1. Summary

1.1. Marc Lai has made an application for a premises licence under section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003.

6. **Guidance Considerations**

6.1. The Licensing Authority is required to have regard to any guidance issued by the Secretary of State under the Licensing Act 2003.

7. Policy Considerations

- 7.1. Licensing Sub-Committee is required to have regard to the London Borough of Hackney's Statement of Licensing Policy ("the Policy) adopted by the Licensing Authority.
- 7.2. The Policy applies to applications where relevant representations have been made. With regard to this application, policies, LP1 (General Principles), LP2 (Licensing Objectives), LP3 (Core Hours) and (LP10 Special Policy Area) are relevant.

8. Officer Observations

8.1. If the Sub-Committee is minded to approve the application, the following conditions should be applied the licence:

Conditions derived from operating schedule

1. The premises are equipped with closed-circuit television (CCTV) cameras. These are located inside and directly outside the premises, where we have an outdoor seating area. The cameras are strategically placed to actively deter disorder, nuisance, anti-social behaviour and crime.

2. Recordings are kept for 30 days and we will be happy to share the footage with the police officers or anyone from the authority.

Conditions derived from Responsible Authorities representations:

3. The Licensee shall ensure that all relevant staff are fully trained and made aware of the legal requirement of businesses to comply with their responsibility as regards the disposal of waste produced from the business premises. The procedure for handling and preparing for disposal of the waste shall be in writing and displayed in a prominent place where it can be referred to at all times by staff.

4. The Licensee shall ensure that any contract for general and recyclable waste disposal shall be appropriate in size to the amount of waste produced by the business. The Licensee shall maintain an adequate supply of waste receptacles provided by his registered waste carrier (refuse sacks or commercial waste bins) in order to ensure all refuse emanating from the business is always presented for collection by his waste carrier and shall not use any plain black or unidentifiable refuse sacks or any other unidentifiable or unmarked waste receptacles.

5. The Licensee's premises are situated in an area within which refuse may only be left on the public highway at certain times (time bands). If the Licensee's waste carrier cannot or does not comply by collecting the refuse within an hour after the close of any time band imposed by the waste authority, the Licensee must remove the refuse

from the public highway and/or keep it within the premises until such time as his/her waste carrier arrives to collect the refuse.

6. The Licensee shall instruct members of staff to make regular checks of the area immediately outside the premises and remove any litter, bottles and glasses emanating from the premises. A final check should be made at close of business.

7.. The Licensee shall provide a safe receptacle for cigarette ends to be placed outside for the use of customers, such receptacle being carefully placed so as not to cause an obstruction or trip.

8. The current trade waste agreement/duty of care waste transfer document shall be conspicuously displayed and maintained in the window of the premises where it can be conveniently seen and read by persons standing in German Doner & Grand Chips. This should remain unobstructed at all times and should clearly identify:-

- the name of the registered waste carrier
- the date of commencement of trade waste contract
- the date of expiry of trade waste contract
- the days and times of collection
- the type of waste including the European Waste Code

9. **Reasons for Officer Observations**

8.1. Conditions 1 and 2 are derived from the applicant's operating schedule. Conditions 3 to 8 have been suggested by the Environmental Enforcement Authority.

10. Legal Comments

- 10.1. The Council has a duty as a Licensing Authority under the Licensing Act 2003 to carry out its functions with a view to promoting the following licensing objectives;
 - The Prevention of Crime and Disorder
 - Public Safety
 - Prevention of Public Nuisance
 - The Protection of Children from Harm
- 10.2. It should be noted that each of the licensing objectives have equal importance and are the only grounds upon which a relevant representation can be made and for which an application can be refused or terms and conditions attached to a licence.

11. Human Rights Act 1998 Implications

- 11.1. There are implications to;
 - Article 6 Right to a fair hearing
 - Article 14 Not to discriminate
 - Balancing: Article 1- Peaceful enjoyment of their possession (i.e. a licence is defined as being a possession) with Article 8 Right of Privacy (i.e. respect private & family life) to achieve a proportionate decision having regard to the protection of an individuals rights against the interests of the community at large.

M Describe the steps you intend to take to promote the four licensing objectives:

a) General – all four licensing objectives (b, c, d and e) (please read guidance note 10)

It is very important for all of us, owner and staff to look after each other and keep everyone safe. My duty prior to opening the restaurant was to make sure we get all the security and fire system installed and in working condition, which is all done and checked by an assessor. There will be one extra worker during night hours to ensure we can react quickly if assistance is required.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

The premises is equipped with closed-circuit television (CCTV) cameras. These are located inside and directly outside the premises, where we have an outdoor seating area. The cameras are strategically placed to actively deter disorder, nuisance, anti-social behavior and crime. The recordings are kept for 30 days and we will be happy to share the footages with the police officers or anyone from the authority.

Regarding myself, the owner, I will be in the premises all the time, I have worked as a supervisor for over a year in a nightclub in London. I have also attended their courses to prevent crime and disorder twice.

c) Public safety

As the new owner of the business, it is very important for me to keep everyone safe A fire risk assessment was issued in January 2023, with every detail being checked by the assessor.

An extensive training was provided to the entire team, prior to the reopening day on the 10th of January 2023. First aid kits and fire blankets are also available.

We do not serve any glassed cups or glassed bottles.

There is presence of a 'CCTV in operation' sign to deter any unwanted action.

The doner burners are using gas, therefore we have installed a gas interlock system, two emergency stop buttons and have a gas certificate dated from January 2023.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

The Shopping Centre is a three storey building; the first floor is unoccupied, second floor is a day time office from the landlord's agents. There is no resident above us. Our equipment aren't loud, the fan system for the canopy is using a silencer.

e) The protection of children from harm

There will be no presence of alcohol or adult services in the premises. Children coming to the restaurant at night are expected to be accompanied by their parent(s) or adult responsible to the safety of the child. In the event it is not the case, we will talk to the child and will react accordingly

 - (iv)self-sufficient e.g. bank statements.

Family members of European Economic Area nationals who are studying or financially independent must also provide evidence that the European Economic Area national and any family members hold comprehensive sickness insurance in the UK. This can include a private medical insurance policy, an EHIC card or an S1, S2 or S3 form.


As an alternative to providing a copy of the documents listed above, applicants may demonstrate their right to work by allowing the licensing authority to carry out a check with the Home Office online right to work checking service.

To demonstrate their right to work via the Home Office online right to work checking service, applicants should include in this application their 9-digit share code (provided to them upon accessing the service at https://www.gov.uk/prove-right-to-work) which, along with the applicant's date of birth (provided within his application), will allow the licensing authority to carry out the check.



- 1. The Licensee shall ensure that all relevant staff are fully trained and made aware of the legal requirement of businesses to comply with their responsibility as regards the disposal of waste produced from the business premises. The procedure for handling and preparing for disposal of the waste shall be in writing and displayed in a prominent place where it can be referred to at all times by staff.
- 2. The Licensee shall ensure that any contract for general and recyclable waste disposal shall be appropriate in size to the amount of waste produced by the business. The Licensee shall maintain an adequate supply of waste receptacles provided by his registered waste carrier (refuse sacks or commercial waste bins) in order to ensure all refuse emanating from the business is always presented for collection by his waste carrier and shall not use any plain black or unidentifiable refuse sacks or any other unidentifiable or unmarked waste receptacles.
- 3. The Licensee's premises are situated in an area within which refuse may only be left on the public highway at certain times (time bands). If the Licensee's waste carrier cannot or does not comply by collecting the refuse within an hour after the close of any time band imposed by the waste authority, the Licensee must remove the refuse from the public highway and/or keep it within the premises until such time as his/her waste carrier arrives to collect the refuse.
- 4 The Licensee shall instruct members of staff to make regular checks of the area immediately outside the premises and remove any litter, bottles and glasses emanating from the premises. A final check should be made at close of business.
- 5. The Licensee shall provide a safe receptacle for cigarette ends to be placed outside for the use of customers, such receptacle being carefully placed so as not to cause an obstruction or trip.
- 6. The current trade waste agreement/duty of care waste transfer document shall be conspicuously displayed and maintained in the window of the premises where it can be conveniently seen and read by persons standing in German Doner & Grand Chips. This should remain unobstructed at all times and should clearly identify:-

the days and times of collection

the type of waste including the European Waste Code

We have received complaints in the past regarding littering and build-up of waste in the area. There have been instances in the past where Enforcement Officers have found evidence of the illegal disposal of waste from businesses in this area. Experience has also shown that there is the probability that there will be cigarette litter outside these premises due to the smoking ban.

The premises is located in the Dalston Special Policy Area (Dalston SPA), the Dalston SPA has been designated as such due to the impact of the number of premises within the area and their impact on the licensing objectives as well as the local amenity.

"LP10 Special Policy Areas – Dalston and Shoreditch

It is the Council's policy that where a relevant representation is made to any application within the area of the Dalston SPA or Shoreditch SPA, the applicant will need to demonstrate that the proposed activity and the operation of the premises will not add to the cumulative impact that is currently being experienced in these areas. This policy is to be strictly applied. It should also be noted that the:

• quality and track record of the management;

May not be in itself sufficient.

The applicant is seeking hours which are beyond the Core Hours LP3, outlined in the current statement of Licensing Policy.

The Licensing Authority notes the applicant is seeking authorisation for Late Night Refreshment only.

The applicant states the premises has a seated capacity of 20. Is this the maximum capacity and how often does the applicant anticipate the maximum capacity being used?

Whilst the premises appears to operate as a food take away venue, no reference has been made to deliveries and how the applicant intends to manage delivery drivers collecting orders from the premises. The applicant should clarify if they will be accepting delivery orders, if so, how do they intend to manage the drivers.

The presence of additional persons and deliveries has the potential to undermine the Prevention of Public Nuisance licensing objective. The risk being somewhat heightened due the premises location in the Dalston SPA.

I am writing to object to German Doner application:

German Doner and Grand Chips, Unit 1b Kingsland Shopping Centre, Kingsland High Street, London E8 2LX, for:

a premises license for late night refreshment from 23.00 to 2.00am Sun to Wed and from 23.00 to 4.00 am Thur to Sat.

IMPORTANTLY, PLEASE ENSURE THAT ALL MY PERSONAL INFORMATION IS REDACTED FROM THE OBJECTION (due to fear of reprisals that are a matter of record).

I am a local resident who will be adversely affected by late night sales from these premises. German Doner and Grand Chips is a distance from my home that would make it highly likely that patrons would bring items purchased there to consume on my street; ASB would result for myself and other John Campbell Road residents. I urge you to REJECT this application.

Residents' quality of life would be directly adversely affected by this license. It is inevitable that this licence would generate ASB and break all the council's four licensing objectives (namely, Prevention of crime and disorder; Public safety; Prevention of public nuisance; Protection of children from harm).

The area in which the premises is located has a dense flow of pedestrian traffic, especially in the evenings. **Refreshment till 4am is aimed at clubbers/NTE and would unavoidably fuel the alcohol economy**. If granted, the license would inevitably and unavoidably add to disturbances of the peace, generating vomiting, noise, urination, litter, drug use and the other types of anti-social behaviour residents have become so familiar with that are inevitable and direct results of late night licences.

A key problem regarding licensed premises for local residents on John Campbell Road is twofold: the area is massively oversaturated with late-licensed premises already; patrons of clubs stock up on 'pre-' and 'post-'drinks refreshments from nearby shops and off licenses and generate ASB often literally on the doorsteps of local residents' homes (stashing food and drink behind residents' bins, vomiting, taking drugs), causing major problems for John Campbell residents. Residents' complaints about this are ongoing, longstanding and a matter of record.

As per your Licensing Statement:

DAMAGE TO RESIDENTS' QUALITY OF LIFE: According to the Licensing Statement 2018-2023, Hackney Council's 'vision is to achieve balanced, sustainable communities and neighbourhoods which celebrate our diversity and share in London's growing prosperity, to enable a good quality of life for all'. This license if granted would damage residents' quality of life, including by generating ASB such as vomit on homes' doorsteps, urination between cars and against walls. For the same reasons, the license if granted would **DAMAGE THE LOCAL COMMUNITY**. Section 1.15 of the the Licensing Statement 2018-2023 states the importance for Hackney Council of 'think[ing] about the whole place, rather than just running individual services' and putting 'the needs, perspectives and feelings of the whole community at the heart of what the Council does through a time of continued change and uncertainty'. This license if granted would DAMAGE the local community, for reasons including that – with vomit etc on the street and broken alcohol bottles – parents fear for children. **EQUALITIES ACT**: Appendix G notes that other relevant legislation is the 2010 Equalities Act. Residents adversely affected by the license would include – on our street – citizens with disabilities, women and carers. As

a woman, I have on several occasions been threatened by drunken / drug-wired patrons of the night time economy; children who live on the street are often approached by people trying to sell them drugs.

PUNITIVE FOR RESIDENTS, DAMAGING HEALTH: Themes at the centre of this Licensing Statement include (section 1.16) that Hackney should be: 'A borough where there is a good quality of life and the whole community can benefit from growth'; 'A borough with healthy, active and independent residents'. A good night's sleep is important to health. Local residents have, for example, had secondary glazing installed in attempts to mitigate noise ASB perpetrated by patrons of the Night Time Economy, for example, and even this is not sufficient when rowdy club patrons are shouting, fighting etc. Thus this license if granted would DAMAGE residents' health. **HOSPITALS** are overstretched already. Section 1.30 of the Licensing Statement notes that, amongst other things, 'the Borough has significantly higher alcohol-specific hospital admissions for men than the national and London average'. Even if this license did not add directly to those statistics, it would contribute indirectly by adding to the number of clubbers stoking up on cheap off-license alcohol before and/or after attending the premises.

LICENSING OBJECTIVES

Crucially, to repeat, granting a license to these premises would break all four of Hackney Council's licensing objectives. It is IMPOSSIBLE for venues to police their patrons once they have left. John Campbell Road is close and the tree-lined, cobbled hammerhead is now inviting that patrons would inevitably consume food and drink al fresco (and urinate and litter) on the hammerhead. Our experience has been that our doorways, front walls, the wall of the Rio and the side of the corner shop suit a variety such anti-social activities, and a significant proportion of these premises customers who are either inconsiderate, caught short or too drunk to care will urinate and/or vomit and/or leave litter including food wrappers on our street on the way home, and/or continue arguments/fights on our street too. A late license for these premises would be PROMOTING CRIME AND DISORDER, UNDERMINING PUBLIC SAFETY, CAUSING PUBLIC NUISANCE AND PUTTING CHILDREN IN THE WAY OF HARM.

Prevention of Crime and Disorder

Crime and disorder that would unavoidably result from the license includes fights, drunken behaviour, urination, vomit etc.

Ensuring public safety

Public safety would be compromised by the contribution the premises would make to rubbish levels which could contribute to a new inflammation of the regular rat infestations.

Prevention of public nuisance

The premises would with a late license generate urination, vomit, noise, litter; parties continued on our walls and in the cars with the car stereos turned so loud our windows shake; trespassing in order that drinkers etc can put litter in our bins.

Protection of children from harm

Several families locally have young children. With these premises operating with late hours, as all these children run, walk, skip, with detritus resulting from street drinkers and clubbers, thereby exposing themselves to danger. Sometimes bottles &/or food remnants that attract rats would inevitably be left with drinks &/or food in them, and often party drinks and small bottles of spirits and little snacks look cute and inviting.
