are relevant.

## 8. OFFICER OBSERVATIONS

8.1 If the Sub-Committee is minded to approve the application, the following conditions should be applied the licence:

## Supply Of Alcohol (On/Both)

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:
  - (a) At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence.
  - (b) At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 3. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
  - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises -
  - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;
  - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
  - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);

- (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
- (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- 4. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 5. 5.1. The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sales or supply of alcohol.
  - 5.2 The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licences must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
  - 5.3. The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years if age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either:-
    - A. a holographic mark or
    - B. an ultraviolet feature.
- 6. The responsible person shall ensure that:
  - a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures:
  - beer or cider: 1/2 pint;
  - gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25ml or 35ml; and
  - still wine in a glass: 125ml; and
    - a. these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
    - b. where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

## **Minimum Drinks Pricing**

7. 7.1 A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

- 7.2 For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 7.1 above -
- (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
- (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula P = D+(DxV) Where -
- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol:
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -
- (i) the holder of the premises licence,
- (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 7.3 Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8.2(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 7.4 (1) Sub-paragraph 7.4(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 7.2(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

## **Conditions derived from Responsible Authority representations**

- 8. The premises shall install, operate and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of a Metropolitan Police. All public areas and each entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or other authorised officer.
- 9. There shall be a staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system on the premises at all times when the premises are open to the public. This staff member must be able to show a Police or authorised council officer recent data or footage when requested.

- 10. Signs will be prominently displayed at all entrance and exit points reminding customers to leave quietly and respect local residents.
- 11. A Challenge 25 proof of age scheme shall be operated at the premises where the only acceptable forms of identification are recognised photographic identification cards, such as driving licence or passport.
- 12. Sales of alcohol shall be for consumption on the premises only.
- 13. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to an authorised officer of the council or the police, which will record the following.
  - a. All crimes reported:
  - b. All ejections of patrons
  - c. Any complaints received.
  - d. Any incidents of disorder.
  - e. Seizure of drugs or offensive weapons.
  - f. Any faults in the CCTV system.
  - g. Any refusal of the sale of alcohol.
  - h. Any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.
- 14. Premises to operate zero tolerance policy to drugs and comply with Hackney Police Drugs and Weapons policy where appropriate.
- 15. All instances of crime and disorder to be reported by the Designated Premises Supervisor or responsible member of staff to an agreed police contact point, as agreed with the police.
- 16. All staff shall receive training on the legislation relating to the sales of alcohol to underage persons and drunken persons and shall have refresher training every 12 months. There shall be written records of such training, which will be kept on the premises and produced to a police officer or other authorised officer upon request.
- 17. Catering/ Event staff shall ensure that any queues that may form outside of the premises in connection with the provision of licensable activities are managed to ensure that there is no obstruction to the footway and do not cause any nuisance to the local residents.
- 18. Smoking shall only be permitted on balconies on floors 2 5 inclusive and in an area to the right of the entrance on Luke Street. No more than 5 smokers who have been provided with licensable activities on the premises shall be permitted on a balcony at any one time; and no more than 10 shall be permitted to congregate in the smoking area on Luke Street at any one time. After 10pm, no more than 5 smokers who have been provided with licensable activities on the premises, shall be permitted to congregate on Luke Street.
- 19. The licence holder shall maintain a dedicated telephone number of the DPS or Duty manager for use by any responsible authority or any person wishing to make a complaint. This number shall be provided to the licensing authority, police or local residents upon request.
- 20. There shall be a written dispersal policy at the premises relating to the provision of licensable activities. All catering/ event staff shall be briefed on this policy. A copy of the policy shall be kept on the premises and shall be produced to a police officer or other authorised officer upon request.

## 9. REASONS FOR OFFICER OBSERVATIONS

9.1 Conditions 8 to 20 agreed with the Police and condition 18 agreed with environmental protection.

## 10. LEGAL COMMENTS

- 10.1 The Council has a duty as a Licensing Authority under the Licensing Act 2003 to carry out its functions with a view to promoting the following 4 licensing objectives:
  - The Prevention of Crime and Disorder
  - Public Safety
  - Prevention of Public Nuisance
  - The Protection of Children from Harm
- 10.2 It should be noted that each of the licensing objectives have equal importance and are the only grounds upon which a relevant representation can be made and for which an application can be refused or terms and conditions attached to a licence.

## 11. HUMAN RIGHTS ACT 1998 IMPLICATIONS

- 11.1 There are implications to;
  - *Article 6* Right to a fair hearing
  - Article 14 Not to discriminate
  - Balancing: Article 1- Peaceful enjoyment of their possession (i.e. a licence is defined as being a possession) with Article 8 Right of Privacy (i.e. respect private & family life) to achieve a proportionate decision having regard to the protection of an individuals rights against the interests of the community at large.

# a) General – all four licensing objectives (b, c, d and e) (please read guidance note 10)

The premises are already required to comply with existing and future legislation to include (but not limited to) legislation on safety, health and environmental issues, fire safety, planning, building regulations, disability discrimination, trading standards, weights and measures, crime and disorder and security industry legislation. The licence holder is also required to comply with the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003. The measures covered by various legislation should not be repeated in the premises licence in accordance with the section 182 Guidance to Licensing Authorities.

## b) The prevention of crime and disorder

The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of a Metropolitan Police Crime Prevention Officer. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping.

Recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the preceding 31 day period. A staff member who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises is open to the public. This staff member will be able to show a Police or authorised council officer recent data or footage with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.

The Licensee will adopt a "Challenge 25" policy where all customers who appear to be under the age of 25 and attempt to purchase alcohol or other age-restricted products shall be asked for proof of their age.

All Food and Beverage Staff to undergo training on induction as to the requirements under the Licensing Act 2003 including underage sales and proof of age and to receive refresher training at least annually.

An incident log and a refusals log will be maintained by the premises that shall, as a minimum, detail: incidents of note that occur in the premises; refused sales; disorder; and ejections. The logs shall be kept on the premises and be available for inspection at all times the premises is open, and management shall regularly check to ensure the logs are being used by all relevant staff.

All sales of alcohol for consumption 'off' the premises shall be in sealed containers and for consumption away from the premises.

- 2. In terms of specific regulated entertainments please note that:
  - Plays: no licence is required for performances between 08:00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
  - Films: no licence is required for 'not-for-profit' film exhibition held in community premises between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day provided that the audience does not exceed 500 and the organiser (a) gets consent to the screening from a person who is responsible for the



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

To whom it may concern,

I would like to make an objection to part of the licensing application by Rise, 41 Luke Street, EC2A 4DP on the grounds of prevention of public nuisance.

I live to Rise in Victoria Chambers - and although the people using 41 Luke Street are generally quiet, there are regular occasions, particularly on summer evenings, when groups of people gather outside to talk after leaving meetings/events.

There are 20+ flats that have bedrooms and living rooms within 20 metres of the entrance to Rise, where the noise from the people in the street outside Rise can get so loud, it can drown out our normal home life.

Given that Rise has been set up to nurture business rather than as a space for socialising, I feel that there is no case for Rise to be licensed beyond 9pm any day and no case at all for licensing on weekends.

Giving Rise a later license or a weekend license will only encourage the space to be used for purely social events. If Rise wants to hold later events, there are already venues with later licenses they could hire in the area.

In the council's Statement of Licensing Policy, it states that: "The Council's vision is to achieve balanced, sustainable communities and neighbourhoods which celebrate our diversity and share in London's growing prosperity, to enable a good quality of life for all.".

Allowing Rise a 7 day a week license would damage the quality of life for people in and around Rise.



I am making a comment/objection to the alcohol license application made by Rise, 41 Luke St, EC2A 4DP (applicant name ISS UK Ltd).

As a resident who lives to Rise I object to the late license hours applied for due to the negative effect this will have to people who live opposite and nearby to the building.

Rise holds regular events attracting large numbers of people, with a constant flow of guest arriving and leaving the building and surrounding area throughout the day. This can cause considerable public nuisance to those living in Victoria Chambers, a residential block of flats immediately opposite Rise (60 x flats) on Luke Street and for people who live in apartments on the adjacent Paul Street, Mark Street, Leonard Street.

Since Rise has occupied the premises there have been noise issues from people congregating and drinking on the street outside the entrance. To be fair, Rise management have responded to resident concerns and instigated a 'no drinking on the street' policy for their events; the current management are approachable and do listen to concerns. However, as they have many events and changing staff this is not always adhered to. I request that any license change is for drinking inside the premises only and for this to be part of the license agreement.

The late hours of 8:00 - 23:00 Mon-Thurs, 8:00 - 00:00 Fri-Sat and 10:00 - 22:30 Sun should be limited to a more reasonable times taking into account the additional noise, disturbance and public nuisance this will bring to residents. The late hours will also bring noise and disturbance from taxis etc. At times this public nuisance has affected us not being able to work without being disturbed, have our evenings interrupted and not able to have windows open.

My main concerns are:

- the hours are too late for what is also a residential neighbourhood.
- no drinking on the street outside the premises at 41 Luke Street.
- people arriving and leaving are asked to do so in a quiet manner.
