#### 1. APPLICATION

- 1.1 U7 LTD have made an application for a premises licence under the Licensing Act 2003:
  - To authorise Regulated Entertainment comprising Plays, films, live music, recorded music, performances of dance and anything of a similar nature.
  - To authorise late night refreshment
  - To authorise the supply alcohol for consumption on and off the premises
- 1.2 The application is attached as Appendix A. The applicant has proposed measures that could be converted to conditions (see paragraph 8.1 below).

#### 2. CURRENT STATUS / HISTORY

3.1 The premises are not currently licensed for any activity.

A previous premises licence was revoked by the Licensing Sub Committee on 01/10/2020 following a review application.

3.2 No TENs have been submitted in respect of the premises in this calendar year.

#### 5. GUIDANCE CONSIDERATIONS

5.1 The Licensing Authority is required to have regard to any guidance issued by the Secretary of State under the Licensing Act 2003.

#### 6. POLICY CONSIDERATIONS

- 6.1 Licensing Sub-Committee is required to have regard to the London Borough of Hackney's Statement of Licensing Policy ("the Policy") adopted by the Licensing Authority.
- 6.2 The Policy applies to applications where relevant representations have been made. With regard to this application, policies, LP1 (General Principles), LP2 (Licensing Objectives), LP5(Planning Status), LP6 (External Areas and Outdoor Events) are relevant.

#### 7. OFFICER OBSERVATIONS

7.1 If the Sub-Committee is minded to approve the application, the following conditions should be applied the licence:

#### Supply Of Alcohol (On/Both)

Supply of Alcohol

- No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:

   (a) At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence.
   (b) At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 3. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

(2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises -

(a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;

(i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);

(b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

(c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period

of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

(d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.

(e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).

- 4. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 5. 5.1. The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sales or supply of alcohol.

5.2 The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licences must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

5.3. The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years if age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either:-

- A. a holographic mark or
- B. an ultraviolet feature.
- 6. The responsible person shall ensure that:

a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures:

- beer or cider:1/2 pint;
- gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25ml or 35ml; and
- still wine in a glass: 125ml; and
  - a. these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
  - b. where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

#### **Minimum Drinks Pricing**

7. 7.1 A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

7.2 For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 7.1 above -(a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;

(b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula - P = D+(DxV) Where -

(i)P is the permitted price,

D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
 V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;

(c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -

(i) the holder of the premises licence,

(ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;

(d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and

(e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

7.3 Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8.2(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub- paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

7.4 (1) Sub-paragraph 7.4(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 7.2(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

#### **Exhibition Of Films**

- 8. Admission of children (under 18) to the exhibition of any film must be restricted in accordance with: -
  - (a) Recommendations made by the film classification body where the film classification body is specified in the licence, or
  - (b) Recommendations made by the licensing authority where the film classification body is not specified in the licence, or the relevant licensing authority has not notified the holder of the licence that this subsection applies to the film in question.

"film classification body" means person('s) designated under s4 of the Video Recordings Act 1984 (c.39).

#### **Door Supervision**

9. Each individual who is to carry out a security activity at the premises must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

#### Conditions derived from operating schedule

10. The premises shall maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of a Metropolitan Police Crime Prevention Officer. All public areas, entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer.

11. A clear and legible notice outside the premises indicating the normal hours under the terms of the premises licence during which licensable activities are permitted.

12.An incident log shall be kept at the premises and made available immediately to an authorised officer of the Hackney Borough Council or the Police which will record the following:

- a) Any crimes reported to the venue
- b) Any complaints received
- c) Any incidents of disorder
- d) Any faults in the CCTV system
- e) Any refusal of the sale of alcohol
- f) Any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service

13. The applicant shall close all entrance doors and windows when regulated entertainment takes place except for immediate access and egress of persons.

14. The applicant shall install a sound limiter device set by a registered member of the Institute of Acoustics and maintain to ensure that the music does not give rise to a nuisance to nearby residents and in the vicinity.

15. The applicant shall prominently display clearly legible signage at all patron exits requesting that patrons leave the premises in a quiet and orderly manner that is respectful to the neighbours.

16. The applicant shall keep all the highway and public spaces in the immediate vicinity of the premises free from litter emanating from the premises while the premises are open.

17. There shall be no deliveries or collection between 22:00-07:00 hours Monday-Sunday.

18. The applicant shall properly present and place out all waste for collection no earlier than 30 minutes before collection times.

19. Light installation at the premises shall not give rise to light nuisance to nearby residents.

20. The extract system at the premises shall not give rise to noise and odour nuisance to nearby residents.

21. The rear outside of the premises shall not be used after 2100hours save for a maximum of 5 Smokers.

22. The smoking area is to be situated at the rear of the premises. The front of the venue is not to be used for smokers.

23. There shall be no glass, drinks or open containers taken outside of the premises after 21:00 hours.

24. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises are open to the public. This staff member shall be able to show Police or an authorised officer of Hackney Borough Council recent data or footage with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.

25. There shall be "CCTV in Operation" signs prominently displayed.

26. All instances of crime or disorder to be reported by the Designated Premises Supervisor or responsible member of staff to an agreed Police contact point as agreed with the Police.

27. The premises will display and maintain appropriate signage advising customers of the contact details of the Designated Premises Supervisor/Duty Manager.

28. All staff will be given refresher training every twelve months on the legislation relating to the sale of alcohol to underage persons and drunken persons. Written records of this training shall be kept on the premises and produced to the Police or other authorised officer upon request.

29. The premises shall adhere to Hackney Police Weapons and Drugs Policies and any updates thereof.

30. When the licensable area is being used for licensable activities, the capacity, including the rear outside area, be restricted to a maximum of 95 patrons at any one time.

31. The premises will implement a written dispersal policy and will provide a copy of the police to the Police, Licensing Authority and Environmental Health. All staff will be trained in the implementation of the dispersal policy.

32. The Premises Licence Holder shall undertake a risk assessment prior to any prebooked function, to determine whether they require a registered door supervisor(s). If required the premises licence holder, in consultation with the door security provider, shall determine the commensurate levels, timings and location of door supervision to be deployed.

33. The risk assessment shall be recorded in writing and retained for a minimum of 31 days and be made available to the Police or officers of the Council immediately upon request.

34. When engaged all security staff shall be clearly identifiable at all times and all door supervisors shall enter their full details in the premises daily register at the commencement of their work, including their SIA registration number.

35. If the door supervisor is provided by an agency the name, registered business address and contact telephone number of the agency shall be recorded and will be made available to police or authorised officers immediately upon request.

#### Conditions derived from Responsible Authority representations

36. There shall be No Glass, Drinks or Open containers taken outside the front of the premises at any time.

#### 9. REASONS FOR OFFICER OBSERVATIONS

9.1 Conditions 10 to 35 are derived from the applicant's operating schedule. Condition 36 has been agreed with the police.

#### 10. LEGAL COMMENTS

- 10.1 The Council has a duty as a Licensing Authority under the Licensing Act 2003 to carry out its functions with a view to promoting the following 4 licensing objectives;
  - The Prevention of Crime and Disorder
  - Public Safety
  - Prevention of Public Nuisance
  - The Protection of Children from Harm
- 10.2 It should be noted that each of the licensing objectives have equal importance and are the only grounds upon which a relevant representation can be made and for which an application can be refused or terms and conditions attached to a licence.

#### 11. HUMAN RIGHTS ACT 1998 IMPLICATIONS

- 11.1 There are implications to;
  - *Article 6* Right to a fair hearing
  - Article 14 Not to discriminate
  - Balancing: Article 1- Peaceful enjoyment of their possession (i.e. a licence is defined as being a possession) with Article 8 – Right of Privacy (i.e. respect private & family life) to achieve a proportionate decision having regard to the protection of an individuals rights against the interests of the community at large.

#### 12. MEMBERS DECISION MAKING



#### Annex 2 – Conditions Consistent with the Operating Schedule

- 1) The premises shall maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of a Metropolitan Police Crime Prevention Officer. All public areas, entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer.
- 2) A clear and legible notice outside the premises indicating the normal hours under the terms of the premises licence during which licensable activities are permitted.
- 3) An incident log shall be kept at the premises and made available immediately to an authorised officer of the Hackney Borough Council or the Police which will record the following:
  - a) Any crimes reported to the venue
  - b) Any complaints received
  - c) Any incidents of disorder
  - d) Any faults in the CCTV system
  - e) Any refusal of the sale of alcohol
  - f) Any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service
- 4) Prominent, clear and legible notices will be displayed at the exit requesting the public to respect the needs of nearby residents and to leave the premises and the area quietly.
- 5) The movement of bins and rubbish outside the premises will be kept to a minimum after 11.00pm.
- 6) Adequate waste receptacles for use by customers will be provided in the local vicinity.
- 7) "Challenge 25" to operate at premises with signage displayed advertising that anyone who is over 18 but looks under 25 to carry acceptable ID (a card bearing the PASS hologram, a photographic driving licence or a passport) if they wish to buy alcohol.
- 8) The applicant shall adequately ventilate the premises to allow doors and windows to remain closed during licensed entertainment.

- 9) The applicant shall close all entrance doors and windows when regulated entertainment takes place except for immediate access and egress of persons.
- 10) The applicant shall install a sound limiter device set by a registered member of the Institute of Acoustics and maintain to ensure that the music does not give rise to a nuisance to nearby residents and in the vicinity.
- 11) The applicant shall prominently display clearly legible signage at all patron exits requesting that patrons leave the premises in a quiet and orderly manner that is respectful to the neighbours.
- 12) The applicant shall keep all the highway and public spaces in the immediate vicinity of the premises free from litter emanating from the premises while the premises are open.
- 13) There shall be no deliveries or collection between 22:00-07:00 hours Monday-Sunday.
- 14) The applicant shall properly present and place out all waste for collection no earlier than 30 minutes before collection times.
- 15) Light installation at the premises shall not give rise to light nuisance to nearby residents.
- 16) The extract system at the premises shall not give rise to noise and odour nuisance to nearby residents.
- 17) There shall be no more than five persons permitted to smoke outside the premises at any one time after 21:00 hours.
- 18) The smoking area is to be situated at the rear of the premises. The front of the venue is not to be used for smokers.
- 19) There shall be no glass, drinks or open containers taken outside of the premises after 21:00 hours.
- 20) A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises are open to the public. This staff member shall be able to show Police or an authorised officer of Hackney Borough Council recent data or footage with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.
- 21) There shall be "CCTV in Operation" signs prominently displayed.

- 22) All instances of crime or disorder to be reported by the Designated Premises Supervisor or responsible member of staff to an agreed Police contact point as agreed with the Police.
- 23) The premises will display and maintain appropriate signage advising customers of the contact details of the Designated Premises Supervisor/Duty Manager.
- 24) All staff will be given refresher training every twelve months on the legislation relating to the sale of alcohol to underage persons and drunken persons. Written records of this training shall be kept on the premises and produced to the Police or other authorised officer upon request.
- 25) The premises shall adhere to Hackney Police Weapons and Drugs Policies and any updates thereof.
- 26) When the licensable area is being used for licensable activities, the capacity, including the rear outside area, be restricted to a maximum of 95 patrons at any one time.
- 27) The premises will implement a written dispersal policy and will provide a copy of the police to the Police, Licensing Authority and Environmental Health. All staff will be trained in the implementation of the dispersal policy.
- 28) The Premises Licence Holder shall undertake a risk assessment prior to any prebooked function, to determine whether they require a registered door supervisor(s). If required the premises licence holder, in consultation with the door security provider, shall determine the commensurate levels, timings and location of door supervision to be deployed.
- 29) The risk assessment shall be recorded in writing and retained for a minimum of 31 days and be made available to the Police or officers of the Council immediately upon request.
- 30) When engaged all security staff shall be clearly identifiable at all times and all door supervisors shall enter their full details in the premises daily register at the commencement of their work, including their SIA registration number.
- 31) If the door supervisor is provided by an agency the name, registered business address and contact telephone number of the agency shall be recorded and will be made available to police or authorised officer immediately upon request.

The applicant has sought a new premises licence to operate the premises as a licensed bar within the locality. The current premises licence permits the sale of alcohol with a substantial table meal.

The Licensing service reviewed the existing premises licence in October 2020. The review application was based on local resident complaints and failure by the licensee to comply with the premises licence. The operators of the premises failed two test purchases of alcohol, condition 31 of the existing premises licence requires a table meal to be served with alcohol.

"31. Intoxicating liquor shall not be sold, supplied or consumed otherwise than to persons who are taking a substantial meal from the menu and that the consumption of alcohol by such persons is ancillary to taking such meals. The supply of alcohol shall be by waiter/waitress service only."

Condition 31 or a similar condition has not been reproduced in the proposed conditions set out in the application.

Whilst the applicant for the licence in this instance is a limited company, it should be noted that the sole director of the said company is the same licensee named on the existing (revoked) premises licence. This information is publicly available on the Companies House website. The relevant web pages have been appended to this representation.

Given the operators track record and previous complaints from local residents, the licensing authority are concerned that the proposed application will lead to further resident complaints. This in turn could place the prevention of public nuisance licensing objective at risk of being undermined.

A redacted copy of a representation submitted by a local resident during the review application has been appended.

It is also subject to a licence review by the Licencing Authority on 01/10/2020.

Since obtaining a license for the premises, in December 2017, the owner has used the premises as a bar/nightclub, operating irresponsibly and with no consideration to the local community, regularly breaching the Planning regulations and Licencing agreements; opening later than the license permits; altering the space inside and outside without submitting any planning consent. Every time there is an event there are always disturbances that have resulted in the local community getting the support of the Hackney Environmental Team and the police to deal with the disturbances.

The last event on 11/12<sup>th</sup> September 2020, resulted in the police being called to come and stop the event at 1.30am. However, even after the premises had been shut the customers continued to party outside till 4am, which ended in a fight on Orsman Road and people being chased up Kingsland Road. There was an added concern for the neighbours that there was no social distancing being maintained inside or outside.

The premises and how it has been managed has had a very negative impact on the local neighbourhood the bar & nightclub being pushed onto the community has not had a positive impact.

I am a resident of Orsman Road, and have been for over 20 years and I have seen the positive impact of the changes in the community by the developments in the neighbourhood, but this Unit and how it has been mismanaged has continued to erode the positive changes and has had a very negative impact on everyone in the local community and all the local businesses. I strongly believe that renewing this license would suggest to the owner that the way in which the premises has been managed is okay and to be encouraged to continue. This would put an enormous strain on the already fractious relationship the owner has with the surrounding community and I think the residents would find it extremely hard to live with.

I am asking if you would be so kind as to share my concerns at the license review as unfortunately, I will be unable to attend due to my work commitments
