1	Mishon	Mishon look at each person who approaches us as an individual, with an aim of not only helping them in every materialistic possible way but also to renew them and strengthen them in spirit.	£19,800
2	MISGAV	Our capacity and experience for providing a wrap-around, targeted support has been put to test during the pandemic, when in lockdowns we provided targeted 1:1 support through our keyworkers and volunteers.	£19,800
3	Clapton Park United Reformed Church	With us people can make mistakes in communication that they won't be penalised for, they can dip in and out, take the opportunity to build networks of support and feel safe here because we do not hold any power over their lives. We try to remove barriers to participation by building relationships and making our sessions easier to attend, incorporating soft start times, sending personal text reminders, adapting activities they participate in during a session balanced with childcare and any additional needs of their child.	£19,800

4	City & Hackney Carers Centre	Carers are able to access our service via a number of channels. This is important as carers come from all backgrounds and we need to make the route into our service as easy as possible. We have exploratory conversations to understand what would help them and also the person/s that they care for.	£19,800

1	Get Set Girls	As an organisation whose mission is to holistically improve the lives and futures of socioeconomically disadvantaged young people, we focus not only on education and employment, but run projects helping our beneficiaries improve their social inclusion, improve their soft skills, become more involved in their communities, raise their physical and mental health, and increase their inclusion in the arts.
2	The Chicken Soup Shelter	For many years, we have been acutely aware that almost all of the families and individuals who use our services have additional needs that we cannot directly address through food assistance, including mental health, childcare, and un- and under-employment. We try, within the limits of our present capacity and funding, to understand the factors that make families dependent on our assistance and identify ways to make them more independent.
3	Children Ahead Ltd	Children Ahead is at its heart rooted in community need and led by community talent. Children Ahead has become the go-to resource. With a range of cultural, logistical and other barriers in place, the children we work with access mainstream support services very marginally.
