Police make the following representations in relation to the application to vary the Premises Licence at So Local, 175 Mare Street, E8 for the following reason(s);

Police have concerns about the variation of the premises licence at this location. The venue currently has a licence until 2300hrs, which in the location seems wholly suitable. Although it is situated on a busy High Street there is a still a large amount of residential properties around the premises, who may be adversely affected by a later opening venue. A late opening off licence has the potential to keep people hanging around the area, disturbing local residents and causing ASB. The councils own policy states that

Opening later into the night brings with it other issues, police would like to know how the premises will deal with customers that are highly intoxicated and the ASB and associated nuisance that comes with it.

There are no additional conditions offered and police are concerned that limited consideration has been given to the impact of opening until these hours.

I wish to object to the license variation taken by Mr Ozkan Maldar for So Local off license at 175 Mare Street.


I believe that having an off license open until that late, directly inbetween a bar and a chicken shop and in an area that is already known for its issues with crime and homelessness will bring unnecessary disruption and possibly more crime to the area.

Helgi's bar closes at 1am during the week, as does the chicken shop Carolina Pizza. Helgi's has security, they disperse their customers in a quick, efficient and timely manner. To have an off license still open when that bar is kicking out will keep people in the area that would have otherwise moved on, and bring noise and disruption at a time when everyone on this road is trying to sleep. This will also add to further issues with noise in the road caused by Hanoi Pho restaurant and their late night illegal parties that go on until morning daylight hours and that all residents in this road experience, and which I am sure the council has already been made aware of.

Bear in mind that there are also two hostels close by, and many of the businesses and residents in this road have had problems from the people staying in or hanging around outside these two hostels. A shop open that late will be a magnet for those wishing to cause trouble and commit crime and will create another place for people to hang around, make noise and litter late into the night. I cannot see the off license employing security to help with these issues.

This would not be good for the area if this variation is granted



As not only a resident but a bar manager I am deeply concerned about the noise levels and the safety not only for me but also my bar staff who are very young girls leaving their shift late at night. I write in regards to the application below to vary the license to extend the shop opening hours. I am objecting to this application being granted because it would further encourage street drinking, littering and anti-social behaviour for residents and other businesses during very unsociable hours and would have a negative impact on the local area. I am a shop owner and landlord of residential properties immediately by this business. This shop operates until 11am which is typical for similar shops around the area, opening until 3 am would not benefit the local neighbourhood and there are existing businesses who already fulfil this demand. Customers of this premise loiter at the front and the back of the premises and can cause a lot of noise and litter and anti-social behaviour (vomiting and urinating on properties and yelling and being loud and abusive to others) along Lamb Lane/Mare Street and beyond. This is because they do not have somewhere to go after partying/socialising and loiter nearby drinking and eating on the streets. I do not want to hear complaints from my customers or tenants about this or plastic bags and litter left by customers from this business on top of what already exists. Annex 1 - Mandatory Conditions

Supply of Alcohol

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:
 - (a) At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence.
 - (b) At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 3. 3.1.The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sales or supply of alcohol.
 - 3.2 The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licences must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
 - 3.3. The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either:-
 - (a) a holographic mark or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.

Minimum Drinks Pricing

- 4.1 A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
 - 4.2 For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 4.1 above -
 - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
 - (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula P = D+(DxV)

Where -

- (i)P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the rate of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and (iii)V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -
- (i) the holder of the premises licence,
- (ii)the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
- (iii)the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of

which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

- 4.3 Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 4.2(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 4.4 (1) Sub-paragraph 4.4(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 4.2(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

 (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

- 5. The premises shall be install and maintain a CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of a police crime prevention officer.
- 6. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition.
- 7. The CCTV system shall be continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of police or authorised officer throughout the preceding 31 day period.
- 8. The CCTV shall be in operation at all the premises are open to the public. a member of staff capable of downloading images for the police or authorised council officers shall be on duty at all times the premises are open to the public.
- 9. All staff will be trained for their role on induction and at regular intervals of six months thereafter. Training will include identifying persons under 25, making a challenge, acceptable proof of age, making and recording a refusal, avoiding conflict and responsible alcohol retailing. Written training records will be kept. The premises will actively engage with and work with the police safer neighbourhood team. The premises will keep strong management controls and train all staff so they are aware of the licence and its requirement.
- 10. The passport check will be in place for all employees before they start on their first working day to employ persons with the right of work in the UK.
- 11. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to an authorised officer of the city council or the police, which will record the following:
 - (a) all crimes reported to the venue
 - (b) all ejections of patrons
 - (c) any complaints received regards crime and disorder
 - (d) any incidents of disorder
 - (e) seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
 - (f) any refusal of the sale of alcohol.
- 12. All occasions when persons have been refused service will be recorded in a refusals book, which shall be kept at the premises for not less than 12 months.
- 13. Suitable signage will be displayed at the point of exit advising customers leave the premises quietly.
- 14. Deliveries to the premises shall only be made during normal working hours.
- 15. Any alcohol must be sold by DPS or a person authorised be the DPS at all times. All staff who sells alcohol will be trained in the role by the DPS with regular refresher training. Records of training will be kept and made available for examining officers of the relevant authorities. Where a person appears to be

under the age 25, identification in the form of passport, photo driving licence or a proof of age card bearing the pass hologram will be sought and if not provided service of alcohol will be refused. Suitable signage will be displayed at the point of entry and at the service area advising customers that the premises operates the "challenge 25" proof of age scheme.

Conditions derived from Responsible authority representations


- 16. No beer, lagers or ciders exceeding 5.5% alcohol by volume (ABV) shall be sold or supplied at the premises.
- 17. No "miniature" bottles of spirits of 50ml or less shall be sold or supplied at the premises.
- 18. Any alcohol sold must be in a securely sealed container.
- 19. The Licensee shall ensure that all staff are fully trained and made aware of the legal requirement of businesses to comply with their responsibility as regards the disposal of waste produced from the business premises. The procedure for handling and preparing for disposal of the waste shall be in writing and displayed in a prominent place where it can be referred to at all times by staff.
- 20. The Licensee shall ensure that any contract for general and recyclable waste disposal shall be appropriate in size to the amount of waste produced by the business. The Licensee shall maintain an adequate supply of waste receptacles provided by his registered waste carrier (refuse sacks or commercial waste bins) in order to ensure all refuse emanating from the business is always presented for collection by his waste carrier and shall not use any plain black or unidentifiable refuse sacks or any other unidentifiable or unmarked waste receptacles.
- 21. The Licensee's premises are situated in an area within which refuse may only be left on the public highway at certain times (time bands). If the Licensee's waste carrier cannot or does not comply by collecting the refuse within an hour after the close of any time band imposed by the waste authority, the Licensee must remove the refuse from the public highway and/or keep it within the premises until such time as his/her waste carrier arrives to collect the refuse.
- 22. The Licensee shall provide a safe receptacle for cigarette ends to be placed outside for the use of customers, such receptacle being carefully placed so as not to cause an obstruction or trip.
- 23. The current trade waste agreement/duty of care waste transfer document shall be conspicuously displayed and maintained in the window of the premises where it can be conveniently seen and read by persons standing in So Local. This should remain unobstructed at all times and should clearly identify:-
 - the name of the registered waste carrier
 - the date of commencement of trade waste contract
 - the date of expiry of trade waste contract
 - the days and times of collection
 - the type of waste including the European Waste Code.

Annex 3 – Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority

- 24. The area for licensable activity is limited to the Ground Floor of the premises only.
- 25. Alcohol off-sales shall cease at 23:00 hours every day.
