# Minutes of the Previous Meeting & Action Log The City Integrated Care Partnership Board APPROVED the minutes of the previous meeting. The Hackney Integrated Care Partnership Board APPROVED the minutes of the previous meeting. Questions from the Public CK stated there are no logged questions from the public.







#### 5. Vaccination Programme Update

Ben Greenbury, (BG) presented a document with slides and gave an update on the vaccination uptake and the outreach work that is taking place in City and Hackney.

BG updated on the data, giving a high level overview of achievements over the last few months and high-level work. The current situation was now that 64% of the 12+ local population had received a first dose, and 58% a 2<sup>nd</sup> dose. We are at 40% on boosters.

There is still work to be done for vulnerable population priority group trends for 75yrs and over and a huge amount of work was taking place. Patients are being contacted to attend vaccination clinics, with practices calling patients over 75yrs old and 500 people had been vaccinated two weeks later. In the last two weeks 2871 local people were vaccinated and the last week increased slightly to 3400. BG flagged that the last few weeks had started to see a reduction for boosters and 3<sup>rd</sup> doses.

BG stated we continue as a programme to target the most vulnerable residents, SOAs and ward ethnicities and health inclusion groups with lowest levels of uptake.

Progress had been made over the last month in outreach targeting, with a clinic being stood up at the beginning of January with a vaccination trailer outside Liverpool street station, three clinics have been taken place with 157 people vaccinated over the three events which was very well received, there's also been an ongoing weekly provision in clinic at the Boots Liverpool street pharmacy, the uptake last week was around 30 the feedback receiving from the leads pharmacists at Boots Liverpool street is the last date is likely to be 17<sup>th</sup> February for this clinic.

There was an event for the orthodox Jewish community at Biala synagogue where 127 people were vaccinated. There were separate events for males and females.

Spring Hill clinics have been a success over the past 3 months, 50 a week vaccinated in this clinic these will be continuing through till end of March.

BG stated there are three outreach clinics taking place this week for children and young people at various schools and colleges. All schools been offered in school vaccination clinic for 12 - 17yr olds and staff between 21<sup>st</sup> February and Easter holidays. The Children and Young People (CYP) team from the council and education are working closely and to date, 13 schools had taken up the offer.

BG stated in terms of homeless and rough sleepers, outreach clinics had been held at Greenhouse practice, Charter Lane and also clinics at Church Walk had taken place for sex workers and the homeless community, with further sites being scoped for future clinics. BG stated these are being risk assessed and that the inclusion of these groups, and other groups continue to be a big priority for the programme.

Briding hotels for the Afghanistan refugees were working very closely with vaccinations partners at the local vaccinations' sites in City and Hackney and the community organisations Bangla housing and Paiwand to get the final people vaccinated. 64 residents had been booked in for vaccinations that includes the 12-15yr olds.

Springhill clinics continue in Feb and March including 12-15yr old on 13<sup>th</sup> Feb and there are 3 outreach clinics taking place in Portsoken Ward in the City on 17, 18<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> February in Mansell St Estate and 2 in clinics in Turkish Cypriot community one on 15<sup>th</sup> Feb and one on 18<sup>th</sup> Feb.







Children and young people are being seen in school clinics delivered by East London Foundation Trust (ELFT). Also, the programme is in the process of onboarding 3 charity organisations to support uptake for 12-15yr olds, starting work in the next week. There will be mop up clinics with the Bridging hotels for Afghanistan refugees when people become eligible for 2<sup>nd</sup> doses and boosters.

CK expressed thanks for the offer for ward members and data sessions, highlighting that Olga's kit had been very well received.

HP stated BG is doing excellent work and that the programme had been successful, however going forward it looks like activity will be going down, will there be a need to look at the model we provide?

BG stated there had been a vaccination steering group discussing this matter yesterday and that it was recognised that we are not in the heights of the peak at the moment. BG continued that the team were having a lot of involvement in the model and working with partners to assess this.

Deputy Mayor Antoinette Bramble (AB) asked a question on how to correlate data and asked whether the data reflected if someone had vaccinations somewhere else?

BG stated that when residents have their vaccinations in City and Hackney it would be recorded in local vaccinations clinics and in their GP records.

Dr Sandra Husbands (SH) stated figures are collected by vaccination sites as well despite the relatively low uptake compared to other parts of London and the country, vaccinations sites have been flat out and have been delivering vaccines to people who don't live in Hackney or registered in Hackney.

John Gieves (JG) expressed concern regarding the recent national u turn on NHS staff being compelled to be fully vaccinated from April 2022 and asked how that is impacting on people's interest in getting vaccinated. CK responded that there had been an announcement yesterday which wouldn't have impacted yet. SH commented there was a lot going on, when the Covid pass existed to access things, people were more motivated to get vaccinated due to legal requirements, however we don't know the uptake as yet. The teams continued to work on mandatory measures planned till end of March.







#### 6. Data Intelligence

Diana Divajeva (DD) set out the picture in City and Hackney in terms of new cases of Covid, setting out there is a huge decline, although still relatively high rates of COVID in City and Hackney. Delta incidence rate was much lower however we are not out of the woods yet but moving in the right direction. There were differences present across City and Hackney with variations in trajectory across wards, although most wards in Hackney had seen declines in rates.

DD stated that the public dashboard is available to access on the Hackney website.

DD set out that testing rates have been declining in case rates while positivity rates are low but fairly stable and hospital bed occupancy at Homerton hospital has been declining with low rates of serious COVID illnesses in hospital. The mortality rate was lower

CK questioned vaccinations status for hospitalised and deaths asked if there was care data / statistics for this? DD responded she doesn't have that data / stats but the North East London (NEL) level was around 90% people in ITU unvaccinated.

CM questioned data for long COVID. DD responded there is a mis match on data where might have long COVID locally and vulnerable groups that received care.

Tony Wong (TW) questioned whether we have hospital data on which cohort that has COVID who are seriously ill. DD responded she doesn't have hospital data however will bring back to NEL group, looking at COVID deaths on death certificates which might be direct / indirect.

CM stated there is a high proportion still unvaccinated. Also seeing cases in maternity services, mothers unvaccinated requiring additional support in maternity services. Screening programme identifies COVID diminishing. Majority of the deaths at Homerton University Hospital was pre-vaccine. The numbers have been smaller over the last months.







#### 7. Local Outbreak Control Plan Update

CK briefed the LOCB that this item is more for information.

SH raised that the LOCB itself may be able to be wrapped considering the changes in the national situation and thatit may not be necessary to give this amount of time and scrutiny to this subject after March 2022.

CK suggested an agenda item be added for the next LOCB meeting to consider the future of the meeting going forward, when more clarity should be available about wider regulations.

AB questioned government restrictions on guidance around isolation, asking if there was local flexibility to respond to numbers of hospitalisation re: ventilation and put measures in place? SH stated that the team would respond to specific situations in the same way as to any other outbreak in terms of treatment. Non-pharmaceutical preventive measures were a much better place to advise on people what to do.

AB thanked the Chair and SH for the measures in place, strategies and tools.

CK asked about mask wearing recommendations in schools. SH stated there was useful constructive conversations with colleagues from the Department for Education (DfE) to discuss any concerns around outbreaks in schools.

JG expressed that he was thinking about raising this matter in the risk register, noting that everyone tended to be assuming that the next variant is going to be milder than the Omicron virus, however this isn't guaranteed to be the case, another variant may be more serious. It will be useful to think about how we maintain readiness for that even though we are not acting on it immediately.

SH stated thinking about that as a Health Protection Board and operational sense and multi-disciplinary partners about existing contracts how to have scalable operation intervention and what impact this will have on population and NHS pressures.

SH noted that conversations are underway with colleagues with UK Health Security Agency (UKHSA) and Office for Health Improvement and Disparities (OHID), the two national public health bodies about what the next phase will be in terms of what structures and relationships we're going to have in the new public health infrastructure and what we do as local areas and what they are going to be doing nationally to be able to respond and scale up rapidly if necessary.





# **Achievements in the past month:**

# Outreach targeting low uptake geographies and ethnicities:

- 108 people vaccinated at Spring Hill Practice
- 42 people vaccinated in clinics supported by Halkevi and TCCA organisations
- 3 outreach clinics mobilised for Portsoken, 1 cancelled due to weather conditions. 11 vaccinated in total
- Hyperlocal approach adopted as the way forward for Q4 2021/2022 and Q1 2022/2023. Springfield and Hoxton West Wards have been identified as areas with lowest uptake to pilot this approach

# **Children & Young People**

• In-school c-19 vaccination clinics: First clinic took place on 21st February in Cardinal Pole Catholice School. 14 12+ children were vaccinated. Nine further in-school clinics will take place during March

**12-15 VCS Community Project mobilisation:** Currently mobilising project delivery for five community organisations (March-June delivery period). Blue Hut Youth & Community Club and Labernum Boat Club will hold the first 12+ clinics before the end of March to support the out of school offer. These sites have already been assured for clinics.

# **Health inclusion:**

- Fortnightly clinics stood up for homeless and rough sleepers at Greenhouse Practice, St Sepulchre, Holiday Inn Old Street,
- **38** residents vaccinated at the Apex London Bridging Hotels, 9,1st dose, 10, 2nd dose and 19 Boosters
- Services that are in contact with homeless and rough sleepers are now handing out the Fast pass to vaccination clinics to encourage the most vulnerable to get vaccinated

# Next steps for the NHS Covid 19 vaccination programme planning and delivery:

- i) continued access to COVID-19 vaccination;
- ii) delivery of an autumn COVID-19 vaccination campaign if advised by JCVI; and
- iii) development of detailed contingency plans to rapidly increase capacity, if required

Across each, the focus must remain on increasing uptake in all communities and addressing unwarranted variation.

Planning for the year ahead will need to cover two time periods to reflect the delivery of continued access to COVID-19 vaccination throughout the spring/summer and an autumn vaccination programme

We need to see the COVID-19 vaccination programme as part of a 2-3 year journey looking at greater opportunities for coadministration with flu and other immunisation programmes

#### **Patient and Public Involvement and Impact:**

Community, public and patient engagement has been undertaken throughout the COVID pandemic to ensure insight is gained, issues addressed and services changed to reflect identified need.

Local contact tracing: Patients are called for contact tracing purposes but also to connect them with the Welfare Line if needed. This can help support a range of issues that might make maintaining isolation difficult or impossible, especially for vulnerable or socially isolated individuals.

# Clinical/practitioner input and engagement:

The Public Health team provides extensive support via the Covid-19 inbox (Monday to Friday), including consultant support when needed. Local contact tracing receives support 7 days a week and working groups have clinical/practitioner input.

#### **Communications and engagement:**

Communications continue to focus on meeting the objectives of the LOMP in particular, preventing and mitigating the spread of Covid-19 to save lives, communicating openly and honestly with key stakeholders, and working with the community to develop capacity to support local testing contact tracing, as well as vaccination uptake. This includes the continued reinforcement of the prevention messages 'hands, face, space' on various channels, amplifying government messages and supporting the work of the GLA and London Councils. In addition, there is ongoing work on specific communications related to key areas of work, with key stakeholders, including the public, care homes, local contact tracing teams and community champions.

## Equalities implications and impact on priority groups:

Local contact tracing: Covid-19 is understood to have disproportionately frequent and severe effects on specific high risk groups, who may be the least likely to be contacted by the national NHS Test and Trace team. The local service offers an opportunity to address this inequality both directly, by contacting harder to reach individuals at higher risk, and indirectly by contributing to the national and global fight against the virus.

The Community Champions work and Covid-19 Grant Information programme are targeted at key communities and priority groups.

# Safeguarding implications:

All contact tracing staff undertake mandatory safeguarding training, before being able to access the national database to make calls.

# Impact on / Overlap with Existing Services:

Potential additional surges in infections may occur during winter and into 2022. As infections rates reduce services will be reviewed to see what can be stepped down or mainstreamed into existing service provision.

#### FINANCE update for LOCB, 10 Mar 22

The total projected spend for the Test and Trace programme is currently standing at £5.041m. The committed spend for LBH and CoL currently stands at £4.814m and £0.227m respectively. The £3.247m Test and Trace allocation is fully utilised, the remaining £1.793m spend is to be funded via the Contained Outbreak Management Fund. A detailed breakdown of the projected spend for each organisation, including details of outbreaks plans agreed to date is shown in Appendix 1 below.



# **Testing: Symptomatic (PCR) Testing**

- There continues to be a decrease in demand for PCR testing in Hackney as we continue to see a downward trend in case numbers (as depicted by the graph below, with the red line being the positive rate of PCR tests, and the blue bar showing the number of PCR tests returned). We continue to also similar trends in the City, although, there was a slight increase in PCR testing rates in the latest week (5.6%), despite the decrease in case numbers.
- We are continuing to operate 5 PCR testing sites throughout Hackney, and have 1 operating in the City of London. All PCR tests sites will remain in operation until the end of March.





# **Testing: Asymptomatic (LFT or rapid) testing**


- There have been four policy changes as of 24 February, that will have an impact on testing:
  - As of 21 February, the Government has removed the guidance for staff and students in most education and childcare settings to undertake twice weekly asymptomatic testing.
  - As of 24 February, the Government:
    - Removed the legal requirement to self-isolate following a positive test. Adults and children who test positive will continue to be advised to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for at least 5 full days and then continue to follow the guidance until they have received 2 negative test results on consecutive days.
    - No longer asks fully vaccinated close contacts and those aged under 18 to test daily for 7 days, and removed the legal requirement for close contacts who are not fully vaccinated to self-isolate.
    - Put an end routine contact tracing. Contacts are no longer be required to self-isolate or advised to take daily tests.
- On 21 February, it was also announced that free, universal, symptomatic and asymptomatic testing for the general public in England will end on 1 April, which has had an impact on demand. Shortly after this announcement was made, tests were "unavailable for delivery". According to the UK Health Security Agency, the number of rapid tests available each day has been capped to "manage demand".
- DHSC has scaled back the amount of delivery stock of LFD test kits they are providing to local authorities, which has, again, negatively impacted our outreach commitments. Small allocations have been reserved to ensure residents have access to tests in both the City of London and Hackney.
- In an effort to ensure access to testing, we continue to offer assisted tests through the MTUs that are placed around the borough in different outreach locations. Outreach teams continue to promote messaging around the importance of testing.




# **Testing over time:**

# **Local contact tracing (LCT)**

# National and local contact tracing - ended on 23 Feb 2022

- Per recent Covid-19 policy changes 'Anyone who tests positive for Covid-19 from 24 Feb will not be contacted to collect information about their close contacts and these close contacts will no longer be traced'
- The 5 full timer call agents have been absorbed back into Customer Service resource pool as planned. Some are / will be 'on retainer' for Public Health initiatives - supporting OIRR, vaccination outreach programme
- LA call agent access to National Test & Trace Web-tool (CTAS) is limited to read only for public health contact tracing



- There is no plan to stand up Local Contact tracing for wider population in case of future surges
  - Contact tracing is an imperfect tool to contain massive Covid 19 transmission, especially when there is limited enforcement of self isolation compliance



# Local contact tracing (LCT) - UKHSA LA Trace Performance

Comparing to baseline, there is a 2-fold increase in self completing trace questionnaire percentage (London average 67%) reflecting changes in case demographics over a 6-month period.








# Outbreak identification and rapid response 'OIRR'

- 'Living with Covid' plan: 'LA will continue to manage local outbreaks of COVID-19 in high risk settings as they do with other infectious diseases', working with UKSHA
- Continued efforts to work with UK HSA Health Protection Team on vulnerable settings with support from City of London and Hackney EHO, and some retainer call agent resource (as standby resources for any desktop investigation and contact tracing) in case of new severe variants or major outbreaks
  - Homeless and asylum seekers accommodations, bridging hotels
  - Supported living accommodations and hospices
  - Critical infrastructure sectors
- iCERT hasn't resumed as at 1 Mar (planned version 4 go-live date) as its existing data feed from National Test and Trace Web-tool (CTAS) had stopped
- Alternative local Covid 19 surveillance data is to be explored







# **Support for self-isolation**

Isolation support continues to be available and provided mostly in response to inbound calls to the Here to Help Helpline. This is expected to continue to end of March 2022, as long as free testing is available. However, with the end to legal self-isolation requirements, a significant drop is expected from 24 February onwards.

### **Food support** during self-isolation:

- January 2022: 185 referrals of which 109 Kosher referrals, supporting 833 people in households
- February 2022 (till 22 Feb): 35 referrals, supporting 105 people in households
- → Marked drop in food referrals between January and February, much like in 2021.

### Care Packages (to households)

- January 2022: 24 referrals, 51 delivered
- February 2022 (till 22 feb): 15 referrals, 28 delivered

Care packages and food support will continue through the Community Partnership Network

# Community engagement: The Community Champions and COVID-19 Information Grants Programme

### <u>Department for Levelling Up Housing and Communities Community Vaccine Champions programme</u>

- A delivery plan has been developed which outlines how we will use the Community Vaccine Champions funding to increase outreach, engagement and communication with residents disproportionately impacted by COVID-19 vaccine inequity as well as to develop solutions which address practical barriers to accessing vaccines.
- As part of this programme, small grants of up to £3k will be available to over 30 VCS organisations hosting Community Champions, to enable them to continue to participate in the Community Champion network, share information about Covid-19 with the communities they support and feedback local insight (including about vaccine barriers and hesitancies) to help inform our ongoing local delivery plans. In addition, 6-12 larger grants of up to £10k in value, with a focus on 'hyper local' place based activity aimed at increasing vaccine uptake in priority areas, will also be available.
- Feedback provided during our recent co-design session with VCS partners has emphasised the need to incorporate communication and engagement about the vaccine as part of broader, non-COVID-19 related, activities.
- Although this work will focus primarily on increasing vaccine rates in priority communities/areas, it will also contribute
  towards the longer term objectives around developing trust and lasting partnerships with the VCS and the
  communities they serve.
- We aim to launch the grant in the next 1-2 weeks and grant activity will take place for six months from April -September 2022.



# Community engagement: The Community Champions and COVID-19 Information Grants Programme

### **Community Champions Programme**

- Hackney's Health and Wellbeing Strategy has been discussed at the most recent Community Champion Forum and Community Champion Peer Support Session. Community Champions have been given the opportunity to feed into the consultation on the draft strategy and discuss the priorities and suggested actions which have been outlined. We will continue to provide opportunities for Community Champions to contribute to the development and implementation of Hackney's Health and Wellbeing Strategy.
- Community Champion peer support sessions have been popular and well received due to the informal nature of the sessions and opportunities for collaborating with peers from a range of different organisations. Volunteer Centre Hackney now plans to host these hour long sessions on a fortnightly basis.

### **Communications**

- We continue to provide updates on COVID-19 information and guidance with Community Champions via the newsletter, What's App Broadcast and monthly forums. We have also been sharing information and resources on wider health and wellbeing topics including mental health and healthy weight.
- The Community Champions Communications Officer post, which was due to end in March 2022, has been extended by nine months and will continue to provide important communications and engagement support to the programme.

- The total projected spend for the Test and Trace Programme currently stands at £5.041m, which is being funded via both the Test & Trace and COMF grants received from DHSC
- The committed spend for LBH and CoL currently stands at £4.814m and £0.227m respectively
- The Test and Trace grant allocation is being fully utilised, funding £3.247m of the spend
- The Contain Outbreak Management Fund is funding the additional £1.793m of spend
- The COMF is funding further spend on Health protection, communications, engagement insights and research, supporting local communities and Health improvements.
