1. Summary

- 1.1. This is an application to vary a premises licence;
 - To update the layout of the premises
 - o To remove condition 16 on the premises licence
 - To extend permitted hours for the late night refreshment and sale of alcohol on Monday to Saturday, no change is sought to Sunday hours.

2. Application

- 2.1. Entropy Drinks Ltd has made an application to vary a premises licence under section 34 of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 2.2. The applicant is seeking authorisation for the following proposed variation:
 - To update the layout of the premises (as per revised plan provided).
 - To remove condition 16: Police and LBH contracted drugs dogs or drug detection equipment will be given immediate access to the premises without notice for the purpose of detecting and reducing incidences of drug misuse.
 - To extend permitted hours for the following licensable activities:

 - 3) The sale of alcohol shall be by waiter/waiter service to customers who are seated.

- 10.1. The Council has a duty as a Licensing Authority under the Licensing Act 2003 to carry out its functions with a view to promoting the following 4 licensing objectives;

 - Prevention of Public Nuisance
 - The Protection of Children from Harm
- 10.2. It should be noted that each of the licensing objectives have equal importance and are the only grounds upon which a relevant representation can be made and for which an application can be refused or terms and conditions attached to a licence.



1 Dispersal Policy

- 1.1 The objective of the Dispersal Policy is to ensure a quiet, controlled and swift dispersal of the Premises' customers.
- 1.2 The Dispersal Policy promotes a professional and responsible management of customers as they leave the Premises to ensure they make their journey home without any adverse impact on local residents.
- 1.3 The Policy prevents nuisance caused to local residents from the following risks:
- 1.3.1 Noisy or anti-social behaviour by customers leaving the Premises.
- 1.3.2 Large numbers of people leaving the Premises at the same time.
- 1.4 Despite the Premises' central London location, employees are made aware that local residents live in the area.

1.5 This Dispersal Policy is followed throughout the opening hours, although particular attention is paid to customers leaving at night.

Entrances and Exits

1.6 The main entrance/exit is on Kingsland Road. Staff and will carefully supervise this entrance during busy periods.

Dispersal

- 1.7 The primary point of dispersal is the main Kingsland Road exit point. From this exit customers will disperse directly home by foot, to their taxi or the area's numerous transport links (see below).
- 1.8 Towards closing time, the following measures are taken to ensure a gradual and quiet closure of the Premises:
- 1.8.1 Raised lighting levels.
- 1.8.2 Lowered music levels.
- 1.8.3 Politely reminding customers the Premises is about to close.

Transport

1.9 The Premises is well serviced by public transport links, as set out below. All staff must be familiar with the transport links so they can advise customers when required.

Overground & Rail

- 1.10 Dalston Kingsland and Dalston Junction Overground stations are located within easy walking distance of the Premises.
- 1.11 Other rail stations, for example Victoria, Paddington, Liverpool Street, Euston, Waterloo and Kings Cross St Pancras are easily reached by Overground train, bus or taxi.
- 1.12 Where necessary customers will be given directions to the relevant station and reminded to reach the station as quietly and as quickly as possible when they leave.

Tube

1.13 Highbury & Islington tube station can be reached by Dalston Kingsland Overground Station. Liverpool Street Station tube station can be reached by travelling from Dalston Junction Overground Station to Shoreditch Overground Station, followed by a 4 minute walk.

1.14 Where necessary customers will be given directions to the relevant station and reminded to reach the station as quietly and as quickly as possible when they leave.

Buses

- 1.15 The Premises is well serviced by public buses. TFL bus services, including 24-hour routes and night buses, are accessible by bus stops in the area. Buses travel to a variety of destinations throughout London.
- 1.16 Bus routes include: 30, 38, 67, 76, 149, 236, 242, 243, 277, 488 and the N38.
- 1.17 Staff will be familiar with the local bus services and will advise customers accordingly

Taxi

- 1.18 Local licensed taxi companies operate in the area. Customers will also be expected to use Uber or similar licensed taxi services.
- 1.19 Customers will be encouraged to wait inside the Premises for their taxi.

"The use of the garden shall cease at 23:00 Monday to Saturday and 22.30 Sunday."

The Licensing Authority are concerned that the extension of hours sought may lead to the Prevention of Public Nuisance licensing objective being undermined.

The premises is located along a commercial parade with residential premises above the premises, the extension of hours for licensable activity may lead to nearby residents being disturbed by the operation and their patrons.

Given the locality and saturation of existing nearby licensed premises, the potential for the negative cumulative impact of licensed premises may be increased and place the licensing objectives at risk of being undermined.

The hours sought are beyond those outlined in the Council's Licensing Policy LP3 Core Hours and LP6 External Areas and Outdoor Events.

Whilst the application seeks to extend the hours, the applicant has not suggested any additional measures/conditions that look to mitigate any problems that may arise from late night dispersal of patrons from the premises.

Some clarification is needed on the provision of Off Sales at the premises, e.g. are these limited to take away orders only?

LP3 Core Hours

Hours for licensable activity will generally be authorised, subject to demonstrating LP 1 and LP2, as follows:

- Monday to Thursday 08:00 to 23:00
- Friday and Saturday 08:00 to 00:00
- Sunday 10:00 to 22:30

Hours may be more restrictive dependent on the character of the area and if the individual circumstances require it. Later hours may be considered where the applicant has identified any risk that may undermine the promotion of the licensing objectives and has put in place robust measures to mitigate those risks.

LP6 External Areas and Outdoor Events

The Licensing Authority will normally restrict external areas and outdoor activity to between 08:00 and 22:00 unless the applicant can demonstrate that comprehensive control measures have been implemented that ensure the promotion of the licensing objectives, in

particular the public nuisance objective. Notwithstanding any proposed control measures, the Licensing Authority may restrict the hours and/or activity even further.

LP11 Cumulative Impact – General

The Council will give due regard to any relevant representations received where concerns are raised and supported around the negative cumulative impact the proposed application has on one or more of the licensing objectives.

The above representations are supported by the following evidence and information.

The Licensing Act 2003, Statement of Licensing Policy 2018 and Guidance issued by the Home Office.

Are there any actions or measures that could be taken to allay concerns or objections? If so, please explain.

The applicant should consider if they are prepared to reduce the hours sought in the application to bring them into alignment with the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy, in particular LP3 Core Hours and LP6 External Areas and Outdoor Events.

The applicant should consider if they are prepared to restrict Off Sales of alcohol to sealed containers only. Also, does the provision of Off Sales require the same extended hours sought for On Sales?

The applicant should consider the draft of a dispersal management plan to mitigate the risk of disturbance from patrons to nearby residents.

The Licensing Authority is happy to speak with the applicant, further discussion may be required.

Annex 1 - Mandatory Conditions Supply Of Alcohol (On/Both)

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:
 - (a) At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence.
 - (b) At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 3. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises -
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
 - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- 4. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 5. 5.1. The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sales or supply of alcohol.
 - 5.2 The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licences must

ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

- 5.3. The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years if age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either:-
- A. a holographic mark or
- B. an ultraviolet feature.
- 6. The responsible person shall ensure that:
- a. where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures:
- beer or cider: 1/2 pint;
- gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25ml or 35ml; and
- still wine in a glass: 125ml; and
- b. these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
- c. where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

Minimum Drinks Pricing

- 7. 7.1 A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 7.2 For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 7.1 above -
- (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
- (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula P = D+(DxV) Where -
- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -
- (i) the holder of the premises licence,
- (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
- (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of

alcohol under such a licence;

- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 7.3 Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 7.2(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub- paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 7.4 (1) Sub-paragraph 7.4(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 7.2(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Door Supervision

8. Each individual who is to carry out a security activity at the premises must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority


- 9. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of a Metropolitan Police Crime Prevention Officer. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored f or a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the preceding 31 day period.
- 10. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises are open to the public. This staff member shall be able to show Police recent data or footage with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.
- 11. There shall be no promotional sales of alcohol at the premises where alcohol is sold at a price lower than that at which the same or similar alcoholic drinks are sold, or usually sold, on the premises.
- 12. The premises will operate a Challenge 25 scheme at the premises. The only acceptable form of identification will be recognised photographic identification cards, such as driving licences and passports.
- 13. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to an authorised officer of the City Council or the Police, which will record the following:
- (a) all crimes reported to the venue
- (b) all ejections of patrons
- (c) any complaints received
- (d) any incidents of disorder
- (e) seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
- (f) any faults in the CCTV system or searching equipment or scanning equipment
- (g) any refusal of the sale of alcohol
- (h) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.
- 14. Premises to operate a zero tolerance policy to drugs and comply with the Hackney Police/Council Community Safety Unit Drugs and Weapons policy where appropriate.
- 15. The premises will display prominent signage by every entrance and exit explaining/requesting: Customers to leave the premises quietly and respect local residents. CCTV in operation Drugs policy Weapons policy
- 16. Police and LBH contracted drugs dogs or drug detection equipment will be given immediate access to the premises without notice for the purpose of detecting and reducing incidences of drug misuse.
- 17. An adequate and appropriate supply of first aid equipment and materials shall be available on the premises.


- 18. The premises licence holder shall ensure that all staff will undertake training in their responsibilities including upholding the four (4) objectives set out in the Licensing Act. Records will be kept of training and refresher training which will take place annually.
- 19. The Licence Holder shall provide and maintain a dedicated telephone number of the Designated Premises Supervisor for use by any Responsible Authority or any person who may wish to make a complaint during the operation of the licence. This shall be provided to the Licensing Authority, Police and local Residents Associations. The Licence Holder shall ensure that any changes to these details are sent to these parties within seven days.
- 20. No more than 5 persons shall be permitted to smoke outside the premises at any one time.
- 21. A minimum of 1 registered SIA door supervisor shall be employed at the premises at any time when licensable activities are taking place after midnight.
- 22. Notices shall be prominently displayed at all exits requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and leave the area quietly.
- 23. All speakers must be isolated from the structure of the building by using anti vibration foam, mat or anti vibration mounts.
- 24. Recorded music shall be played at background level only to allow face to face conversation.
- 25. There shall be no glass, drinks, or open containers taken outside the front of the premises at any time, except for those seated in the designated seating area.
- 26. There shall be substantial food available at all times that alcohol is for sale.
- 27. The Licensee shall ensure that all staff are fully trained and made aware of the legal requirement of businesses to comply with their duty of care as regards the disposal of waste produced from the business premises. The procedure for handling and preparing for disposal of the waste shall be in writing and displayed in a prominent place where it can be referred to at all times by staff.
- 28. The Licensee shall ensure that any contract for general and recyclable waste disposal shall be appropriate in size to the amount of waste produced by the business. The Licensee shall maintain an adequate supply of waste receptacles provided by his registered waste carrier (refuse sacks or commercial waste bins) in order to ensure all refuse emanating from the business is always presented for collection by his waste carrier and shall not use any plain black or unidentifiable refuse sacks or any other unidentifiable or unmarked waste receptacles
