- 1. You do not have to pay a fee if the only purpose of the variation for which you are applying is to avoid becoming liable for the late night levy

 - Indoor sporting events: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000.
 - Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a
 contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman wrestling, or freestyle
 wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the
 audience does not exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports defined
 as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling
 with one or more martial arts are licensable as a boxing or wrestling
 entertainment rather than an indoor sporting event.
 - Live music: no licence permission is required for:

- 1. How they intend to manage noise from the external areas
- 2. The hours of use of the external areas
- 3. How they intend to carry out dispersal without causing disturbance to neighbours
- 4. The number of customers smoking outside and how they intend to minimise the noise
- 5. How the applicant intends to minimise the noise from live and recorded music

The premises is situated on Kingsland Road within the boundaries of the Dalston Special Policy Area. It therefore falls to the applicant to demonstrate that the proposed activity and the operation of the premises will not add to the cumulative impact on the area. Police do not believe that the applicant has adequately done so in this application. The hours requested by the applicant are also far outside that of the councils core hours, again without measure from the applicant to mitigate any impact these may have.

Police would like to know why the applicant is requesting the range of Regulated Entertainment that is included on the application, as the venue is a restaurant. The applicant has included plays, live and recorded music, and performance of dance and anything of a similar description to the previous. Police would understand the request for music, either background and therefore ancillary to the operation as a restaurant, or for occasional special nights, however more explanation is required regarding this.

Police would like more information regarding the venue's dispersal policy and how this would alter and be implemented should later hours be granted. Police would also like a visit to the premises and a discussion with the applicant about the operation of the venue.

The premises is located in the Dalston Special Policy Area (Dalston SPA), the Dalston SPA has been designated as such due to the impact of the number of premises within the area and their impact on the licensing objectives as well as the local amenity.

"LP10 Special Policy Areas - Dalston and Shoreditch

It is the Council's policy that where a relevant representation is made to any application within the area of the Dalston SPA or Shoreditch SPA, the applicant will need to demonstrate that the proposed activity and the operation of the premises will not add to the cumulative impact that is currently being experienced in these areas. This policy is to be strictly applied.

It should also be noted that the;

- quality and track record of the management;
- good character of the applicant; and
- extent of any variation sought

May not be in itself sufficient.

It should be noted that if an applicant can demonstrate that they will not add to the cumulative impact in their operating schedule and at any hearing, then the Core Hours Policy within LP3 will apply."

The applicant has proposed an extension to the hours for licensable activity that includes earlier opening hours as well as later closing hours. The applicant is seeking to open at 08:00 everyday and close the premises at 02:30 Sunday to Wednesday and 03:30 Thursday to Saturday.

The hours sought are a considerable extension beyond the LP3 Core Hours set out in the Statement of Licensing Policy.

Given the premises location in the Dalston SPA, the applicant does not appear to have taken the Licensing Policy and Dalston SPA into consideration in the application, they have not offered any conditions and/or mitigations that would promote the Licensing objectives. No conditions have been offered in relation to the potential extension for "Off Sales", the potential frequenting of delivery vehicles for takeaways late at night or security measures that may be required for the extended hours sought.

The applicant is also seeking the provision of additional licensable activities that are not currently on the premises licence, including Live Music, Recorded Music, Plays, Performance of Dance, Similar activities to Dance, Recorded and Live Music. The applicant has not offered any conditions and/or information regarding how the premises would operate in order to mitigate any potential risk to the Prevention of Public Nuisance licensing objectives whilst carrying out these activities.

The matters outlined above raise significant concerns for the Licensing Authority, the lack of detail in the application has done little to convince the Licensing Authority that the Licensing Objectives would not be at risk of being undermined.

The applicant has not demonstrated an understanding of the locality, Licensing Policy, Licensing Objectives or the Special Policy Area.

Instead of offering a robust set of conditions and/or possible mitigations to the risk to the Licensing Objectives, the applicant has used the application to demand the hours are granted.

See part 3 of the application form:

"Since our closing hours are pretty early compared to the other businesses in the vicinity, we cannot benefit from the natural human traffic of the region. For this reason we demand that a fair competition environment be created at least by being able to provide at the same hours as the surrounding businesses."

The Licensing Authority takes the view that this demonstrates a lack of understanding by the applicant with regards to the Licensing Objectives and the cumulative impact of late night premises within the Special Policy Area.

Whilst we may be sympathetic to the strain experienced by businesses in the current economic climate, pecuniary interests of applicants are not a consideration for the Licensing Authority.

The above representations are supported by the following evidence and information.

The Licensing Act 2003, Statement of Licensing Policy 2016 and Guidance issued by the Home Office.

Are there any actions or measures that could be taken to allay concerns or objections? If so, please explain.

The applicant should consider the matters outlined above and propose a robust set of conditions and mitigations to promote the Licensing Objectives.

Supply of Alcohol

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:
 - (a) At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence.
 - (b) At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 3. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises -
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
 - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).

- 4. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 5. 5.1. The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sales or supply of alcohol.
 - 5.2 The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licences must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
 - 5.3. The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years if age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either:-
 - A. a holographic mark or
 - B. an ultraviolet feature.
- 6. The responsible person shall ensure that:
 - a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures:
 - beer or cider:1/2 pint;
 - gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25ml or 35ml; and
 - still wine in a glass: 125ml; and
 - a. these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
 - b. where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

Minimum Drinks Pricing

- 7. 7.1 A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
 - 7.2 For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 7.1 above -
 - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979:
 - (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula P = D+(DxV) Where -
 - (i)P is the permitted price,
 - (ii)D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
 - (iii)V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
 - (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -

- (i) the holder of the premises licence,
- (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 7.3 Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8.2(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 7.4 (1) Sub-paragraph 7.4(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 7.2(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

Conditions derived from Responsible Authority representations

- 8. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of a Metropolitan Police. All public areas and each entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or other authorised officer.
- 9. There shall be a staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system on the premises at all times when the premises are open to the public. This staff member must be able to show a Police or authorised council officer recent data or footage when requested.

- 10. Signs will be prominently displayed at all entrance and exit points reminding customers to leave quietly and respect local residents.
- 11. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request by an authorised officer of the council or a police officer, which will record the following:
 - a. All crimes reported
 - b. All ejections of patrons
 - c. Any complaints received.
 - d. Any incidents of disorder.
 - e. Seizure of drugs or offensive weapons.
 - f. Any faults in the CCTV system.
 - g. Any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.
- 12. Premises to operate zero tolerance policy to drugs and comply with Hackney Police Drugs and Weapons policy where appropriate.
- 13. All instances of crime and disorder to be reported by a responsible member of staff to an agreed police contact point, as agreed with the police.
- 14. All staff shall receive training on the legislation relating to the sales of alcohol to underage persons and drunken persons and shall have refresher training every 12 months. There shall be written records of such training which will be kept on the premises and produced to a police officer or other authorised officer upon request.
- 15. There shall be no glass, drinks or open containers taken outside the premises at any time, except drinks bought with a meal for consumption off the premises.
- 16. Alcohol shall not be sold, supplied or consumed otherwise than to persons who are taking a substantial meal from the menu and that the consumption of such alcohol is ancillary to taking such meals. The supply of alcohol shall be by waiter/waitress service only.
- 17. There shall be a written dispersal at the premises. This policy shall be kept on the premises and produced to a police officer or other authorised officer upon request.
- 18. A 'Challenge 25' proof of age scheme shall be operated at the premises where the only acceptable forms of identification are recognised photographic identification cards, such as driving licence or passport.
- 19. There shall be a personal licence holder on the premises whenever licensable activity is taking place.
- 20. The Licensee shall ensure that all staff are fully trained and made aware of the legal requirement of businesses to comply with their responsibility as regards the disposal of waste produced from the business premises.

 The procedure for handling and preparing for disposal of the waste shall be

in writing and displayed in a prominent place where it can be referred to at all times by staff.

- 21. The Licensee shall ensure that any contract for general and recyclable waste disposal shall be appropriate in size to the amount of waste produced by the business. The Licensee shall maintain an adequate supply of waste receptacles provided by his registered waste carrier (refuse sacks or commercial waste bins) in order to ensure all refuse emanating from the business is always presented for collection by his waste carrier and shall not use any plain black or unidentifiable refuse sacks or any other unidentifiable or unmarked waste receptacles.
- 22. The Licensee's premises are situated in an area within which refuse may only be left on the public highway at certain times (time bands). If the Licensee's waste carrier cannot or does not comply by collecting the refuse within an hour after the close of any time band imposed by the waste authority, the Licensee must remove the refuse from the public highway and/or keep it within the premises until such time as his/her waste carrier arrives to collect the refuse.
- 23. In order to minimise the amount of time any waste remains on the public highway in readiness for collection, the Licensee will ensure the timeframe within which it may expect its waste carrier to collect is adhered to.
- 24. The Licensee shall instruct members of staff to make regular checks of the area immediately outside the premises and remove any litter, bottles and glasses emanating from the premises. A final check should be made at close of business.
- 25. The Licensee shall provide a safe receptacle for cigarette ends to be placed outside for the use of customers, such receptacle being carefully placed so as not to cause an obstruction or trip.
