We have responsible staff and they prevent overconsumption and related disturbances according to our alcohol service procedures. They have been well trained to focus on conflict resolution, customer management.
b) The prevention of crime and disorder
We have already security measures like CCTV cameras, well trained staff and alarm system,
c) Public safety
We consider participating in or supporting local neighborhood programs to overall safety in the area. We also developed a clear and well-communicated emergency procedures. We trained our staff on how to respond to various emergencies including fires, medical incidents and disruptive behavior and display emergency contact information.
d) The prevention of public nuisance
To prevent disturbances to nearby residents during extended hours, we invested in soundproofing materials for walls. We have a noise level policy which is really important for our establishment.

  - Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling with one or more martial arts are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an indoor sporting event.

Police make the following representations in relation to the application to vary the Premises Licence at for the following reason(s);

The application is to vary the current premise licence by extending the sale of alcohol on Sunday – Thursday until 0100hrs and on Friday and Saturday until 0200hrs, with the opening hours being extended to the same.

Police object to this variation. On Saturday 28<sup>th</sup> October Police Licensing officers witnessed the venue open and still serving at 0050hrs where the licensable hours currently finish at 2300hrs, meaning nearly 2 hours of unauthorised licensable activity.

Conditions 11 and 12 on the current licence give the provision of making the venue a restaurant and ensuring that all sales of alcohol are to those taking substantial table meals and by waiter and waitress service. However this application only seeks to extend the hours for the sale of alcohol and does not request the addition of Late Night Refreshment, therefore making any hot food or drink served after 2300hrs unauthorised. Additionally police feel there would also be a breach with people drinking alcohol up to 3 hours after being able to purchase the substantial table meal that it should be ancillary to. Condition 11 specifically details that the venue shall operate as a restaurant, however without the ability to serve hot food after 2300hrs it would clearly be in breach of this condition after this time.

Police therefore ask that the variation is refused.

I write to make a representation in response to this application.

The proposed additional hours into the morning (until 01:00 Sundays and weekdays and until 02:00 at weekends) could have a negative impact on the promotion of the licensing objectives, in particular, the prevention of public nuisance. Residential premises appear to be in close proximity, directly above and opposite the site. However, it is noted that the premises licence issued to the nearby Brownswood Park Tavern has similar hours to what is being sought in this application.

The applicant's attention is drawn to the following extract from the Council's Licensing Policy:

#### LP3 Core Hours

Hours for licensable activity will generally be authorised, subject to demonstrating LP1 and LP2, as follows:

- Monday to Thursday 08:00 to 23:00
- Friday and Saturday 08:00 to 00:00
- Sunday 10:00 to 22:30

Hours may be more restrictive dependent on the character of the area and if the individual circumstances require it.

Later hours may be considered where the applicant has identified any risk that may undermine the promotion of the licensing objectives and has put in place robust measures to mitigate those risks.

It should be noted that this policy does not apply to those who are making an application within a special policy area (see section 3) unless they have been able to demonstrate that the proposed activity or operation of the premises will not add to the cumulative impact that is already being experienced.

It should also be noted that where a premises is not in possession of planning permission for the proposed activity and/or hours may be further restricted during weekdays and not permitted at all at weekends.

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:
  - (a) At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence.
  - (b) At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 3. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
  - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises -
  - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;
  - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
  - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
  - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
  - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
  - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
- 4. dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- 5. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on

request to customers where it is reasonably available.

- 6. 5.1. The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sales or supply of alcohol.
  - 5.2 The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licences must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
  - 5.3. The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years if age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either:-
    - A. a holographic mark or
    - B. an ultraviolet feature.
- 7. The responsible person shall ensure that:
  - a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures:
  - beer or cider: 1/2 pint;
  - gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25ml or 35ml; and
  - still wine in a glass: 125ml; and
    - a. these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
    - b. where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

### **Minimum Drinks Pricing**

- 7.1 A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 7.2 For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 7.1 above -
- (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
- (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula P = D+(DxV) Where -
- (i)P is the permitted price.
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (c) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol:
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -
- (i) the holder of the premises licence,
- (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
- (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;

- (e) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (f) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 7.3 Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8.2(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 7.4 (1) Sub-paragraph 7.4(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 7.2(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

### Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

- 8. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of a Metropolitan Police Crime Prevention Officer. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the preceding 31 day period. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises is open to the public. This staff member must be able to show a Police or authorised council officer recent data or footage when requested.
- 9. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to an authorised officer of Hackney Council or the Police, which will record the following:
  -all crimes reported to the venue -all ejections of patrons -any complaints received -any incidents of disorder -all seizures of drugs or offensive weapons -any faults in the CCTV system -any refusal of the sale of alcohol -any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.
- 10. There shall be a personal licence holder on duty on the premises at all times when the premises are authorised to sell alcohol.
- 11. The premises shall only operate as a restaurant in which customers are shown to their table, they are served food in the form of substantial table meals that is prepared on the premises and consumed at the table using non disposable crockery.
- 12. Alcohol shall not be sold, supplied, or consumed on the premises otherwise than to persons who are taking substantial table meals and that the consumption of alcohol by such persons is ancillary to taking such meals. The supply of alcohol shall be by waiter or waitress service only.
- 13. A proof of age scheme, such as Challenge 25, shall be operated at the premises where the only acceptable forms o f identification are recognised photographic identification cards, such as a driving licence or passport.
- 14. Police and/or LBH contracted drugs dogs or drug detection equipment will be given immediate access to the premises without notice for the purpose of detecting and reducing incidences of drug misuse.
- 15. Notices shall be prominently displayed at all exits requesting patrons to respect the needs of local residents and businesses and leave the area quietly.
- 16. A smoking management plan shall be submitted to the pollution team detailing how the premise management plan to manage patrons in a way that ensures they do not cause nuisance to nearby neighbouring properties.
- 17. Discharge and collection of waste from the premises shall not take place between the hours of 11pm and 7am.
