1. Summary

Notes for Guidance

This application cannot be used to vary the licence so as to extend the period for which the licence has effect or to vary substantially the premises to which it relates. If you wish to make that type of change to the premises licence, you should make a new premises licence application under section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003.

- 1. You do not have to pay a fee if the only purpose of the variation for which you are applying is to avoid becoming liable for the late night levy
- 2. Describe the premises. For example, the type of premises, its general situation and layout and any other information which could be relevant to the licensing objectives.  - Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling with one or more martial arts are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an indoor sporting event.
 - Live music: no licence permission is required for:

- a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
- a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
- a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
- a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
- a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
 - any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
 - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;

- any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
- any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
- any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.

Police make the following representations in relation to the application to vary the Premises Licence at for The Falafel House, 297 Old Street, EC1V 9LA for the following reason(s);

This premises is located in the middle of the Shoreditch Special Policy Area on an extremely busy stretch of a road that forms part of the 'Shoreditch Triangle'. The Shoreditch SPA was introduced as the council recognised that this area has a high level and density of licensed premises and suffers high levels of nuisance and disorder. Although this venue will not be selling alcohol, it will be dealing with the effects of the alcohol consumed over several hours in other venues. Police have serious concerns regarding the effect that this premises could have on the cumulative impact and the promotion of the licensing objectives should the hours here be extended.

They have offered no additional conditions or measures in order to mitigate their impact on the SPA and show how they will not add to the cumulative impact despite wanting a large extension, far outside core hours.

In the past the venue has been seen by police operating after hours, some of these prior to there being a licence at the venue, and a great deal more after a licence to sell hot food until midnight was issued.

Since they were granted hours at a sub-committee hearing on 13th October 2022 there have still been occasions when police have found them operating after their hours. Most recently on 18th February @ 0230hrs, 26th February @ 0155hrs and 11th March @ 0110hrs. On this last occasion a colleague walked into the venue, seeing only 2 members of staff behind the counter and no security in sight.

It is clear that despite being granted later hours the venue are still content to operate with a complete disregard of the licensing legislation, and the decision of the sub-committee in issuing them a licence.

The application seeks to extend the hours of operation for the premises by an additional 3 hours on Sunday to Wednesday, 2 hours on Thursday and Friday and 3 Hours on Saturday.

The current licence already authorises licensable activity beyond the core hours outlined in the LP3 Core Hours section of the council's licensing policy for late night refreshment.

The premises are situated within the Shoreditch Special Policy Area (Shoreditch SPA); the Shoreditch SPA has been designated as such due to the impact of the number of premises within the area and their impact on the licensing objectives as well as the local amenity.

"LP10 Special Policy Areas – Dalston and Shoreditch

It is the Council's policy that where a relevant representation is made to any application within the area of the Dalston SPA or Shoreditch SPA, the applicant will need to demonstrate that the proposed activity and the operation of the premises will not add to the cumulative impact that is currently being experienced in these areas. This policy is to be strictly applied.

It should also be noted that the;

- quality and track record of the management;
- good character of the applicant; and
- extent of any variation sought

May not be in itself sufficient.

It should be noted that if an applicant can demonstrate that they will not add to the cumulative impact in their operating schedule and at any hearing, then the Core Hours Policy within LP3 will apply." The extension of authorised hours in the area increases the probability that persons are likely to remain in the area and not disperse, this leads to the further potential that the licensing objectives could be undermined, in particular the Prevention of Public Nuisance.

The Licensing Sub-Committee approved a variation of the premises licence on 13/10/2022. Since that time, colleagues in the Metropolitan Police have informed us that they have observed the premises operating beyond the current authorised hours of operation. The Licensing Authority was made aware of this activity in April 2023.

The Licensing Authority are concerned that, if the operator cannot comply with the current authorisation, how can we have confidence that they will comply with the hours of an extended authorisation.

The above representations are supported by the following evidence and information.

The Licensing Act 2003, Statement of Licensing Policy 2018 and Guidance issued by the Home Office.

Are there any actions or measures that could be taken to allay concerns or objections? If so, please explain.

The applicant should consider if the hours sought are appropriate for the locality, opening until 03:00 on Sunday to Friday and 04:00 on Saturday seems excessive in the view of the Licensing Authority.
