1. **Summary**

1.1. The Metropolitan Police and Environmental Protection have given the Licensing Authority and the premises user notice of objections to Temporary Event Notices for an event to be held on 29/10/2023 from 00:01am finishing on 29/10/2023 at 03:00am at above premises. The Licensing Authority must hold a hearing to decide whether or not to allow the event to proceed.

2. Current Status/History

2.1. The premises is licensed under the Licensing Act 2003 and the licence document is attached as Appendix C.

3. <u>TEMPORARY EVENT NOTICE FOR EVENT TO BE HELD 29/10/2023 - 29/10/2023</u>

3.1. A TEN has been submitted to allow licensable activities to take place on the premises. A copy of the Temporary Event Notice is attached as Appendix A.

4. Objections

4.1. The Metropolitan Police and Environmental Protection have objected to the TEN on the grounds of the prevention of crime and disorder, public safety and the prevention of public nuisance. A copy of the objections is attached as Appendices B1 and B2.

5. **Guidance Considerations**

5.1. That the Licensing Sub-Committee consider the issuing of counter notices if it is satisfied that any of the licensing objectives would be undermined if the premises were to be used in accordance with the temporary event notice.

6. **Policy Considerations**

- 6.1 When considering an objection to a TEN the Council will:
 - Expect that any existing conditions will be maintained (where relevant) in circumstances where an event is to take place at a premises that has an existing authorisation.
 - Assess any history of complaints as a result of licensable activity that may or may not have been authorised by a TEN.
 - Consider the track record of the premises user
- 6.2 Consider any other control measures proposed to mitigate the objection

7. Human Rights Act 1998 Implications

- 7.1. There are implications for;
 - Article 6 Right to a fair hearing
 - Article 14 Not to discriminate
 - Balancing; Article 1- Peaceful enjoyment of their possession (i.e. a licence is defined as being a possession) with Article 8 Right of Privacy (i.e. respect private & family life) to achieve a proportionate decision having regard to the protection of an individuals rights against the interests of the community at large.

8.2. **Option 2**

That the Licensing Authority decides to give a counter notice, giving the reasons for the decision.

9. Conclusion

Representations (which include comments and/or objections) in relation to:

Police object to the granting of this TEN for the 29th October 2023 on the grounds of crime and disorder, public safety, the prevention of public nuisance and the protection of children from harm for the following reason(s):

Police need to be satisfied that the licensing objectives will not be undermined. This venue has a recent history of causing issues around dispersal, nitrous oxide use outside and large scale public disorder. Most recently this was caused by promoters over selling tickets leading to the doors being rushed. Police note that the original TEN submitted was invalidated as the number of people present was listed as 1,000. The venue is large and does hold in excess of a 1,000 people. We can not be satisfied that ticket numbers in excess of 499 will not be sold. In any event, how would the venue remove large numbers of ticket paying customers at 0001 hours in order to comply with the legislation?

Additionally we understand that numerous noise complaints have been received by the Local Authority as a result of the roof structure being inadequate for this type of venue which has led to noise escaping upwards to the block of flats next door. Extending licensable activity until 0300 hours affords these residents no respite.

The Prevention of Public Nuisance:

This premises has a history of complaints from nearby residents alleging disturbances from music and patrons. On 4th August 2023 a likely occurrence s80 Abatement Notice (Environmental Protection Act 1990) was served on LaLaLand London Ltd. Officers witnessed a breach of the notice on Sunday 24th September 2023 at 22:15 hours. Environmental Protection (EP) have concerns with the addition of regulated entertainment this event could amount to a further statutory noise nuisance hence undermining the licensing objective (Public Nuisance).

Annex 1 - Mandatory Conditions

Supply of Alcohol

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:
 - (a) At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence.
 - (b) At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 3. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises -
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
- 4. dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- 5. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on

request to customers where it is reasonably available.

- 6. 5.1. The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sales or supply of alcohol.
 - 5.2 The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licences must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
 - 5.3. The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years if age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either:-
 - A. a holographic mark or
 - B. an ultraviolet feature.
- 7. The responsible person shall ensure that:
 - a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures:
 - beer or cider: 1/2 pint;
 - gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25ml or 35ml; and
 - still wine in a glass: 125ml; and
 - a. these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
 - b. where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

Minimum Drinks Pricing

- 7.1 A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 7.2 For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 7.1 above -
- (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
- (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula P = D+(DxV) Where -
- (i)P is the permitted price.
- (ii)D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (c) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol:
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -
- (i) the holder of the premises licence,
- (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
- (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence:

- (e) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (f) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 7.3 Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8.2(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 7.4 (1) Sub-paragraph 7.4(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 7.2(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Door Supervision

8. Each individual who is to carry out a security activity at the premises must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

- 9. An advertised "hotline" telephone number to the (Duty Manager) shall be available to local residents during events. A log shall be kept of all telephone complaints and any complaints made shall be investigated as soon as possible and recorded together with action taken.
- 10. The premises shall Install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of a Metropolitan Police Crime Prevention Officer. All public areas will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all Times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored f or a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the preceding 31 day period.
- 11. There shall be a staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system on the premises at all times when the premises are open to the public. This staff member must be able to show a Police or authorised council officer recent data or footage when requested.
- 12. Signs will be prominently displayed at all exit points reminding customers to leave quietly and respect local residents.
- 13. A Challenge 25 proof of age scheme shall be operated at the premises where the only acceptable forms of identification are recognised photographic identification cards, such as a driving licence or passport.
- 14. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to an authorised officer of the council or the police, which will record the following:
 - (a) All crimes reported:
 - (b) All ejections of patrons;
 - (c) Any incidents of disorder;
 - (d) Seizure of drugs or offensive weapons;
 - (e) Any faults in the CCTV system or searching equipment or scanning equipment;
 - (f) Any refusal of the sale of alcohol;
 - (g) Any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.
- 15. Premises to operate zero tolerance policy to drugs and comply with Hackney Police Drugs, Weapons and Search policy.
- 16. An adequate and appropriate supply of first aid equipment and materials shall be available on the premises.
- 17. All staff will be given refresher training every six months on the legislation relating to the sales of alcohol to underage persons and drunken persons.
- 18. The licence holder shall maintain a dedicated telephone number of the Designated Premises Supervisor for use by a Responsible Authority or any person who may wish to make a complaint. This contact number shall be provided to licensing authority, police and to any local residents upon request.

- 19. There shall be a minimum of 2 SIA registered supervisors onsite between 7.00pm and 00:30am at all times, and a minimum of 6 onFriday and Saturdays, whenever there is licensable activity taking place. Additional SIA registered supervisors shall be employed on the basis of an operational risk assessment. All security staff and stewards shall be clearly identifiable at all times. All supervisors shall enter their full details in the premises daily register at the commencement of their work. They shall record their full name, home address and contact telephone number, their SIA registration number, and the time they commence and conclude working. If the supervisor was provided by an agency the name, registered business address and contact telephone number will also be recorded. This register will be made available to Police or authorised officers immediately upon request.
- 20. Patrons will not be allowed to take drinks, glass or open containers outside of the premises.at any time.
- 21. A written dispersal policy shall be agreed with the police and licensing authority prior to the carrying out of any licensable activities at the premises. The approved written dispersal policy shall be implemented at all times that licensable activities are provided at the premises. A copy of the policy shall be kept on the premises and produced to the police or an authorised officer upon request.
- 22. Stewards or SIA registered supervisors will be responsible for ensuring that any queue for the venue is orderly and noise is kept to a minimum.
- 23. A qualified Acoustic Consultant, who is a member of the Institute of Acoustics (IoA) or other similar professional body, should be appointed by the applicant to carry out a full acoustic survey of the site, before regulated entertainment Is to take place, to determine the maximum music levels and noise levels from patrons. These levels should be such as not to cause a noise nuisance in the nearest noise sensitive premises during the provision of regulated entertainment and be inaudible in such premises at all times. The acoustic survey should be followed by a comprehensive acoustic report outlining survey's methodology, established music levels, all nearest noise sensitive premises and all recommended noise mitigation measures to be implemented when regulated entertainment is taking place. The acoustic report should be submitted to the Local Authority for approval. All the recommendations within the report must be implemented prior to the regulated entertainment taking place.
- 24. There shall be a minimum of 1 SIA registered supervisor at the entrance of Fairchild Place from 9.00pm until close on Fridays and Saturdays when licensable activities are taking place at the premises to encourage members of the public not to access the street except for access to properties along the same. The requirement for SIA registered supervisors to be on duty at the entrance of Fairchild Place shall be risk assessed on all other days of the week when licensable activities are taking place at the premises.
- 25. When licensable activities are taking place at the premises, the public pavement shall not be used as a designated smoking area or for smoking by the patrons of Dinerama, 19 Great Eastern Street.
- 26. When licensable activities are taking place at the premises, no drinks are allowed outside on the public pavement.

27. The Licensee shall provide a safe receptacle for cigarette ends to be placed outside for the use of customers, such receptacles being carefully placed so as not to cause an obstruction or trip.

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
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
