6. GUIDANCE CONSIDERATIONS

6.1 The Licensing Authority is required to have regard to any guidance issued by the Secretary of State under the Licensing Act 2003.

7. POLICY CONSIDERATIONS

- 7.1 Licensing Sub-Committee is required to have regard to the London Borough of Hackney's Statement of Licensing Policy ("the Policy") adopted by the Licensing Authority.
- 7.2 The Policy applies to applications where relevant representations have been made. With regard to this application, policies, LP1 (General Principals), LP2 (Licensing Objectives), LP3(Core Hours), LP4('Off' Sales of Alcohol), LP11(Cumulative Impact-General) are relevant.

8. OFFICER OBSERVATIONS

8.1 If the Sub-Committee is minded to approve the application, the following conditions should be applied the licence:

Mandatory Conditions

Supply of Alcohol

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:
 - (a) At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence.
 - (b) At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 3. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises -
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining

a licensing objective;

- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
- 4. dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability). The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 5. 5.1. The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sales or supply of alcohol.
 - 5.2 The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licences must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
 - 5.3. The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years if age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either:-
 - A. a holographic mark or
 - B. an ultraviolet feature.
 - 6. The responsible person shall ensure that:
 - a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures:
 - beer or cider: 1/2 pint;
 - gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25ml or 35ml; and
 - still wine in a glass: 125ml; and
 - a. these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
 - b. where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

Minimum Drinks Pricing

7. 7.1 A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the

permitted price.

- 7.2 For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 7.1 above -
- (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
- (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula P = D+(DxV) Where -
- (i)P is the permitted price,
- (ii)D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (c) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol; "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -
- (i) the holder of the premises licence,
- (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
- (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 7.3 Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8.2(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub- paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 7.4 (1) Sub-paragraph 7.4(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 7.2(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Mandatory condition: exhibition of films

- 8. Admission of children (under 18) to the exhibition of any film must be restricted in accordance with: -
- (a) Recommendations made by the film classification body where the film classification body is specified in the licence, or
- (b) Recommendations made by the licensing authority where the film classification body is not specified in the licence, or the relevant licensing authority has not notified the holder of the licence that this subsection applies to the film in question.

"film classification body" means person('s) designated under s4 of the Video Recordings Act 1984(c.39).

Door Supervision

9.Each individual who is to carry out a security activity at the premises must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

Conditions derived from operating schedule

- 10. CCTV covering the interior & exterior of the premises will be installed to the minimum standards of the Metropolitan Police Service and will be kept operational at all times the premises are open to the public. It shall be capable of taking a head & shoulders shot of persons entering the premises, be capable of storing images for a minimum of 31 days and a member of staff trained & capable of downloading images shall be on duty at all times the premises are open to the public. Images shall be provided to the Police or Authorised Officers on request.
- 11.An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to an authorised officer of the council or the police, which will record the following:
 - a. all crimes reported to the venue
 - b. all ejections of patrons
 - c. complaints received
 - d. any incidents of disorder
 - a. seizure of drugs or offensive weapons.
 - b. any faults in the CCTV system or searching equipment or scanning equipment
 - c. any refusal of the sale alcohol
 - d. any visit by a relevant authority or emergency services.
- 12. The premises shall operate a zero tolerance drugs policy and comply with Hackney Police and Council Community safety unit drugs and weapons policy where appropriate.
- 13.SIA registered door supervisors shall be employed subject to an operational risk assessment basis. All security staff shall be clearly identifiable at all times. All door supervisors shall enter their full details in the premises daily register at the commencement of their work. They shall record their full name, home address and contact telephone number, their SIA registration number, and the time they commence and conclude working. If the door supervisor was provided by an agency the name, registered business address and contact telephone number will also be provided. This register will be made available to police or authorised officer immediately upon request.
- 14. All staff will be given refresher training every twelve months on the legislation relating to the sales of alcohol to underage persons and drunken persons. There shall be written records of all training kept at the premises and made available to police or other authorised officer upon request.

- 15. An adequate and appropriate supply of first aid equipment and materials shall be available on the premises.
- 16. The Premises License Holder or DPS will ensure that there is a fire risk assessment and emergency evacuation plan in place at all times.
- 17. A Challenge 21 proof of age scheme shall be operated at the premises where the only acceptable forms of identification are recognised photographic identification cards, such as driving license or passport. Challenge 21 signage will be prominently displayed.
- 18 . The Licensee shall ensure that all staff are fully trained and made aware of the legal requirement of businesses to comply with the irresponsibility as regards the disposal of waste produced from the business premises. The procedure for handling and preparing for disposal of the waste shall be in writing and displayed in a prominent place where it can be referred to at all times by staff.
- 19. The Licensee shall ensure that any contract for general and recyclable waste disposal shall be appropriate in size to the amount of waste produced by the business. The Licensee shall maintain an adequate supply of waste receptacles provided by his registered waste carrier (refuse sacks or commercial waste bins) in order to ensure all refuse emanating from the business is always presented for collection by his waste carrier and shall not use any plain black or unidentifiable refuse sacks or any other unidentifiable or unmarked waste receptacles.
- 20. The Licensee shall instruct members of staff to make regular checks of the area immediately outside the premises and remove any litter, bottles and glasses emanating from the premises. A final check should be made at close of business.
- 21. Clear and prominent notices shall be displayed and maintained at all exits in a place where they can be seen and easily read by customers requiring customers to leave the premises and the area quietly.
- 22. There shall be no more than 8 persons who have temporarily left the venue, allowed to smoke outside the Courtyard at the front of the premises at any one time. This area will be monitored by staff.
- 23. "There shall be a staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system on the premises at all times when the premises are open to the public. This staff member must be able to show a Police or authorised council officer recent data or footage when requested".
- 24. Alcohol shall not be sold or supplied for consumption on the premises otherwise than to persons taking substantial tables meals there for consumption by such a person as an ancillary to their meal.
- 25. Off sales of alcohol shall be in sealed containers and only for delivery to a residential or business address.

- 26. There shall be a written dispersal at the premises. This policy shall be kept on site and produced to a police officer or other authorised officer upon request.
- 27. In order to minimise the amount of time any waste remains on the public Highway in readiness for collection, the Licensee will ensure the timeframe within which it may expect its waste carrier to collect is adhered to.
- 28. The Licensee shall provide a safe receptacle for cigarette ends to be placed outside for the use of customers, such receptacle being carefully placed so as not to cause an obstruction or trip.
- 29. The current trade waste agreement/duty of care waste transfer document shall be conspicuously displayed and maintained in the window of the premises where it can be conveniently seen and read by persons standing in The Bread Station.
 - This should remain unobstructed at all times and should clearly identify:-
 - the name of the registered waste carrier
 - the date of commencement of trade waste contract
 - the date of expiry of trade waste contract
 - the days and times of collection
 - the type of waste including the European Waste Code

9. REASONS FOR OFFICER OBSERVATIONS

9.1 Conditions 10 to 22 above are derived from the applicant's operating schedule. Conditions 23 to 26 have been proposed by the Police and conditions 27 to 29 by the Environmental Enforcement .The applicant has agreed to conditions proposed by Environmental Enforcement.

10. LEGAL COMMENTS

- 10.1 The Council has a duty as a Licensing Authority under the Licensing Act 2003 to carry out its functions with a view to promoting the following 4 licensing objectives;
 - The Prevention of Crime and Disorder
 - Public Safety
 - Prevention of Public Nuisance
 - The Protection of Children from Harm
- 10.2 It should be noted that each of the licensing objectives have equal importance and are the only grounds upon which a relevant representation can be made and for which an application can be refused or terms and conditions attached to a licence.

11. HUMAN RIGHTS ACT 1998 IMPLICATIONS

- 11.1 There are implications to:
 - **Article 6** Right to a fair hearing
 - Article 14 Not to discriminate

Balancing: Article 1- Peaceful enjoyment of their possession (i.e. a licence is defined as being a possession) with Article 8 – Right of Privacy (i.e. respect private & family life) to achieve a proportionate decision having regard to the protection of an individuals rights against the interests of the community at large.

12. MEMBERS DECISION MAKING

That the application be approved, together with any conditions or restrictions which Members consider necessary for the promotion of the Licensing objectives.

13. CONCLUSION



Annexe 2 The Bread Station Conditions consistent with Operating Schedule

9.CCTV covering the interior & exterior of the premises will be installed to the minimum standards of the Metropolitan Police Service and will be kept operational at all times the premises are open to the public. It shall be capable of taking a head & shoulders shot of persons entering the premises, be capable of storing images for a minimum of 31 days and a member of staff trained & capable of downloading images shall be on duty at all times the premises are open to the public. Images shall be provided to the Police or Authorised Officers on request.

- 10.. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to an authorised officer of the Council or the Police, which will as a minimum record the following:
 - all crimes reported to the venue
 - all ejections of patrons

- complaints received
- any incidents of disorder
- seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
- any faults in the CCTV system or searching equipment or scanning equipment
- any refusal of the sale of alcohol
- any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.
- 11. Premises will operate zero tolerance policy to drugs and comply with Hackney Police and Council Community Safety Unit Drugs and Weapons Policy where appropriate.
- 12. SIA registered door supervisors shall be employed subject to an operational risk assessment basis. All security staff shall be clearly identifiable at all times. All door supervisors shall enter their full details in the premises daily register at the commencement of their work. They shall record their full name, home address and contact telephone number, their SIA registration number, and the time they commence and conclude working. If the door supervisor was provided by an agency the name, registered business address and contact telephone number will also be provided. This register will be made available to police or authorised officer immediately upon request.
- 13. All staff will be given refresher training every twelve months on the legislation relating to the sales of alcohol to underage persons and drunken persons. There shall be written records of all training kept at the premises and made available to police or other authorised officer upon request.
- 14. An adequate and appropriate supply of first aid equipment and materials shall be available on the premises.

- 15. The Premises License Holder or DPS will ensure that there is a fire risk assessment and emergency evacuation plan in place at all times.
- 16. A Challenge 21 proof of age scheme shall be operated at the premises where the only acceptable forms of identification are recognised photographic identification cards, such as driving license or passport. Challenge 21 signage will be prominently displayed.
- 17. The Licensee shall ensure that all staff are fully trained and made aware of the legal requirement of businesses to comply with their responsibility as regards the disposal of waste produced from the business premises. The procedure for handling and preparing for disposal of the waste shall be in writing and displayed in a prominent place where it can be referred to at all times by staff.
- 18. The Licensee shall ensure that any contract for general and recyclable waste disposal shall be appropriate in size to the amount of waste produced by the business. The Licensee shall maintain an adequate supply of waste receptacles provided by his registered waste carrier (refuse sacks or commercial waste bins) in order to ensure all refuse emanating from the business is always presented for collection by his waste carrier and shall not use any plain black or unidentifiable refuse sacks or any other unidentifiable or unmarked waste receptacles.

Police submit the following representations for the new premises licence at Arch 374 Helmsley Place. The venue is one of a number of arches that already benefit from premises licences that allow for the consumption of alcohol on the premises. The applicant has stated that they would like to offer the sale wine in the external courtyard area in a manner that is similar to the venue next door. Whilst offering off sales of wine.

The applicant is seeking a premise licence that would allow for the sale of alcohol both on and off the premises Monday – Sunday 1100-2330hours with the venue closing 30 minutes after this allowing for a period of 30 minutes for customers to finish their drinks.

Police have noted the following on the application the hours for the supply of alcohol Sunday to Thursday exceed the core hours stated in the London Borough of hackneys Statement of Licensing Policy in which also states LP6 that the use of outdoor area will normally be restricted to 2200hours unless the applicant can demonstrate the promotion of the licensing objectives .

It should be noted that although there are already a number of existing premises licences in the immediate vicinity they are in the midst of constructing eight three bedroom flats opposite the venue meaning that in addition to the existing residents in the area there will be the potential for 8 further families with young children

Alongside the application the applicant has supplied a number of conditions which they believe would seek to promote the licensing objectives. In respect of these conditions, Police would request the following;

- Police would request that Condition 16 relating to Challenge 21 be amended top Challenge 25
- Condition 21 states "There shall be no more than 8 persons who have temporarily left the venue, allowed to smoke outside the Courtyard at the front of the premises at any one time. This area will be monitored by staff" This is residential area and Police would ask why the venue would need to utilise space outside the venue when they already benefit from an external courtyard

Police Would ask what will the capacity of the venue be both internally and externally?

Since the granting of the previous licences on Helmsley place there has been a shift in character of the area which is now leaning more towards a residential street as opposed to the commercial character that it previously was. The applicant has stated that they may wish to have live music on occasion in the court yard.

The way in which the application presents suggests that they venue will steering towards operating as a bar which Police believe will undermine the licence objectives namely Crime and disorder and public nuisance. Police would ask what steps the applicant would intend to take in order to minimise any effect the granting of a licence at the location would have on the undermine of the licensing objectives

Representations (which include comments and/or objections) in relation to:

I write to make a representation in relation to this application. The premises is located within an area that in recent years has seen a growth in the number of licence premises in the locality. An additional premises could lead to an undermining of the licensing objectives, in particular, the prevention of public nuisance.

It is noted that the proposed hours exceed those set out within LP12 (Core Hours). The application also seeks to authorise live and recorded music with no reference to noise limitation measures. The application does not seek to limit alcohol sales to being ancillary to table meals. If granted this could enable to premises to operate as a vertical drinking establishment. I am also concerned by the proposed "off-sales" of alcohol given the close proximity to London Fields. This is an area that suffers from alcohol related noise and anti-social behaviour, particularly during the summer months. An additional premises in this location could further add to these negative impacts.

The above representations are supported by the following evidence and information.

The Licensing Act 2003, Statement of Licensing Policy 2016 and S182 Guidance issued by the Home Office.

Are there any actions or measures that could be taken to allay concerns or objections? If so, please explain.

The application offers little to no measures that could be converted to conditions. Therefore, the following amendments are suggested:

- Revise hours to align with LP12, therefore limited to 23:00 Mon to Thu, 23:30 Fri and Sat and 22:30 on Sun
- Withdrawal of proposed regulated entertainment in external areas or detail of noise management measures.
- Cease use of external areas by 22:00 daily other than a limited number of smokers
- Additional condition limiting alcohol sales to those that are ancillary to a person taking a seated table meal
- Removal of off-sales
- "Challenge 25" implemented

I am writing to object to the license application submitted by Bread Station at 373 Helmsley Place E8 3SB.

The premises are located in the minds of a residential area. At pre-Covid times we have been continuously suffering from the loss of amenities caused by the patrons from the leaving the bars and restaurants on that street, such as London Fields Brewery, also located meters away. Considering that there is no direct access to public transport to/from Helmsley Place inevitably at the end of the night, the patrons will have to leave via Mentmore Terrace, which residential. Adding other late-night premises will undoubtedly create even more nuisance to the local community through noise and disorder, such as public urination, vomiting, taxis etc. I'd also like to raise a general concern of the accumulative effect this can have on the area. There are already three licensed premises with an overall capacity in a few hundred people; it's a small street leading to or surrounded by houses and blocks of flats. While we appreciate a great variety of businesses that Hackney has to offer - however, we categorically don't want what happened on Kingsland Road or Broadway market happen to us. I sincerely hope the licensing committee considers the context here.

Dear Sirs,

I wish to make a representation in respect of the above licence application.

The Bread Station is a relatively new business in one of the arches in Helmsley Place. It has been a significant and beneficial addition to the area. At the heart of the operation is a commercial bakery providing high quality properly fermented and "proved" bread to restaurants across London and an increasing number of independent outlets. For the record, the bread is excellent and a beneficial aid to proper digestion.

As an adjunct to the bakery, the owner has developed a small cafe to provide a local outlet for their products and offer a high quality deli style service for the supply of sandwiches and light meals.

The application for an alcohol licence is to broaden the licence and allow customers who should choose to do so, to enjoy a drink with their meal, or perhaps on its own as a companion had a light lunch.

I understand that there have been a request for the committee to consider fairly restrictive conditions.

As the committee will be aware, any conditions must be reasonable and proportionate and related to specific licensing objectives.

The prevention of public nuisance

The hours of operation and style of operation suggest that this objective is not engaged. There is no record of any complaints about public nuisance. The venue is situated far from any residential buildings within the arches. I would respectfully suggest this objective is not engaged.

The protection of children from harm.

The venue does not attract children and would in any case operate a "Challenge 25" policy. Ι would respectfully suggest this objective is not engaged.

Public safety

This is a relatively small venue primarily selling coffee, bread based products and cakes. There is no evidence that the current operation poses a risk to public safety. Theer is also no evidence that to grant a licence would pose a risk to public safety. nor that to grant a licence would create a I would respectfully suggest this objective is not engaged.

The prevention of crime and disorder

There is no evidence of any record of criminal behaviour linked to these premises. I understand CRIS reports have no records linked to the venue. In addition to the lack of historical evidence of any crimean ddisorder linked to this venue, it is improbable that a well run reputable coffee shop and sandwich bar would lead to any activity that would create a crime and disorder issue. I would respectfully suggest that this objective is not engaged.

It is entirely right that careful consideration should be given to all and any licensing applications that are made. It is also correct, reasonable and proportionate that where there is no evidence that the licensing objectives are engaged, a licence should be granted.

There is a danger in adopting "cut and paste" conditions, that are not carefully assessed against an individual application. It seems clear that in this case, the police have forwarded a set of standard "conditions" and have not had the chance to closely look at this operation. I attach no blame to them for this, as they are currently under huge pressure. It does though lay with the authority, and if appropriate the committee, to ensure that any conditions are 3 reasonable and proportionate. If they are not, they should not be adopted

I therefore reiterate my support for this application.

I have known the applicant for over ten years and believe him to be an individual of the highest integrity and probity, with an excellent track record of running licensedpremises elsewhere. I am happy to provide both a reference and a testimonial.

I hope that having considered the application, the committee are able to grant it in full.


