TEMPORARY EVENT NOTICE – COUNTER NOTICE: Browns, 1 Hackney Road, London, E2 7NX	Ward Hoxton East and Shoreditch	

1. SUMMARY

- 1.1 The Police have given the Licensing Authority and the premises user notice of objection to Temporary Event Notices for an event to be held on **15/12/2021** from **02:00am** finishing on **19/12/2021** at **04:00am** at above premises. The Licensing Authority must hold a hearing to decide whether or not to allow the event to proceed.

2. RECOMMENDATION

- 2.1 That the Licensing Sub-Committee consider the issuing of counter notices if it is satisfied that any of the licensing objectives would be undermined if the premises were to be used in accordance with the temporary event notice.

3. TEMPORARY EVENT NOTICES - BACKGROUND

- 3.1 Part 5 the Licensing Act 2003 permits small scale events to take place at which alcohol will be sold or other licensable activities will take place. The numbers attending the event must not exceed 499 people and there are restrictions on the number of events that can be held per year.
- 3.2 The individual must give notice of her/his intention to hold the event to the Licensing Authority, police and environmental health at least 10 working days (or 5 days in the event of a late notice) before the event is scheduled to take place by issuing a Temporary Event Notice (TEN). The event will be permitted to take place unless the Licensing Authority issues a counter notice.
- 3.3 The Licensing Authority can issue a counter notice if the number of permitted events has been exceeded or if, upon consideration of an 'objection notice' given by the police or those in the Council that exercise environmental health functions, it is satisfied that the event would undermine one or more of the licensing objectives.

3.4 If the police or those in the Council that exercise environmental health functions give an objection notice to the Licensing Authority, the Authority must convene a hearing to consider if it wishes to issue a counter notice. If the Authority determines to issue a counter notice it must give two copies to the premises user – a notice of its decision and a notice of the reasons for its decision. The decision must be made and the notices given at least 24 hours before the event is to begin. There is a right of appeal to the magistrates' court against the giving of a counter notice as a result of an objection notice

4. BACKGROUND

4.1 The premises is currently licensed under Licensing Act 2003 and a copy of the licence is attached as Appendix C.

5. TEMPORARY EVENT NOTICE FOR EVENT TO BE HELD 15/12/2021 - 19/12/2021

5.1 A TEN has been submitted to allow licensable activities to take place on the premises. A copy of the Temporary Event Notice and additional information is attached as Appendix A.

5.2 The Police have objected to the TEN on the grounds of the prevention of crime and disorder, public safety and public nuisance. A copy of the Police objection is attached as Appendix B.

6. HUMAN RIGHTS ACT 1998 IMPLICATIONS

6.1 There are implications for;

- **Article 6** – Right to a fair hearing
- **Article 14** – Not to discriminate
- Balancing; **Article 1**- Peaceful enjoyment of their possession (i.e. a licence is defined as being a possession) with **Article 8** – Right of Privacy (i.e. respect private & family life) to achieve a proportionate decision having regard to the protection of an individuals rights against the interests of the community at large.

7. MEMBERS DECISION MAKING

A. Option 1
That the Licensing Authority decides not to give a counter notice.

B. Option 2
That the Licensing Authority decides to give a counter notice, giving the reasons for the decision.

8. CONCLUSION

- 8.1 That Members decide whether or not to issue a counter notice for the event scheduled to take place on **15/12/2021** from **02:00am** finishing on **19/12/2021** at **04:00am** at location above.

Police object to the granting of this TEN for the 15th-19th December 2021 on the grounds of crime and disorder, public safety, the prevention of public nuisance and the protection of children from harm for the following reason(s):

Following the full reopening of hospitality venues with the increase in the capacities that this has brought, we have seen violent crime figures increase and particularly in the Shoreditch High Street, Curtain Road, Great Eastern Street and Old Street areas.

Large groups have been seen to be congregating around these areas both during and after the opening of licensed premises in which these areas have reached saturation and this is recognised by the designation of this area as a SPA which brings additional responsibilities on operators when applying for licensable activity to demonstrate that the activity will benefit an area. Additionally there is no provision by TFL for resuming the night tube which will exacerbate the problems around dispersal from the area, indeed there is currently tube strikes at every weekend further hindering travel.

We the Police are duty bound to prevent crime and this is one of the 4 licensing objectives.

Whilst we note that this TEN has been resubmitted with a 0400hrs finish after the previous submission was counter noticed with a 0500hrs finish we are not supporting any increase in hours in these areas as one of the tools available to limit alcohol fuelled violence.

Annex 1 - Mandatory Conditions

Supply of Alcohol

1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:
 - (a) At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence.
 - (b) At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
3. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

(2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises -
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
 - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).

4. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
5. 5.1. The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sales or supply of alcohol.
5.2 The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licences must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
5.3. The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either:-
 - A. a holographic mark or
 - B. an ultraviolet feature.
6. The responsible person shall ensure that:
 - a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures:
 - beer or cider: 1/2 pint;
 - gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25ml or 35ml; and
 - still wine in a glass: 125ml; and
 - a. these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
 - b. where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

Minimum Drinks Pricing

7. 7.1 A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
7.2 For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 7.1 above -
 - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
 - (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula - $P = D + (D \times V)$
Where -
 - (i) P is the permitted price,
 - (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
 - (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
 - (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -

(i) the holder of the premises licence,
(ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
(iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;

(d) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and

(e) “value added tax” means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

7.3 Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8.2(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

7.4 (1) Sub-paragraph 7.4(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 7.2(b) above on a day (“the first day”) would be different from the permitted price on the next day (“the second day”) as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Door Supervision

8. Each individual who is to carry out a security activity at the premises must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

9. Two SIA registered Door Supervisors shall be on duty during licensing hours, apart from Monday - Thursday before 5.00pm when one registered Door Supervisor is required for any number of people up to 100, and 2 Door Supervisors for 101 - 200.
10. Compliance with the rules of the Council annexed hereto relating to the rules of management of the places of public entertainment and to the following additional conditions derived from Public Entertainment Licence.
11. The maximum number of persons accommodated at any one time shall not exceed 200.
12. The premises licence holder will undertake acoustic treatment to the premises and/or ensure that all amplified recorded and live music played within the premises, is subject to the control of a noise

limiter so noise and vibration is inaudible in the nearest noise sensitive premises between the hours of 23:00 and 07:00 on any day and does not cause nuisance at all other times anytime.

13. The noise limiter shall be set and calibrated by an Acoustic Consultant, registered with a recognised regulating authority on an annual basis. A copy of certificate(s) of compliance is to be forwarded to the Pollution Control Team prior to regulated entertainment taking place and annually updated from there on.
14. The noise limited shall be kept in a secure, lockable cupboard or similar location. The system is to be completely independent of control by persons other than the licensee.
15. The premises shall maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of a Metropolitan Police Crime Prevention Officer. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises are open to the public. This staff member shall be able to show Police or an authorised officer of Hackney Borough Council recent data or footage with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.
16. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available immediately to an authorised officer of the Hackney Borough Council or the Police, which will record the following:
 - a. all crimes reported to the venue
 - b. any complaints received
 - c. any incidents of disorder
 - d. any faults in the CCTV system or searching equipment or scanning
 - e. equipment
 - f. any refusal of the sale of alcohol
 - g. any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.
17. There shall be "CCTV in Operation" signs prominently displayed.
18. All instances of crime or disorder to be reported by the designated premises supervisor or responsible member of staff to an agreed police contact point, as agreed with the Police.
19. There shall be no promotional sales of alcohol at the premises.

20. Additional SIA registered door supervisors shall be considered on an operational risk assessment basis. All door supervisors shall enter their full details in the premises daily register at the commencement of their work. They shall record their full name, home address and contact telephone number, their SIA registration number, and the time they commence and conclude working. If the door supervisor was provided by an agency the name, registered business address and contact telephone number will also be recorded. This register will be made available to police or authorised officer immediately upon request.
21. There shall be no glass, drinks or open containers allowed outside the front of the premises at any time.
22. Where the sale or supply of alcohol is taking place employees of the premises must request sight of evidence of the age of any person appearing to be under 25 years of age (Challenge 25). Such evidence may include a driving licence or passport.
23. Premises to operate a zero tolerance policy to drugs and comply with the Hackney Police/Council Community Safety Unit Drugs and Weapons Policy where appropriate.
24. The premises will display and maintain appropriate signage advising customers of the contact details of the Designated Premises Supervisor.
25. All staff should receive training and have an awareness of the four licensing objectives.
26. All staff will be trained on the legislation relating to the sales of alcohol to underage persons and drunken persons.

Annex 3 – Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority

27. On Friday and Saturday nights there shall be no entry to or re-entry to the premises after 02:30 am the day following by members of the public, except those patrons who have temporarily left the premises to smoke.

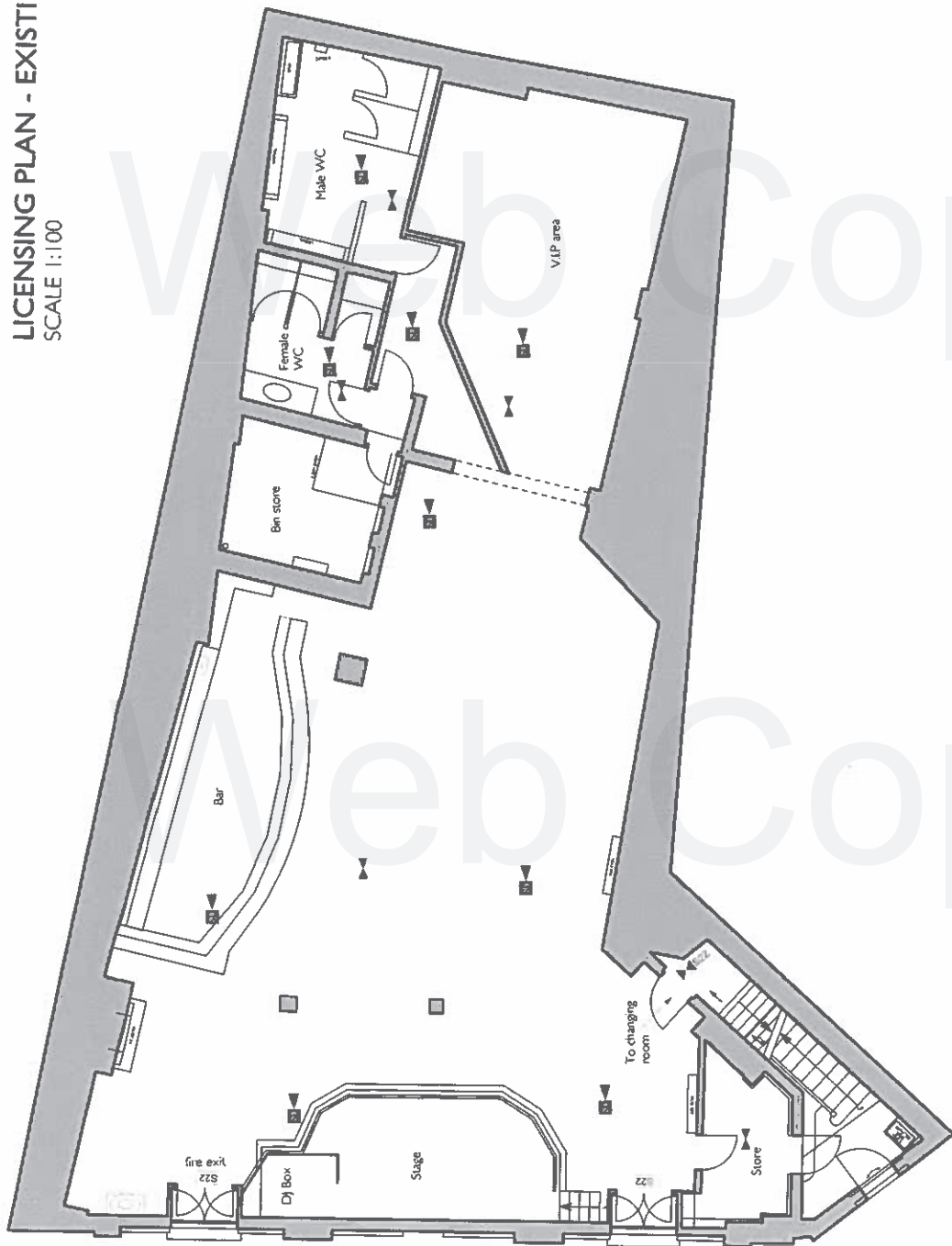

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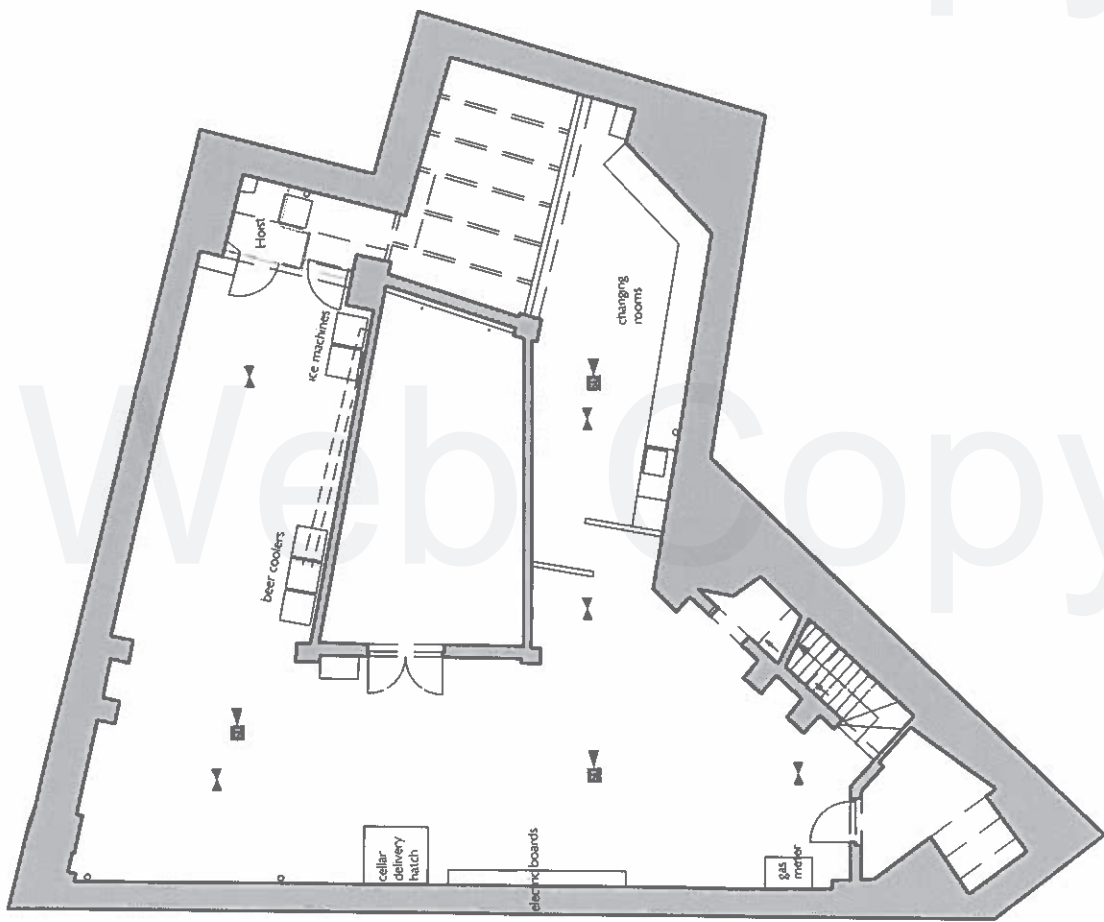
