1. **Summary**

1.1. This is an application for a premises licence to allow authorisation for the provision of late night refreshment and sale of alcohol on Monday to Sunday.

2. **Application**

- 2.1. HS Hackney Ltd has made an application for a premises licence under section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 2.2. The applicant is seeking authorisation for the following licensable activities and times:

- 3.1. The current premises licence was granted on 28 February 2017 with the hours for supply of alcohol (on sales), Mon-Sun: 12:00-23:30 and late night refreshment, Mon-Sun: 23:00-23:30.
- 3.2. No temporary event notices have been given for this premises in current year.

6. **Guidance Considerations**

6.1. The Licensing Authority is required to have regard to any guidance issued by the Secretary of State under the Licensing Act 2003.

7. **Policy Considerations**

- 7.1. Licensing Sub-Committee is required to have regard to the London Borough of Hackney's Statement of Licensing Policy ("the Policy) adopted by the Licensing Authority.
- 7.2. The Policy applies to applications where relevant representations have been made. With regard to this application, policies, LP1 (General Principles), LP2 (Licensing Objectives), LP3 (Core Hours), LP5 (Planning Status), LP6 (External Areas and Outdoor Events) and LP11 (Cumulative Impact) are relevant.

8. Officer Observations

8.1. If the Sub-Committee is minded to approve the application, the following conditions should be applied the licence:

Supply of Alcohol (On/Both)

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:
 - (a) At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence.
 - (b) At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be

made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

- 3. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises -
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
 - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- 4. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 5. 5.1. The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sales or supply of alcohol.
 - 5.2 The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licences must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
 - 5.3. The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible

person to be under 18 years if age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either:-

- A. a holographic mark or
- B. an ultraviolet feature.
- 6. The responsible person shall ensure that:
 - a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures:
 - beer or cider: 1/2 pint;
 - gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25ml or 35ml; and
 - still wine in a glass: 125ml; and
 - a. these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
 - b. where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

Minimum Drinks Pricing

- 7. 7.1 A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
 - 7.2 For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 7.1 above -
 - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979:
 - (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula P = D+(DxV) Where -
 - (i)P is the permitted price,
 - (ii)D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
 - (c) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
 - (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -
 - (i) the holder of the premises licence,
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
 - (e) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the

club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and

- (f) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 7.3 Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8.2(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub- paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 7.4 (1) Sub-paragraph 7.4(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 7.2(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Conditions derived from Responsible Authority representations

- 8. The premises shall maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of a Metropolitan Police Crime Prevention Officer. All public areas, entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer.
- 9. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises are open to the public. This staff member shall be able to show Police or an authorised officer of Hackney Borough Council recent data or footage with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.
- 10. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available immediately to an authorised officer of the Hackney Borough Council or the Police, which will record the following:
 - a. all crimes reported to the venue
 - b. any complaints received
 - c. any incidents of disorder
 - d. any faults in the CCTV system
 - e. any refusal of the sale of alcohol
 - f. any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service
- 11. There shall be "CCTV in Operation" signs prominently displayed.

- 12. All instances of crime or disorder to be reported by the designated premises supervisor or responsible member of staff to an agreed police contact point, as agreed with the Police.
- 13. Where the sale or supply of alcohol is taking place employees of the premises must request sight of evidence of the age of any person appearing to be under 25 years of age (Challenge 25). Such evidence may include a driving licence or passport.
- 14. The premises will display and maintain appropriate signage advising customers of the contact details of the Designated Premises Supervisor/Duty Manager.
- 15. All staff will be given refresher training every twelve months on the legislation relating to the sales of alcohol to underage persons and drunken persons. Written records of this training shall be kept on the premises and produced to police or other authorised officer upon request.
- 16. The premises shall adhere to Hackney Police Theft, Weapons and Drugs Policies and any updates thereof.
- 17. There shall only be background music at the premises that allows for a face-to-face conversation at a normal speech level.
- 18. There shall be no more than 3 patrons smoking outside the premises at any one time.
- 19. There shall be no more than 40 seated patrons permitted in the premises at any one time.
- 20. The window at the rear of the premises, facing the canal, is to be kept closed from 22.00 hours.
- 21. Prominent, clear and legible notices will be displayed at the exit requesting the public to respect the needs of nearby residents and to leave the premises and the area quietly.
- 22. All deliveries will be carried out at such a time or in such a manner as to not cause nuisance and disturbance to nearby residents.
- 23. Customers will be asked not to loiter outside the premises.
- 24. The movement of bins and rubbish outside the premises will be kept to a minimum after 11pm.
- 25. Adequate waste receptacles for use by customers will be provided.
- 26. The sale of alcohol shall only be by waiter service to seated customers, and there shall be no direct sales of alcohol to customers standing at the bar.

- 27. The Licensee shall ensure that all relevant staff are fully trained and made aware of the legal requirement of businesses to comply with their responsibility as regards the disposal of waste produced from the business premises. The procedure for handling and preparing for disposal of the waste shall be in writing and displayed in a prominent place where it can be referred to at all times by staff.
- 28. The Licensee shall ensure that any contract for general and recyclable waste disposal shall be appropriate in size to the amount of waste produced by the business. The Licensee shall maintain an adequate supply of waste receptacles provided by his registered waste carrier (refuse sacks or commercial waste bins) in order to ensure all refuse emanating from the business is always presented for collection by his waste carrier and shall not use any plain black or unidentifiable refuse sacks or any other unidentifiable or unmarked waste receptacles.
- 29. The Licensee's premises are situated in an area within which refuse may only be left on the public highway at certain times (time bands). If the Licensee's waste carrier cannot or does not comply by collecting the refuse within an hour after the close of any time band imposed by the waste authority, the Licensee must remove the refuse from the public highway and/or keep it within the premises until such time as his/her waste carrier arrives to collect the refuse.
- 30. The Licensee shall instruct members of staff to make regular checks of the area immediately outside the premises and remove any litter, bottles and glasses emanating from the premises. A final check should be made at close of business.
- 31. The Licensee shall provide a safe receptacle for cigarette ends to be placed outside for the use of customers, such receptacle being carefully placed so as not to cause an obstruction or trip.
- 32. The current trade waste agreement/duty of care waste transfer document shall be conspicuously displayed and maintained in the window of the premises where it can be conveniently seen and read by persons standing in By the Bridge. This should remain unobstructed at all times and should clearly identify:-
 - the name of the registered waste carrier
 - the date of commencement of trade waste contract
 - the date of expiry of trade waste contract
 - the days and times of collection
 - the type of waste including the European Waste Code

9. Reasons for Officer Observations

9.1. Conditions 8 to 26 are derived from applicant's operating schedule and conditions 27 to 32 have been proposed by Environmental Enforcement.

10. **Legal Comments**

- 10.1. The Council has a duty as a Licensing Authority under the Licensing Act 2003 to carry out its functions with a view to promoting the following 4 licensing objectives;
 - The Prevention of Crime and Disorder
 - Public Safety
 - Prevention of Public Nuisance
 - The Protection of Children from Harm
- 10.2. It should be noted that each of the licensing objectives have equal importance and are the only grounds upon which a relevant representation can be made and for which an application can be refused or terms and conditions attached to a licence.

11. Human Rights Act 1998 Implications

- 11.1. There are implications to;
 - *Article 6* Right to a fair hearing
 - *Article 14* Not to discriminate
 - Balancing: **Article 1-** Peaceful enjoyment of their possession (i.e. a licence is defined as being a possession) with **Article 8** Right of Privacy (i.e. respect private & family life) to achieve a proportionate decision having regard to the protection of an individuals rights against the interests of the community at large.





By the Bridge, 283a Kingsland Road, London E2 8AS

- The Licensee shall ensure that all relevant staff are fully trained and made aware of the legal requirement of businesses to comply with their responsibility as regards the disposal of waste produced from the business premises. The procedure for handling and preparing for disposal of the waste shall be in writing and displayed in a prominent place where it can be referred to at all times by staff.
- 2. The Licensee shall ensure that any contract for general and recyclable waste disposal shall be appropriate in size to the amount of waste produced by the business. The Licensee shall maintain an adequate supply of waste receptacles provided by his registered waste carrier (refuse sacks or commercial waste bins) in order to ensure all refuse emanating from the business is always presented for collection by his waste carrier and shall not use any plain black or unidentifiable refuse sacks or any other unidentifiable or unmarked waste receptacles.
- 3. The Licensee's premises are situated in an area within which refuse may only be left on the public highway at certain times (time bands). If the Licensee's waste carrier cannot or does not comply by collecting the refuse within an hour after the close of any time band imposed by the waste authority, the Licensee must remove the refuse from the public highway and/or keep it within the premises until such time as his/her waste carrier arrives to collect the refuse.

Police make the following representations in relation to the application for a Premises Licence at BY THE BRIDGE, 283A KINGSLAND ROAD, LONDON, E2 8AS for the following reason(s);

This premises is a small premises situated on a main road that links Dalston and Shoreditch. This particular area has several licensed premises including bars, food outlets and shops.

This application has been submitted by HS Hackney Ltd. This company has one person assigned to it on Companies House – that being Ms Hande SEZGIN. Ms SEZGIN was recently the DPS at this premises – which currently holds a valid premises licence – but was replaced after police officers found breaches at the premises. She was replaced by her partner Mr Ismail TEZGEL.

Police licensing officers have visited this premises several times and on each occasion found breaches of the conditions. These breaches have been pointed out to the operators and warning letters sent. The most recent visit was on 25th March 2022, when police attended to conduct a licensing visit and monitor whether the breaches pointed out in the warning letter had been rectified. The manager was extremely unhelpful and refused to show police any orders, till receipts and customers tabs/bills. It was clear that conditions were still being breached and confidence levels in the operators remain low.

This application has been submitted so that the operators can run the premises as a bar. The reason that police were satisfied with the original application for this premises, was the ancillary to food condition that was offered. This area has attracted complaints from residents (some of which have been attributed to this applicants and partners other venue close by – U7). This venue was reviewed by Hackney Council Licensing Enforcement officers resulting in Ms Hande SEZGIN (this applicant), being banned from the premises when the premises licence is in use, in order to promote the licensing objectives.

This application describes itself as a 'Licensed Restaurant', yet no restaurant conditions have been added to the proposed conditions listed in the operating schedule. Neither does the application address the tables outside on the street.

Police not only have concerns in relation to the operators of the premises but also the structure of the premises itself. During my last visit, I found the staircase that leads up to the roof terrace, where numerous customers were sat drinking, extremely steep and narrow and difficult to navigate. Police would like to see a Health and Safety assessment and fire risk assessment that relates to the use of this staircase in an emergency, as police feel that this could be a hazard and cause injury.

Police have very little confidence in the operators at this venue, and the introduction of a new DPS is not sufficient to allay our concerns.

I write in relation to the application for a new premises licence.

It is noted that there is a premises licence (ref: 083644) already in existence at this site. However, this application appears to be seeking to (1) enable the premises to operate without the existing requirement for alcohol to be sold ancillary to substantial table meals (2) increase capacity from 15 seated patrons to 40 and (3) regularise a roof terrace constructed subsequent to the grant of the existing licence.

Planning records (ref: 2016/2589) show that Change of use of ground floor unit to a drinking establishment (use class A4) was granted on 5 September 2016. In a management plan that accompanied the application, the following was stated: "The business operates 7 days a week from 8.00 to 18.00 hours weekdays 9.00 to 18.00 on weekends. Our request will be to change that to Mon-Fri 08.00 to 23.00, sat 09.00 to 23.00 and Sunday/ bank holidays 09.00 to 22.00 o`clock accordance with the alcohol licence." Therefore it is noted that the existing and proposed licence hours already exceed the hours authorised under planning.

Planning records also show that the roof terrace has permission after being allowed by the Planning Inspector (ref APP/U5360/W/21/3269292). This enabled the "continuous use of the existing seating area on the terrace floor including the metal balustrade for safety reasons." It is noted that the following condition was attached:

"The roof terrace hereby permitted shall not be used outside the hours of 0800–2200 Sunday to Wednesday and 0800-2300 Thursday to Saturday."

The applicant may wish to amend the licence application to reflect this condition in the licence application to ensure the promotion of the public nuisance objective. I am also aware of Police concerns in relation to the structural suitability of the roof terrace which is accessed via a spiral staircase. Some detail in relation to this to allay safety concerns would be helpful.

It is noted that the director of the company is known to the service as having involvement with two other nearby sites. One of these sites has been particularly problematic so discussion may be required in order to ensure the promotion of the licensing objectives.
