Collections are made on a weekly frequency, with use of single use sacks for street level properties and flats above shops and communal bins for estate based properties. A network of public bring sites collecting these materials are also available for residents to use across the borough. A commercial recycling service collecting all of the specified materials is also available for businesses in the borough (at a cost).</p>
