1. **Summary**

- 1.1. This is an application for a premises licence for late night refreshment on Monday to Saturday.

2. **Application**

- 2.1. Mr Haydar Donmez has made an application for a premises licence under section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003.

- 8.1. If the Sub-Committee is minded to approve the application, the following conditions should be applied the licence:

Mandatory Conditions:

Conditions derived from the operating Schedule:

1.The Licensee will install comprehensive CCTV coverage at the premises and it is operated and maintained at the premises. The CCTV system shall conform to the following points:

- a. Cameras must be sited to observe the entrance and exit doors both inside and outside.
- b. Cameras on the entrances must capture full frame shots of the heads and shoulders of all people entering the premises i.e. capable of identification.
- c. Cameras viewing till areas must capture frames not less than 50% of the screen.
- d. Cameras overlooking floor areas should be wide angled to give an overview of the premises.
- e. Be capable of visually confirming the nature of the crime committed.
- f. Provide a linked record of the date, time and place of any image.
- g. Provide good quality images –colour during opening times.
- h. Operate under existing light levels within and outside the premises.
- i. Have the recording device located in a secure area or locked cabinet.

- j. Have a monitor to review images and recorded picture quality.
- k. Be regularly maintained to ensure continuous quality of image capture retention.
- l. Have signage displayed in the customer area to advise that CCTV is in operation.
- m. Digital images must be kept for 31 days.
- n. Police will have access to images at any reasonable time.
- o. The equipment must have a suitable export method, e. G. CD/DVD writer so that the police can make an evidential copy of the data they require. This data should be in the native file format, to ensure that no image quality is lost when making the copy, if this format is non-standard (i.e. manufacturer proprietary) then the manufacturer should supply the replay software to ensure that the video on the CD can be replayed by the police on a standard computer. Copies must be made available to Police on request.

2. The Licensee shall ensure that all staff will undertake training in their responsibilities. Records will be kept of training and refresher training.

3. Any incidents of a criminal nature that may occur on the premises will be reported to the Police.

4. All emergency exits shall be kept free from obstruction at all times.

5. All customers will be asked to leave quietly. Clear and legible notices will be prominently displayed to remind customers to leave quietly and have regard to our neighbours.

Conditions derived from Responsible Authorities representations:

6. Staff at the venue will be responsible for ensuring that any queue is orderly and well managed.

9. **Reasons for Officer Observations**

9.1. Conditions 1 to 5 are derived from the applicant's operating schedule. Condition 6 has been agreed with the Police Authority.

10. **Legal Comments**

10.1. The Council has a duty as a Licensing Authority under the Licensing Act 2003 to carry out its functions with a view to promoting the following 4 licensing objectives;

- The Prevention of Crime and Disorder
- Public Safety
- Prevention of Public Nuisance
- The Protection of Children from Harm

10.2. It should be noted that each of the licensing objectives have equal

importance and are the only grounds upon which a relevant representation can be made and for which an application can be refused or terms and conditions attached to a licence.

11. **Human Rights Act 1998 Implications**

11.1. There are implications to;

- **Article 6** – Right to a fair hearing
- **Article 14** – Not to discriminate
- Balancing: **Article 1**- Peaceful enjoyment of their possession (i.e. a licence is defined as being a possession) with **Article 8** – Right of Privacy (i.e. respect private & family life) to achieve a proportionate decision having regard to the protection of an individuals rights against the interests of the community at large.

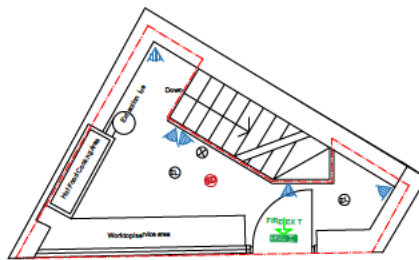

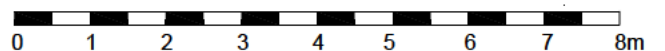

I have noticed something interesting about this shop, which is located very close to where I live and I often pass by during the day.

360 OLD STREET, LONDON, EC1V 9LT

Most of the time, it's closed with shutters in front of it. One night, while passing by at around 11 PM, I noticed that they have applied to the Hackney Council to stay open from 20.30 PM to 2 AM, and this permission is valid until August 14th. What caught my attention is that they are deliberately hiding the application notice, so that no one notices or realizes it. On Friday and Saturday nights, they are even opening until 3 AM without waiting for the application's result.

They have not even displayed the application notice on their shutter so far, and sometimes they put it on the window, but remove it quickly in the evenings. This shop has a history of poor hygiene as well. Consequently, since they are not adhering to the regulations of having the application notice visible to everyone for 24 hours a day for 30 days, you should ensure that this period is reset and that everyone gets to see it.

Please make sure that this information is conveyed properly to the relevant authorities at the Hackney Council.

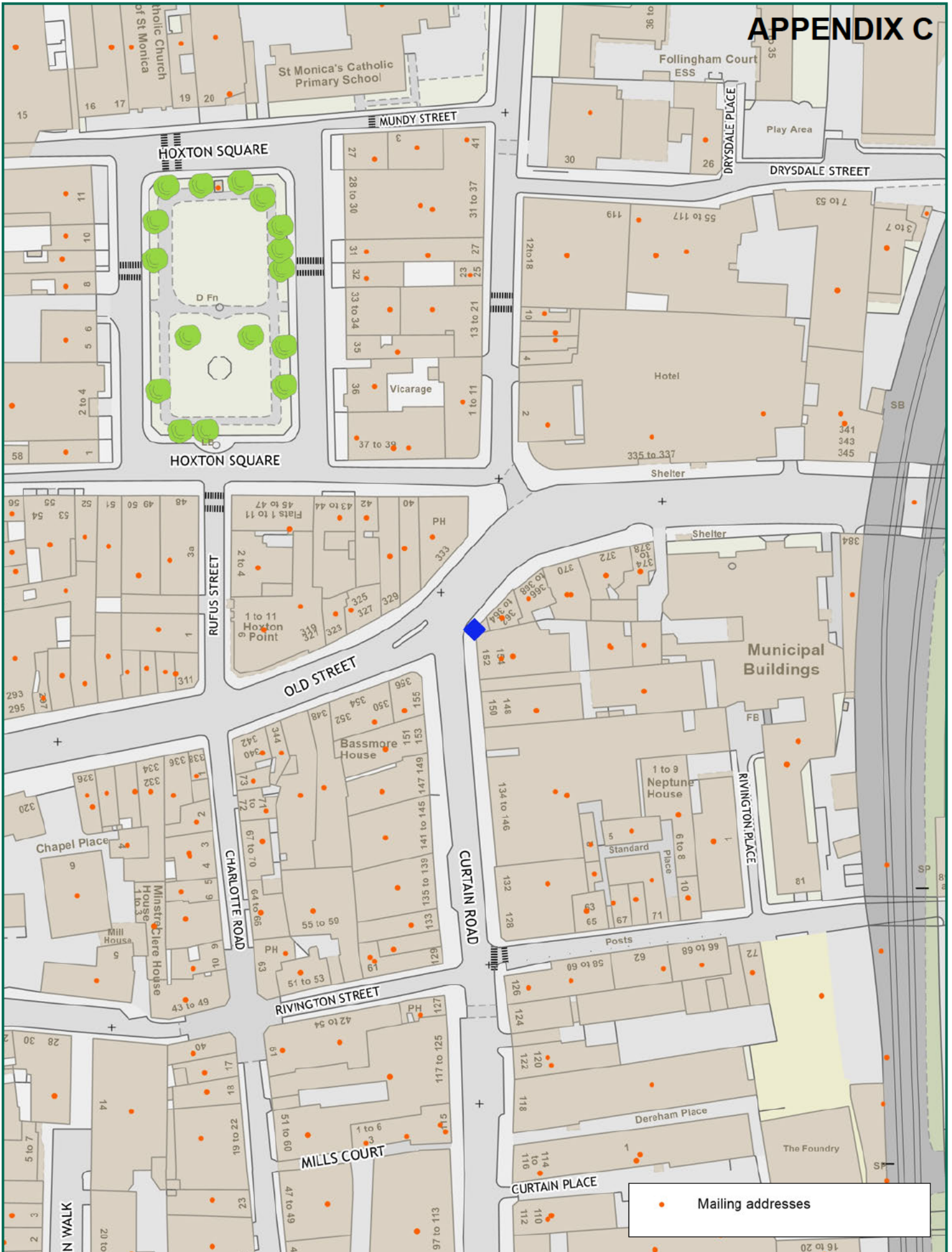
