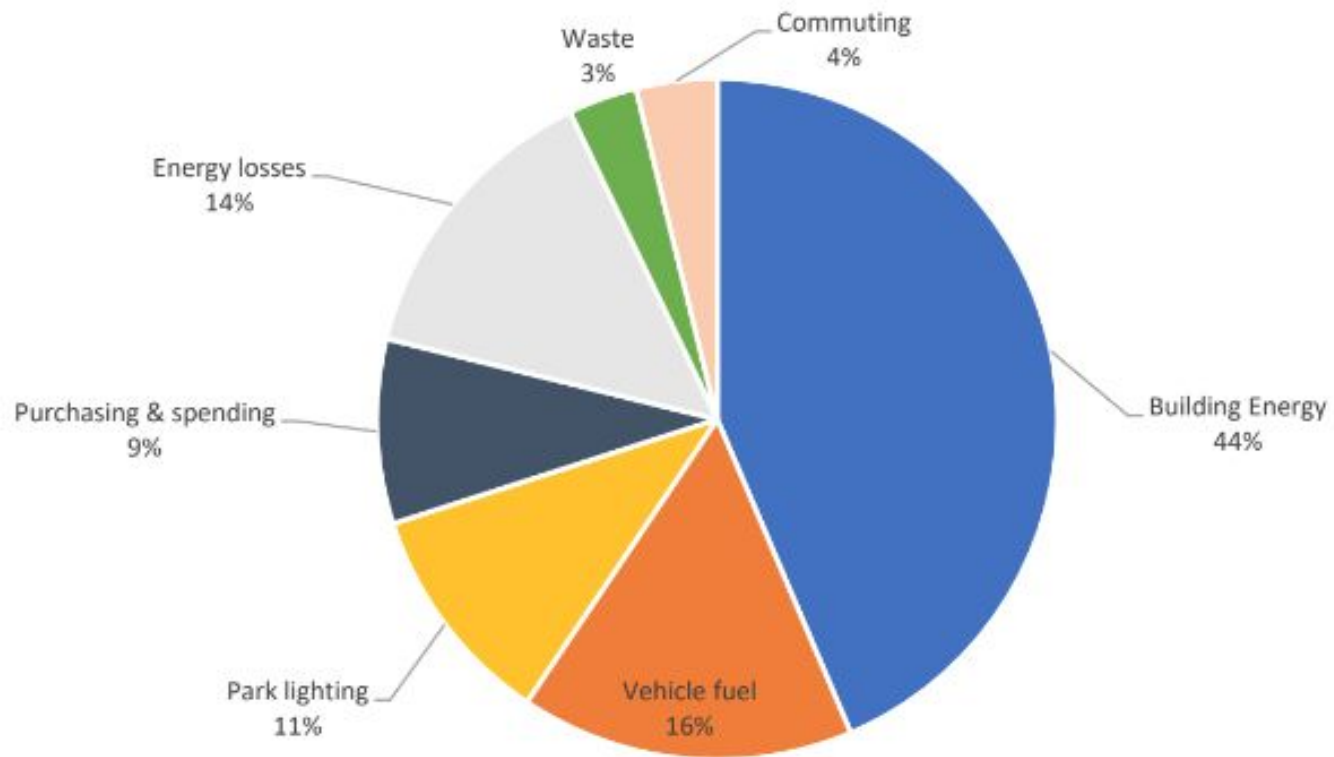


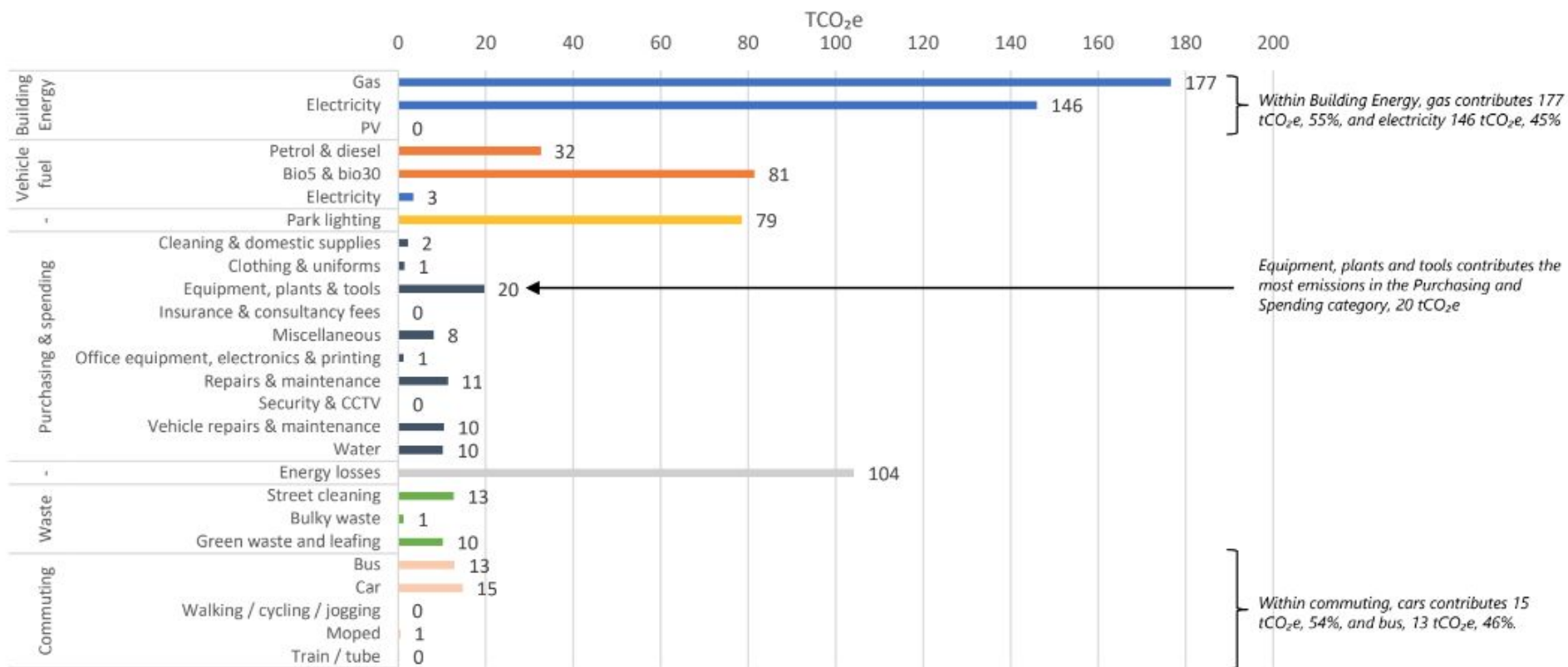

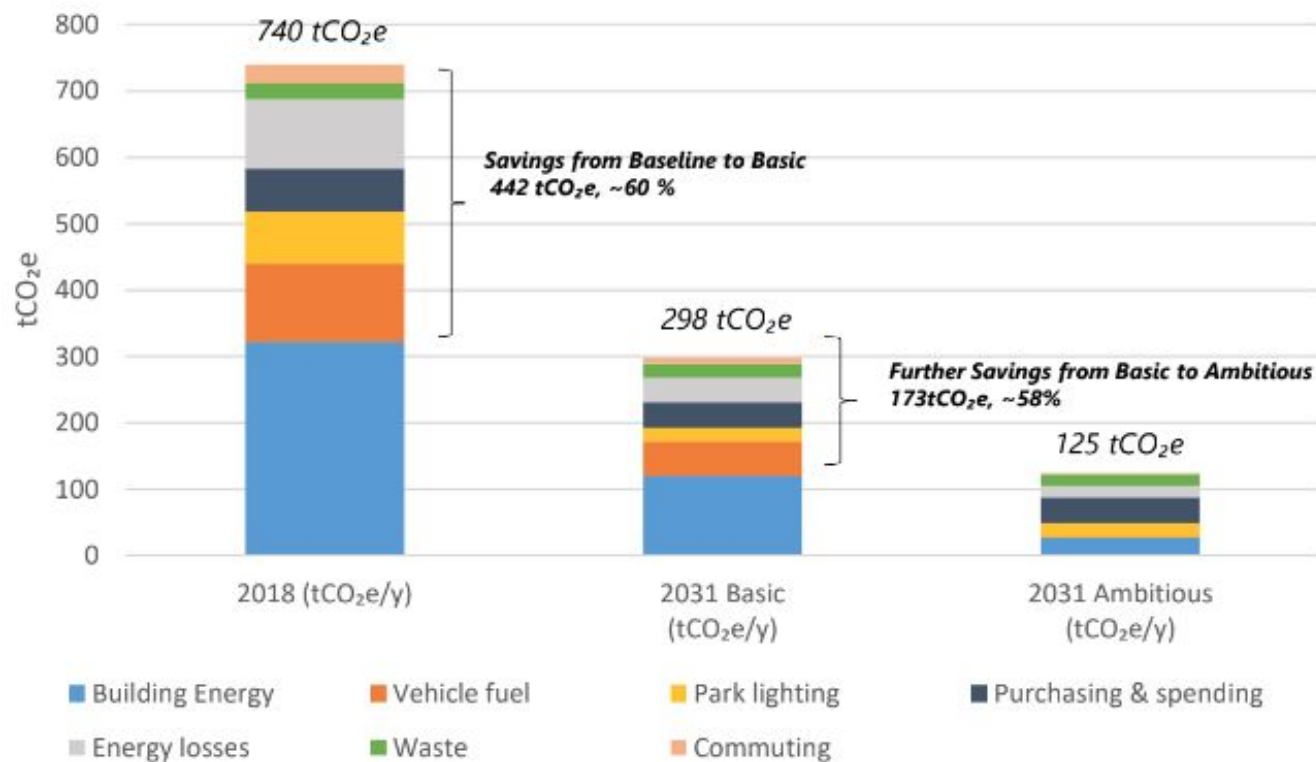

Potential Savings in 2031: Ambitious Case

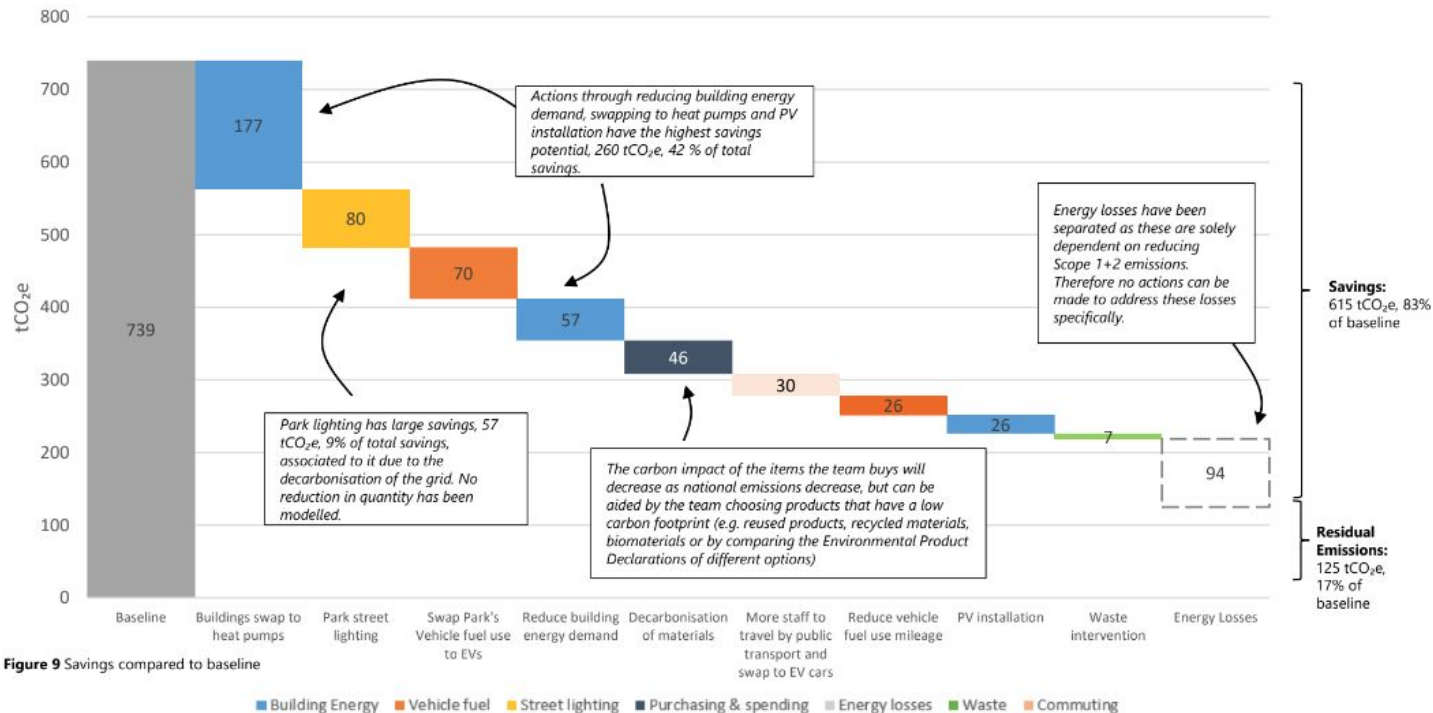


Figure 9 Savings compared to baseline

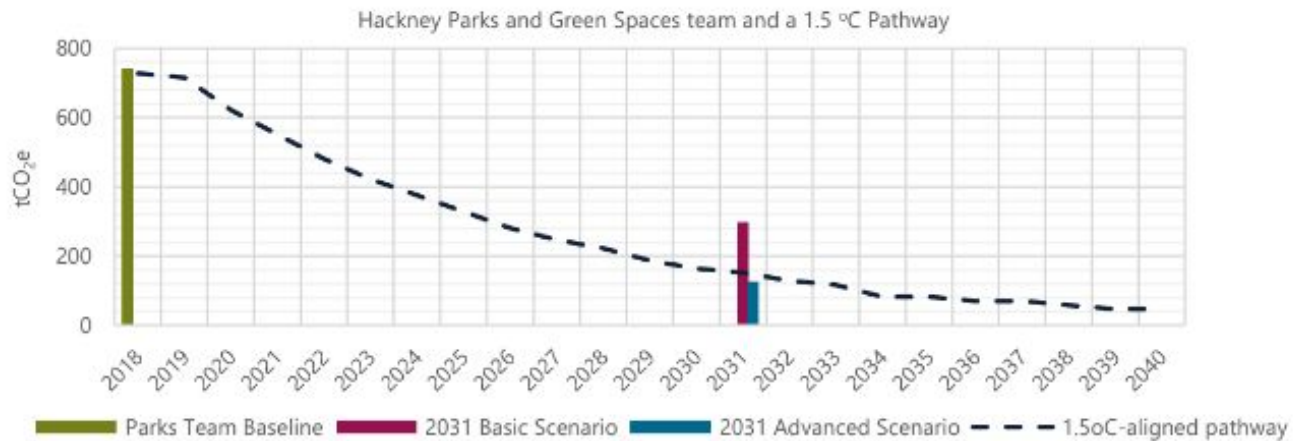
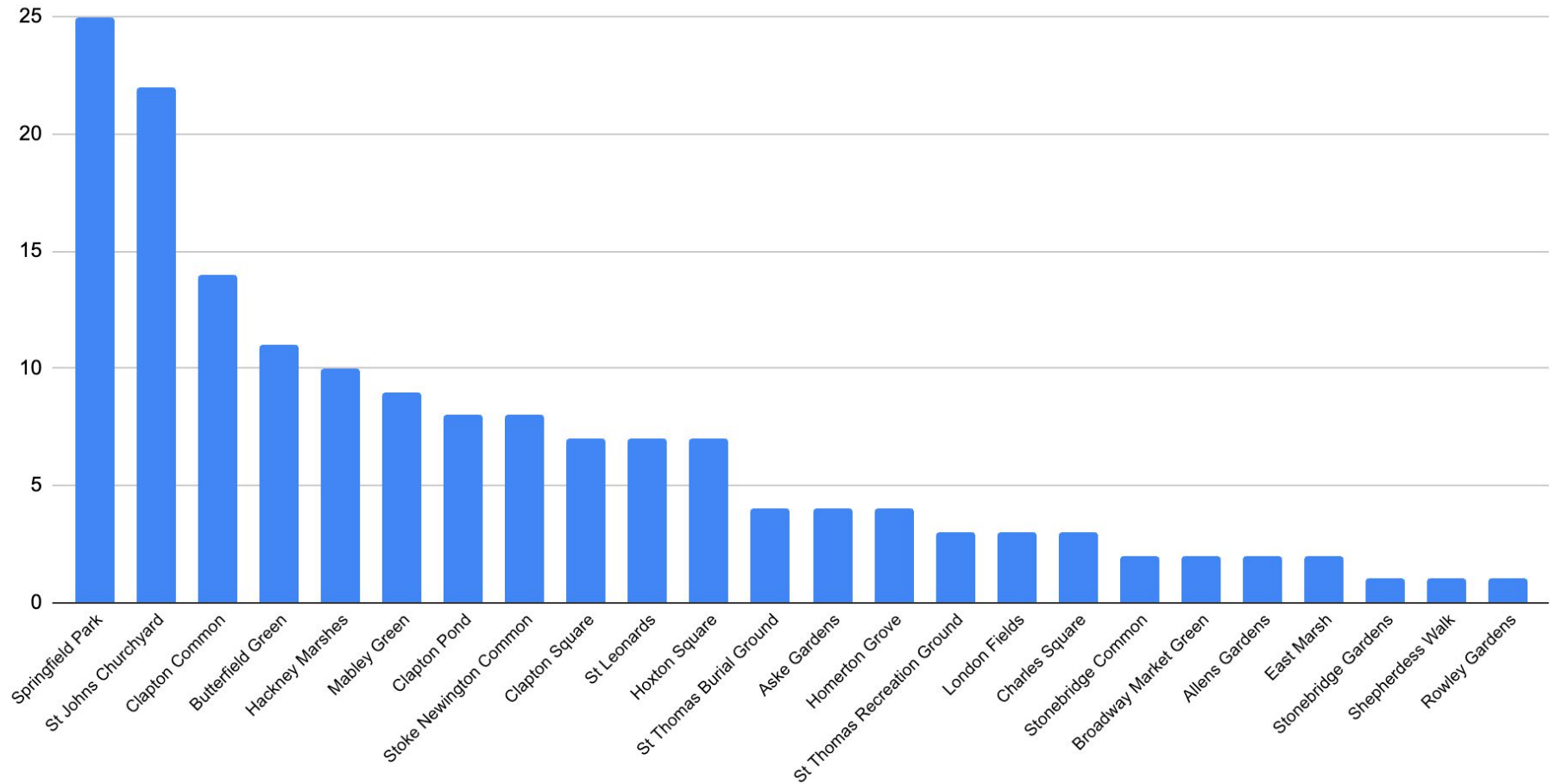


Figure 2b Comparing the 2031 scenario modelling to the Tyndall Centre Hackney 1.5°C aligned pathway RIGHTS RESERVED 9

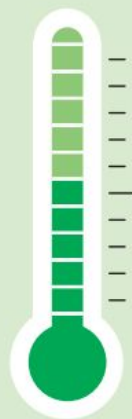

How we're doing – progress in 2021/2022

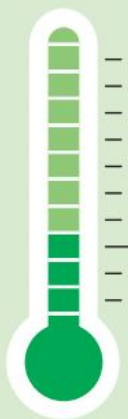
Each year we will monitor and chart our progress towards achieving all 30 commitments in our Parks Strategy. The progress we have made in 2020/2021 can be seen below.



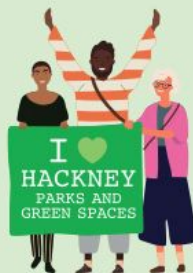

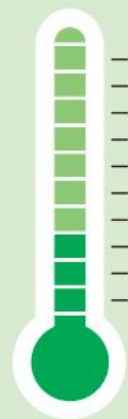
