Police make the following representations in relation to the application to vary the Premises Licence at TRE COLORI PIZZERIA, 19 HACKNEY ROAD, LONDON, E2 7NX for the following reason(s);

This premises is located on a busy High Street in Shoreditch and although it is situated just outside of the Shoreditch Special Policy Area (SPA), it is still surrounded by other licensed premises that attract the crowds from within the SPA.

This application seeks authorisation to extend the sale of alcohol for consumption on the premises until 0200hrs on Thursdays, Fridays and Saturdays and to add the provision of Late Night Refreshment also until 0200hrs on the same days. The premises currently closes at 2300hrs every day.

Police would accept a proposal to extend licensable activity on Fridays and Saturdays until midnight in line with the core hours set out in LBH's Statement of Licensing Policy as the hours proposed by the applicant exceed the core hours by several hours.

Disappointingly, there is nothing within the application that details how the premises intend to demonstrate how they will ensure that any extension of hours so close to the Special Policy Area will not have a negative effect on the cumulative impact and add to the problems that are currently being experienced in this area – more specifically the groups that are loitering in the street causing ASB and preying on those who are vulnerable and/or intoxicated who then become victims of crime.

Police also note that proposed hours for alcohol and closing are the same, meaning that there is no 'drinking up' time given to customers at the end of the night. This should be addressed by the applicant in forthcoming discussions with the responsible authorities.

Police look forward to hearing from the applicant soon to discuss a way forward for this application.

The night time economy has taken a terrible toll upon the lives of ordinary people who live and work in the Shoreditch area. Hackney Council should be finding ways to encourage a more diverse economy so that we might have a variety of shops and businesses instead of the ever expanding wall-to-wall food and alcohol economy which appeals primarily to the booze tourists who descend upon Shoreditch many nights per week and, in their wake, leave a trail of anti social problems including noise, violence and vandalism.

Opportunistic booze / fast food owners know that Hackney / Shoreditch has been a very soft touch in the last decade and a half as it seems anyone can get a license and join in the night time economy orgy and enrich themselves. The Special Policy Area desperately needs to be expanded and more strictly enforced if there is to be any chance of turning the tide against the nocturnal mayhem of Shoreditch. Ladies and Gentlemen,

I write to oppose the application by Tre Colori Pizzeria, [19 Hackney Road E2 7NX](#), for late night refreshment and alcohol. This application will bring more alcohol and people, late into the night, to a stretch of Shoreditch already overrun with notorious late night venues. The venue is sandwiched between a bunch of already difficult venues, with Browns and the kebab shop on one corner, and Looking Glass just a few feet further up the road. It offers a late night place for people to keep drinking and feed, in a tiny environment, directly underneath bedroom windows with children in the area. It will bring more mess to an already messy stretch.

I oppose the application on the following specific grounds:

- The premises is located almost immediately adjacent to the the Shoreditch Special Policy Area, just feet away, and risks undermining each goal of the SPA.
- The prevention of crime and disorder is paramount in Shoreditch, which has amongst the highest crime rates in London, heavily related to the late-night economy. Additional late night venues, particular on this street whihc includes multiple strip clubs, kebab shops and was the scene of alleged gun crime, will by definition contribute to the cumulative impact on crime.
- Public safety is at risk with this new application. The neighbourhood already has significant issues with violence, vomiting, urination, defecation and drug use late into the night, presenting real safety, security and nuisance issues.
- This additional late night license for food and alcohol contributes to the public nuisance via overwhelming crowds. A late night licence will enable significant noise from the venue, and the nuisance of people coming and going, with drunk and disorderly crowds gathering underneath bedroom windows.
- The protection of children from harm is vital. Evenings regularly attract violent people, illicit acts and vile behaviour, as confirmed by the police. The addition of another late-night establishment will contribute to the impact on the numerous children in the neighbourhood.

Annex 1 - Mandatory Conditions

Supply of Alcohol

1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:
 - (a) At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence.
 - (b) At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
3. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

(2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises -
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
 - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
4. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
5. 5.1. The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sales or supply of alcohol.

5.2 The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licences must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

5.3. The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either:-

- (a) a holographic mark or
- (b) an ultraviolet feature

6. The responsible person must ensure that:

a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures:

- beer or cider: 1/2 pint;
- gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25ml or 35ml; and
- still wine in a glass: 125ml; and

b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

Minimum Drinks Pricing

7. 7.1 A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

7.2 For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 7.1 above -

(a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;

(b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula - $P = D + (D \times V)$

Where -

(i) P is the permitted price,

(ii) D is the rate of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and

(iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;

(c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -

(i) the holder of the premises licence,

(ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or

(iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;

(d) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
(e) “value added tax” means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

7.3 Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 7.2(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

7.4 (1) Sub-paragraph 7.4(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 7.2(b) above on a day (“the first day”) would be different from the permitted price on the next day (“the second day”) as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

8. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of a Metropolitan Police Crime Prevention Officer. All public areas and all entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the preceding 31-day period.
9. Any staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises are open to the public. This staff member must be able to show a Police or authorised council officer recent data or footage upon request.
10. A Challenge 25 proof of age scheme shall be operated at the premises where the only acceptable forms of identification are recognised photographic identification cards, such as driving licence or passport.
11. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to an authorised officer of the council or the police, which will record the following.
 - a. All crimes reported:
 - b. Any complaints received.
 - c. Any ejections
 - d. Any incidents of disorder.
 - e. Seizure of drugs or offensive weapons.
 - f. Any faults in the CCTV system

- g. Any refusal of the sale of alcohol.
h. Any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.
12. All staff will be given refresher training every twelve months on the legislation relating to the sales of alcohol to underage persons and drunken persons. Written or electronic records shall be kept and produced to police or an authorised officer upon request.
 13. The licence holder shall maintain a dedicated telephone number of the Designated Premises Supervisor for use by any Responsible Authority or any person who may wish to make a complaint. This contact number shall be provided to licensing authority, police and to any local residents upon request.
 14. There shall be no drink, glass or open containers taken outside the premises at any time.
 15. Intoxicating liquor shall not be sold, supplied or consumed otherwise than to persons who are taking a substantial meal from the menu and that the consumption of intoxicating liquor by such persons is ancillary to taking such meals. The supply of alcohol will be by waiter/waitress service only.
 16. There shall be no more than 5 smokers are allowed to smoke in front of the premises at any time.

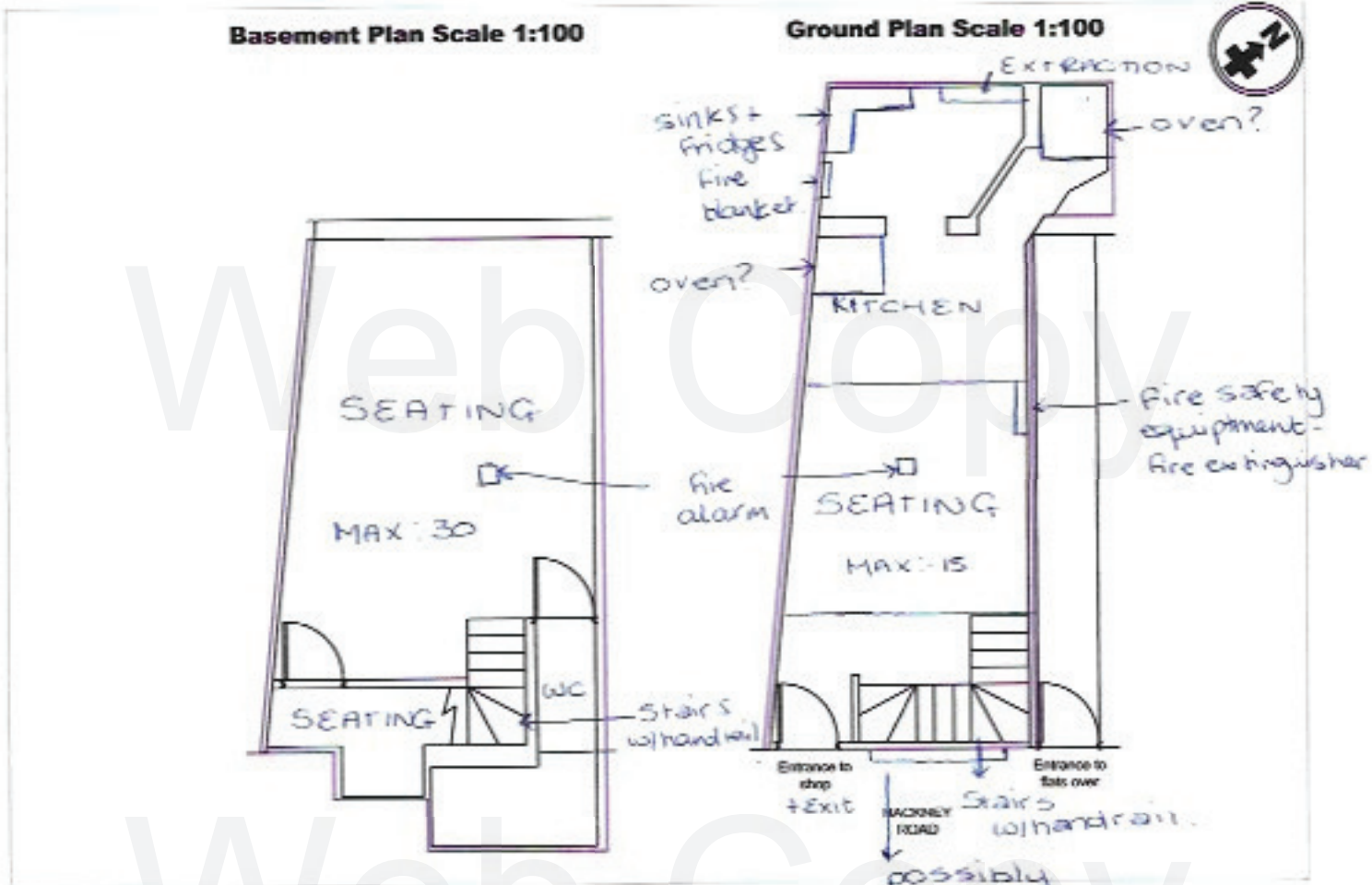

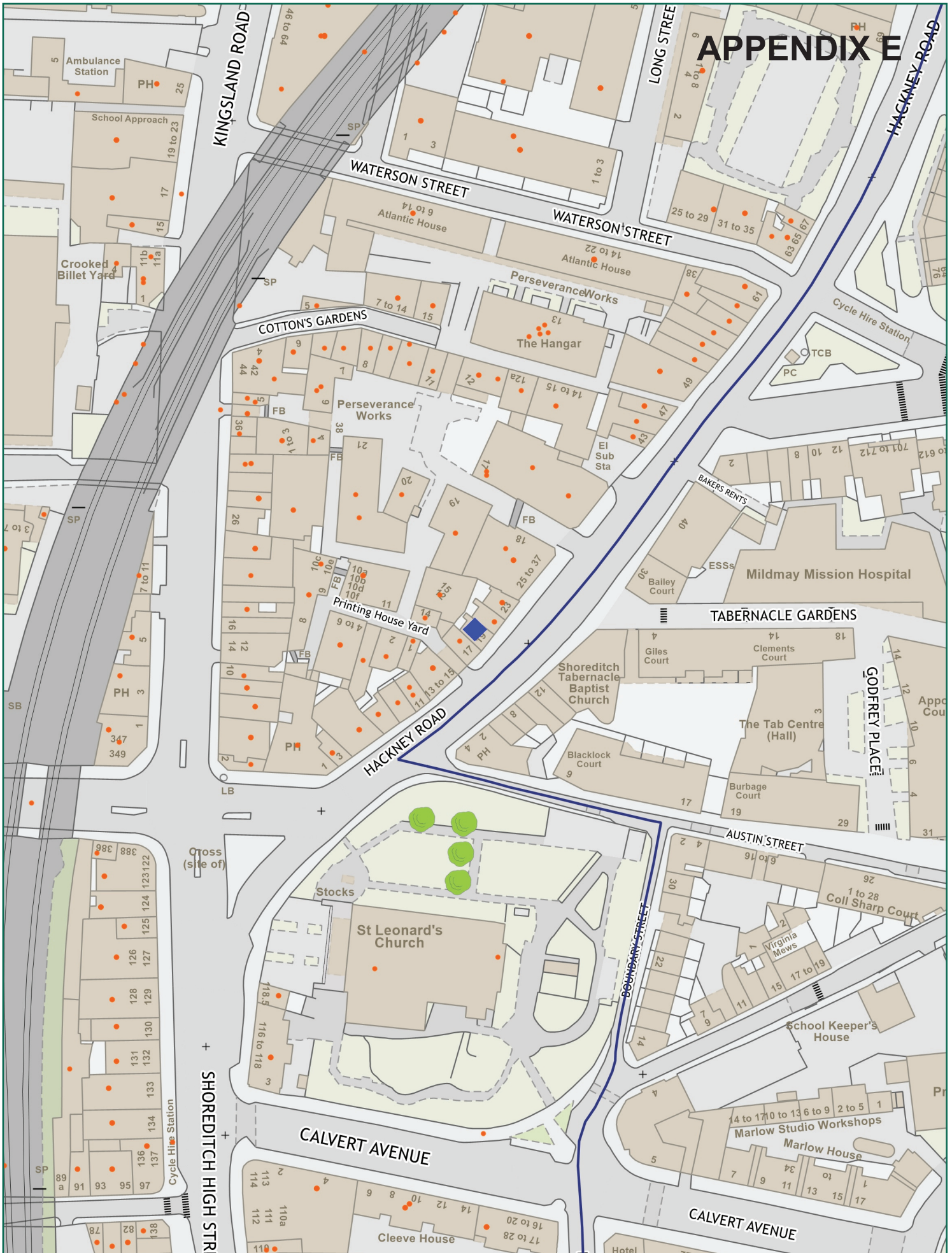
LEASE PLAN of Ground and Basement
