3. CURRENT POSITION/ HISTORY

- 3.1 The premises were in procession of a justice's licence prior to the introduction of the Licensing Act 2003 in 2005. The licence is held by Sherkhan Limited. A copy of the current premises licence is attached as Appendix B.
- 3.2 Police had made an application for review relating to this premises on 18 May 2020 and the Licensing Sub-Committee was held on 17 June 2020.

Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:
 - (a) At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence.
 - (b) At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 3.1. The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sales or supply of alcohol.
 - 3.2The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licences must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
 - 3.3. The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either:-
 - (a) a holographic mark or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.

Minimum Drinks Pricing

- 4. 4.1 A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
 - 4.2 For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 4.1 above -
 - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
 - (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula P = D+(DxV) Where -
 - (i) P is the permitted price.
 - (ii) D is the rate of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
 - (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
 - (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -
 - (i) the holder of the premises licence,
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
 - (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in

and

- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 4.3 Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 4.2(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that subparagraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 4.4 (1) Sub-paragraph 4.4(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 4.2(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

- 5. CCTV Cameras shall be in operation at all hours the premises are open.
- 6. The 'Red Care' Alarm System, providing direct connection to the police station, shall be maintained;
- 7. Fire alarms and fire extinguishers shall be installed and maintained on the premises;
- 8. A minimum of three employees shall be on the premises between 12.00 midnight and 7.00am

Annex 3 - Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority

- 9. CCTV covering the interior and exterior of the shop premises must be installed and be kept operational at all times the premises are open to the public.
- 10. The CCTV system shall be capable of taking a head and shoulders shot of persons entering the premises.
- 11. The CCTV system will be capable of storing images for a minimum of 31 days and a member of staff trained and capable of downloading images shall be on duty at all times the premises are open to the public. Images will be provided to the Metropolitan Police or Authorised Officers on request.
- 12. Challenge 25 will be in operation at the premises as the proof of age policy. Only the following credible photographic evidence may be accepted as proof of age: a passport, photographic driving licence, UK Armed Forces ID card or a proof of age card with the PASS hologram/ logo on it. Refusals of the sale of alcohol must be recorded in the relevant section of the Incident Book.
- 13. Relevant notices will be prominently displayed by the entry/exit door and counter as appropriate advising customers that:
 - CCTV and Challenge 25 are in operation;
 - Advising customers of the provisions of the Licensing Act regarding underage and proxy sales;
 - Asking customers to respect nearby residents, to leave quietly, not to drink outside the shop or in the street and not loiter outside the shop.
- 14. No alcohol may be consumed in the shop at any time.
- 15. Alcohol will not be supplied in an open container.
- 16. An incident book is to be kept at the premises and made available to the Police or Authorised Officers which will record the following
 - a) All crimes reported;
 - b) Lost property;
 - c) All ejections of customers:
 - d) Any complaints received;
 - e) Any incidents of disorder;
 - f) Any seizure of drugs or offensive weapons;
 - g) Any faults in the CCTV system;
 - h) Any refusal in the sale of alcohol;
 - i) Any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service;
 - i) A CAD number where Police are called
- 17. Staff will be trained on induction and be given refresher training at 6 monthly intervals in the operation of Challenge 25. Training will include identifying persons under 25, making a challenge, acceptable proof or age and checking it, making and recording a refusal, not serving intoxicated persons, avoiding conflict, responsible alcohol retailing, operating the CCTV system and downloading images and safeguarding children.

- 18. A written training record will be kept for each staff member and will be made available to the Police and Authorised Officers on request.
- 19. Management and staff will monitor the outside of the shop to check that persons are not loitering or drinking outside and will politely ask any that do to leave the area quickly and quietly.
- 20. The Licensee shall ensure that all staff are fully trained and made aware of thelegal requirement of businesses to comply with their responsibility as regards the disposal of waste produced from the business premises. The procedure for handling and preparing for disposal of the waste shall be in writing and displayed in a prominent place where it can be referred to at all times by staff.
- 21. The Licensee shall ensure that any contract for general and recyclable waste disposal shall be appropriate in size to the amount of waste produced by the business. The Licensee shall maintain an adequate supply of waste receptacles provided by his registered waste carrier (refuse sacks or commercial waste bins) in order to ensure all refuse emanating from the business is always presented for collection by his waste carrier and shall not use any plain black or unidentifiable refuse sacks or any other unidentifiable or unmarked waste receptacles.
- 22. The Licensee's premises are situated in an area within which refuse may only be left on the public highway at certain times (time bands). If the Licensee's waste carrier cannot or does not comply by collecting the refuse within an hour after the close of any time band imposed by the waste authority, the Licensee must remove the refuse from the public highway and/or keep it within the premises until such time as his/her waste carrier arrives to collect the refuse.
- 23. The Licensee shall instruct members of staff to make regular checks of the area immediately outside the premises and remove any litter, bottles and glasses emanating from the premises. A final check should be made at close of business.
- 24. The Licensee shall provide a safe receptacle for cigarette ends to be placed outside for the use of customers, such receptacle being carefully placed so as not to cause an obstruction or trip.
- 25. The current trade waste agreement/duty of care waste transfer document shall be conspicuously displayed and maintained in the window of the premises where it can be conveniently seen and read by persons standing in Topaloglu Food & Wine.
 - This should remain unobstructed at all times and should clearly identify:-
 - the name of the registered waste carrier
 - the date of commencement of trade waste contract
 - the date of expiry of trade waste contract
 - the days and times of collection
 - the type of waste including the European Waste Code

Representations (which include comments and/or objections) in relation to:

I write to make a representation in relation to this application and to express support for the action being taken by the Police. I am satisfied that the activities at the premises are undermining the crime prevention objective,

I am aware that following a summary review application earlier this year, the premises licence was subject to a number of interventions taken by the Licensing Sub-Committee at a hearing on 17th June 2020. These measures included modified conditions, removal of the designated premises supervisor (DPS) and the suspension of the premises licence. The licensee did not appeal the decision. However, I was made aware by Police colleagues that the premises continued to operate after the decision had been made, with no cessation of the alcohol sales nor nomination of a new individual as DPS. Subsequently, i visited the premises with Police colleagues on 25th September 2020 during which PC Amanda GRIGGS was able to make a purchase of alcohol at the premises. I subsequently entered the premises shortly afterwards with PC Neal HUNWICK to give the staff present a closure notice under s19 of the Criminal Justice and Police Act 2001. In serving the notice I explained to the staff member behind the counter the purpose of the notice and the steps that could be taken to rectify the matter. However, I was later advised by Police colleagues that on a visit to the site the following day, that alcohol was still displayed for sale. Furthermore, I received no contact from the licensee/management despite including my name and contact details on the notice.

Below are extracts from Chapter 11 (Reviews) of the Home Office Guidance that would appear to be relevant to this application. Paragraph 11.21 states:

"For example, licensing authorities should be alive to the possibility that the removal and replacement of the designated premises supervisor may be sufficient to remedy a problem where the cause of the identified problem directly relates to poor management decisions made by that individual."

Paragraph 11.22 goes on to state:

"Equally, it may emerge that poor management is a direct reflection of poor company practice or policy and the mere removal of the designated premises supervisor may be an inadequate response to the problems presented. Indeed, where subsequent review hearings are generated by representations, it should be rare merely to remove a succession of designated premises supervisors as this would be a clear indication of deeper problems that impact upon the licensing objectives"

I feel that on this occasion the Sub-Committee will have no choice but to take more

stringent measures bearing in mind that powers to remove the DPS, modify conditions and suspend the licence have previously been utilised with no apparent change in conduct of the management.
