1. **Summary**

1.1. The Metropolitan Police has given the Licensing Authority and the premises user notice of objection to Temporary Event Notices for an event to be held on 15/09/2022 from 12:00 finishing on 18/09/2022 at 22:00 at above premises. The Licensing Authority must hold a hearing to decide whether or not to allow the event to proceed.

2. **Current Status/History**

2.1. The premises is licensed under the Licensing Act 2003 and the licence document is attached as Appendix C.

3. <u>TEMPORARY EVENT NOTICE FOR EVENT TO BE HELD 15/09/2022 - 18/09/2022</u>

3.1. A TEN has been submitted to allow licensable activities to take place on the premises. A copy of the Temporary Event Notice is attached as Appendix A.

4. **Objections**

4.1. The Metropolitan Police has objected to the TEN on the grounds of the prevention of crime and disorder, public safety and the prevention of public nuisance. A copy of the objection is attached as Appendices B.

5. **Guidance Considerations**

5.1. That the Licensing Sub-Committee consider the issuing of counter notices if it is satisfied that any of the licensing objectives would be undermined if the premises were to be used in accordance with the temporary event notice.

6. **Policy Considerations**

- 6.1 When considering an objection to a TEN the Council will:
 - Expect that any existing conditions will be maintained (where relevant) in circumstances where an event is to take place at a premises that has an existing authorisation.
 - Assess any history of complaints as a result of licensable activity that may or may not have been authorised by a TEN.
 - Consider the track record of the premises user
- 6.2 Consider any other control measures proposed to mitigate the objection

7. Human Rights Act 1998 Implications

- 7.1. There are implications for;
 - Article 6 Right to a fair hearing
 - Article 14 Not to discriminate
 - Balancing; Article 1- Peaceful enjoyment of their possession (i.e. a licence is defined as being a possession) with Article 8 Right of Privacy (i.e. respect private & family life) to achieve a proportionate decision having regard to the protection of an individuals rights against the interests of the community at large.

8. Members; Decision Making

8.1. **Option 1**

That the Licensing Authority decides not to give a counter notice.

8.2. **Option 2**

That the Licensing Authority decides to give a counter notice, giving the reasons for the decision.

9. Conclusion

9.1. That Members decide whether or not to issue a counter notice for the event scheduled to take place on **15/09/2022** from **12:00** finishing on **18/09/2022** at **22:00** at location **above**.

Police object to the granting of this TEN for the 1st- 4th September, 6th-11th September, 15th-18th September, 22nd-25th September and 29th-30th September 2022 on the grounds of crime and disorder, public safety, the prevention of public nuisance and the protection of children from harm for the following reason(s):

This is the fourth different site location for the container at this venue. It was found from a site visit during the 'second round of TENs' that the container itself hadn't moved at all and the venue was therefore operating without an authorisation. It was also noted that the TEN authorisation was not being displayed as required.

The visitor management strategy seems to relate mainly to the inside area as it talks about placing SIA at the main entrance and exit, with another patrolling. There is no mention of the large outside seating area and how this is controlled. The policies provided have not been updated and largely focus on the main building and do not cover the off sales from the container.

Police would suggest that by simply moving the site of the container, in this instance by literally a few feet from 'site 3's' location, it is abusing the TENs process.

Annex 1 - Mandatory Conditions Supply Of Alcohol (On/Both)

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:
 - (a) At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence.
 - (b) At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 3. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises -
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
 - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- 4. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 5. 5.1. The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sales or supply of alcohol.

- 5.2 The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licences must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
- 5.3. The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years if age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either:-
- A. a holographic mark or
- B. an ultraviolet feature.
- 6. The responsible person shall ensure that:
- a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures:
- beer or cider:1/2 pint;
- gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25ml or 35ml; and
- still wine in a glass: 125ml; and
- a. these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and

b. where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

Minimum Drinks Pricing

- 7. 7.1 A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 7.2 For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 7.1 above -
- (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
- (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula P = D+(DxV) Where -
- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol:
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -
- (i) the holder of the premises licence,
- (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
- (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence:

- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 7.3 Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8.2(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub- paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 7.4 (1) Sub-paragraph 7.4(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 7.2(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Mandatory Condition - Exhibition Of Films

- 8. Admission of children (under 18) to the exhibition of any film must be restricted in accordance with: -
- (a) Recommendations made by the film classification body where the film classification body is specified in the licence, or
- (b) Recommendations made by the licensing authority where the film classification body is not specified in the licence, or the relevant licensing authority has not notified the holder of the licence that this subsection applies to the film in question.

"film classification body" means person('s) designated under s4 of the Video Recordings Act 1984(c.39).

Mandatory Condition -Door Supervision

9. Each individual who is to carry out a security activity at the premises must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

- 10. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of a Metropolitan Police Crime Prevention Officer. All public areas and all entry and exit point will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time tamping. Recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer.
- 11. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises are open to the public. This staff member shall be able to show Police or an authorised officer of Hackney Borough Council recent data or footage with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.
- 12. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to an authorised officer of the Council or the Police, which will as a minimum record the following:
- (a) all crimes reported to the venue
- (b) all ejections of patrons
- (c) any complaints received
- (d) any incidents of disorder
- (e) seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
- (f) any faults in the CCTV system or searching equipment or scanning equipment
- (g) any refusal of the sale of alcohol
- (h) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.
- 13. SIA will be deployed subject to an operational risk assessment basis. All security staff shall be clearly identifiable at all times. All door supervisors shall enter their full details in the premises daily register at the commencement of their work. They shall record their full name, home address and contact telephone number, their SIA registration number, and the time they commence and conclude working. If the door supervisor was provided by an agency the name, registered business address and contact telephone number will also be provided. This register will be made available to police or authorised officer immediately upon request.
- 14. Premises to operate zero tolerance policy to drugs and comply with Hackney Police and Council Community Safety Unit Drugs and Weapons Policy where appropriate.
- 15. All staff will be given refresher training every twelve months on the legislation relating to the sales of alcohol to underage persons and drunken persons. There shall be written records of all training kept at the premises and made available to police or other authorised officer upon request.

- 16. An adequate and appropriate supply of first aid equipment and materials shall be available on the premises.
- 17. The Premises License Holder or DPS will ensure that there is a fire risk assessment and emergency evacuation plan in place at all times.
- 18. There shall be a written dispersal policy, as agreed with the relevant Responsible Authorities, implemented at the premises and a copy lodged with the Council's Environmental Protection Team. A copy shall be kept on the premises and made available to the Metropolitan Police Service or other authorised officer upon request.
- 19.Clear and prominent notices shall be displayed and maintained at all exits in a place where they can be seen and easily read by customers requiring customers to leave the premises and the area quietly.
- 20.All staff are to be fully trained and made aware of the legal requirement of businesses to comply with their duty of care as regards the disposal of waste produced from the business premises. The procedure for handling and preparing for disposal of the waste shall be in writing and displayed in a prominent place where it can be referred to at all times by staff.
- 21.On days when a high profile sporting event is taking place within the Queen Elizabeth Olympic Park then the premises licence holder shall comply with any reasonable requests from the Police (including requests to not use outside seating areas or to cease sales of alcohol between certain hours) provided that at least 48 hours prior notice has been given to the premises licence holder.
- 22. The premises licence holder is to ensure that all amplified music at the premises between the hours of 23:00 and 08:00 is played through a sound limiting device to be set by a registered member of Institute of Acoustic or other similar professional body. The level should be set such as not to cause nuisance to the nearest noise sensitive receptor.
- 23. The sound limiter shall be securely locked and accessed only by the management.
- 24.A Challenge 25 proof of age scheme shall be operated at the premises where the only acceptable forms of identification are recognised photographic identification cards, such as driving license or passport
- 25. Challenge 25 signage will be prominently displayed.

Conditions derived from Responsible Authority representations

26. The Licensee shall ensure that all staff are fully trained and made aware of the legal requirement of businesses to comply with their responsibility as regards the disposal of waste produced from the business premises. The procedure for handling and preparing for disposal of the waste shall be in writing and displayed in a prominent place where it can be referred to at all times by staff.

- 27. The Licensee shall ensure that any contract for general and recyclable waste disposal shall be appropriate in size to the amount of waste produced by the business. The Licensee shall maintain an adequate supply of waste receptacles provided by his registered waste carrier (refuse sacks or commercial waste bins) in order to ensure all refuse emanating from the business is always presented for collection by his waste carrier and shall not use any plain black or unidentifiable refuse sacks or any other unidentifiable or unmarked waste receptacles. In order to minimise the amount of time any waste remains on the public highway in readiness for collection, the Licensee will ensure the timeframe within which it may expect its waste carrier to collect is adhered to.
- 28. The Licensee shall instruct members of staff to make regular checks of the area immediately outside the premises and remove any litter, bottles and glasses emanating from the premises. A final check should be made at close of business.
- 29. The Licensee shall provide a safe receptacle for cigarette ends to be Placed outside for the use of customers, such receptacle being carefully placed so as not to cause an obstruction or trip.
- 30. The current trade waste agreement/duty of care waste transfer document shall be conspicuously displayed and maintained in the window of the premises where it can be conveniently seen and read by persons standing in Hackney Bridge. This should remain unobstructed at all times and should clearly identify:-
 - the name of the registered waste carrier
 - the date of commencement of trade waste contract
 - the date of expiry of trade waste contract
 - the days and times of collection
 - the type of waste including the European Waste Code
- 31. The designated smoking area for Block B is the central courtyard
- 32. Notices shall be prominently displayed at all exits requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and leave the area quietly.
- 33. There shall be a written dispersal policy, a copy of which shall be kept on the premises and made available to police or other authorised officers upon request.
- 34. When licensable activities are taking place in the venue, the number of persons using the designated smoking areas, at the top and right of the venue, should be limited to a maximum of 50 at any one time after 22:00 hours.

Annex 3 - Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority

- 35. All alcohol sold, supplied and consumed on the premises shall be ancillary to a table meal in the restaurant areas. These areas shall be clearly marked. All customers shall be seated and alcohol supplied by waiter/waitress service.
- 36. Patrons permitted to temporarily leave and then re-enter the premises, e.g. to smoke, shall not be permitted to take glass containers with them, and drinks must be in plastic containers. Patrons sitting in the central courtyard the drinks must be in plastic containers. Off-sales will also be in closed or plastic containers.
- 37. There shall be a minimum of two (2) street marshals to assist with dispersal from midnight on Friday and Saturday nights. Additional marshals shall be deployed on a risk assessed basis. Marshals shall dispose of any waste or rubbish left by dispersing patrons, and ensure that patrons leave quietly respecting the local community.
