1. **Summary**

1.1. Kenan Yildrim has made an application for a premises licence under section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003.

2. **Application**

- 2.1. The application seeks to authorise the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises from Monday to Sunday.
- 2.2. The premises are not located within a Special Policy Area.
- 2.3. The applicant is seeking authorisation for the following licensable activities and times:

6. **Guidance Considerations**

6.1. The Licensing Authority is required to have regard to any guidance issued by the Secretary of State under the Licensing Act 2003.

7. **Policy Considerations**

- 7.1. Licensing Sub-Committee is required to have regard to the London Borough of Hackney's Statement of Licensing Policy ("the Policy) adopted by the Licensing Authority.
- 7.2. The Policy applies to applications where relevant representations have been made. With regard to this application, policies, LP1 (General Principles) and LP2 (Licensing Objectives) are relevant.

8. Officer Observations

8.1. If the Sub-Committee is minded to approve the application, the following conditions should be applied the licence:

Mandatory Conditions: Supply of Alcohol (On and Off Premises)

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:
- (a) At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence.
- (b)At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 3. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
- (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises -
- (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;
- (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit(other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
- (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise
- anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manners.
- (e)dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- 4. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 5.5.1. The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sales or supply of alcohol.
- 5.2 The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licences must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
- 5.3. The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either:-
- (a) a holographic mark or
- (b) an ultraviolet feature
- 6. The responsible person must ensure that:
- a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures:
- beer or cider: 1/2 pint;
- gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25ml or 35ml; and
- still wine in a glass: 125ml; and
- b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
- c)where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customers are made aware that these measures are available.

Minimum Drinks Pricing

- 7. 7.1 A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 7.2 For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 7.1 above -
- (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
- (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula -
- P = D+(DxV)

Where -

- (i)P is the permitted price,
- (ii)D is the rate of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and (iii)V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -
- (i) the holder of the premises licence,
- (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
- (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 7.3 Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 7.2(b) above would (apart from

this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that subparagraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

- 7.4 (1) Sub-paragraph 7.4(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 7.2(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Conditions derived from the operating schedule:

- 8. Alcohol will only be served to customers in the lounge area as indicated on the floor plan. Alcohol cannot be consumed in the Hairdresser area of the premises.
- 9. To install CCTV system which will operate and record video images at all times that the premises are open to the public. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering the premises in any light condition. All CCTV recordings made shall be retained for not less than 31 days with time and date stamping and be made available to a police officer or an authorised officer of any responsible authority upon request. Images shall be provided free of charge as soon as reasonably practicable, but not more than 24 hours after the request (subject to the Data Protection Act 1998).
- 10. The licensee will ensure that the system is checked every two weeks to ensure that the system is working properly and that the date and time are correct. -The Police will be informed if the system will not be operating for longer than one day of business for any reason
- 11.During opening hours, at least 1 member of staff on duty will be able to operate the system sufficiently to allow Police or authorised Council officers to view footage on request.-
- 12.Display clear signs at the premises stating `CCTV in Operation
- 13. Display clear signs stating that anti-social behaviour will not be tolerated
- 14. A refusal book recording all refused sales of alcohol shall be kept at the premises and maintained at all times, which shall be made available to a police officer or an authorised officer of any responsible authority upon request.

The register will contain:

- a) details of the time and date the refusal was made
- b) the reason for the refusal (including underage and attempted purchase by a person who is drunk)
- c) the identity of the staff member refusing the sale
- d) details of the alcohol the person attempted to purchase
- e) brief description of the customer concerned
- 15. All incidences of the following shall be recorded in the incident book within 24 hours and retained for a minimum of 12 months.
- a) theft or attempted theft of alcoholic drinks;
- b) any criminal incident;
- c) any incidents of disorder;
- d) all ejections of patrons;
- e) any visit by a relevant authority or the emergency services;
- f) any complaints received;
- g) any faults in the CCTV system
- h) any and all seizures of drugs or offensive weapons;

An incident book shall be kept and maintained at the premises at all times, which shall be made available to a police officer or an authorised officer of any responsible authority upon request. - The incident book shall be used to record the date and time

of any incident, the name of the staff member and a brief description of the customer concerned. -

- 16. The licence holder shall ensure that staff are trained to use and maintain the refusal book and the incident book. In the event that crime or serious disorder is, or appears to have been, committed on the premises,
- 17. The premises will display and maintain appropriate signage advising customers of the contact details of the Designated Premises Supervisor; There shall be no vertical drinking permitted anywhere on the premises at any time.
- 18. Training of staff on a regular basis to ensure public safety The premises licence holder shall ensure that all sales staff receive appropriate training in relation to managing conflict and health and safety of the public and staff. Training documents shall be signed and dated and will be held in a suitable hard-copy log, to be made available to a Police Officer or Council Officer upon request. Records shall be retained for at least 12 months.
- 19. The sign shall remind customers to respect the neighbours, leave the area quietly and request that they do not congregate outside the premises.
- 20. To keep deliveries of goods at afternoon times (Delivery times not to be very early or late) Keeping noise to a minimum at all times.
- 21. A 'Challenge 25' scheme that ensures any person attempting to purchase alcohol who appears to be under the age of 25 shall provide documented proof that he/she is over 18 years of age shall be implemented at the premises. Proof of age shall only comprise a passport, a photo card driving licence, or Proof of Age Standards Scheme (PASS) approved proof of age identity card.
- 21. A prominent notice, of a size A4 or larger, shall be displayed at the point of entry to the premises and at the serving area advising customers that the premises operates the `Challenge 25` proof of age scheme.
- 22. All staff whose responsibilities include the retail sale of alcohol shall receive training prior to them being permitted to sell alcohol and refreshed not more than every six months thereafter. the training shall include, but is not restricted to: a) the prevention of underage sales of alcohol which shall include: i. operation of the
- 23. No one under the age of 18 years will be allowed into the smoking area of the premises.

Conditions derived from Responsible Authorities representations:

24. The premises shall maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of a Metropolitan Police Crime Prevention Officer. All public areas, entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the

premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer.

25.A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises are open to the public. This staff member shall be able to show Police or an authorised officer of Hackney Borough Council recent data or footage with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.

26.An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available immediately to an authorised officer of the Hackney Borough Council or the Police, which will record the following:

- all crimes reported to the venue
- any complaints received
- any incidents of disorder
- any faults in the CCTV system
- any refusal of the sale of alcohol
- any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.
- 27. There shall be clear and prominent signage asking all customers to leave quietly and respect local residents.
- 28.All instances of crime or disorder to be reported by the designated premises supervisor or responsible member of staff to an agreed police contact point, as agreed with the Police.
- 29. Where the sale or supply of alcohol is taking place employees of the premises must request sight of evidence of the age of any person appearing to be under 25 years of age (Challenge 25). Such evidence may include a driving licence or passport.
- 30. The premises will display and maintain appropriate signage advising customers of the contact details of the Designated Premises Supervisor.
- 31.All staff will be given refresher training every six months on the legislation relating to the sales of alcohol to underage persons and drunken persons. Written records of this training shall be kept on the premises and produced to police or other authorised officer upon request.
- 32. There shall be no open containers or drinks taken outside the premises at any time.
- 33. Alcohol shall not be sold or supplied for consumption on the premises other than to people taking a substantial table meal from the menu and that the consumption of such alcohol is ancillary to taking table meals. This shall be served by waiter/waitress service.
- 34. The Licensee shall ensure that all relevant staff are fully trained and made aware of the legal requirement of businesses to comply with their responsibility as regards the disposal of waste produced from the business premises. The procedure for

handling and preparing for disposal of the waste shall be in writing and displayed in a prominent place where it can be referred to at all times by staff.

- 35. The Licensee shall ensure that any contract for general and recyclable waste disposal shall be appropriate in size to the amount of waste produced by the business. The Licensee shall maintain an adequate supply of waste receptacles provided by his registered waste carrier (refuse sacks or commercial waste bins) in order to ensure all refuse emanating from the business is always presented for collection by his waste carrier and shall not use any plain black or unidentifiable refuse sacks or any other unidentifiable or unmarked waste receptacles.
- 36. The Licensee's premises are situated in an area within which refuse may only be left on the public highway at certain times (time bands). If the Licensee's waste carrier cannot or does not comply by collecting the refuse within an hour after the close of any time band imposed by the waste authority, the Licensee must remove the refuse from the public highway and/or keep it within the premises until such time as his/her waste carrier arrives to collect the refuse.
- 37. The Licensee shall instruct members of staff to make regular checks of the area immediately outside the premises and remove any litter, bottles and glasses emanating from the premises. A final check should be made at close of business.
- 38.. The Licensee shall provide a safe receptacle for cigarette ends to be placed outside for the use of customers, such receptacle being carefully placed so as not to cause an obstruction or trip.
- 39. The current trade waste agreement/duty of care waste transfer document shall be conspicuously displayed and maintained in the window of the premises where it can be conveniently seen and read by persons standing in Chef's Signature. This should remain unobstructed at all times and should clearly identify:- the name of the registered waste carrier the date of commencement of trade waste contract the date of expiry of trade waste contract the days and times of collection the type of waste including the European Waste Code

9. Reasons for Officer Observations

8.1. Conditions 9 to 23 are derived from the applicant's operating schedule, conditions 24 to 33 have been suggested by the Police Authority and conditions 34 to 39 have been suggested by the Environmental Enforcement Authority.

10. **Legal Comments**

- 10.1. The Council has a duty as a Licensing Authority under the Licensing Act 2003 to carry out its functions with a view to promoting the following licensing objectives;
 - The Prevention of Crime and Disorder
 - Public Safety
 - Prevention of Public Nuisance
 - The Protection of Children from Harm

10.2. It should be noted that each of the licensing objectives have equal importance and are the only grounds upon which a relevant representation can be made and for which an application can be refused or terms and conditions attached to a licence.

11. Human Rights Act 1998 Implications

- 11.1. There are implications to;
 - **Article 6** Right to a fair hearing
 - Article 14 Not to discriminate
 - Balancing: **Article 1-** Peaceful enjoyment of their possession (i.e. a licence is defined as being a possession) with **Article 8** Right of Privacy (i.e. respect private & family life) to achieve a proportionate decision having regard to the protection of an individuals rights against the interests of the community at large.

All four licensing objectives to be in place and to be implemented to protect public nuisance and children away from harm.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

Alcohol will only be served to customers in the lounge area as indicated on the floor plan. Alcohol cannot be consumed in the Hairdresser area of the premises.

- To liaise with the local police
- To install CCTV system which will operate and record video images at all times that the premises are open to the public. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering the premises in any light condition.
- All CCTV recordings made shall be retained for not less than 31 days with time and date stamping and be made available to a police officer or an authorised officer of any responsible authority upon request. Images shall be provided free of charge as soon as reasonably practicable, but not more than 24 hours after the request (subject to the Data Protection Act 1998).
- -The licensee will ensure that the system is checked every two weeks to ensure that the system is working properly and that the date and time are correct.
- -The Police will be informed if the system will not be operating for longer than one day of business for any reason;
- -During opening hours, at least 1 member of staff on duty will be able to operate the system sufficiently to allow Police or authorised Council officers to view footage on request;
- Display clear signs at the premises stating `CCTV in Operation`
- Display clear signs stating that anti-social behaviour will not be tolerated
- Do not sell alcohol to drunk person
- A refusal book recording all refused sales of alcohol shall be kept at the premises and maintained at all times, which shall be made available to a police officer or an authorised officer of any responsible authority upon request. The register will contain:
- a) details of the time and date the refusal was made
- b) the reason for the refusal (including underage and attempted purchase by a person who is drunk)
- c) the identity of the staff member refusing the sale
- d) details of the alcohol the person attempted to purchase
- e) brief description of the customer concerned
- An incident book shall be kept and maintained at the premises at all times, which shall be made available to a police officer or an authorised officer of any responsible authority upon request.
- The incident book shall be used to record the date and time of any incident, the name of the staff member and a brief description of the customer concerned.
- All incidences of the following shall be recorded in the incident book within 24 hours and retained for a minimum of 12 months.
- a) theft or attempted theft of alcoholic drinks;
- b) any criminal incident;
- c) any incidents of disorder;
- d) all ejections of patrons;
- e) any visit by a relevant authority or the emergency services;
- f) any complaints received;
- g) any faults in the CCTV system;

- h) any and all seizures of drugs or offensive weapons;
- The licence holder shall ensure that staff are trained to use and maintain the refusal book and the incident book
- In the event that crime or serious disorder is, or appears to have been, committed on the premises, the management will immediately ensure that:
- (a) The police and, where appropriate, the London Ambulance Service, are called immediately;
- (b) As far as is safe and reasonable practicable, all measures will be taken to apprehend any identified suspects pending the arrival of the police;
- (c) As far as is safe and reasonable practicable, all measures will be taken to preserve any identified crime scene pending the arrival of the police.
- The premises will display and maintain appropriate signage advising customers of the contact details of the Designated Premises Supervisor;
- There shall be no vertical drinking permitted anywhere on the premises at any time.

c) Public safety

- To meet all health and safety objectives
- Liaise with the local police
- Training of staff on a regular basis to ensure public safety
- The premises licence holder shall ensure that all sales staff receive appropriate training in relation to managing conflict and health and safety of the public and staff. Training documents shall be signed and dated and will be held in a suitable hard-copy log, to be made available to a Police Officer or Council Officer upon request. Said records shall be retained for at least 12 months.
- Do not sell alcohol to underage persons, always check ID's if in doubt about person's age.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

- Customers requested to leave the premises in a quiet and orderly manners. A suitably worded sign, of a size A4 or larger, shall be displayed at each exit point from the premises. The sign shall remind customers to respect the neighbours, leave the area quietly and request that they do not congregate outside the premises.
- The licensee shall ensure that the management and staff prevent the admission of, and ensure the prompt departure from the premises of, any and all drunk and or disorderly people or other people displaying signs of other substance use, without causing any disorder;
- To keep deliveries of goods at afternoon times (Delivery times not to be very early or late)
- Keeping noise to a minimum at all times.

e) The protection of children from harm

- Clear signs displayed to warn families to keep children with them at all times
- To keep sharp and flammable objects from children
- Do not sell alcohol to underage persons. A `Challenge 25` scheme that ensures any person attempting to purchase alcohol who appears to be under the age of 25 shall provide documented proof that he/she is over 18 years of age shall be implemented at the premises. Proof of age shall only comprise a passport, a photo card driving licence, or Proof of Age Standards Scheme (PASS) approved proof of age identity card.
- A prominent notice, of a size A4 or larger, shall be displayed at the point of entry to the premises and at the serving area advising customers that the premises operates the `Challenge 25` proof of

age scheme.

- All staff whose responsibilities include the retail sale of alcohol shall receive training prior to them being permitted to sell alcohol and refreshed not more than every six months thereafter, the training shall include, but is not restricted to:
- a) the prevention of underage sales of alcohol which shall include:
- i. operation of the `Challenge 25` scheme;
- ii. types of acceptable ID;
- iii. method of recording challenges;
- iv. potential consequences of making an underage sale.
- b) refusing sales of alcohol to persons who appear to be drunk;
- c) identifying and preventing proxy sales;
- d) the operation of the CCTV equipment.

Such training shall be recorded, a version of which must be kept in English and these records shall, on request, be made available to any police officer or authorised person upon demand;

- No one under the age of 18 years will be allowed into the smoking area of the premises.





To demonstrate their right to work via the Home Office online right to work checking service, applicants should include in this application their 9-digit share code (provided to them upon accessing the service at https://www.gov.uk/prove-right-to-work) which, along with the applicant's date of birth (provided within his application), will allow the licensing authority to carry out the check.

In order to establish the applicant's right to work, the check will need to indicate that the applicant is allowed to work in the United Kingdom and is not subject to a condition preventing them from doing work relating to the carrying on a licensable activity.

An online check will not be possible in all circumstances because not all applicants will have an immigration status that can be checked online. - The Licensee shall ensure that all relevant staff are fully trained and made aware of the legal requirement of businesses to comply with their responsibility as regards the disposal of waste produced from the business premises. The procedure for handling and preparing for disposal of the waste shall be in writing and displayed in a prominent place where it can be referred to at all times by staff.
- 2. The Licensee shall ensure that any contract for general and recyclable waste disposal shall be appropriate in size to the amount of waste produced by the business. The Licensee shall maintain an adequate supply of waste receptacles provided by his registered waste carrier (refuse sacks or commercial waste bins) in order to ensure all refuse emanating from the business is always presented for collection by his waste carrier and shall not use any plain black or unidentifiable refuse sacks or any other unidentifiable or unmarked waste receptacles.
- 3. The Licensee's premises are situated in an area within which refuse may only be left on the public highway at certain times (time bands). 1) The premises shall maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of a Metropolitan Police Crime Prevention Officer. All public areas, entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer.

- 2) A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises are open to the public. This staff member shall be able to show Police or an authorised officer of Hackney Borough Council recent data or footage with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.
- 3) An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available immediately to an authorised officer of the Hackney Borough Council or the Police, which will record the following: all crimes reported to the venue any complaints received any incidents of disorder any faults in the CCTV system any refusal of the sale of alcohol any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.
- 4) There shall be clear and prominent signage asking all customers to leave quietly and respect local residents.
- 5) All instances of crime or disorder to be reported by the designated premises supervisor or responsible member of staff to an agreed police contact point, as agreed with the Police.
- 6) Where the sale or supply of alcohol is taking place employees of the premises must request sight of evidence of the age of any person appearing to be under 25 years of age (Challenge 25). Such evidence may include a driving licence or passport.
- 7) The premises will display and maintain appropriate signage advising customers of the contact details of the Designated Premises Supervisor.
- 8) All staff will be given refresher training every six months on the legislation relating to the sales of alcohol to underage persons and drunken persons. Written records of this training shall be kept on the premises and produced to police or other authorised officer upon request.
- There shall be no open containers or drinks taken outside the premises at any time.
- 10) Alcohol shall not be sold or supplied for consumption on the premises other than to people taking a substantial table meal from the menu and that the consumption of such alcohol is ancillary to taking table meals. This shall be served by waiter/waitress service.
