The three variations we are proposing are as follows: Permission to show films on a Sunday night To extend our opening hours and trading hours to 23:30 on Sundays To allow customers to drink outside until 23:00 seven days a week			
Approximately seven years ago when we applied to extend our trading hours, a condition was applied to our license which states that customers must not drink in our terrace area after 10pm. To my knowledge, there was no specific reason for this condition to have been imposed - if I recall it was merely a negotiation so that we would be allowed slightly extended trading hours for the pub in general.			
In light of Covid and the restictions placed on our business, as well as the positive health implications of being seated outside, we would like to now have the option of letting customers drink outside until 23:00. We are a small venue, so restrictions on the hours we can trade really make a big difference to our business being viable. We only have space for 40 customers outside, so it's not a large rowdy beer-garden, but an extra hour of trading each day would make a massive difference to the survival of the pub.			
I don't feel that this will have a negative effect on any interested parties, and would make opening viable for us under such restrictive circumstances. We would use our upmost dilligence to ensure that customers are quiet and respectful of neighbours at all times. Many customers would feel safer being able to sit outside due to better ventilation to avoid Covid infection.			
We would also like to start hosting an independent film night at the pub on a Sunday. We feel that this would benefit the local community, and be an excellent showcase of local talent, with such talented film makers living in Hackney. For this reason, we'd like to apply to have slightly later closing times on a Sunday: to stop trading at 23:30 as opposed to 22:30. We'd also like to have the approval to show films. We'll of course source the correct licenses for each film.

Allowing guests to drink outside for longer rather than inside would make our business more viable in light of Covid restrictions and would also help ease the speading of the virus. We will

ensure that customers keep all sound levels to a minimum whilst outside the pub, and that all customers leave the vicinity in a quiet and considerate manor.

### b) The prevention of crime and disorder

objectives as a result of the proposed variation:

We will ensure that customers do not drink too much alcohol. Anyone who is drunk will not be served any more alcohol, but be asked to drink some water before being asked to leave the venue safely.

We have CCTV that is monitored as a deterant for any crime or antisocial behaviour, and on busy shifts we have doorstaff who make sure that no weapons are brought into the premises, no drugs are on site and that no violence or antisocial behaviour is allowed.

Staff are dilligent in monitoring the bar and terrace to make sure customers are safe as well as being mindful in detecting thieves, pickpockets, drug use etc

### c) Public safety

As mentioned in section b) our staff are extremely dilligent in ensuring that all customers are safe. Staff won't allow any excessive consumption of alcohol, aggressive behaviour, drug use etc.

On busy shift our door staff will provide extra security in ensuring the safety of our customers and staff.

### d) The prevention of public nuisance

We will continue to ensure that customers are quiet when seated outside on our terrace. Staff and door staff monitor sound levels to ensure that voices are kept to an acceptable level. No recorded or live music will be played outside to ensure the sound levels are minimal.

Staff and door staff also ask customers to disperse and move away from the premises quietly, especially at clsoing time.

Combined fighting sports defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling with one or more martial arts are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an indoor sporting event.
  - Live music: no licence permission is required for:
    - a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.

Police submit the following representations for the premises licence variation at 99 Dalston Lane. The venue is a public house situated on a busy road in a residential area. They are seeking to vary the licence to extend the supply of alcohol on Sundays until 2300hours Monday – Sunday, permission to show films on a Sunday and to amend to condition 21 to read the outside space and seating area at the front of the premises shall not be used after 23:00hrs. As previously mentioned this is a residential area. Police are concerned that the extension of hours for the external area will have an impact on the local residents due to noise levels. It should also be noted that LP6 of the London borough of Hackneys Statement of Licensing policy states 'The Licensing Authority will normally restrict external areas and outdoor activity to between 08:00 and 22:00 unless the applicant can demonstrate that comprehensive control measures have been implemented that ensure the promotion of the licensing objectives, in particular the public nuisance objective.' The applicant is also seeking to extend their hours for supply of alcohol to 2330hours LP3 of the aforementioned policy gives the cores hours for Sunday as 1000-2230hours. Police would ask the following of the applicant what provisions does the applicant intend to put in place in order to offset any negative effect that the proposed variations may have on the licencing objectives and limit any effect that there may be on local residents? Police believe that without sufficient measures in place the proposed will undermine the licensing objectives namely public nuisance.

# **Annex 1 - Mandatory Conditions**

Supply of Alcohol

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:
  - (a) At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence.
  - (b) At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 3. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
  - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises -
  - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;
  - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
  - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
  - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
  - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
  - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
  - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- 4. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

- 5. 5.1. The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sales or supply of alcohol.
  - 5.2 The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licences must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
  - 5.3. The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years if age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either:-
    - A. a holographic mark or
    - B. an ultraviolet feature.
- 6. The responsible person shall ensure that:
  - a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures:
  - beer or cider: 1/2 pint;
  - gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25ml or 35ml; and
  - still wine in a glass: 125ml; and
    - a. these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
    - b. where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

## **Minimum Drinks Pricing**

- 7. 7.1 A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
  - 7.2 For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 7.1 above -
  - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979:
  - (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula P = D+(DxV) Where -
  - (i)P is the permitted price,
  - (ii)D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
  - (iii)V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
  - (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -
  - (i) the holder of the premises licence,
  - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or

- (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence:
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 7.3 Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8.2(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 7.4 (1) Sub-paragraph 7.4(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 7.2(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

# Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

## **Conditions derived from Responsible Authority representations**

- 8. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of a Metropolitan Police Crime Prevention Officer. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the preceding 31-day period.
- 9. There shall be a staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system on the premises at all times when the premises are open to the public. This staff member must be able to show a Police or authorised council officer recent data or footage when requested.
- 10. Signs will be prominently displayed at all exit points reminding customers to leave quietly and respect local residents.
- 11. Signs will be prominently displayed in any smoking areas reminding

- customers to leave quietly and respect local residents.
- 12. A Challenge 25 proof of age scheme shall be operated at the premises where the only acceptable forms of identification are recognised photographic identification cards, such as driving licence or passport.
- 13. There shall be a personal licence holder on duty whenever alcohol is being sold.
- 14. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to an authorised officer of the council or the police, which will record the following.
  - 1. All crimes reported:
  - 2. All ejections of patrons
  - 3. Any complaints received.
  - 4. Any incidents of disorder.
  - 5. Seizure of drugs or offensive weapons.
  - 6. Any faults in the CCTV system or searching equipment or scanning equipment.
  - 7. Any refusal of the sale of alcohol.
  - 8. Any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.
- 15. The premises will have a written dispersal policy that ensures that all patrons exiting the venue are encouraged to leave the area quickly and quietly.
- 16. Premises to operate zero tolerance policy to drugs and comply with Hackney Police Drugs, Weapons and Theft policy where appropriate.
- 17. All staff will be given refresher training every twelve months on the legislation relating to the sales of alcohol to underage persons and drunken persons. There shall be written records kept which can be produced to a police officer or other authorised officer upon request.
- 18. No noise shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises which gives rise to a nuisance.
- 19. No waste or recyclable materials including bottles, shall be moved, removed from or placed in outside areas between 2300hrs and 0800hrs on the following day.
- 20. Patrons will not be allowed to take drinks, glass or open containers outside of the building at any time, except for those customers sat in the designated seating area at the front of the premises.
- 21. The outside space and seating area at the front of the premises shall not be used after 22:00hrs.
- 22. All 'off sales' of alcohol will be sold in sealed containers to be taken and consumed away from the premises.
