TEMPORARY EVENT NOTICE – COUNTER NOTICE: Basement, 8 Stoke Newington Road, London, N16 7XN	Ward Shacklewell	

1. SUMMARY

1.1 The Police and Environmental Protection have given the Licensing Authority and the premises user notice of objection to Temporary Event Notices for an event to be held on 06/08/2021 from 22:00 finishing on 08/08/2021 at 04:00am at above premises. The Licensing Authority must hold a hearing to decide whether or not to allow the event to proceed.

2. RECOMMENDATION

2.1 That the Licensing Sub-Committee consider the issuing of counter notices if it is satisfied that any of the licensing objectives would be undermined if the premises were to be used in accordance with the temporary event notice.

3. TEMPORARY EVENT NOTICES - BACKGROUND

- 3.1 Part 5 the Licensing Act 2003 permits small scale events to take place at which alcohol will be sold or other licensable activities will take place. The numbers attending the event must not exceed 499 people and there are restrictions on the number of events that can be held per year.
- 3.2 The individual must give notice of her/his intention to hold the event to the Licensing Authority, police and environmental health at least 10 working days (or 5 days in the event of a late notice) before the event is scheduled to take place by issuing a Temporary Event Notice (TEN). The event will be permitted to take place unless the Licensing Authority issues a counter notice.
- 3.3 The Licensing Authority can issue a counter notice if the number of permitted events has been exceeded or if, upon consideration of an 'objection notice' given by the police or those in the Council that exercise environmental health functions, it is satisfied that the event would undermine one or more of the licensing objectives.

3.4 If the police or those in the Council that exercise environmental health functions give an objection notice to the Licensing Authority, the Authority must convene a hearing to consider if it wishes to issue a counter notice. If the Authority determines to issue a counter notice it must give two copies to the premises user – a notice of its decision and a notice of the reasons for its decision. The decision must be made and the notices given at least 24 hours before the event is to begin. There is a right of appeal to the magistrates' court against the giving of a counter notice as a result of an objection notice

4. BACKGROUND

4.1 The premises are not licensed under Licensing Act 2003.

5. TEMPORARY EVENT NOTICE FOR EVENT TO BE HELD 06/08/2021 - 08/08/2021

- 5.1 A TEN has been submitted to allow licensable activities to take place on the premises. A copy of the Temporary Event Notice and additional information is attached as Appendix A.
- 5.2 The Police and Environmental Protection have objected to the TEN on the grounds of the prevention of crime and disorder, public safety, public nuisance and protection of children from harm. A copy of the Police and Environmental Protection objection is attached as Appendix B1 & B2.

6. HUMAN RIGHTS ACT 1998 IMPLICATIONS

- 6.1 There are implications for:
 - **Article 6** Right to a fair hearing
 - Article 14 Not to discriminate
 - Balancing; Article 1- Peaceful enjoyment of their possession (i.e. a licence is defined as being a possession) with Article 8 Right of Privacy (i.e. respect private & family life) to achieve a proportionate decision having regard to the protection of an individuals rights against the interests of the community at large.

7. MEMBERS DECISION MAKING

A. Option 1

That the Licensing Authority decides not to give a counter notice.

B. Option 2

That the Licensing Authority decides to give a counter notice, giving the reasons for the decision.

8. CONCLUSION

8.1 That Members decide whether or not to issue a counter notice for the event scheduled to take place on **06/08/2021** from **22:00** finishing on **08/08/2021** at **04:00am** at location **above**.

Dear PC Giles,

I write in response to your objection to the Temporary Events Notice (TEN) application for 6th -8th August 2021

"Police object to the granting of this TEN for the above location on 6th-8th August 2021on the grounds of on the grounds of crime and disorder, public safety, the prevention of public nuisance and the protection of children from harm for the following reason(s):

On 11th July 2021 Officers from the Police licensing team found the venue open and operating without a licence. The applicant was present at the time and admitted to selling alcohol without a licence.

Despite an A board was outside the venue advertising £15 entry to watch England vs Italy. Initially Mr Steele tried to tell officers it was a private party but when the officers questioned further he informed officers the entry charge was because his sons friends were happy to pay. His story changed from giving away thr alcohol to only charging the customers inside.

This visit alone means we lack confidence and trust in Mr Steele to operate such an event whilst upholding the licence objectives. His complete disregard for the licence legislation means we struggle to see how he will operate responsibly. Furthermore the venue is in an area heavily saturated with licenced premises, such an extension passed core hours in such an area calls for a responsible and strict operator, this is not something I believe the applicant is.

I also question if this TENs is actually for what it is described- a surprise party over a two day period".

I would like to respond to comments and hopefully allay your concerns in reverse order.

- I'm unsure as to why you question the purpose of the TEN. Prior to the pandemic, we have consistently held family parties during the first 2 weeks of August as we have several family members with birthdays over this period including my partner and my son. 'TEN's were granted in 2018 for 18th 19th for 10pm to 5am and in 2019 for 9th 10th for 10pm to 3am.
 - The events were enjoyable, successful and without incident and indeed you are most welcomed to visit and check on either night.
- Your lack of confidence in my ability to responsibly operate the event and uphold the licence objectives is somewhat unfair as I have held multiple 'Temporary Events' (the last two years prior to the pandemic 20 TEN's are listed below), all without incident.

WHILST I TAKE FULL RESPONSIBILTY FOR WHAT OCCURRED with regard the your visit on 11th July 2021 when England Vs Italy, the circumstances were as follows:-

When England reached the final of the European Championship, it was arranged that our social club members could view the match from our premises. My youngest son is captain of a local football team and the hold some club meetings in our venue. He invited team members to also come and view the 'finals' match from our premises for a fee.

Un-beknowing to me and prior to the start of the match, he placed a notice outside the building to this effect.

When yourself and other officers came into the building and notified me of the sign, I immediately and angrily asked my son to remove it and this was done. I also introduced you to to confirm the above.

You noted the displayed Club Prices List and I pointed out to you that this cheap price list was only used for sales to our social members for when we had allowable club events.

Admittedly my son did receive payment from some of his colleagues for drinks and he was severely reprimanded for such.

In summary, I take the responsibility of upholding the licensing objectives very seriously and have done so over several years without incident. I welcome your input and advice on any areas where you feel this can be improved upon.

I kindly ask that you reconsider your objection.

As a Responsible Authority the Environmental Protection Team have been asked to consult on the above application with regards to the licensing objective, the Prevention of Public Nuisance.

A site visit to the above premises was conducted on 5th March 2020 in the presence of the applicant Mr Steele.

The premises occupies the basement floor of a of three-storey terrace building facing on to the busy A10. The terrace comprises of commercial use on the ground floor with residential accommodation on the first and second floors.

If the Council is mindful to grant this application for a new Premises Licence, the applicant will benefit from the following licensable activities;

1) Regulated Entertainment

Films, Indoor Sporting, Live Music, Recorded Music, Performance of dance

10.00 - 01.00 Sunday to Wednesday,

10.00 – 03.00 Thursday

10.00 - 05.00 Friday & Saturday

2) Provision of Late Night Refreshment

23.00 - 01.00 Sunday to Wednesday,

23.00 - 03.00 Thursday

23.00 – 05.00 Friday & Saturday

3) Sale by Retail of Alcohol

12.00 - 01.00 Sunday to Wednesday,

12.00 – 03.00 Thursday

12.00 – 05.00 Friday & Saturday

Noise breakout from the building envelope was minimal when loud amplified music was played within the basement area. A sound limiting device is installed on the premises which controls the music noise level on the in-house music system. The designated smoking area is located to the rear of the premises overlooking Shacklewell Road. I was advised that the designated smoking area is constantly supervised when in use and restricted to no more than 10 people at any one time.

Our records confirm that over the past 12 months from 10th March 2019 to 10th March 2020 the premises has been granted 13 temporary event notices (TENs). Details of these TENs are listed below.

I can confirm from the Council's noise database that there have been no noise complaints registered against any of these TENs.

Nevertheless I am conscious that with the granting of a premises licence, the use of the premises and frequency of events will enviably increase as well as the potential for public nuisance.

I therefore suggest the additional conditions (1) to (7) below which were agreed in principle to promote the licensing objective, the prevention of public nuisance.

- 1) A sound limiting device within the premises shall be installed to control all amplified sound generated on the premises. The device shall be approved by and set to the Council's satisfaction and thereafter maintained for the duration of use. No additional noise generating equipment shall be used on the premises without being routed through the sound limiting device.
- 2) Amplified sound (Live music or prerecorded music) on the premises shall be played at such a level so as not to cause nuisance to any un-associated noise sensitive premises.
- 3) Wall mounted speakers installed in the premises shall be isolated from the existing building structure to prevent the transmission of vibration or reradiated noise breaking out into any un-associated or noise sensitive premises.
- 4) All doors (excluding the front door at street level) shall be kept closed when regulated entertainment is in operation, except for the immediate ingress and egress of patrons.
- 5) Notices shall be prominently displayed at all exits requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and businesses and leave the area quietly.
- 6) The designated smoking area shall be located to the rear of the premises overlooking Shacklewell Lane. The number of patrons utilising the designated smoking area (which shall be supervised) shall not exceed 6 people at any one time.
- 7) No collections of waste or recycling materials including the movement of glass bottles within or from the premises shall take place between 11pm and 7am.

As Council Officers are unable to impose conditions without going through the formal hearing process, I have forwarded this email to you in anticipation that you are in agreement with the above suggested conditions (1) - (7) as additional conditions on your premises licence.

If you are in agreement, may I suggest you reply with the following wording highlighted in bold below, remember to copy and paste the 7 conditions into your response.

I, Mr Ian Steele have read conditions (1) - (7) suggested by the Environmental Protection Team. I am happy to amend my operating schedule to include the conditions (1) - (7) listed below as additional conditions on my premises licence.

DISPERSAL POLICY

Club No8 is aware of the importance of ensuring that customers leave our premises as quietly as possible. We are aware that due to our location, safe dispersal and departure from our premises is of greater importance for our customers.

We will ensure that at peak trading times, which varies by event, that a designated security staff member will be responsible to manage and control customers when arriving, during their stay and when leaving.

Customers will be encouraged to prepare for dispersal by:

- 1. Announcing final music to be played/performed and calling for last drinking orders so that there is adequate entertainment and "drinking-up time".
- 2. Staff encouraging customers to finish their drinks and prepare to leave in plenty of time.
- 3. Adequate signage displayed.

Customers will be directed by staff and signage towards the staircases leading to both the front and back exits.

Staff members will be present at the top and outside both exits points and will encourage customers to disperse quietly and quickly towards Shacklewell Lane, at the rear and Stoke Newington Road, at the front, where there are various transport options available.

Staff and Door Supervisors roles will include the following:-

- 1. To encourage customers to leave the premises in a quiet and orderly manner.
- 2. Not to allow any drinks to be taken outside the building.
- 3. If a group of customers are found to be loitering near the building then they will be politely asked to move on as guickly as possible.

General Manager's role

It is ultimately the responsibility of the General Manager to ensure that:-

- 1. Door supervisors and other staff act effectively and responsibly to comply with this policy and are aware of the importance of customers leaving as safely and quietly as possible.
- 2. Customers do not cause any disturbance or nuisance to any local residents within the vicinity of the premises.

To prioritise and assist wherever possible in ensuring that customers leave as safely, quietly and in an orderly manner as possible.

Despite an A board was outside the venue advertising £15 entry to watch England vs Italy. Initially Mr Steele tried to tell officers it was a private party but when the officers questioned further he informed officers the entry charge was because his sons friends were happy to pay. His story changed from giving away thr alcohol to only charging the customers inside.

This visit alone means we lack confidence and trust in Mr Steele to operate such an event whilst upholding the licence objectives. His complete disregard for the licence legislation means we struggle to see how he will operate responsibly. Furthermore the venue is in an area heavily saturated with licenced premises, such an extension passed core hours in such an area calls for a responsible and strict operator, this is not something I believe the applicant is.

I also question if this TENs is actually for what it is described- a surprise party over a two day period.
