- any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
- any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.

Police make the following representations in relation to the application to vary the Premises Licence at Vintage Bottle, 14 Chatsworth Road, London, E5 0LP for the following reason(s);

This variation seeks to extend the current hours for off sales of alcohol to 24 hrs a day from previously being more or less in line with core hours.

The venue is located on a busy road which has numerous retail type outlets which would be open during the day time however the surrounding area is highly residential.

By being able to sell alcohol 24hrs a day the footfall in the area would increase throughout the night, impacting on the local residents with the associated ASB, including increased street drinking, litter, noise, and urination and so on. There are nearby areas that attract street drinkers which has the potential to increase should this premises get an extended licence.

As soon as people start gathering after drinking the chance of disorder also increases.

There have been no additional conditions offered in order to minimise the impact of this extension of hours and the impact on the licensing objectives. The application seeks hours far outside the councils own policy without any extra measures offered to mitigate this.

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Representations (which include comments and/or objections) in relation to:

The Licensing Authority are concerned that the availability of alcohol for the additional hours (enabling sales up to 24 hours daily) could lead to the Prevention of Public Nuisance licensing objective being undermined.

Customers purchasing alcohol from this site, most notably late at night and in the early hours of the morning may increase the potential that the licensing objectives could be undermined. The Licensing Authority are concerned that the alcohol sales, particularly to persons who may have already been consuming alcohol in the area, creates a further risk to the Licensing objectives. It is noted that the applicant has not offered any additional measures to promote the objectives if the application were to be granted.

The applicants attention is also drawn to the Council's Licensing Statement. This states the following:

LP4 'Off' Sales of Alcohol

Hours for the supply of alcohol will generally be restricted to between 08:00 and 23:00.

The above representations are supported by the following evidence and information.

The Licensing Act 2003, guidance issued by the Home Office under s182 of the Licensing Act 2003

Are there any actions or measures that could be taken to allay concerns or objections? If so, please explain.

Dear Colleagues

Would you kindly note my objections in the strongest terms to the application for a 24-hour licence at these premises.

There are a high number of licenced premises in Chatsworth Road, including off-licences, and they would all want longer licences were this to be approved. This is an area with a high number of residential properties and they don't need people turning up late at night to buy alcohol; we have a local policy and agreement with licencees that they will cease selling alcohol at 11pm and 10.30pm on Sundays. Let's stick to that please. We are already dealing with problems from establishments nearby who flout their restrictions: were this licence to be granted it would give more power to the elbow of those licensees who have no regard for local residents.

In addition, Chatsworth Road is narrow and residents already complain about inconsiderate vehicles and illegal parking. A 24-hour licence would be hugely damaging and completely counter to what residents would like to see (more peace and quiet at night). Vintage Bottle is on a corner, so the residents of that street will be troubled by vehicles stopping in their street.

I will be happy to attend the hearing to make my objections in person.

Annex 1 - Mandatory Conditions

Supply of Alcohol (Off)

1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:

(a) At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence.

(b) At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

3. 3.1.The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sales or supply of alcohol.

3.2 The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licences must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

3.3.The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and

either:-

(a) a holographic mark or

(b) an ultraviolet feature.

Minimum Drinks Pricing

4. 4.1 A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

4.2 For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 4.1 above -

(a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;

(b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula -

P = D + (DxV)

Where -

(i) P is the permitted price,

(ii) D is the rate of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if

the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol,

and (iii)V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale

or supply of the alcohol;

(c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -

(i) the holder of the premises licence,

(ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or

(iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a

supply of alcohol under such a licence;

(d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

4.3 Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 4.2(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

4.4 (1) Sub-paragraph 4.4(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 4.2(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

- 5. The premises shall maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of a Metropolitan Police Crime Prevention Officer. All public areas, entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer.
- 6. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises are open to the public. This staff member shall be able to show Police or an authorised officer of Hackney Borough Council recent data or footage with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.
- 7. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available immediately to an authorised officer of the Hackney Borough Council or the Police, which will record the following: 1. all crimes reported to the venue 2. any complaints received 3. any incidents of disorder 4. any faults in the CCTV system 5. any refusal of the sale of alcohol 6. any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.
- 8. There shall be "CCTV in Operation" signs prominently displayed.
- 9. All instances of crime or disorder to be reported by the designated premises supervisor or responsible member of staff to an agreed police contact point, as agreed with the Police.
- 10. All alcohol shall be sold in sealed containers. They shall not be opened or consumed in or within the vicinity of the premises.
- 11. Where the sale or supply of alcohol is taking place employees of the premises must request sight of evidence of the age of any person appearing to be under 25 years of age (Challenge 25). Such evidence may include a driving licence or passport.
- 12. The premises will display prominent signage by every entrance and exit requesting customers to leave the premises quietly and respect local residents.
- 13. The premises will display and maintain appropriate signage advising customers of the contact details of the Designated Premises Supervisor.
- 14. Refuse, including bottles, shall not be taken outside the premises between the hours of 22:00hrs and 08:00hrs.
- 15. All staff will be given refresher training every twelve months on the legislation relating to the sales of alcohol to underage persons and drunken persons. Written records of this training shall be kept on the premises and produced to police or other authorised officer upon request.
- 16. All emergency exits shall be kept free from obstruction at all times.
