# Outreach work continues to target the most vulnerable residents, as well as geographies and ethnicities with the lowest uptake



#### Achievements to date: (12th Oct - 10th Nov)

- 8 Community organisations being onboarded for Equitable Vaccine Uptake Round 2 (Shomrim, CAN, Skyway, Bangla Housing, Halkevi, Future Challenges, Hawa Trust, Kanlugan)
- 115 people vaccinated at the Apex London Bridging Hotel
- Testing and training events held at Apex London
- 331 people vaccinated at the Spring Hill Practice outreach clinics (17 Oct, 24 Oct, 31 Oct & 7 November)
- Feedback and evaluation report completed for Kings Park education event
- Outreach Vaccination/Testing and Outreach Engagement plans developed to address identified priority areas:

#### ☐ LSOAS

- Priority 1: Address the uptake across the 14 LSOA's with less than 50% uptake
- $\circ$  Priority 2: Address the uptake across other LSOAs that have an uptake between 50-60%

#### Ethnicity

- Deep dive into the Any Other White Background to understand the specific needs of the communities within this community, i.e, Orthodox Jewish, Haredi, Turkish Kurdish, White Eastern European

#### What next?

- Community organisations will be tasked to gather insights and engage with communities in the priority LSOA areas to drive uptake through to existing vaccination sites with plans to offer of hyper local outreach clinics (where capacity permits)
- 2. Further 5 outreach Vaccination and Testing clinics booked within Springhill Practice (21st, 28th November, 5th, 12th and 19th December).
- 3. Further 2 outreach vaccination clinics at Apex London Bridging Hotel (17<sup>th</sup> and 24<sup>th</sup> Nov)
- 4. Agree forward plan with Find & Treat Team and how they collaborate with wider teams to ensure the most vulnerable are vaccinated over the coming months
- Develop denominators for Homeless, Rough Sleepers.
  Asylum Seekers, Sex Worker and Gypsy Roma Travellers required by NHSEI
- 6. Review potential for vaccination event in Kings Park ward
