Dear all,

Apologies for the broad email, but we are raising a timely potential multi-disciplinary issue.

I write on behalf of nearly a dozen Shoreditch residents/families. We've just completed another horrible weekend, slightly moderated by the rain. All of you are keenly aware of the disturbing trends in Shoreditch, with a seemingly ever-increasing level of violence, filth, disorder, disruption and general anti-social behaviour, now day and night. We appreciate this is on your current agendas.

We are begging you not to issue a TENs for this event, and to hold it to very strict account if it does proceed.

The open-air site is completely inappropriate for an event. Childrens' bedrooms are less than 10 feet from the lot (photos attached). The property is quite literally surrounded by residences (map attached, residences circled), and noise echoes off the dense urban landscape.

Billed as a "community" event, there's been zero community consultation. Being blunt: no one wants this. We already suffer through the Urban "Food" Fest across the road, which is little more than an open-air booze garden. Last weekend saw shouting and screaming until nearly midnight.

No other borough would issue a TENs for an event like this, in this neighbourhood, in the current emergency-environment. *Again, we beg you not to add to the disorder by issuing a TENs.*

But again, for the sake of our and our childrens' health, we beg you to stop this madness before it starts.
