6. GUIDANCE CONSIDERATIONS

6.1 The Licensing Authority is required to have regard to any guidance issued by the Secretary of State under the Licensing Act 2003.

7. POLICY CONSIDERATIONS

- 7.1 Licensing Sub-Committee is required to have regard to the London Borough of Hackney's Statement of Licensing Policy ("the Policy") adopted by the Licensing Authority.
- 7.2 The Policy applies to applications where relevant representations have been made. With regard to this application, policies, LP1 (General Principles), LP2 (Licensing Objectives), LP3 (Core Hours) and LP4 ('Off' Sales of Alcohol) are relevant.

8. OFFICER OBSERVATIONS

8.1 If the Sub-Committee is minded to the application, the following conditions should be applied to the licence:

Supply of Alcohol (Off Premises)

1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:

(a) At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence.

(b) At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

3. 3.1. The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sales or supply of alcohol.

3.2 The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licences must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

3.3.The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and

either:-(a) a holographic mark or

(b) an ultraviolet feature. Minimum Drinks Pricing

4. 4.1 A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

4.2 For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 4.1 above -

(a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic

Liquor Duties Act 1979;

(b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula -

P = D + (DxV)

Where -

(i) P is the permitted price,

(ii) D is the rate of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and (iii)V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;

(c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of

which there is in force a premises licence -

(i) the holder of the premises licence,

(ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or

(iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a

supply of alcohol under such a licence;

(d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the

premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and

(e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

4.3 Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 4.2(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

4.4 (1) Sub-paragraph 4.4(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 4.2(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Conditions derived from operating schedule

5.All sales of alcohol arising from a [telephone/App/website] order for delivery must be paid for by debit or credit card. An alcohol verification sticker shall be applied to the delivery package so that alcohol can be easily retrieved by the delivery person to prevent an illegal sale. Details of the order (including the type, amount of alcohol, name, and address of the customer) must be included with the order. The details shall be shown on the printout receipt dispatched with the order. All delivery drivers and riders must allow any Police Constable or Local Authority Officer to inspect any alcohol or order details on request.

6.The premises will operate as a delivery only business. The premises will not open to the public and will be used for the dispatch of alcohol and other goods only. There shall be no collection of alcohol by the public from the premises.

7.The premises licence holder shall provide a closed-circuit television system (CCTV) at the premises. The CCTV system installed shall be maintained in effective working order and shall be in operation during licensing hours. All recordings made by the CCTV system shall be retained and stored in a suitable and secure manner for a minimum of 31 days. The licence holder shall notify the Licensing Authority within 24 hours when they become aware that the CCTV system is not functioning correctly.

8. A record of refusals shall be maintained which documents every instance that a sale or supply of alcohol is refused, indicating the date and time the refusal was made, and the member of staff making the refusal.

9. The record of refusals shall be available for inspection by authorised officers of the licensing authority, officers of the trading standards service and officers of the police.

10. Alcohol deliveries shall only be made to business and/or private residences and not to any public/open spaces.

11. A 'Challenge 25' Policy shall be in force at the point of delivery of the alcohol. No delivery shall be made if the person seeking to accept delivery appears under 25 and is unable to provide proof of age. Examples of appropriate ID include a passport; photographic driving licence; military ID; biometric residents permit and the Proof of Age Standards Scheme (PASS) approved age cards.

12. Staff training records shall be available for inspection by authorised officers of the licensing authority, officers of the trading standards service, and officers of the Police.

13. Deliveries and orders dispatched shall be from the front entrance only on Mentmore Terrace.

14. No waste or recyclable materials to be placed in external receptacles or in areas outside the premises between 23:00 and 07:00.

15. Waste to be collected during daytime hours from the rear of the premises on Lamb Lane. The Licensee shall maintain an adequate supply of waste receptacles provided by his registered waste carrier (refuse sacks or commercial waste bins) to ensure all refuse emanating from the business is always presented for collection by his waste carrier and shall not use any plain black or unidentifiable refuse sacks or any other unidentifiable or unmarked waste receptacles.

16. The telephone number for the premises and/or a member of the management team to be provided to EHO and residents upon request in order that any complaints can be made directly.

17. Staff who wish to smoke shall be directed to do so at the front entrance on Mentmore Terrace. The Licensee shall provide a safe receptacle for cigarette ends to be placed outside for the use of customers, such receptacle being carefully placed so as not to cause an obstruction or trip.

18. There shall be no extractor fans and/or refrigeration units fitted to the exterior of the premises. (Informative: It is understood that the premises will use commercial freestanding freezers and fridges).

19. All staff that sale or supply of alcohol shall receive appropriate training in relation to undertaking appropriate age checks, drunkenness and proxy sales before being allowed to sell or supply any alcohol.

20. To minimise disturbance to local residents after 22:00 hours when a delivery is made utilising a vehicle then only electric or non-motorised vehicles will be used except in the event of an emergency and breakdown'.

9. REASONS FOR OFFICER OBSERVATIONS

9.1 Conditions 5 to 12 above are derived from the applicant's operating schedule. Conditions 13 to 20 have been agreed with Environmental Enforcement, Police Authority and Licensing Authority.

10. LEGAL COMMENTS

- 10.1 The Council has a duty as a Licensing Authority under the Licensing Act 2003 to carry out its functions with a view to promoting the following 4 licensing objectives;
 - The Prevention of Crime and Disorder
 - Public Safety
 - Prevention of Public Nuisance
 - The Protection of Children from Harm
- 10.2 It should be noted that each of the licensing objectives have equal importance and are the only grounds upon which a relevant representation can be made and for which an application can be refused or terms and conditions attached to a licence.

11. HUMAN RIGHTS ACT 1998 IMPLICATIONS

- 11,1 There are implications to;
 - Article 6 Right to a fair hearing
 - Article 14 Not to discriminate
 - **Balancing: Article 1** Peaceful enjoyment of their possession (i.e. a licence is defined as being a possession) with Article 8 Right of Privacy (i.e. respect private & family life) to achieve a proportionate decision having regard to the protection of an individuals' rights against the interests of the community at large.



We have already had issues with the granting of a licence to Wagamama (Arch <u>385 Mentmore Terrace</u>). All Nations House is a residential block and there are currently 6 children across 5 households at the back of All Nations House and directly looking out at the Arches. I mention this as children can be adversely affected by noise pollution and by a further erosion of their privacy by a business like Weezy Fulfilment Centre being run from one of the arches.

My specific concerns regarding 'the prevention of public nuisance' include:

1. Increased noise pollution from delivery trucks bringing stock into the Arch. If it is the plan to deliver stock around the back of the arch, we would want to be reassured that the delivery trucks if they are delivering at the back of the Arch only do so during acceptable times of the day and NEVER at night time or early in the morning. It is imperative that as residents of All Nations House, our sleeps are not disrupted by vehicles coming in and out at the back of the Arch;

2. With regard to vehicles coming in and out, that also includes the companies that come to collect all rubbish. We came to an arrangement with Wagamama (Arch <u>385 Mentmore Terrace</u>) about when the companies they employ can come and collect rubbish and waste (including recycling waste etc) and we would expect to be able to do the same with regard to Weezy Fulfilment Centre and any arrangements they enter into with waste collection companies;

3. With regard to extractor fans and refrigeration units installed in Arch 384, we would expect that there should be absolutely not intrusive noises from such installations that would impact in any way on the residents of All Nations House.
