I write in relation to the application submitted to vary the premises licence.

The proposal could have a negative impact on the promotion of the licensing objectives, in particular, the prevention of public nuisance given the close proximity of residential properties located to the rear of the site. The applicant should have regard to LP6 (External Areas and Outdoor Activities) which states:

#### LP6 External Areas and Outdoor Events

The Licensing Authority will normally restrict external areas and outdoor activity to between 08:00 and 22:00 unless the applicant can demonstrate that comprehensive control measures have been implemented that ensure the promotion of the licensing objectives, in particular the public nuisance objective. Notwithstanding any proposed control measures, the Licensing Authority may restrict the hours and/or activity even further.

Regarding this my tenants will have no choice but to leave . This will put me in a difficult situation in finding new tenants because I will be faced with the same consequences .


Sandringham rd, Amhurst rd and Wayland avenue are all highly populated residential properties . There are only 4 essential shops and even those have living accommodation above.

### **Annex 1 - Mandatory Conditions**

### Supply of Alcohol

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:
  - (a) At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence.
  - (b) At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 3. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
  - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises -
  - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;
  - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
  - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
  - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
  - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
  - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
  - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).

- 4. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 5. 5.1. The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sales or supply of alcohol.
  - 5.2 The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licences must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
  - 5.3. The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years if age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either:-
    - A. a holographic mark or
    - B. an ultraviolet feature.
- 6. The responsible person shall ensure that:
  - a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures:
  - beer or cider: 1/2 pint;
  - gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25ml or 35ml; and
  - still wine in a glass: 125ml; and
    - a. these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
    - b. where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

### **Minimum Drinks Pricing**

- 7. 7.1 A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
  - 7.2 For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 7.1 above -
  - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
  - (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula P = D+(DxV) Where -
  - (i)P is the permitted price,
  - (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
  - (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;

- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -
- (i) the holder of the premises licence,
- (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
- (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 7.3 Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8.2(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 7.4 (1) Sub-paragraph 7.4(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 7.2(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

### Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

- 8. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of a Metropolitan Police Crime Prevention Officer. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the preceding 31-day period.
- 9. There shall be a staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system on the premises at all times when the premises are open to the public. This staff member must be able to show a Police or authorised council officer recent data or footage when requested.
- 10. Signs will be prominently displayed at all exit points reminding customers to leave quietly and respect local residents.
- 11. Signs will be prominently displayed in any smoking areas reminding customers to leave quietly and respect local residents.
- 12. A Challenge 25 proof of age scheme shall be operated at the premises where the only acceptable forms of identification are recognised photographic identification cards, such as driving licence or passport.
- 13. There shall be a personal licence holder on duty whenever alcohol is being sold.
- 14. Intoxicating liquor shall not be sold, supplied or consumed otherwise than to persons who are taking a substantial meal from the menu and that the consumption of intoxicating liquor by such persons in ancillary to taking such meals. The supply of alcohol, on the premises, will be by waiter/waitress service only.
- 15. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to an authorised officer of the council or the police, which will record the following.
- a. All crimes reported:
- b. All ejections of patrons
- c. Any complaints received.
- d. Any incidents of disorder.
- e. Seizure of drugs or offensive weapons.
- f. Any faults in the CCTV system or searching equipment or scanning equipment.
- g. Any refusal of the sale of alcohol.
- h. Any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.
- 16. The premises will have a written dispersal policy that ensures that all patrons exiting the venue are encouraged to leave the area quickly and

quietly.

- 17. Premises to operate zero tolerance policy to drugs and comply with Hackney Police Drugs, Weapons and Theft policy where appropriate.
- 18. All staff will be given refresher training every twelve months on the legislation relating to the sales of alcohol to underage persons and drunken persons.
- 19. All off sales of alcohol shall be in sealed, unopened containers and packaged appropriately.
- 20. No noise shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises which gives rise to a nuisance.
- 21. No waste or recyclable materials including bottles, shall be moved, removed from or placed in outside areas between 2200hrs and 0700hrs on the following day.
- 22. All waste shall be properly presented and placed out for collection no earlier than 30 minutes before the scheduled collection times.
- 23. Patrons will not be allowed to take drinks, glass or open containers outside of the building at any time.
- 24. Any outside space shall not be used after 22:00.
- 25. There shall be a maximum of 5 smokers outside the front of the venue at any one time.
- 26. A specified indoor area on the ground floor shall not be subject to the ancillary to food condition subject to a maximum of 15 persons.
- 27. All music at the venue will be played at background level which will enable customers to have a face to face conversation.
- 28. The maximum capacity shall be:
- 8 persons in the outdoor area at the front of the premises;
- 15 persons in the indoor ground floor area of the premises;
- 38 persons in the basement area of the premises; and
- 40 persons in the outdoor area at the rear of the premises.


