Summary

1.1. This is an application to vary a premises licence to change the interior layout of the premises.

2. Application

- 2.1. Greene King Retailing Limited have made an application to vary a premises licence under section 34 of the Licensing Act 2003.

The plan will be revisited periodically and amended to reflect any changes required. The plan will be disseminated to all staff required to implement it and will be made available to responsible authorities on request.

- A complaints log will be maintained and any complaints from residents shall be recorded in it. As a minimum, the information recorded shall include: date and time of the complaint, name of the complainant and any action taken thereafter in relation to it.

Notes for Guidance

This application cannot be used to vary the licence so as to extend the period for which the licence has effect or to vary substantially the premises to which it relates. If you wish to make that type of change to the premises licence, you should make a new premises licence application under section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003.

- 1. You do not have to pay a fee if the only purpose of the variation for which you are applying is to avoid becoming liable for the late night levy
- 2. Describe the premises. For example, the type of premises, its general situation and layout and any other information which could be relevant to the licensing objectives. Where your application includes off-supplies of alcohol and you intend to provide a place of consumption of these off-supplies of alcohol, you must include a description of where the place will be and its proximity to the premises.

 - Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling with one or more martial arts are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an indoor sporting event.
 - Live music: no licence permission is required for:
 - a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.

- a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
- a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
- a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
 - on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
 - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority:
 - any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
 - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor;
 and
 - any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.
- 4. Where taking place in a building or other structure please tick as appropriate (indoors may include a tent).
- 5. For example state type of activity to be authorised, if not already stated, and give relevant further details, for example (but not exclusively) whether or not music will be amplified or unamplified.





Dear Licensing,

I am writing to object to specific aspects of the the variation of license application issued by Greene King for the Horse & Groom pub at 28 Curtain Road, EC2A 3NZ.

I am a recent resident of The Stage, EC2 which adjoins this public house at the rear. The two specific requests for rejection we have are:

- a. an objection to allowing drinking to be permitted outside the establishment
- b. to allow the use of the area to the side of the premises to be used by the same outdoor drinkers

The reason for these objections are two-fold:

- 1. Public Nuisance: the pub already operations 'disco' and 'soul' club nights through to 2am or 3am Thu-Sat. Allowing the activity and noise from pub-goers and revellers to spill out onto the street and side alley will create a significant noise nuisance way into the early hours for ourselves and other residents alike, affecting sleep and hence stress levels and health. In addition the alleyway's unique shape acts as a funnel that will simply direct any of this noise up and onto the various floors of The Stage to amplify such noise levels (this unique narrow funnel shape and it's impact can be witnessed by visiting the site)
- 2. Public Safety: the alleyway beside the Horse & Groom is very narrow as stated, and also acts as a thoroughfare for access to The Stage residences, to the new Shakespeare Curtain theatre, and various retail units. Having pub-goers, tables and chairs in this very narrow access space will restrict freedom of movement and inward and outward access for any residents, theatre or retail visitors.

I hope the above is self explanatory. But please let me know if you need further information.

This is within the special policy area and will add to the existing public nuisance from other bars and venues.

There is significant likely hood of noise, public disorder.

The extreme disturbance from late night arrivals parking in side streets breathing gas and "front loading" then departing later after shouting, urination in the street (men and women, pictures available on request!!!) and blaring car sound systems.

The late night disturbance causes serious loss of sleep for the very many residents in nearby streets along with an extremely unsafe environment for residents who do venture out. Perfect Example was Friday 10:30 pm 28th July 23 ... Just crazy mayhem along Great Eastern St and curtain road. Literally hundreds of people swarming on the pavement and randomly dangerously crossing in front of and threatening traffic and drivers. All this required large groups of Police constables to try to keep order. It was an extremely unsafe situation. This occurred within 75m of the premises indicated above.

- The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
 - The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sales or supply of alcohol.
 - The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.
- 7. The responsible person shall ensure that:
 - a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures:

beer or cider: 1/2 pint;

gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25ml or 35ml; and

still wine in a glass: 125ml; and

customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

Mandatory Condition: Exhibition of films

- 8. Admission of children (under 18) to the exhibition of any film must be restricted in accordance with: -
 - (a) Recommendations made by the film classification body where the film classification body is specified in the licence, or
 - (b) Recommendations made by the licensing authority where the film classification body is not specified in the licence, or the relevant licensing authority has not notified the holder of the licence that this subsection applies to the film in question.

"film classification body" means person('s) designated under s4 of the Video Recordings Act 1984(c.39)

- 13. No happy hours or other similar promotions will be undertaken
- 14. Signs will be displayed requesting patrons to leave the premises quietly
- Waste will not be dealt with outside the premises between 23:00 and 07:00 hours.
- 16. The installation of sound limiting devices to all music systems. The limiting devices should be set to ensure inaudibility in all nearby residential premises, a certificate of compliance should be submitted to the pollution group.
- 17. Voluntary codes of practice/best practice guides such as those promoted by the Portman Group or the British Beer and Pub Association shall be adhered to.
- 18. Risk management assessments shall be checked weekly.
- 19. All procedures, appliances and systems shall be regularly tested and certified.
- 20. No drinking shall be permitted outside the premises.
- Glasses, bottles or open containers shall not be allowed to be taken off the premises.
- 22. Where appropriate persons under 18 shall be excluded from the premises if the style of regulated entertainment is not conducive for young persons.
- 23. Children shall not be permitted at the bar counter.

Conditions deriving from Responsible Authority representations

- 24. No noise to be audible within the nearest noise sensitive premises.
- All live music to cease at 23:00 hours.
- 26. A comprehensive CCTV system that ensures all areas of the licensed premises are monitored, including all entry points, and which enable frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. All cameras shall continually record whilst the premises are in operation and the recording shall be kept available for a minimum of 31 days with time and date stamping. Recording shall be made available to a duly authorised Hackney Council officer or a police officer together with facilities for viewing. The recordings for the preceding 31 days shall be made available immediately on request. The CCTV system shall be operated in accordance with the Data Protection Act 1998 and any other relevant legislation.
- 27. A minimum of one SIA registered door staff per 100 customers or part thereof shall be on duty when required on the basis of an operational risk assessment with identity badges displayed at all times and SIA numbers, full names, times worked and duty performed to be entered into an occurrence book and made.
- Reasonable steps to be taken to ensure that an authorised person is a member of Pubwatch or Clubwatch and SNOW and attends at least three meetings a year.
- 29. Premises to operate a zero tolerance policy to drugs and comply with the Hackney Police/Council Community Safety Unit Drugs and Weapons Policy.
- 30. The premises will also, in cooperation with Hackney Police and no later than 6 months following granting of the premises licence, regularly facilitate a premises drug audit using the Ion Itemiser or similar device.
- Toilets to be checked by staff randomly and at least once per hour after 2000 and an entry made in a register and made immediately available to police at reasonable request.
- 32. Non-intoxicating beverages, including drinking water, shall be available throughout the permitted hours in all parts of the premises where alcohol is sold.
