The venue is in the Dalston SPA and is asking for an increase in hours without any further conditions or mitigations in place to manage any impact these later hours may have.

It is also noted in the Councils Statement of Licensing Policy under LP10 that the track record of the venue should be taken into account. Police are aware that Licensing enforcement have previously found them operating after their licensable hours. When trying to demonstrate that they are responsible operators there needs to be a track record of operating within their current restrictions.

Police would like a discussion around how they intend to operate deliveries in these later hours and how waiting drivers will be managed.

I write to make a representation in response to this application. The premises is located within the Dalston Special Policy area which is an area identified as suffering from the negative cumulative impact as a result of the high concentration of licensed premises in the immediate area. The following policy applies:

LP10 Special Policy Areas – Dalston and Shoreditch

It is the Council's policy that where a relevant representation is made to any application within the area of the Dalston SPA or Shoreditch SPA, the applicant will need to demonstrate that the proposed activity and the operation of the premises will not add to the cumulative impact that is currently being experienced in these areas. This policy is to be strictly applied. It should also be noted that the:

- quality and track record of the management;
- good character of the applicant; and
- extent of any variation sought

May not be in itself sufficient. It should be noted that if an applicant can demonstrate that they will not add to the cumulative impact in their operating schedule and at any hearing, then the Core Hours Policy within LP3 will apply

I am concerned that the additional hours being sought would add to the negative cumulative impact already being experienced in the area. The applicant does not appear to address this in the application. The proposal could therefore have a negative impact on the promotion of the licensing objectives, most notably, the prevention of public nuisance.

Annex 1 - Mandatory Conditions

Supply Of Alcohol(Off)

Supply of Alcohol

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:
 - (a) At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence.
 - (b) At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 3. 3.1.The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sales or supply of alcohol.
 - 3.2 The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licences must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
 - 3.3. The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either:-
 - (a) a holographic mark or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.

Minimum Drinks Pricing

- 4. 4.1 A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
 - 4.2 For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 4.1 above -
 - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
 - (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula P = D+(DxV)

Where -

- (i)P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the rate of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and (iii)V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -
- (i) the holder of the premises licence.
- (ii)the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
- (iii)the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply

of alcohol under such a licence;

- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 4.3 Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 4.2(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 4.4 (1) Sub-paragraph 4.4(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 4.2(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

 (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule Not applicable.

Conditions derived from Responsible Authority representations

- 5. The use of the external area shall cease by 22:00 hours when all street furniture such as tables and chairs shall be rendered unusable, and shall be removed.
- 6. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of a Metropolitan Police Crime. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorized officer throughout the preceding 31 day period. The CCTV system should be updated and maintained according to police recommendations.
- 7. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises is open to the public. This staff member must be able to show a Police or authorized council officer recent data or footage with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.
- 8. Customers will be encouraged to leave premises quietly and promptly. The Premises Licence Holder shall display A4 size notices on entry / exit point, with clear wording no smaller that size 50 font stating "Please respect our neighbours and leave the area quietly."
- 9. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to an authorised officer of the council or the police, which will record the following:
 - a. All crimes reported.
 - b. All ejections of patrons
 - c. Any complaints received.
 - d. Any incidents of disorder.
 - e. Seizure of drugs or offensive weapons.
 - f. Any faults in the CCTV system.
 - g. Any refusal of the sale of alcohol.
 - h. Any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.
- 10. All instances of crime and disorder witnessed or reported to staff to be reported by the Designated Premises Supervisor or responsible member of staff to police.
- 11. All staff shall receive training on the legislation relating to the sales of alcohol to underage persons and drunken persons and shall have refresher training every 6 months. There shall be written records of such training which will be kept on the premises and produced to a police officer or other authorised officer upon request.
- 12. All off sales of alcohol shall be ancillary to a take away meal and in sealed containers for consumption away from the premises.

- 13. The premises shall at all times operate a Challenge 25 policy to prevent any customers who attempt to purchase alcohol and who appear to the staff member to be under the age of 25 years without having first provided identification. Only a valid British driver's licence showing a photograph of the person, a valid passport or proof of age card showing the 'Pass' hologram are to be accepted as identification. Military ID Cards can also be accepted. Notices and/or posters advertising the Challenge 25 policy shall be placed in prominent positions at the premises.
- 14. No alcohol to be situated in the public area. The location of the alcohol is to be sited out of sight of members of the public.
- 15. The licence holder shall maintain a dedicated telephone number of the Designated Premises Supervisor for use by a responsible authority or any person who may wish to make a complaint. This contact number shall be provided to the Licensing authority police and any local authority upon request.
- 16. Deliveries will not be made to public places such as parks, roadsides or landmarks. Deliveries can only be made to a home or business address given at the time of the order.
- 17. Super Strength lagers, beers and/or ciders with an ABV of 5.5% or higher, shall not be sold at the premises.


