# 1. **Summary**

1.1. The Environmental Protection have given the Licensing Authority and the premises user notice of objection to Temporary Event Notices for an event to be held on 01/01/2024 from 01:00am finishing on 01/01/2024 at 04:00am at above premises. The Licensing Authority must hold a hearing to decide whether or not to allow the event to proceed.

# 2. **Current Status/History**

2.1. The premises is licensed under the Licensing Act 2003 and the licence document is attached as Appendix C.

# 3. <u>TEMPORARY EVENT NOTICE FOR EVENT TO BE HELD 01/01/2024 - 01/01/2024</u>

3.1. A TEN has been submitted to allow licensable activities to take place on the premises. A copy of the Temporary Event Notice is attached as Appendix A.

# 4. **Objections**

4.1. The Environmental Protection have objected to the TEN on the grounds of the prevention of public nuisance. A copy of the objection is attached as Appendix B.

# 5. **Guidance Considerations**

5.1. That the Licensing Sub-Committee consider the issuing of counter notices if it is satisfied that any of the licensing objectives would be undermined if the premises were to be used in accordance with the temporary event notice.

# 6. **Policy Considerations**

- 6.1 When considering an objection to a TEN the Council will:
  - Expect that any existing conditions will be maintained (where relevant) in circumstances where an event is to take place at a premises that has an existing authorisation.
  - Assess any history of complaints as a result of licensable activity that may or may not have been authorised by a TEN.
  - Consider the track record of the premises user
- 6.2 Consider any other control measures proposed to mitigate the objection

# 7. Human Rights Act 1998 Implications

- 7.1. There are implications for;
  - **Article 6** Right to a fair hearing
  - Article 14 Not to discriminate
  - Balancing; Article 1- Peaceful enjoyment of their possession (i.e. a licence is defined as being a possession) with Article 8 Right of Privacy (i.e. respect private & family life) to achieve a proportionate decision having regard to the protection of an individuals rights against the interests of the community at large.

# 8. Members; Decision Making

8.1. **Option 1**

8.2. **Option 2** 

That the Licensing Authority decides to give a counter notice, giving the reasons for the decision.

### **Grounds of Objection**

# The revention of Public Nuisance:

This premises has a history of complaints fr m nearby residents alleging disturbances from music. The most recent complaint was received on 08/12/23 at 23:29. On 14/4/23 at 22:05 Environmental Protection Officers witnessed a statutory noise nuisance and subseque tly an abatement notice (S.80 Environmental Protection Act 1990) was served on the directors of the company. Officers have also witnessed two further breaches of the abatement notice on 16/6/23 at 22:15 and 02/12/23 at 00:10. Environmental Protection (EP) have concerns with the addition of regulated entertainment this event could amount to a further statutory noise nuisance hence undermining the licensing objective (Public Nuisance).

# **Annex 1 - Mandatory Conditions**

# **Supply of Alcohol**

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:
  - (a) At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence.
  - (b)At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 3. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
  - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises -
  - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to:
  - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
  - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
  - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
  - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
  - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
  - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- 4. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 5.1. The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sales or supply of alcohol.



- 5.2. The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years if age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.
- 6. The responsible person shall ensure that:
  - a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures:
  - beer or cider: 1/2 pint;
  - gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25ml or 35ml; and
  - still wine in a glass: 125ml; and
  - b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

A responsible person in relation to a licensed premises means the holder of the premise licence in respect of the premises, the designated premises supervisor (if any) or any individual aged 18 or over who is authorised by either the licence holder or designated premises supervisor. For premises with a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity that which enables him to prevent the supply of alcohol.

- 7.1 A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
  - 7.2 For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 7.1 above -
  - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
  - (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula -
  - P = D+(DxV)

Where -

- (i)P is the permitted price,
- (ii)D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii)V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -
- (i) the holder of the premises licence,
- (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
- (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

- 7.3 Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8.2(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 7.4 (1) Sub-paragraph 7.4(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 7.2(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

### **Exhibition Of Films**

- 8. Admission of children (under 18) to the exhibition of any film must be restricted in accordance with: -
  - (a) Recommendations made by the film classification body where the film classification body is specified in the licence, or
  - (b) Recommendations made by the licensing authority where the film classification body is not specified in the licence, or the relevant licensing authority has not notified the holder of the licence that this subsection applies to the film in question.

"film classification body" means person('s) designated under s4 of the Video Recordings Act 1984(c.39).

# **Door Supervision**

9. Each individual who is to carry out a security activity at the premises must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.



# Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

- 10. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV.
- 11. Non-intoxicating beverages, including drinking water, shall be available throughout the permitted hours in all parts of the premises where alcohol is served.
- 12. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available immediately to an authorised officer of the Council or the Police, which will record the following:
  - a. all crimes reported to the venue
  - b. all ejections of patrons
  - c. any complaints received
  - d. any incidents of disorder
  - e. seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
  - f. any refusal of the sale of alcohol
- 13. The premises will display and maintain appropriate signage advising customers of the contact details of the Designated Premises Supervisor.
- 14. All windows and doors shall remain closed at all times when regulated entertainment is being played except for access and egress.
- 15. Signs to be placed at all exits requesting customers to leave the area quietly.
- 16. The pavement from the building line to the kerb edge immediately outside the premises, including gutter/channel at its junction with the kerb edge, shall be swept and or washed, and litter and sweepings collected and stored in accordance with the approved refuse storage arrangements.
- 17. Key members of staff shall be trained to make customers aware of the laws regarding sales or purchase of alcohol on behalf of children.

# **Conditions derived from Responsible Authority representations**

- 18. The licensee shall ensure that noise or vibration shall not emanate from the premises from any equipment, machinery or live performance such as to cause persons in the neighbourhood to b e disturbed
- 19. The volume of all amplified sound used in connection with all entertainment provided shall at all times be under the control of the licensee or management and the controlling mechanism so installed shall be maintained and operated from a part of the premises inaccessible to the public.
- 20. The Licensee shall ensure that all staff are fully trained and made aware of the legal requirement of businesses to comply with their duty of care as regards the disposal of waste produced from the business premises. The procedure for handling and preparing for disposal of the waste shall be in

writing and displayed in a prominent place where it can be referred to at all times by staff.

- 21. The Licensee shall ensure that any contract for general and recyclable waste disposal shall be appropriate in size to the amount of waste produced by the business. The Licensee shall maintain an adequate supply of waste receptacles provided by its registered waste carrier (refuse sacks or commercial waste bins) in order to ensure all refuse emanating from the business is always presented for collection by its waste carrier and shall not use any plain black or unidentifiable refuse sacks or any other unidentifiable or unmarked waste receptacles.
- 22. The Licensee's premises are situated in an area within which refuse may only be left on the public highway at certain times (time bands). If the Licensee's waste carrier cannot or does not comply by collecting the refuse within an hour after the close of any time band imposed by the waste authority, the Licensee must remove the refuse from the public highway and/or keep it within the premises until such time as his/her waste carrier arrives to collect the refuse.
- 23. When the venue is opening beyond 00:30 Security (SIA licensed door supervisors) will be employed at a ratio of one (1) SIA per one hundred (100) customers or part thereof from 2000 hours until half an hours after closing of the premises. On other occasions security is to be considered on a continual basis. All details (full name, DOB, Address, SIA badge number, company and Booking on off times) to be recorded and to be made available to police immediately.
- 24. The premises shall maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of a Metropolitan Police Crime Prevention Officer. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of the Police or authorised officer. A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises are open to the public. This staff member shall be able to show Police recent data or footage with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.
- 25. All instances of crime or disorder to be reported by the designated premises supervisor or responsible member of staff to an agreed police contact point, as agreed with the Police. The premises will also, in cooperation with Hackney Police and no later than 3 months following granting of the premises licence, regularly facilitate a premises drug audit using the iron itemiser or similar device.



- 26. The provision of licensable activity shall at all times be ancillary to the business of a Theatre or Artistic Performance or Exhibition.
- 27. After 23:00 the sale and supply of alcohol shall only be to persons attending the premises that have purchased a ticket for theatrical and or artistic production or performances or comedy nights or "theatre club" members and such alcohol shall be ancillary to the premises primary use as a theatre
- 28. Membership to the "theatre club" can only be granted to applicants at least 24 hours prior to seeking admission.
- 29. The theatre club's activities are to be complementary to and ancillary to the operation of the premises as a theatre.
- 30. The theatre is to maintain an up to date membership list of members of the theatre club. The membership list is to be made available to a Police or authorised officer on demand.
- 31. A proof of age scheme, such as Challenge 25, shall be operated at the premises.
- 32. The only acceptable forms of identification are recognised forms of photographic identification cards, such as a driving licence or passport.
- 33. Substantial food and suitable beverages other than intoxicating liquor (including drinking water) shall be available during the whole of the premises where intoxicating liquor is sold or supplied.
- 34. On an open stage and elsewhere in the premises any permanently installed scenery should normally be made from the following:
  - Non-combustible material; or
  - Inherently flame-retarded fabric; or
  - Durably-treated flame retarded fabric; or
  - Timber, hardboard or plywood treated by a process of impregnation which meets Class 1 (BS 476-7) or Class-s3.d2 (BS EN 13501-1) surface spread flame: or
  - Timber framing of minimum 22mm nominal thickness; or
  - Medium-density fibreboard (MDF), plywood, chipboard not less than 18mm in thickness; or
  - Plastics material subject to special consideration by appropriate Responsible Authority, being the Fire Authority; or
  - Other materials acceptable to the appropriate Responsible Authority, being the Fire Authority.
- 35. All materials used in finishing and furnishing the premises should, as far as is reasonably practicable, be selected so as to be difficult to ignite and provide a low surface spread of flame and low rates of heat release and smoke emission.



- 36. All fabrics, curtains, drapes and similar features should be either non-combustible or be durable or inherently flame-retarded fabric. Any fabrics used in escape routes, other than foyers, entertainment areas or function rooms, should be non-combustible.
- 37. No person shall give at the premises any exhibition, demonstration or performance of hypnotism, mesmerism or any similar act or process which produces or is intended to produce in any other person any form of induced sleep or trance in which susceptibility of the mind of that person to suggestion or direction is increased or intended to be increased.
  - NOTE: (1) This rule does not apply to exhibitions given under the provisions of Section 2(1A) and 5 of the Hypnotism Act 1952.

    Any entertainment, performance, service, or exhibition involving nudity or sexual stimulation which would come within the definition of a sex establishment in Schedule 3 to the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982 as amended by the Greater London Council (General Powers) Act 1986 and The London Local Authorities Act 2 007 shall not be provided.
- 38. The approved arrangements at the premises, including means of escape provisions, emergency warning equipment, the electrical installation and mechanical equipment, shall at all material times be maintained in good condition and in full working order.
- 39. The means of escape provided for the premises shall be maintained unobstructed, free of trip hazards, be immediately available and clearly identified in accordance with the plans provided.
- 40. All exit doors shall be available at all material times without the use of a key, code, card or similar means.
- 41. All emergency doors shall be maintained effectively self-closing and not held open other than by an approved device.
- 42. The edges of the treads of steps and stairways shall be maintained so as to be conspicuous.
- 43. Curtains and hangings shall be arranged so as not to obstruct emergency signs.
- 44. No regulated entertainment except for background entertainment and films shall be provided on the ground floor except for 24 performances a year that require use of the ground floor for the performance.
- 45. Loudspeakers shall not be located near the entrance area.
- 46. All entrance doors shall be kept closed, when regulated entertainment is taking place and in any event after 2100 hours, except for immediate access and egress of persons.

- 47. The operators of the business and/or the licensees shall exercise all due diligence so as to prevent the formation of queues outside the premises causing a nuisance.
- 48. There shall be no DJ only events.
- 49. The capacity on the basement shall be 150 customers (excluding staff and performers).
- 50. After 21.00 hours no persons are permitted in the rear garden, save for up to 15 smokers at any one time.
