1. **Summary**

- 1.1. This is an application to vary a premises licence to allow authorisation:
 - To extend the terminal hours for all licensable activities on Thursday, Friday and Saturday.
 - Removal of current conditions 24 and 26
 - Amendment of current condition 10

2. Application

- 2.1. Lily Twenty Limited has made an application to vary a premises licence under section 34 of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 2.2. The applicant is seeking authorisation for the following proposed variation:
 - To remove condition 24; The premises shall not be used for the provision of regulated entertainment until officers from the Council's Building Control Service have confirmed in writing that the premises are technically suitable for the intended use (by applying of relevant technical regulations), and condition 26; There shall be no more than 40 customers permitted in to the second floor licensed area at any one time.
 - To amend condition 10; A comprehensive CCTV system shall be maintained in accordance with the reasonable requirements of the Police. All cameras shall continually record whilst the premises are open to the public and the video recordings shall be kept available for a minimum of 31 days with time and date stamping. Tape recordings shall be made

available to an authorised officer of the Council or a Police officer on request. (see paragraph 8.1 below for a revised condition)

6. **Guidance Considerations**

6.1. The Licensing Authority is required to have regard to any guidance issued by the Secretary of State under the Licensing Act 2003.

7. Policy Considerations

- 7.1. Licensing Sub-Committee is required to have regard to the London Borough of Hackney's Statement of Licensing Policy ("the Policy) adopted by the Licensing Authority.
- 7.2. The Policy applies to applications where relevant representations have been made. With regard to this application, policies, LP1 (General Principles), LP2 (Licensing Objectives), LP3 (Core Hours) and LP4 ('Off' Sale of Alcohol) are relevant.

8. Officer Observations

8.1. If the Sub-Committee is minded to approve the application, the following additional/amended conditions should be applied the licence:

Replace current condition 10:

The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of a Metropolitan Police Crime Prevention Officer. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Recordings shall be made available to with 24 hours upon the request of Police or authorized officer throughout the preceding 31 day period.

A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises are open to the public. This staff member shall be able to show Police recent data or footage with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.

Replace current condition 14(agreed with the Environmental Protection):

A sound limiting device within the premises shall be installed to control all amplified sound generated on the premises. The device shall be approved

by and set to the Council's satisfaction and thereafter maintained for the duration of its use.

Additional suggested conditions:

- 1. The premises will operate a Challenge 25 scheme at the premises. The only acceptable form of identification will be recognised photographic identification cards, such as driving licences and passports.
- 2. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to an authorised officer of the City Council or the Police, which will record the following:
 - (a) all crimes reported to the venue
 - (b) all ejections of patrons
 - (c) any complaints received
 - (d) any incidents of disorder
 - (e) seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
 - (f) any faults in the CCTV system or searching equipment or scanning equipment
 - (g) any refusal of the sale of alcohol
 - (h) any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.
- 3. Premises to operate a zero tolerance policy to drugs and comply with the Hackney Police/Council Community Safety Unit Drugs and Weapons policy where appropriate.
- 4. The premises will display prominent signage by every entrance and exit explaining/requesting:
 - Customers to leave the premises quietly and respect local residents. CCTV in operation Drugs policy Weapons policy.
- 5. An adequate and appropriate supply of first aid equipment and materials shall be available on the premises.
- 6. The premises licence holder shall ensure that all staff will undertake training in their responsibilities including upholding the four (4) objectives set out in the Licensing Act. Records will be kept of training and refresher training which will take place annually.
- 7. The premises shall be managed as specified in the separate Fire Risk Assessment as set out under the Regulatory Reform (Fire Safety) Order 2005.
- 8. All exit routes shall be kept unobstructed, with non-slippery and even surfaces, free of trip hazards and clearly identified.
- 9. All exits doors shall be maintained easily operable without the use of a key, card, code or similar means.

- 10. Exit doors shall be regularly checked to ensure that they function satisfactorily, and a record of the check shall be kept.
- 11. Adequate and appropriate supply of first aid equipment and materials must be available on the premises at all times.
- 12. The Licence Holder shall provide and maintain a dedicated telephone number of the Designated Premises Supervisor for use by any Responsible Authority or any person who may wish to make a complaint during the operation of the licence. This shall be provided to the Licensing Authority, Police and local Residents Associations. The Licence Holder shall ensure that any changes to these details are sent to these parties within seven days.
- 13. The Licensee shall ensure that all staff are fully trained and made aware of the legal requirement of businesses to comply with their duty of care as regards the disposal of waste produced from the business premises. The procedure for handling and preparing for disposal of the waste shall be in writing and displayed in a prominent place where it can be referred to at all times by staff.
- 14. The Licensee shall ensure that any contract for general and recyclable waste disposal shall be appropriate in size to the amount of waste produced by the business. The Licensee shall maintain an adequate supply of waste receptacles provided by his registered waste carrier (refuse sacks or commercial waste bins) in order to ensure all refuse emanating from the business is always presented for collection by his waste carrier and shall not use any plain black or unidentifiable refuse sacks or any other unidentifiable or unmarked waste receptacles.
- 15. Amplified sound (Live music or prerecorded music) on the premises shall be played at such a level so as not to cause nuisance to any unassociated noise sensitive premises.

9. Reasons for Officer Observations

9.1. Conditions (1) to (14) are derived from applicant's operating schedule. The applicant has agreed to the Environmental Protection revised condition and additional condition (15).

10. **Legal Comments**

- 10.1. The Council has a duty as a Licensing Authority under the Licensing Act 2003 to carry out its functions with a view to promoting the following 4 licensing objectives;
 - The Prevention of Crime and Disorder
 - Public Safety
 - Prevention of Public Nuisance
 - The Protection of Children from Harm

10.2. It should be noted that each of the licensing objectives have equal importance and are the only grounds upon which a relevant representation can be made and for which an application can be refused or terms and conditions attached to a licence.

11. Human Rights Act 1998 Implications

- 11.1. There are implications to:
 - **Article 6** Right to a fair hearing
 - *Article 14* Not to discriminate
 - Balancing: **Article 1-** Peaceful enjoyment of their possession (i.e. a licence is defined as being a possession) with **Article 8** Right of Privacy (i.e. respect private & family life) to achieve a proportionate decision having regard to the protection of an individuals rights against the interests of the community at large.

Background information for application.

operating scheudle for the premises.

The Old Blue Last is a world-famous venue and was one of the first venues to open as a grassroots music venue in Shoreditch in the early 2000s.

It was built in 1700 on the site of the first purpose-built theatre in Britain since the Roman era: James Burbage's The Theatre, subsequently dismantled and rebuilt across the river as the Globe.

The Last was named after a cobbler's tool, subsequently renamed The Old Blue Last and enduring through the Victorian era as a working-class pub.

Martin Thomas has been runnig the venue as the DPS and then director since 2004 with a focus on live music, of which we believe we have legendarily good booking record: Arctic Monkeys, Amy Winehouse, Kylie Minoue, Ninah Cherry, Florence + the Machine, The La's and many others have played here.

We are located between the Tube stations of Shoreditch High Street (Overground), Old Street (Northern) and Liverpool Street (Hammersmith & City/Central/Circle/Metropolitan), and on numerous bus and night bus routes.

It has operated on the existing hours since 2006, with the exception of amending the licence to add the second floor.

This is an application is to extend the terminal hours on Thursday, Friday and Saturday for all current licensable activities.

In addition, as part of the application we are purposing to update and improve the current licensing operating schedule.

In summary this is an application to give the premises longer term resilience.

The premises is primarily a grassroots music venue and over the past 20 years 35% of Grassroots Music Venues (GMVs) have closed in the UK.

This is a live issue and it is still ongoing; at the start of 2023 Music Venue Trust reported that the UK was continuing to lose GMVs at an average rate of one a week. We want to do all we can at the premises to avoid being another statistic.

GMVs such as the Old Blue Last provide new and emerging artists and musicians with a space to hone their craft, develop their fanbase and increase access to cultural opportunities for the local community.

The Music Venue Trust recently made the case to Government and industry that they are the 'research and development' arm of the music industry.

However, in the aftermath of the Covid-19 Pandemic, the economic resilience of Grassroots Music Venues has been pushed to the limit.

The report launched at Parliament revealed the startling statistic that the average profit margin of a GMV is 0.2%, and that at its core, the provision purely of live music is a loss-making activity; the national subsidy invested by GMVs in order to provide grassroots music is £79 million.

It is revenue streams such as later hours that we at the Old Blue Last rely on to co fund the music offer and which enable us as a GMV to provide our cultural activities.

So simply we need the greater flexibility of longer hours to be sustainable and to survive in this difficult climate.

Our premises was recently accredited under the Councils Hackney Nights Scheme.

This scheme rewards best practice at licensed premises.

The premises is already open later than the Council's core hours policy so we have demonstrated that we are an exception to this policy already.

We also pay into the late levy scheme which funds additional staff and policing in the latenight economy, although at a 30% discounted rate due to our Hackney Nights Accreditation.

This application would enable our premises to retain existing customers for longer hours and we don't believe it would add to cumulative impact in this location with the operating procedures and polices already in place.

Our premises uses its full allocation of temporary event notices (TEN's) each calendar year.

These TEN's are normally until 04:00 so are in excess of the hours being sought in this application. So we clearly demonstrate that we can run later hours without adding to cumulative impact and also fully promote the four licensing objectives.

The late-night levy teamwork also works shifts until 06:00 on weekends so it makes sense to allow well run established venues such as our venue slightly later hours to allow slower dispersal into the night time economy.

In addition, the nature and musical programming of the Old Blue Last means it attracts a different crowd that don't attract some of the other elements in other area of Hackney Night Time economy that cause concerns.

The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of a Metropolitan Police Crime Prevention Officer. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Recordings shall be made available to with 24 hours upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the preceding 31 day period.

A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times when the premises are open to the public. This staff member shall be able to show Police recent data or footage with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.

I write to make a representation in response to this application. I am concerned that there may be a negative impact on the promotion of the licensing objectives if the additional hours are granted. In particular, the prevention of crime and disorder and the prevention of public nuisance. It should be noted that I have no comments to make on the request to remove conditions 24 and 26 and to revise condition 10.

It is noted that the additional hours are being sought to support grass roots music. However, newly commissioned research on behalf of the Council shows that the Shoreditch area suffers from the negative cumulative impact likely to be as a result of the large number of night-time, licensed venues in the area. The report states that this is at a significantly greater intensity and spatial scale than the rest of the borough's clusters of night-time economy. These impacts include:

- High levels of crime, such as thefts, robberies and violence
- Significant on-street urination
- Large numbers of calls to the London Ambulance Service

Although data suggests that crime and ambulance calls have fallen since 2019, the level remains higher than in other parts of the borough. Additional hours could add to these figures given the prominent location of the premises within the Shoreditch Triangle.

On 21 November 2017, the licence holder made an application to vary the premises licence to add the second floor of the site to the licensable area. This application was later determined under delegated authority. However, a browse of the website connected with the premises suggests that there is a further level, described as "The Flat" on the third floor. It is not clear the extent to which licensable activities may be being carried on in this space but it is noted that a private bar appears to be available in the space.

Furthermore, a visit was made by an Enforcement Officer to the premises at 00:38 on 14/01/2024. During the visit, the duty manager at the time appeared reluctant to show the officer the CCTV and limited this to accessing via mobile phone only. Also, it appeared that recorded music was being played on all floors. This was despite condition 27 which states: 27. There shall be no live or recorded music permitted to take place in the second floor licensed area at any one time.

Music Venue Trust is a UK registered charity established in 2014 that acts to protect, secure and improve the UK's Grassroots Music Venue circuit. Music Venue Trust provides advice to the government, the cultural sector and the music industry on issues impacting the network of venues and is the nominated representative that speaks on behalf of the Music Venues Alliance, an association of over 800 venues from across the UK.

We write to offer comments to the Hackney Licensing sub-committee hearing which is meeting to consider a licensing variation to the operating hours for the grassroots music venue The Old Blue Last.

As an important cultural hub, the Old Blue Last is a member of the Music Venue Alliance. We write in support of their extension to the Premises License application. Music Venue Trust is confident that an extension to Old Blue Last's licence from 1am to 3.00 am on Fridays and Saturdays would strengthen the cultural provision of the area and allow the venue to build a more robust and resilient operation.

Over the past 20 years 35% of Grassroots Music Venues (GMVs) have closed in the UK and this is still ongoing; at the start of 2023 Music Venue Trust reported that the UK was continuing to lose GMVs at an average rate of one a week.

In order for Hackney to maintain its reputation as 'the creative heart of London', with a 'cultural and creative economy central to the success of the borough' (Hackney Council Arts and Cultural Strategy 2019-2022) we urge the council to support successful business operators who are working to drive the market, taking risks on grassroots musicians and developing the talent pipeline.

Hackney's recent cumulative impact specifically references that there are very few venues left from Shoreditch's night time heyday, and that most venues are now mainstream alcohol – focused operations. Music Venue Trust urges you to support the Old Blue Last which is one of the oldest grassroots venues in the Shoreditch area so that it can remain open and viable in line with the Council's own impact review from 2023.

GMVs provide new and emerging artists and musicians with a space to hone their craft, develop their fanbase and increase access to cultural opportunities for the local community. MVT makes the case to the Government and industry that they are the 'research and development' arm of the music industry. However, in the aftermath of the Covid-19 Pandemic, the economic resilience of Grassroots Music Venues has been pushed to the limit. In our Annual Report we announced at Parliament the startling statistic that the average profit margin of a GMV is 0.2%, and that at its core, the provision purely of live music is a loss-making activity; the national



subsidy invested by GMVs in order to provide grassroots music is £79 million. It is other revenue streams, like the often late-night provision of food & beverages, which enable GMVs to provide their cultural activity. Through this cultural heavy-lifting GMVs make an enormous contribution to the national economy. MVT was able to report that the total contribution to the economy was over £500 million, and across the UK over 30,000 are employed by the sector. GMVs create a rich cultural environment for the local community, boost the local economy and increase footfall to the UK's high streets, yearly generating 21.9million individual audience visits.

In our role as sector experts, we can attest to the venue operator team's commitment to operational best practice. Music Venue Trust is confident that the venue operators will continue to work in partnership with the responsible authorities and ensure the venue works professionally and cohesively alongside local businesses and residents.

The operators have extensive experience working in the night-time economy, the Old Blue Last has also been accredited via the Hackney Nights best practice scheme operated as part of the Council Late Night Levy team.

In respect of any cumulative impact policy considerations for this application, Music Venue Trust experiences that venues rarely operate at full capacities or for full hours. What we have found is that not being able to operate whole premises to full hours means operators risk losing valuable income by being limited in the scope of their programming, rather than actually resulting in increasing footfall in the location over the calendar year. As such, this aspect of the licensing policy would also be unaffected.

Music Venue Trust has looked at the proposal offered by the applicant and are satisfied that these would fully promote the licensing objectives if this application was granted as submitted. It is important that Hackney Licensing Committee grant the applicant a premises licence for the full hours specified in the application. Having the flexibility to open for extended hours on evenings and weekends is often the difference that allows GMVs to remain financially resilient.

It is the aim of Music Venue Trust to protect, secure and improve grassroots music venues, therefore we offer positive support of the application and hope that it is granted as submitted.

- 3. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises -
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or

 (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
- 4. dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).

- 5. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 6. 5.1. The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sales or supply of alcohol.
 - 5.2 The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licences must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
 - 5.3. The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years if age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either:-
 - A. a holographic mark or
 - B. an ultraviolet feature.
- 7. The responsible person shall ensure that:
 - a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures:
 - beer or cider:1/2 pint;
 - gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25ml or 35ml; and
 - still wine in a glass: 125ml; and
 - a. these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
 - b. where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

Minimum Drinks Pricing

- 7.1 A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 7.2 For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 7.1 above -
- (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
- (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula P = D+(DxV) Where -
- (i)P is the permitted price,
- (ii)D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (c) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -
- (i) the holder of the premises licence,
- (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
- (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol

under such a licence;

- (e) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (f) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 7.3 Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8.2(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 7.4 (1) Sub-paragraph 7.4(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 7.2(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Exhibition of Films

- 8. Admission of children (under 18) to the exhibition of any film must be restricted in accordance with: -
 - (a) Recommendations made by the film classification body where the film classification body is specified in the licence, or
 - (b) Recommendations made by the licensing authority where the film classification body is not specified in the licence, or the relevant licensing authority has not notified the holder of the licence that this subsection applies to the film in question.

"film classification body" means person('s) designated under s4 of the Video Recordings Act 1984 (c.39).

Door Supervision

9. Each individual who is to carry out a security activity at the premises must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

- 10. A comprehensive CCTV system shall be maintained in accordance with the reasonable requirements of the Police. All cameras shall continually record whilst the premises are open to the public and the video recordings shall be kept available for a minimum of 31 days with time and date stamping. Tape recordings shall be made available to an authorised officer of the Council or a Police officer on request.
- 11. After 20.00 Friday and Saturday and after 22.00 Thursday and Sunday, there shall be one SIA registered door supervisor per 100 patrons or part thereof.
- 12. The outside areas shall not be used for licensable activities after 22.00.
- 13. Only plastic glasses shall be permitted in the outside drinking area.
- 14. The noise limiter shall not be altered without the prior consent of an officer from the Council's Pollution Team.
- 15. No additional sound generation equipment shall be used on the premises without being routed through the noise limiter.
- 16. Patrons exiting the premises will be directed to leave the area quietly and suitable notices to that effect will be displayed inside and outside the premises.
- 17. The licensee shall encourage patrons to leave in the direction of the public transport. Information on public transport shall be available at the premises.
- 18. A notice shall be clearly visible on the premises advising that taxis may be ordered for patrons.
- 19. When regulated entertainment is taking place at the premises, all windows shall remain closed.
- 20. Drivers shall be informed of the need to keep noise to a minimum and to switch their vehicles engines off whilst waiting.
- 21. The placing of refuse for the collection and deliveries shall take place between the hours of 07.00 and 22.00.
- 22. When the premises close (and at regular intervals), the highway outside the premises shall be swept.
- 23. Dancing will only be ancillary to music and there will be no separate designated dancing area
- 24. The premises shall not be used for the provision of regulated entertainment until officers from the Council's Building Control Service have confirmed in writing that the premises are technically suitable for the intended use (by applying of relevant technical regulations)

Informative

Your attention is drawn to the Council's letter dated 30 January 2006 (Ref: MS-397), setting out the additional conditions that will apply at all times, in order to comply with condition 20 set out above, namely:

- i) The Technical Standards for places of Public Entertainment published by the London District Surveyors Association shall be complied with.
- ii) The total number of persons to be accommodated at any one time within the ground and first floors, based on the latest revised drawings handed to the Building Control Officer, on the 19th January 2006, shall not exceed 280 persons made up as listed below: Ground Floor = 1 80 First Floor = 100 Total = 280 Note: this figure is a MAXIMUM accommodation and may be reduced if the internal layout is changed.
- iii) The fire alarm installation shall be under the supervision of a competent person who shall arrange for regular maintenance and testing to be carried out. The results of the tests shall be recorded in a logbook which shall be readily available for inspection by officers of the Council or LFEPA.
- iv) The fire alarm change over switch shall be in the "FIRE ALARM LI GHTS AND BUZZER" position during the whole time that the premises are in use under the licence.
- v) Any alterations or additions to the existing electrical installation (including those which may be found necessary as a result of any electrical inspections) shall be carried out using a system of wiring approved by the Council (eg cables enclosed in a screwed metal conduit or metal trunking, or mineral insulated metal-sheathed cables. NOTE: FP200 or similar cables would not be acceptable for this purpose).
- vi) An attendant shall be on duty in the cloakroom during the whole time that it is in use.
- vii) The doors or gates in the following locations shall be locked back in the open position whilst the premises are occupied / in use under the licence, External front entrance door Any door on escape routes that do not open in the direction of escape. and notices shall be exhibited adjacent thereto worded: THIS DOOR / GATE TO BE KEPT LOCKED BACK OPEN WHILST THE PREMISES ARE OCCUPIED / IN USE UNDER THE LICENCE
- 25. There shall be no more than 30 customers permitted to smoke outside the premises at any one time.
- 26. There shall be no more than 40 customers permitted in to the second floor licensed area at any one time.
- 27. There shall be no live or recorded music permitted to take place in the second floor licensed area at any one time.
- 28. The windows in the licensed area on the second floor shall remain closed at all times.
- 29. Double glazing units will be installed within the licensed area on the second floor.
